DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Fifth Annual Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Tennessee-Alabama District, at Cumberland Grove Campground, greetings:

We are glad to report victory through the blood. Hard battles have been fought the last year but God has given the victory.

During the year I have traveled 15,377 miles, besides two trips to the General Board meetings. Have preached eighty sermons and had 110 seekers at the altar. Have also conducted two revivals and nine zone meetings. Have made fifty four church visits. Received \$474.48 from the District on salary, and \$50.13 for traveling expenses.

Much work has been done on the parsonage at Jamestown, and it is now practically completed. Improvements have been made at LaFollette and New Tazwell, and the church at McEwen has been painted.

The work at Harriman needs much prayer, and we are striving to obtain a building there. A church building is under construction at Monterey. At Silver Point land, lumber and cash has been given for a new church. Brother Roy Hill recently closed a revival at Bethpage where land and lumber is offered for a church. The tent meeting at Knoxville is still on, and a number have sought and found the Lord. With more work and prayer we can have a good church in Knoxville. We have not organized at these places as we feel more work will result in better classes. Brother Freelan has also opened a mission in Rossville, Georgia. This puts the Pilgrim Holiness Church actively engaged in saving souls in a new state. We feel the prospects for the Tennessee-Alabama District are the brightest we have ever seen, and with the continued co-operation of our pastors we will march forward to greater victory.

We wish also to state that with more funds we could soon plant Pilgrim Holiness Churches in new communities and states.

GENERAL PROCEEDINGS

The Fifth Annual Assembly of the Tennessee-Alabama District, Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened at Cumberland Grove Campground, Jamestown, Tennessee, August 1, 1938. District Superintendent, Rev. H. O. Howell, in the chair. The first session opened at 8:00 o'clock A. M. by singing, 'Majestic Sweetness,' and 'He Lifted Me.' Rev. D. T. Crider from Kentucky, our Campmeeting evangelist, read and commented on Philippians 1:1-11.

Moved and supported that the first four rows of seats and the platform be established as the conference bar. Carried.

Registration of ministers and delegates.

Moved and supported that Rev. Coy Hilbrecht be admitted as a member of the Assembly.

Moved and supported that the Assembly recess until 10:00 A. M.

SECOND SITTING

Assembly opened with prayer by Sister Watson.

Appointing of Committees by the District Superintendent. (Refer to Official Directory.)

Reading of the following reports: East Chattanooga, Coal Creek, Ansley, Jamestown, La-Follette, McEwen, Pall Mall, New Tazewell, Sharps and Monterey.

The following were introduced to the Assembly and given seats within the conference bar: Rev. Roy Hill and daughter, Rev. Allen Wilcox, Sisters Grace Dye and L. Emma Koder.

Examining Board recommends Miss Emma Koder, and ordained minister, as a member of this Assembly. Also Mary Brown, Pearl Hatfield and Allen Wilcox as members of the Assembly.

Rev. W. J. Crider from Kentucky introduced to the Assembly and given seat within the bar.

Moved and supported that the Assembly recess from 12:00 until 1:00 o'clock.

THIRD SITTING

Assembly opened with prayer by Sister Moyers.

Report of Resolutions Committee:

Nos. 1 and 3 laid on the table.

Nos. 2, 4, 5, 6 and accepted. Also #7.

Sister Roy Hill introduced to the Assembly.

Examining Board recommends that Brother C. I. Milligan be reinstated as a member of the Assembly.

Clinton and Shadoer School House reports read and accepted.

Reports of L. T. Wallingford and Mrs. Kennie Adams read and accepted.

Moved and supported that the election of officers be held at 10:00 A. M. August 2nd.

Moved and supported that the question under discussion regarding the making out of reports be referred to the General Superintendent.

Examining Board recommends that the Deaconess license of Mrs. Dona Heath be renewed. Also that Mrs. W. B. Hughes be granted Deaconess license.

Moved and supported that the Assembly recess until the bell rings.

FOURTH SITTING

Assembly reconvened at 10:00 A. M. Aug. 2nd with General Superintendent W. L. Surbrook presiding.

"Blessed Assurance" was sung after which minutes were read and approved.

The General Superintendent rules that when a pastor and his wife are making calls that the pastor alone report the number of calls. An evangelist and not a pastor is to report the number of seekers. Also that a minister report only the calls he has made himself personally.

Report of the District Superintendent read and accepted by a rising vote of thanks.

Election of officers. (Refer to Directory.)

Moved and carried that each pastor submit one name to be voted on as a lay delegate to the General Assembly.

Assembly recessed for five minutes.

Special song by Brothers Wilcox and Simmons.

Moved and carried that the Committees for the next Assembly be appointed by the District Supt.

Report of the Resolutions Committee: Moved and carried that No. 1 taken from the table. Referred to the District Council. (This resolution was in reference to date of next Assembly.

Nos. 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 16 and 17 accepted.

No. 15 was referred to the District Council. (Regards date of preachers meeting.)

Report of Ways and Means Committee: No. 1 referred back to the Committee.

Report of Examining and Educational Board:

Recommends that Mrs. Eugene Freelan be accepted as a member of this Assembly providing she obtains a transfer from the Indiana District.

Recommends the following ministers for ordination: Coy Hilbrecht, L. T. Wallingford and C. W. Keyes. Also that Mrs. Eugene Freelan be ordained as deaconess.

Moved and carried that the Assembly adjourn until 2:45 P. M.

FIFTH SITTING

Assembly opened by singing, "What a Friend We have in Jesus." Prayer by Brother Moon.

Report of Examining and Educational Board:

Moved and supported that the names as found in the Ministerial Directory be granted license as either licensed ministers or licensed deaconesses.

Report of the Auditing Committee accepted.

Special song by the Brown sisters.

Brother Goodman from Ohio District introduced to the Assembly.

Report of District Treasurer read and accepted.

Report of Ways and Means Committee:

Moved and supported that Nos. 1, 2, 6 and 7 as found in last year's minutes be dropped.

Nos. 1, 2 and 3 accepted.

Moved and accepted that the balance necessary to cover General Assembly expense be prolated among the different churches, and to be raised by August 31st.

Assembly recessed until 5:00 P. M.

Reconvened at 5:00 P. M. for ordination service.

Moved and supported that the unapproved portion of the minutes be approved by the Council.

Moved and supported that the Council write words of appreciation and thanks to Almighty God for His presence in the Assembly, and to be spread on the minutes.
