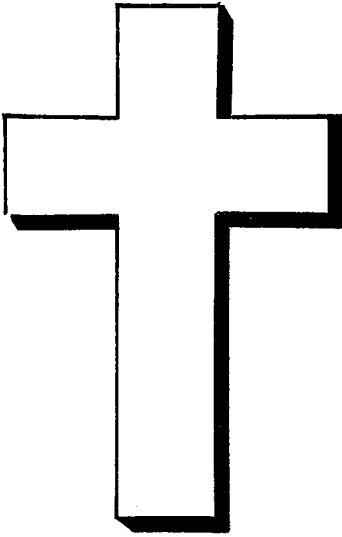

FIRST SESSION, 7:30 P.M.—7-6-66

Our Beloved District Superintendent, Rev. Richard T. Powell, first introduced all the new ministers of the district, and then asked that the congregation stand in a few moments of silent prayer. Then Brother Powell led in prayer of invocation. Rev. Jackson led the congregation in singing, "Satisfied" and "He Abides." Rev. W. N. Miller, new Secretary of Church Extension, led in prayer. Greetings were brought by the host pastor on behalf of the Fort Worth Church. The District Superintendent responded, and called for a liberal offering to help defray the costs of the conference. Rev. & Mrs. Timothy Rovenstine sang a special song.

The Superintendent presented our new General Superintendent, Rev. J. D. Abbott, who brought a very inspiring and timely message using for a basis, Ephesians 5:25-27 and Acts 2:1-4, and directing our thoughts to the facts that God intended the church to be a Spirit-filled organization, to be a missionary organization, a praying organization, a united organization, a giving organization, and a glorious organization. It was a wonderful keynote to start our conference, so ably presided over by Rev. Abbott, who was so recently elected as General Superintendent.

The Conference sang "A Charge to Keep." Brother Banz, from Dallas, prayed the benediction.

SECOND SESSION

The first business session convened at 9 A.M., and Brother Powell requested Brother Rovenstine, new pastor at Corpus Christi, to lead the devotional singing. The congregation of ministers and delegates sang, "More About Jesus," and "Tell It To Jesus." Sister Powell was requested to sing "He Giveth More Grace," which she did with feeling, bringing blessing upon the conference. With a spontaneous agreement, we all took up the refrain "What a Friend We Have in Jesus." Brother Zamarron was requested to lead in prayer in his native language.

Rev. Powell introduced Rev. W. N. Miller, our new General Secretary of Church Extension, who made a few appropriate remarks, requesting the personal privilege of being brief for the moment, noting that he was the announced speaker for the evening service. Brother Miller then again presented the chairman for the conference, our new General Superintendent, Rev. J. D. Abbott. Brother Abbott spoke devotionally using as a basis I Timothy 1:11. Coining a new meaning to an old word, Rev. Abbott indicated that we should have an "effervescence" to do the work at hand, an unflagging enthusiasm for the work God has called us to do in the church. He directed our thoughts to the facts that we are trustees of the Truth, for our own age and time, for the future, and for our children.

The Secretary called the roll. Brother Powell made the motion that the conference bar should consist of the first three pews on each side of the church and the platform. The motion carried, and all members of the conference were requested to come within the conference bar.

The Secretary reported that the District Council had received Transfers from other Districts, and approved the seating of the following ministers as members of the Conference: Rev. Harold Crosser as an Ordained Minister and Rev. Richard J. Hawkins as a Licensed Minister from Arizona; Rev. Richard C. Hawkins as an Ordained Minister from Northern Indiana; and Rev. Timothy Rovenstine as a Licensed Minister from Kansas, (R. J. Hawkins, pending receipt of Transfer). The motion prevailed to accept these men as recommended, and those present were, together with their spouses, introduced to the conference: Brother and Sister Rovenstine and Brother and Sister Hawkins, pastors at Corpus Christi and Houston, respectively. It was noted that both of (see copy furnished) these couples were second generation Pilgrims, and all were children of Pilgrim ministers.

The hours of the sessions were set: 9-12 A.M., 2:30 to completion of business in the afternoon, and the evening service at 7:30.

The report of the District Superintendent was called for, which Brother Powell read. A motion prevailed to accept this report with gratitude.

The Chairman called for the report of the Auditing Committee, which was given, and accepted.

The chairman called for the report of the District Treasurer, and in the absence of Brother Dillingham, the District Superintendent read the Treasurer's Report. The motion prevailed to accept it.

The statistician's report was read and accepted.

Brother Powell moved that this conference by a rising vote of thanks show its appreciation to Rev. William Jackson for his leadership in the District Youth work and in the Youth Camp; and to his wife, Mrs. Jackson, for her leadership and dedication to the task of directing the Christian Youth Crusaders on the District. The motion was adopted.

The Chairman requested the conference to show by a rising vote of thanks, and insert into the minutes, its appreciation for the work of the Statistician, and the District Superintendent and his wife, who helped compile and prepare these fine reports.

The report of the Educational and Examining Board was read by the secretary and the motion prevailed to approve this report with its recommendations.

The District Director of the Christian Youth Crusaders gave her report, and the motion prevailed to receive the report and spread it in the minutes.

The chairman declared that the next order of business was the election of officers of the district. Rev. Miller, Secretary of Church Extension, was asked to read the appointments by the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. They were as follows:

District Superintendent, Rev. Richard T. Powell

District Secretary, Rev. S. Allen Thomas

District Treasurer, Mr. Thomas Dillingham

The conference was then instructed to prepare its ballots for the two advisory members of the District Council. The Superintendent was requested to appoint tellers, and he appointed R. J. Hawkins, J. T. Rovenstine, and Joe Aguilar.

Rev. William Jackson was elected as one of the Advisory Members of the Council on the first ballot. On the Fourth ballot, Rev. R. J. Hawkins was elected the other member.

The Chairman declared that the Conference was adjourned for lunch by expiration of time. Rev. Miller was asked to pray the benediction.

THIRD SESSION

The afternoon session was called to order about 2:30 P.M., and was immediately recessed for the taking of pictures by the photographer. After the pictures were taken, Chairman Abbott again called the conference to order.

The report of the Committee on Memoirs was read, and the motion prevailed to accept the same. The conference stood for a few moments of silent prayer, and then our District Superintendent led the prayer.

An additional report by the Educational and Examining Board was approved by the conference.

The District Council reported through the secretary that the following were nominated for the vacancy on the Educational and Examining Board: Rev. William Jackson and Rev. Allen Thomas. Rev. William Jackson was elected to serve for three years.

It was called to the Chairman's attention that the District Trustees are the members of the District Council.

The Superintendent asked the Secretary to read the appointments by the District Superintendent of the Sunday School Promotional Secretary, the District Youth President, the District Director of the Christian Youth Crusaders, and the members of the various Committees.

The District Superintendent proposed the pledging of the Conference to pay 100% of the United Stewardship Fund, which was raised by the International Conference from \$8.00 per member to \$9.50 per member. The Conference endorsed this proposal.

The motion was made by Brother Powell that in view of the action just taken, that the District Assessment be continued at \$2.00 per month per member, or \$24.00 per year per member, and that this shall be used first to pay the full United Stewardship Fund of \$9.50 per member, secondly, to place \$1.00 per member in the General Conference Reserve Fund, and the remaining \$13.50 shall be used by the District as deemed necessary, providing that the Central Pilgrim College shall be permitted to come onto the District to raise offerings, but shall not be included in the assessment. This motion was brought to the conference supported by the Council. After some discussion the motion carried.

This District Superintendent presented his pastoral proposal on "Waging War", which has become an annual plan for expansion. This plan received the full support of the conference.

The District Council was authorized to approve the reading of the minutes of the Conference.

A CHALLENGING RESOLUTION PASSED BY THE 1966 CONFERENCE

Our General Superintendent, Rev. J. D. Abbott, presented a theme on "Spiritual Life", recalling the emphasis of the recent International Conference, and suggested that this conference set up definite goals for deepening the Spiritual Life of the church. The following resolution was passed: In the light of the emphasis of the 1966 International Conference on the matter of deepening the spiritual life of our people, and, Whereas we are convinced that to accomplish the task of evangelizing the lost of our time, a pre-requisite is an increased emphasis upon individual commitment of our people to Christ and a closer walk with Him; Therefore be it resolved that we pledge ourselves to those practices which will enable us to accomplish this goal by:

1. Spending more time with the Word, and continuing other reading of the best Christian literature.
2. Maintaining a deepened and more significant prayer life.
3. Maintaining a regular family altar, with no irregularity allowed.
4. Daily witnessing through life and word, and urging more regular attendance at weekly prayer services.

Any unfinished business was committed to the District Council.

The Resolutions Committee reported, and its miscellaneous resolutions carried.

The General Superintendent and the General Secretary of Church Extension each expressed appreciation for the consideration shown them by the Conference.

It was moved that we adjourn. The Conference joined in singing "Jesus Is the Sweetest Name I Know." Brother Powell dismissed us with prayer.

FOURTH SESSION

The evening service was begun as Brother Rovenstine led the congregation in singing "A Child of the King," and "Amazing Grace." Brother Tucker led in prayer. The Texas Trio (composed of Mrs. Jackson, Mrs. Rovenstine, and Mrs. Hawkins) sang, "It Took a Miracle." After receiving the offering Brother Powell called for another special song, and the Rovenstines and Hawkinses sang "When I Said 'Yes' to Jesus."

Rev. & Mrs. William Jackson presented their baby Paul Douglas to be dedicated, and Brother Abbott, Brother Miller, and Brother Powell participated in this ceremony.

Rev. & Mrs. Powell sang "Take Up Thy Cross." Brother Powell then intro-

duced Rev. W. N. Miller, who brought a very challenging message to climax the conference, based on Matthew 4:18-22, "Fishers of Men." It was a fitting close to a wonderful conference.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

We extend a real Southwestern welcome to Reverend J. D. Abbott, our General Superintendent and Reverend W. N. Miller, our General Secretary of Church Extension. May we be as much a blessing to you as we know you will be to us in the Lord.

To all our wonderful pastors and their wives, to our fine laymen and friends of the Texas District, we greet you in the Name of our Saviour.

Throughout our entire church there cannot be found a more dedicated ministry than that of the men right here. We know that many of you labor in shops, schools and elsewhere, to keep the church doors open. If it were not for men like this our church would never have grown as it has. We pray God will bless every one of you and reward you richly.

We are living and working in a world that is confronted with many problems. There is unrest and dissatisfaction among men in the political realm over Viet Nam, — battles are raging over the agriculture program, — the Medical profession is in conflict, — rights, — freedoms and liberty, — all these pose many questions. The "Intellectuals" of our world are groping and searching for answers. The enormity of knowledge already attained is almost overwhelming. Still so many people are trying to find an anchor and a reason for living. The Pilgrim Holiness Church, OUR CHURCH, proclaims the Gospel of Jesus Christ and it is He who has the answer to the needs of this world. Let us rise up and announce in tones loud and clear, "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever."

The progress of the church cannot be judged rightly by any set of figures or charts. These are a good gauge for showing some of our accomplishments. The most important thing is to be sure that we are proclaiming a Gospel that makes men free. Jesus said, "If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed." (Jno. 8:36) This Gospel makes us free from sin, — free from worldliness, with all its evils and disress. We will also be free from legalism and its accompanying lethargy and bondage. There will be a holy love that will make our churches soul saving stations. I pray that we may be so moved upon by the Holy Spirit that there will be a humbling of the church until revival fires will fall.

There are a few discouraging things to report in our district this year but there are also some very bright spots. This is the first year on record that every church in the district participated in every District and General Church Program. The following comparative figures will give you some of the highlights:—

This spirit of co-operation is also reflected in the giving to World Missions, Church Extension, School and District projects.

Our Sunday Schools are almost 100% in the purchasing of Pilgrim literature. The district records show that we have a total of 75 member families. The Ad-

vocate is going into 63 homes. We have 29 member families in our Latin-American work and 20 copies of the Peregrino (Spanish paper published in Mexico for Pilgrims) is being placed in these homes. We must not let up on our teaching and preaching of holiness. This can also be done through our publications.

We Pilgrims must review the goals set forth for this quadrennium and then go forth by the help of our God to not only reach them but to go beyond. According to the Secretary of State, Mr. Waggoner Carr, Texas had a growth in population of 12% last year. We lost 9 members from our rolls. What is the cause? Can it be that we are not contacting enough people through Personal Evangelism? Have we lost the VISION? The Word of God says, "Where there is no vision, the people perish." The answer to these questions can only be found in us. May God help us to be honest with ourselves and rise to meet this great challenge.

This has been a very busy year but it has been filled with many blessings and joys. It has been a pleasure to labor with the council you have given me. The Texas District is blessed and I know all of us are indeed grateful for the untiring labors of love given by Brother S. Allen Thomas, District Secretary and Brother Thomas Dillingham our District Treasurer. Our thanks go also to Brother Leroy Birnbrook, Sunday School Executive Secretary, for efficiently handling the Sunday School promotional programs. We owe a debt of gratitude to Brother and Sister William Jackson, District Youth President and C. Y. C. Director. I'm sure none of us will forget our first District Youth Comp. Many of you here helped them to make it a success. For this we are indeed grateful.

I give personal thanks to our pastors and their wives for the many kindnesses and gracious hospitality to us during this past year. A hearty "thank you" too, to our wonderful laymen who have stood by our churches and pastors with their presence at the services, their finance and hours of labor. May God bless you one and all. As we return to our churches and fields of labor let us re-dedicate our lives to Christ and His Kingdom and may we give to our people the kind of leadership that comes from the heart of strong men, — faithful men, — men who are obedient to the heavenly vvision.

REPORT OF THE CONFERENCE ACTION COMMITTEE

1. Resolved, that the Resolutions Committee and the Ways & Means Committee shall be combined into one committee called the "Conference Action Committee."

2. Resolved, that the Total Budgets, including District and General, shall be No. 2.00 per month per member, or a total of \$24.00 per year per member. This shall be used to, firstly, pay the entire United Stewardship Fund of \$9.50 per member; secondly, to place \$1.00 per member in the International Conference Reserve Fund; and the remaining \$13.50 shall be used by the District as deemed necessary by the District Superintendent and/or District Council. It is provided that the Central Pilgrim College shall be permitted to raise offerings in our churches, but shall not be included in the District Assessment.

3. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall meet with each pastor and/or Church Board to help set up a program to raise the budgets of \$2.00 per month per member.

4. We recommend that the District pay \$50.00 monthly on the salary of the District Superintendent.

5. We recommend that the Phone and utility bills of the District Superintendent be paid by the District.

6. We recommend that the District pay any mailing or traveling expense authorized by the District Superintendent.

7. We recommend that each pastor, upon receipt of the District Minutes take a Sunday Morning to read and discuss with the church congregation all the actions of the District Conference pertaining to the local church, and that in the same service a special offering shall be taken equal to 50¢ per member family, same to be sent to the District Treasurer and applied to that church's budgets.

8. We recommend that the annual business of the church be closed on April 30th. We also recommend that the District Treasurer's books be closed on May 10th and that each church send all District funds to the District Treasurer before May 10th.

9. We recommend that a Worker's Convention be held during the year, the time and place to be agreed upon by the District Superintendent, the General Secretary of Church Extension, and the District Council.

10. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and the Editorial Committee print and mail to each pastor a District Paper at least once each quarter, preferably monthly. This shall contain the monthly Sunday School report, the Quarterly report of the District Treasurer, which latter shall list the amounts paid by each church on the total budgets.

11. We recommend that each church set aside one service each month as a time for bringing donations to the pastor, announced by a deacon or deaconess of the local church. (See Manual, Page 28, Sec. 50.)

12. We recommend that the location of the churches and parsonages appear in the minutes. We further recommend that where the parsonages are equipped with telephones, the name of the pastor and the church name be listed in the telephone directory, and that the phone number appear in the District Minutes.

13. Be it resolved that the churches of the Texas District shall be Zoned as follows: Zone I, Corpus Christi, Houston, Lyford, Raymondville, San Antonio, and Sebastian; Zone II, Fort Worth and Hillsboro; Zone III, Borger and Dalhart.

14. Be it resolved that no church or church group in this District shall build or cause to be built any structure or improvement exceeding a cost of \$100.00, without the authorization of the District Superintendent.

15. Be it resolved that the Texas District shall have a Youth Camp in 1967; the details shall be worked out by the District Superintendent with the cooperation of the Youth President and the C.Y.C. Director; a report of plans shall be given in the District Paper by December 1966, which shall include announcement of time, place, cost, and other information that will be needed, so that each person planning to go will have time to prepare for the necessary expenses.

16. We recommend that there be a Sunday School Promotional Secretary. We further recommend that each pastor send him a report on Monday following the last Sunday of each month, on the report cards provided, which report shall include the average Sunday School attendance, and as the Rally Day Offering, Self Denial Offering, Easter Offering, Bible School Offering, etc.

CONFERENCE

1. We recommend that each pastor shall see that the yearly reports be in the hands of the Statistician by May 10h.
2. We recommend that each pastor report in full each month by the 10th, to the District Superintendent, on blanks provided by the Superintendent.
3. We recommend that each pastor shall be granted a two week's vacation with pay.
4. We recommend that immediately following the Conference the District Treasurer shall mail to each pastor an itemized notice of the financial responsibilities of his church to the District for the year, giving the address of the District Treasurer.

MISCELLANEOUS

1. Whereas Almighty God has been with us on our District, and has permitted us to enjoy another Conference; therefore be it resolved that we express our appreciation to God by standing and singing the Doxology.
2. Whereas our newly elected General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Rev. J. D. Abbott, has given unstintingly of his time and efforts to make our Conference a success, therefore be it resolved that we show our appreciation to him by standing and saying, "God Bless You."
3. Whereas our newly elected General Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. W. N. Miller, has been present in this Conference, and has pledged to give his best efforts in leading the Department of Church Extension, therefore be it resolved that we express our whole-hearted support to him by standing.
4. Be it resolved that this Conference express its appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. Richard T. Powell, and his wife, for their untiring and inspiring efforts in leading our district, and that they be according a rising vote of thanks and a hearty, "Amen."
5. Since our efficient District Secretary, Rev. S. Allen Thomas, has served faithfully another year; therefore be it resolved that we express our sincere appreciation by a rising vote of thanks.
6. Be it resolved that this Conference show its heartfelt appreciation to our efficient and faithful District Treasurer, Mr. Thomas Dillingham, who is absent this Conference, by instructing the District Secretary to send him a letter of appreciation.
7. Be it resolved that the local church be accorded our appreciation for the entertainment enjoyed by this Conference, and for their efforts to properly house us, and that the District Treasurer be authorized to reimburse the local church that which it cost financially.
