Sturk then brought a much appreciated and helpful message to the conference.

Roll call of ministers and delegates.

It was moved and adopted that the first five seats of the two middle sections of the tabernacle and the platform constitute the conference bar.

It was moved and adopted that the time of the settings be eight to twelve a. m., and one to five p. m.

Miss Blanche Reed, Bro. and Sister Wm. H. Johnson, Bro. Bolender, Bro. and Sister Roy Quackenbush, Bro. Acil Turner, Bro. and Sister Eldon Hotle, Bro. Elton Cato, were introduced to the conference and seated in the conference bar.

Report of the District Superintendent read and accepted.

Report of the Assistant Superintendent read and accepted.

Report of District Treasurer read and accepted.

Report of the statistician read and accepted with necessary corrections.

Report of Resolutions committee read and accepted. (See Resolutions).

Report of Camp Meeting Treasurer read and accepted.

Conference recessed for dinner.

Afternoon Sitting

Opened with song led by Bro. Galyon.

Prayer by Homer Brown.

Rev. H. H. Bolender, Rev. Acil Turner, Rev. Elton Cato, Rev. Eldon Hotle, Rev. Wm. H. Johnson and Rev. Roy Quackenbush were received into the conference as new ministers in District and were seated in the conference.

It was moved and adopted that the District Council draft a letter to the Kernersville Bible School relative to the maintenance of certain standards of the School, at the same time giving assurance of our whole-hearted support and expressed regrets that we as a District have not been able to do more for the School.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee read and accepted.

Report of the Auditor's Committee read and accepted.

The election of officers. (See Official Directory).

Moved and adopted that a rising vote of thanks be given our General Superintendent for presiding at the conference.

Conference adjourned.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the twenty-first annual session of the Tennessee District Conference, greetings and great blessings.

God has seen fit for us to close another year that has been filled with hard work and many blessings, also with several victories won.

From the deep of my heart I can say it has been a joy to work with the members of this district, our Council and pastors that we esteem very highly.

With lots of hard work on the part of our pastors we are happy

to report a new church and parsonage at Paris, a new parsonage nearing completion at Clinton, a basement church and parsonage at Morris-town and a church soon to be completed at Gordon Lake. Some re-modeling has been done at Jellico. The Jamestown church has re-decorated the interior, built new pews and installed gas furnaces. For all of this we give God the glory.

We reached a possible all time high figure in total receipts this year of \$37,220.63, 9,548.06 over last year and \$1,703.44 over 1949 figures which was the highest since 1946. God has helped us to raise the equity of our district to \$109,906.70. This is a gain of \$8,058.01, with a debt over the entire district of \$4,405.03.

Personal Report

Have helped in two tent meetings, held one revival and one week end meeting, visited all of our churches three times, held fifteen annual meetings, attended one Superintendent's meeting at Indianapolis, Indiana, two school board meetings at Kernersville, North Carolina, one regional conference meeting at Burlington, North Carolina, one Sunday School Institute at Kernersville, North Carolina, and the General Conference at Winona Lake, Indiana. Presided over one Ministerial Convention at Paris, Tennessee.

Have helped what I could on the different building projects of the District.

Have travelled some twenty thousand miles in the interest of the District.

Received my salary in full.

Spoke on the subject of Sunday Schools in the ministerial convention.

Attended one Sunday School board meeting in Burlington, North Carolina.

Conducted Youth and Sunday School services during the camp-meeting.

Received twenty subscriptions to the Pilgrim Youth News.

R E S O L U T I O N S

1. Be it resolved that the date of the District Campmeeting be year to year from Friday before the first Sunday in July to continue to the second Sunday in July, and the conference to follow on Monday.

2. Be it resolved that we have three zones in the District as follows: Zone No. 1 to comprise the following churches: Clinton, Lake City, East LaFollette, West LaFollette, Jellico, Morristown, Newport. Zone No. 2: New Providence, Paris, McEwen, Nashville. No. 3: James-

town, Moss, Monterey, Chattanooga and Gordon Lake. Plans are to be made for at least two special meetings during the year.

3. Since it is a matter of importance for all pastors to attend Campmeeting and Conference, be it resolved that all pastors' supports at the church he is serving continue over the two weeks that he is away.

4. Be it resolved that each pastor read all resolutions, also recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee to the church at the earliest convenience, and also a few weeks before campmeeting.

5. Whereas many of our pastors have not received sufficient financial support, be it resolved that our local church boards with the help of the District Superintendent impress on the deacons the fact that it is the duty to see that monthly donations are brought to the pastor.

6. Be it resolved that no pastor's wife be elected to serve at the Conference as a delegate where the church has sufficient number of members to select from.

7. Be it resolved that each church organize a Young People's Society and encourage same.

8. Be it resolved that one copy of the Minutes be in each church, also that pastors urge their members to have their own copy.

9. Be it resolved that the District Council have charge of the printing of the minutes, and make provision for the paying for the same.

10. Be it resolved that the Examining Committee before recommending ministers or deaconesses to the Conference explain the requirements and obligations of the District and urge keeping of the same.

11. Be it resolved that no children under twelve years of age be sent to stay at the campmeeting unless attended by parents or guardian.

12. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be empowered to appoint regular committees.

13. Be it resolved that churches desiring to build cottages for their pastors may do so under the supervision of the campground and lot committee.

14. Be it resolved that the Ministerial Convention be the last of January or first of February, the exact date to be set by the District Council.

15. Be it resolved that the local churches observe the Lord's Supper on the first Sunday of each quarter when possible.

16. Be it resolved that each church grant its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay.

17. Be it resolved that no minister of the District receive a recommendation to another District until their District obligations, such as ministerial tithes and other requirements passed by the conference are paid.

18. Be it resolved that the Conference appoint a committee to write letters of appreciation to various ones who contributed to the success of the camp.

19. We recommend that the District Secretary write a letter of thanks and publish it in the Upper Cumberland Times, thanking those who in any way assisted in making the campmeeting a success.

20. Be it resolved that any minister or church failing to comply with the rules and regulations passed by this Conference, that said minister or delegate meet with the District Council and give a satisfactory explanation before being allowed a voice in the Conference.

21. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent check pillows, quilts and linens, also apron supply by the end of the second quarter and notify each church what they are to provide.

22. Be it resolved that we put on a special drive in the District

for subscriptions to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate, and that our pastors make an effort to get the paper into every member's home, and also put the paper into as many schools, libraries, doctors' offices and church friends homes as possible.

23. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be allowed a two weeks vacation with pay.

24. We recommend that in all revivals in local churches, also all seekers in our services of the local church be reported by the pastor in his pastor's report.

25. Be it resolved that all persons attending the District Campmeeting abide by the rules of the District Council.

26. Be it resolved that the changes or deletions of the Resolutions Committee or the Ways and Means Committee be copied and a copy be sent to each pastor immediately.

27. Be it resolved that no pastor or evangelist engage in a revival during campmeeting, conference or ministerial meeting unless excused by the District Superintendent.

28. Be it resolved that those who operate the lunch stand, also those in charge of beds, and all active ministers be on the campground Wednesday morning before camp starts, unless excused by the District Superintendent.

29. Be it resolved that those taking the course of study take it with the Pilgrim Bible College at Kernersville, North Carolina, where possible.

30. Moved and adopted that the conference year close May 31st, because of the change of the time of camp and conference.

31. We recommend that churches sending in reports for Y. P. S., and S. S. quarterly news sheet, send them in before the tenth of the month, that being the dead line.

32. Because television is classed with sin according to the scriptures, and the traditional teaching of our church, be it resolved that we go on record as opposed to our members having television sets.

33. Be it resolved that all licensed and ordained ministers shall remain after District Conference for the purpose of instructions and making plans for the new year.

34. Because of the decline of Sunday School attendance in our district, we recommend the enforcement of Sec. 79, Para. 2 in the Manual which reads as follows: "The District Council shall appoint for each conference year a Sunday School board of not less than three members, one of which shall be a conference promotional secretary of Sunday Schools."

35. Be it resolved that our District Youth Convention be the last Friday and Saturday of the campmeeting.

Recommendations of the WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

Local Church Financial

1. We recommend that all evangelists, song evangelists, pastors and conference ministers are to send their ministerial tithes to the District Treasurer the first of each month. Where their ministerial tithes do not average as much as \$2.00 per month, they are to send that amount monthly, except ministerial students while attending Bible School, or those physically unable to work or pastor a church. When husband and wife are both pastoring a church, or both travelling together in evangelistic work, they shall be assessed a minimum of \$2.00 per month. This money is to be divided as follows: 60% District Administration; 20% District Home Missions; 20% District Campmeeting.

2. We recommend that each evangelist, song evangelist, pastor and conference minister pay their general budget through the local church.

3. We recommend that all members tithe into the local treasury, except ministerial tithe from church salary, and that 10% of the regular offerings, or its equivalent, from each church or mission be sent to the District Treasurer the first of each month. The treasurer is to divide as follows: 40% District administration fund; 17½% District Missionary fund; 7½% Campground fund. 15% Incidental fund; 15% General Conference fund; 5% Bible School.

4. We recommend that each church or mission take two free will offerings for the Bible School at Kernersville. The first to be taken on or before October 31st, and to be sent to the District Treasurer November 1st. The second to be taken on or before May 31st and to be sent to the District Treasurer on June 1st.

5. We recommend that our churches and missions be assessed the following amounts for travelling expenses of our District Superintendent: Chattanooga, Jamestown, McEwen, Monterey, Clinton and Paris \$2.50 per month. Lake City, Jellico, West LaFollette, Gordon Lake, and Morristown \$1.50 per month. Moss, Nashville and East LaFollette 50c per month. This money is to be sent to the District Treasurer the first of each month to be placed in the District Superintendent's travel expense fund. Also it is understood that any church calling the Superintendent for a special meeting shall be expected to give him an equivalent of 5c per mile for his expense.

Sunday School Work

1. We recommend that all birthday offerings be placed in the District Home Missions fund, and that all pastors co-operate with our Sunday School Superintendents in urging those attending our Sunday Schools to bring in their birthday offerings, explaining to them that the money is used for District Home Missions. This money to be sent to the District Treasurer the first of each month.

2. We recommend that our pastors see to it that on the last Sunday of each month the Sunday School raise the equivalent of 2c per member average attendance for that month, the same to be sent to the District Treasurer the first of the following month. This money is to be divided equally between the District Home Missions fund and the District Campground fund.

Young People's Work

1. We recommend that our District Young People's and Sunday School Secretary send monthly news sheets to each pastor for distribution to Y. P. Leaders and Sunday School Superintendents etc., also giving them helpful hints and advice. Pastors, Y. P. leaders and S. S. Superintendents are to inform the District Young Peoples Secretary as to what the local churches are doing for our young people, and do all in their power to push the interests of the local work. We further recommend that they heartily co-operate with our District Y. P. Secretary. Said Secretary is to receive \$4.00 per issue to take care of expenses and trouble in connection with this work. This money is to be paid from District S. S. and Y. P. fund.

District Financial

1. We recommend that our District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$140.00 a month. If the salary cannot be paid from the District administration fund because of lack of funds, it is to be paid from

the Home Missions fund.

2. We recommend that our District Superintendent pay his tithes to the District Treasurer, the same to be placed in the incidental fund.

3. We recommend that our District Superintendent be allowed the privilege of holding three revivals off the District this year, and that he be permitted to keep his offerings, but he shall pay his own traveling expenses.

4. We recommend that our District Treasurer pay our District Superintendent's light and phone bills, also his 4% pension plan dues, same to be paid from the incidental fund.

5. We recommend that our District Superintendent's travelling expenses to the Superintendent's meeting in Indianapolis be paid from the incidental fund.

6. We recommend that all pastors receiving District assistance, make a full monthly report to the District Superintendent.

7. We recommend that our District Superintendent visit each church three times during the year if possible, and that he inform the churches of the progress that the District is making, and also inform each church as to what progress that church is making in keeping their budgets paid. If they are behind, he is to meet with the board and try to work out a plan whereby they may do better.

8. We recommend that our District Superintendent appoint some one to launder all campmeeting things needing washing at the close of the camp, the party doing the work to receive \$20.00. This money is to be paid from campmeeting fund.

9. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid his actual expenses, same to be paid from the incidental fund.

10. We recommend that our District Treasurer be paid \$7.50 per month for expenses, this money to be paid from the District Administrative fund. The Treasurer is to mail out once a quarter to each pastor or church treasurer and active evangelists, a report of monies received to date. Also to keep the Superintendent informed as to how the churches are keeping up with their budgets.

11. We recommend that the District Treasurer pay the 4% contribution to the pension plan for each of our evangelists who are cooperating with the District in sending in their ministerial tithes monthly, and who desire to sign with the pension plan. This payment is to be made from the incidental fund.

12. Inasmuch as it is with real difficulty and hardship that the camp is prepared each year, we recommend that each conference licensed and ordained minister work two days on the camp ground or hire some one to work these two days. If unable to do either the church shall pay the pastor's amount of \$15.00 or in case of evangelists or unstationed ministers, they shall pay this amount to the District Treasurer to be placed in the camp ground fund.

13. We recommend that at each zone meeting an offering be taken in one of the services, this money to be sent to the District Treasurer to be placed in the Sunday School and Young People's fund.

14. We recommend that the District Superintendent appoint a committee of three to be in charge of all District Home Missions work and monies to be spent for that work.

15. We recommend that we have a camp ground and lot committee, consisting of the District Superintendent and the District Treasurer and one other man elected by the District Council. This committee is to be in charge of all lots, the upkeep and improvements of the buildings and to have the oversight of all rooms. The chairman is to get the consent of at least one other member of the committee before paying out any monies for improvements.

16. We recommend that we have a camp meeting committee consisting of the Camp Meeting Treasurer, the person in charge of the kitchen, also of the lunch stand. The duties of the committees

are to purchase foods needed for the camp, to count all offerings received at camp and to keep the District Superintendent informed from time to time as to how much additional money should be raised to take care of camp expenses.

17. We recommend that our District Superintendent be paid 5c a mile travelling expenses when travelling in the interest of the District. When travelling especially in the interest of District Home Missions, travel expenses are to be taken from District Home Mission fund and to be reported along with regular travel expense.

18. We recommend that at the beginning of the 1955 camp, there be a charge of \$1.00 registration fee for each person over ten years of age, or 50c for each person staying less than five nights. A charge of \$5.00 per room for ten days or \$1.00 per night. All dormitory beds free. A charge of \$5.00 for ten days for meals, or 40c a meal. All children under ten years of age, one half price. We further recommend that those desiring to work out expenses, be permitted to do so.

19. We recommend that all active gospel workers be entertained free, but shall pay registration fee.

DISTRICT LOAN FUND

1. We recommend that District Loan Fund be placed under supervision of a committee of three, the District Superintendent, District Treasurer and one other appointed by the District Council, said committee to be under direction of District Council.

2. We recommend that each loan be limited to \$500 payable in eighteen monthly installments at 4% interest rate until loan fund shall reach such an amount as would merit an increase.

3. We recommend that each church be limited to one loan at five hundred dollar limit until said Church has paid principal and interest down to \$250.00. After which the Church will become eligible for additional loan of \$250.00.

4. We recommend that when regular monthly payment can not be made that the Church be penalized \$2.50 for each month behind with payment.
