PROCEEDINGS

MONDAY, AUGUST 7th, 1949, FIRST SESSION

The sixteenth Annual Conference of the Tennessee District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened at Cumberland Grove Campground, Jamestown, Tennessee, August 7th, 1949, with Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary of Home Missions, presiding. The conference was opened at 8:00 o'clock A. M., by singing, "When I See The Blood. Prayer by Bro. A. M. Eads. Bro Beltz spoke to the conference on the subject of "Facing and Solving Our Problems."

It was moved and adopted that the first six seats of the two middle sections of the tabernacle, also the platform, constitute the conference bar.

It was moved and adopted that the report of the Educational and Examining Committee be given at this time. (See Ministerial Directory.) Accepted.

It was moved and adopted that the time of conference be from 8:00 to 12:00 o'clock, and from 1:00 o'clock to the conclusion.

Roll Call.

Rev. and Mrs. C. A. Simmons of Birmingham, Alabama, were introduced to the conference. After giving their testimonies they were given honorary seats within the bar.

Moved and adopted that the new churches at Morristown and also Cumberland Grove be admitted to the conference.

Rev. Russell Coston was introduced to the conference and given an honorary seat with the bar.

Report of the District Superintendent read and accepted.

Report of the Auditing Committee given and accepted.

Report of the District Treasurer read and accepted.

Report of the District Statistician read and accepted.

Report of the Young Peoples' president given and accepted.

Recess.

Re-convened from recess by singing, "I Am Thine O Lord."

Report of the Ways and Means Committee given (See Resolutions of the Ways and Means Committee.)

Conference adjourned until 1:00 o'clock.

SECOND SITTING

The afternoon sitting was opened by singing, "He Abides", and prayer.

The minutes were read and approved.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee was given and accepted. (See Resolutions of the Ways and Means Committee.)

Report of the Resolutions Committee given. (See Resolutions.)

Moved and adopted that a vote be taken as to whether we shall have a Ministerial Convention this year. The result of the vote was "Yes."

Election of Officers. (See Official Directory)

It was moved and accepted that all unfinished business be left in the hands of the District Council.

A rising vote of thanks was extended to Bro. Beltz.

A beautiful ordination service was held at the close of the conference. The charge was given by Bro. Beltz to Brothers Charles J. Verness, Sr., and Homer Brown.

Moved and adopted that Sister Hall be given the chickens left from the camp.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the sixteenth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Tennessee District, greetings in the name of Jesus.

Another year has passed by finding us in the midst of battles. God has not failed us in a one of them.

I have traveled 14,300 miles in the interest of the district. Preached 135 times, conducted five funerals, attended two Bible School board meetings at Kernersville, North Carolina. Conducted five communion services, fifteen business meetings in churches (annual), eight district council meetings and assisted in forty five other services. Conducted six week-end meetings and held three revivals on the district. Organized two churches and conducted one ministerial convention. Thirty five saved and twenty sanctified.

Received salary in full. \$168.33 traveling expenses; \$174.54 from revivals; \$38.00 donations; \$50.00 on back salary and \$25.00 traveling expenses from the district.

God has helped us to pay off the debt on the parsonage at Lake City. Another room at Chattanooga has been finished. Mineral Springs finishing up church on inside. New Tazwell church has made some needed improvements. The debt on the Paris church has been paid off, also some improvements made. Jamestown has made some improvements on parsonage, including a bath room. Cumberland Grove has purchased a Sunday school bus and paid

for it this year. The folks at Morristown have moved into another building. The folks at McEwen have started a building fund, looking forward to a new church. In all of these things we thank God for His goodness to us.

RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that the date of the District Campmeeting be year to year from Friday before the last Sunday in July to continue over the first Sunday in August, and the Conference to follow on Monday.

2. Be it resolved that we have three zones in the District, as follows: Zone No. 1 comprising the following churches: Clinton, Knoxville, Lake City, LaFollette, Jellico, New Tazwell (Sand Lick) Lone Mountain and Morristown. Zone No. 2, McEwen and Paris. Zone No. 3, Jamestown, Monterey, Moss, Cumberland Grove, Chattanooga, Wolfe River, Mineral Springs and Silver Point. Each zone is to meet for an all-day meeting quarterly. The morning service is to be devoted to Young People's work, and the afternoon to Sunday school interests. The night service speaker is to be chosen by the zone chairman and pastor of the local church.

3. Since it is a matter of importance for all pastors to attend Campmeeting and Conference, be it resolved that all pastor's support at the church he is serving continue over the Sundays he is away.

4. Be it resolved that each pastor read all resolutions, also recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee to the church at the earliest convenience, and also a few weeks previous to Campmeeting.

5. Whereas many of our pastors have not received sufficient financial support, be it resolved that our District Superintendent impress on the deacons the fact that it is their duty to see that donations are brought to the pastor.

6. Be it resolved that no pastor's wife be elected to serve at the Conference as a delegate where the church has a sufficient number of members to select from.

7. Be it resolved that each church organize a Young People's Society and to encourage same.

8. Be it resolved that one copy of the District Minutes be in every Pilgrim Holiness Church for the use of those wishing to read same, also that pastors urge members to have their own copy.

9. Be it resolved that the District Council have charge of the printing of the District Minutes, and make provision for the paying for same.

10. Be it resolved that the Examining Committee before recommending ministers or deaconesses to the Conference explain the requirements and obligations of the District, and urge the keeping of them.

11. Be it resolved that no children under twelve years of age be sent to stay at the Campmeeting unless attended by parents or guardian .

Page Eight

12. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be empowered to appoint regular committees.

13. Be it resolved that churches desiring to finish rooms or build cottages for their pastors be allowed to do so under the supervision of the Campground and Lot committee.

14. Be it resolved that the set place for the Ministerial Convention be at the Cumberland Grove Campground. Also the date be from Tuesday until Thursday before the last Sunday in March.

15. Be it resolved that each church have a communion service once each quarter.

16. Be it resolved that each church grant its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay.

17. Be it resolved that no minister of the District receive a recommendation to another district until their district obligations, such as ministerial tithes and other requirements passed by the Conference, are paid.

18. Be it resolved that this Conference appoint a Committee to write letters of appreciation to various ones who contributed to the success of the Camp. (See names under "Proceedings" at the Second Sitting.)

19. We recommend that the District Secretary write a letter of thanks and publish it in the Upper Cumberland Times, thanking those who assisted in any way in making the Campmeeting a success.

20. Be it resolved that any pastor or church failing to comply with the rules and regulations passed by the Conference, that said pastor or delegate meet with the District Council and give a satisfactory explanation before being allowed a voice in the Conference.

21. Be it resolved that each church give one pair of pillows and cases, and one sheet or quilt this year to the Campground.

22. Be it resolved that we put on a special drive in the District for subscriptions to the Advocate, and that our pastors make an effort to get the paper going into every member's home, and also to put the paper into as many schools, libraries, doctor's offices and church friends homes as possible.

23. Be it resolved that our District Superintendent be allowed two weeks vacation with pay.

24. We recommend that all revivals in local churches, also all seekers in our services of the local churches be reported by the local pastor in his pastor's report.

25. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be placed on the Pilgrim Bible College board of trustees.

26. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be given a rising vote of thanks for excellent service rendered the District.

27. Be it resolved that all persons attending Campmeeting abide by the rules of the District Council.

28. Be it resolved that when a church gives a pastor a recall that said pastor reject or accept within ten days.

29. Be it resolved that the Recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee, and the Resolutions be mimeographed within thirty days after Conference and a copy be sent to each pastor im-

mediately.

30. We recommend that no pastor engage in a revival during Campmeeting, Conference or Ministerial Convention.

31. Be it resolved that a fire escape be installed on each dormitory.

32. Be it resolved that the ones who operate the dining room and lunch stand, also those in charge of the beds be on the Campground two days before Campmeeting starts.

Recommendations of the WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

Local Church Financial.

1. We recommend that all Evangelists, Song Evangelists, Pastors and other Conference Ministers are to send their ministerial tithes to the District Treasurer the first of each month. Where their ministerial tithes do not average as much as \$2.00 per month they are to send that amount monthly, except students while attending Bible School, or those physically unable to work or to pastor a church. When husband and wife are both acting as pastors of one church, or both traveling together in evangelistic work they shall be assessed a minimum of \$2.00 per month. Active Evangelists and Song Evangelists tithes are to be divided as follows: The first \$4.00 from each one is to be put in the General Budget fund. The balance is to be divided as follows: 60% District Administration fund; 20% District Home Missions fund; 20% District Campground fund. All other ministerial tithes are to be put into the District Administration fund.

2. We recommend that all members tithe into the local treasury, except the ministerial tithe, and that 10% of the regular offerings, or its equivalent, from each church or mission be sent to the District Treasurer the first of each month. The District Treasurer is to divide as follows: 40% District Administration fund; 17½% District Home Missions fund; 17½% District Campground fund; 10% Incidental fund; 10% General Conference Fund and 5% Bible School fund.

3. We recommend that each church raise the equivalent of five cans of food per member for our Campmeeting, and that the Zone Chairman mention this in the zone meetings and help the Pastors try to raise this as early as possible in the conference year, and that the District Superintendent pick it up on his visits to the churches.

4. We recommend that our churches in the District raise their General Budget by taking a special offering each month in either the Sunday school or church service, doing their best to raise at least one twelfth (1/12) of the annual budget each month. This money to be sent to the District Treasurer the first of each month.

5. We recommend that each church or mission take two free will offerings for our Bible School at Kernersville. The first to be taken on or before October 31, and to be sent to the District Treasurer November 1st. The second to be taken on or before May 31st,

and to be sent to the District Treasurer on June 1st .

6. We recommend that our churches and missions be assessed the following amounts for the traveling expenses of our District Superintendent: Chattanooga, Jamestown, McEwen, Clinton, Monterey and Paris \$2.50 per month. Lake City, Jellico, Knoxville, La-Follette, Cumberland Grove and Morristown \$1.50 per month. Mineral Springs, Moss, New Tazwell and Lone Mountain 50c per month. This money is to be sent to the District Treasurer the first of each month to be placed in the District Superintendent's traveling expense fund. Also be it understood that any church calling the Superintendent for a special meeting shall be expected to give him the equivalent of 5c per mile for his expenses.

Sunday School Work

1. We recommend that all birthday offerings be placed in the District Home Missions fund, and that all our pastors co-operate with our Sunday School Superintendents in urging those attending our Sunday Schools to bring in their birthday offerings, explaining to them that the money is used for District Home Missions. This money is to be sent to our District Treasurer the first of each month.

2. We recommend that our pastors see to it that on the last Sunday of each month, the Sunday School raise the equivalent of 2c per member average attendance for that month, the same to be sent to the District Treasurer the first of the following month. This money is to be divided equally between the District Home Missions fund and the District Campground fund.

Young Peoples Work

1. We recommend that each Young People's Society send one offering each month to the District Treasurer to be placed in our District Sunday School and Young Peoples fund.

2. We recommend that our District Sunday School and Young Peoples Secretary send a monthly news sheet to each pastor and Sunday School superintendent, also Young Peoples leader informing them as to what the local churches are doing for our young people, also giving them helpful hints and advice and do all in their power to push the interests of the Sunday School and Young Peoples work in the Tennessee District. Said secretary to receive \$4.00 per month to take care of expense and trouble in connection with this work. This money is to be paid from the District Sunday School and Young Peoples fund. We further recommend that all pastors, Sunday School superintendents and local young peoples leaders in our churches heartily co-operate with our District leader.

District Financial

1. We recommend that our District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$130.00 per month, as far as possible, after the District Secretary, District Treasurer, Pension Plan, District light and telephone bills are paid.

2. We recommend that our District Superintendent pay his tithes to the District Treasurer, the same to be placed in the District Home Missions fund.

3. We recommend that our District Superintendent be allowed the privilege of holding three revivals off the District this year, and that he be permitted to keep his offerings, but he shall pay his own traveling expenses.

4. We recommend that our District Treasurer pay our District Superintendent's light, telephone bills and also his 4% Pension Plan dues, same to be paid from the District Administration fund.

5. We recommend that our District Superintendent's traveling expense to the Superintendent's meeting in Indianapolis be paid from the Incidental fund.

6. In as much as the District at this time is unable to pay our District Superintendent a larger salary, we recommend that when the Campground and Lot committee hire labor for improvements on the grounds such as painting, carpenter work, etc., that our District Superintendent be granted the privilege of doing this work at the times when he is home, if he so desires. The District Council is to decide the hourly wage to be paid, taking into consideration the prevailing wage paid locally for work of this kind.

7. We recommend that our District Superintendent visit each church three times during the year, staying over Sunday or for at least two nights with each church during one of his visits, and that he inform the churches of what progress the District is making, and also inform each church as to what progress that church is making in keeping their budgets paid. If they are behind he is to meet with the Board and try to work out a plan whereby they can do better. He is to visit Knoxville and all churches east of there on one trip; Chattanooga, Mineral Springs and any other work we have south of Monterey on one trip. Monterey and all churches west of there on one trip. He is to be paid 4c per mile traveling expense, this money to be paid from District Superintendent's traveling expense fund.

8. We recommend that our District Superintendent appoint someone to launder all Camp things needing washing at the close of Campmeeting, the party doing the work to receive \$15.00. This money is to be paid from the Campmeeting fund.

9. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid a salary of \$2.50 per month, same to be paid from the District Administration fund.

10. We recommend that our District Treasurer be paid \$7.50 per month for salary and expenses, this money to be paid from the District Administration fund. The Treasurer is to mail out on the 10th of the month to each pastor or church treasurer and active evangelists a financial report of monies received to date, also to keep the superintendent informed as to how the churches are keeping up their budgets.

11. We recommend that our District Treasurer pay the 4% contribution to the Pension Plan for each of our evangelists and song evangelists who are co-operating with the District in sending in their ministerial tithes monthly, and who desire to sign with the pension plan.

12. After organizing the Cumberland Grove Campmeeting Association, charging \$1.00 per year membership fee, we further

recommend that this money be placed in the Campmeeting fund, and that our District Superintendent endeavor to obtain more new members both at Campmeeting and in the local churches .

13. We recommend that all conference licensed ministers and deaconesses pay to the District Treasurer \$7.50 per year for the purpose of improving our campground. This money is to be placed in the District Campground fund.

14. We recommend that at each Zone meeting an offering be taken in one of the services, this money to be sent to the District Treasurer to be placed in the District Sunday School and Young Peoples fund.

15. We recommend that the District Council be in charge of all Home Missionary work in the District.

16. We recommend that what money we have on hand in District Home Missions fund, and all money received for District Home Missions in the future be divided into two District Home Missions funds, one fund to be called District Home Mission Operating fund, the other to be called District Home Missions Church Extension Loan fund. The money from the first fund is to be used for operating expenses of District Home Missionary work in the District. The second to be under the supervision of the District Council for loaning to churches for Church Extension or improvements. This money is to be repaid as the Council and church concerned agree upon, the loan to draw 6% interest payable in advance .

17. We recommend that we have a Campground and Lot committee, consisting of the District Superintendent, the District Treasurer and one other man elected by the District Council. The District Superintendent is to be chairman of this committee. This committee is to be in charge of all lots, the upkeep and improvement of all buildings and to have the oversight of all rooms. The chairman is to get the consent of at least one other member before paying out any monies for improvements.

18. We recommend that we have a Campmeeting committee consisting of District Treasurer, the person in charge of the kitchen and the person in charge of the lunch stand. The duties of this committee are to purchase foods needed for Camp, to count all offerings received at Camp, and to keep the District Superintendent informed from time to time as to how much additional money will need to be raised to take care of Camp expenses.
