PROCEEDINGS

Monday, August 5, 1946, First Session.

The thirteenth Annual Conference of the Tennessee District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Cumberland Grove Campground, Jamestown, Tennessee, August 5, 1946; with General Secretary. Rev. S. M. Stikeleather, presiding. The conference opened at 8:00 A. M., by singing, "I Am Thine, O Lord". Prayer by Brotner J. L. Tucker. Brother Stikeleather commented from 1st Timothy 4:12-16.

By common consent the conference recessed until 10:00 A. M.

Second Sitting

The second sitting was opened by singing, "Standing On The Promises". Prayer by Bro. H. H. Barton.

It was moved and adopted that Sister Herman M. Rhyne act as delegate from New Tazewell, Sister H. A. Wilcox from Knoxville, and Sister W. P. Goodman from Paris in the absence of regular delegates from these churches.

Roll call.

It was moved and carried that the following be received into the District as ministers: Rev. J. L. Tucker. Rev. Charles J. Verness, Sr., Rev. Russell Berry and Rev. W. P. Goodman.

Moved and adopted that the two middle sections of the tabernacle constitute the conference bar.

The report of the District Superintendent was read and accepted.

The report of the Auditing Committee was given at this time and was accepted.

The report of the District Treasurer was read and accepted.

Rev. E. A. Shetler was appointed to fill a vacancy on the Reception Committee.

It was moved and adopted that reports handed to the Statistician at the Conference be included in the statistical report before going to press.

The report of the District Statistician was read and accepted.

It was moved and adopted that the matter of reporting revivals and seekers be referred to the Resolutions Committee.

A partial report of the Resolutions Committee was given and accepted. (See Resolutions).

It was moved and adopted that the conference recess to 2 P. M.

Third Sitting

The third sitting was opened by singing "The Lily of the Valley". Prayer by Sister Goodman.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee read and accepted.
(See Ways and Means).

The report of the Educational and Examining Board was read and accepted. (See Directory).

The final report of the Resolutions Committee was read and accepted. (See Resolutions).

The Reception Committee presented Brothers Taylor, Winkler, Tucker, Hall, Berry, and Charles J. Verness, Sr., also Sisters Verness, Goodman and Rhyne to the conference. They were given honorary seats within the conference bar.

The election of officers was held at this time. (See Official Directory).

The conference recessed until 5 P. M.

Fourth Sitting

The fourth sitting was opened by singing "Amazing Grace".

The election of officers was concluded.

Moved and adopted that the District Trustees be elected by acclamation.

The various committees were appointed by the District Superintendent. (See Official Directory).

Brother and Sister Tucker from Kentucky were presented to the conference.

Moved and adopted that a rising vote of thanks be given Brother and Sister Moon for their faithful efforts in the District this year and that a love offering be taken for them.

Moved and adopted that a rising vote of thanks be given the kitchen and dining room force for the help rendered during Camp and Conference.

At this time an ordination service was held. Rev. S. M. Stikeleather, General Secretary, gave the charge and was assisted by several members of the District Council. Rev. Herman Rhyne, pastor of the New Tazewell Church was ordained.

In compliance of Resolutions No. 3, the election of Zone chairmen was held. Rev. Jack Polson and Rev. Beulah Moyers were elected chairman of Zones No. 1 and 2 respectively.

Moved and adopted that the approving of the Minutes Together with any other business overlooked by the Conference be taken care of by the District Council.

Moved and adopted that the Conference adjourn.

Report of the District Superintendent

To the thirteenth District Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in the Tennessee District, greetings in Jesus's name.

After serving as Superintendent during the past year I can truthfully say that I have enjoyed the fellowship and co-operation of the brethren. Can say we have made some progress, and expect to see the District go on and accomplish many things yet in the future.

During the past year the church at Paris has bought property and is having services in the small buildings on the lot. They expect to build when able. The church at Lake City has bought a good corner lot near their present location, and repaired the old building on the lot for a parsonage. They expect to build when they get able to do so.

A new parsonage has been constructed at Moss which is a great asset to the church there. The new church at Alpine is near completion. We expect to have services in it in the near future.

During the year I have preached fifty five times and held one funeral. Made 185 calls, attended 181 other services, visited 18 revivals on the District, wrote 310 letters and 95 post cards and received 295 letters. Edited three District Bulletins and mailed out about 2000 copies. Have conducted two ministerial meetings, attended the General Conference at Frankfort, Indiana, and our annual Campmeeting that just closed. Traveled 17,778 miles, worked 70 days at manual labor on the campground and elsewhere on the District, held twelve church board meetings, eleven yearly church meetings and seven council meetings. Received \$124.11 traveling expenses, \$1,286.00 salary, also gifts and donations amounting to \$64.80.

RESOLUTIONS

No. 1. Be it resolved that the date of the District Campmeeting for 1947 be from Friday before the last Sunday in July to continue over the first Sunday in August, and the conference to follow on Monday.

No. 2. Be it resolved that each church devote one service each month to General Missionary interests, and offerings to be taken in the Sunday School or Church service and be sent to the District Treasurer for General Missions.

No. 3. Be it resolved that we have two zones in the District next year. Zone No. 1 to be composed of the following churches: Clinton, Knoxville, Lake City, LaFollette; Jellico and New Tazewell. Zone No. 2 to be composed of the following churches: Jamestown, Monterey, McEwen, Paris, Moss, Cumberland Grove, Alpine and Chattanooga. The ministers and delegates from each zone are to meet while at Conference and elect a chairman for their respective zones. Each zone is to meet for an all day meeting each quarter, the morning and the afternoon services to be devoted to young people and the Sunday Schools, in charge of our District Young Peoples' leader and the Secretary of the Sunday School Board. The speaker at the night service to be chosen by the zone chairman and the pastor of the local church.

No. 4. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent, or his assistant, visit each church three times a year, and that he make one of these visits over Sunday at each church.

No. 5. Since it is a matter of importance for all pastors of the District to attend the Conference and Campmeeting, be it resolved that all pastors' support at the church where he is serving continue over the Sundays he is away.

No. 6. Be it resolved that each pastor read all resolutions, and also recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee, to his church at the earliest convenience, and also a few weeks previous to Campmeeting.

No. 7. Be it resolved that each church take an offering of groceries, vegetables and cash for the Camp.

No. 8. Be it resolved that all monies raised by local church for District or General expense be sent to the District Treasurer by the 10th of each month.

No. 9 Whereas many of our pastors have not received sufficient financial support, be it resolved that our District Superintendent impress upon the local deacons or deaconesses that it is one of their duties to see that monthly donations are brought to the pastor.

No. 10 We recommend that no pastor's wife be elected to serve as a delegate to the Conference where the church has a sufficient number of members to select from.

No. 11 Be it resolved that each pastor organize a Young Peoples' Society where possible, and to encourage same. Futhermore, that District Home Missionary offerings be taken monthly at regular Young Peoples' services.

No. 12 Be it resolved that one copy of the minutes be in every Pilgrim Holiness Church for the use of those wishing to read same, also that pastors urge members to have their own copy.

No. 13 Be it resolved that the District Council have charge of the printing of the minutes and provision for paying for same.

No. 14 Be it resolved that we have one ministerial convention this Conference year. Workers and date to be arranged by the District Council.

No. 15 Be it resolved that all annual church and ministerial reports be in the hands of the District Statistician not later than ten days before Camp.

No. 16 Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and his assistant be elected a Campground Committee to look after any emergency that may arise between Campmeeting seasons.

No. 17 Be it resolved that no children under twelve years of age be sent to stay at Campmeeting unless attended by parents or guardian.

No. 18 Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be empowered to appoint regular committees.

No. 19 Be it resolved that churches desiring to finish rooms or build cottages for their pastor, be allowed to do so under supervision of the District Council.

No. 20 Be it resolved that the church entertaining the Ministerial Convention make arrangements with some restaurant for said delegation to be fed, expense to be taken care of by offerings to be raised at the Convention, and that bedding arrangements be made by the entertaining church.

No. 21 Be it resolved that each church have a communion service once each quarter.

No. 22 Be it resolved that each church grant its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay.

No. 23 Be it resolved that the District Council have a 'phone installed in the District Parsonage, the regular monthly bill plus any extra bills pertaining to the duties of the District Superintendent to be paid from Campground fund.

No. 24 Be it resolved that all churches where 'phone service is available have a 'phone installed in the parsonage, the regular monthly bill plus any extra bills pertaining to the church be paid by the local church.

No. 25 Be it resolved that next year our District Superintendent make arrangements before Camp with the proper authorities for one of our ministers to be deputized and be given authority to keep order on the Campground at all times.

No. 26 Be it resolved that we want no smoking on the Campground, and that we post "NO SMOKING" signs on the grounds next year.

No. 27 Be it resolved that before Camp next year more lights be installed both in the tabernacle and on the grounds.

No. 28 Be it resolved that any pastor or church failing to comply with the rules and regulations passed by this Conference, that said pastor or delegate meet with the District Council and give a satisfactory explanation before being allowed a voice in the Conference.

No. 29 Be it resolved that each church give one pair of pillows and cases and one sheet or quilt this year for the Campground.

No. 30 Be it resolved that we put on a special drive in the District for subscriptions to our church paper, the Advocate, and our pastors make an effort to get the paper going into every member's home, and also that the church put the paper into as many schools, libraries, doctors' offices and church friends homes as possible.

No. 31 We recommend that we buy 300 new song books before Campmeeting time next year.

No. 32 Moved and adopted that the District Council be asked to move the lunch room to a better location.

No. 34 We recommend that all revivals held in local churches, also all seekers in our services of the local churches be reported by the local pastor of the church in his Pastor's report.

RECOMMENDATION of the WAYS and MEANS COMMITTEE

No. 1 We recommend that the ministers' tithes be sent to the District Treasurer, same to be applied on the District Superintendent's salary.

No. 2 We recommend that all members tithe into the local treasury, and that ten percent of the regular offerings, or its equivalent, be sent to the District Treasurer to be prorated to the various departments of the District work. Be it further resolved that the percent for the various departments be as follows. District Superintendent 25 percent; Home Missions 35 percent; Incidentals 25 percent; Campground fund 15 percent.

No. 3 We recommend that the District Superintendent be allowed the privilege of holding two revivals off the district this year, and that he be permitted to keep his offerings, but he shall pay his own traveling expenses.

No. 4 We recommend that each pastor take a free will offering at each visit of the District Superintendent or assistant for his traveling expenses, and that each local church treasurer report said amount to the District Treasurer with other monies.

No. 5 We recommend that each church member be assessed 25¢ next year in order to accumulate the General Conference expense fund.

No. 6 We recommend that the District Treasurer be allowed \$2.50 per month for postage, phone calls, etc., same to be paid from the incidental fund.

No. 7 After organizing the Cumberland Grove Campmeeting Association, charging \$1.00 per year membership fee, we further recommend that the District Council have charge of same Association.

No. 8 We recommend that all birthday offerings be applied on the District Home Missionary work in the District.

No. 9 We recommend that the District Council have charge of the Home Missionary work in the District.

No. 10 We recommend that the District Superintendent have oversight of the Campground and buildings, and that all monies appropriated for such purposes be used by him.

No. 11 We recommend that each preacher donate four days labor each year or pay \$15.00 in cash to support the work on the Campground.

No. 12 We recommend that our District Superintendent pay his tithes to the District Treasurer, the same to be placed in the District Home Missionary fund.

No. 13 We recommend that the District Secretary be paid \$25.00. and the District Treasurer be paid \$50.00 for their yearly services to the District, and that it be paid from the Incidental fund in quarterly installments.
