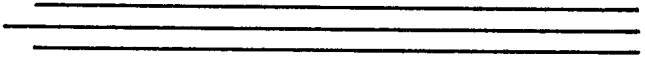
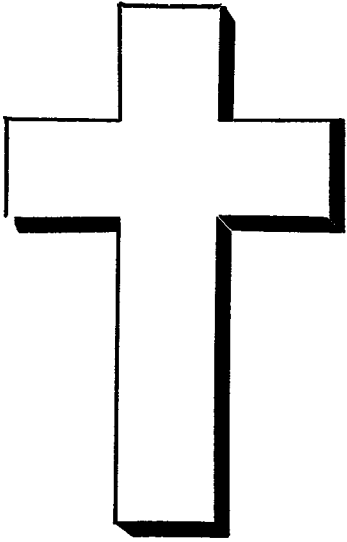

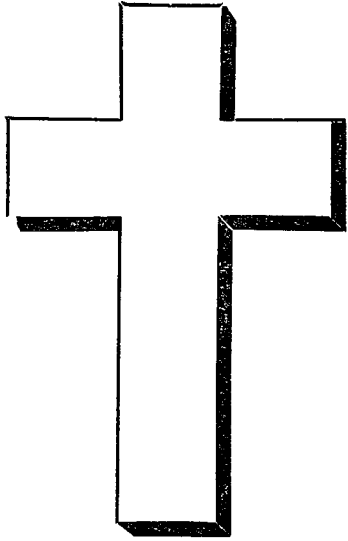

FIRST SESSION, 7:30 P. M., June 4, 1968

The eighteenth annual conference of the Texas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 7:30 P.M., Tuesday June 4th in the First Church at 1009 Maxey Road, Houston, Texas. Rev. Richard T. Powell, District Superintendent, opened the conference with warm words of welcome and brought greetings on behalf of the local church of which he is also pastor. The Rev. R. G. Rhoades, pastor of the Houston Wesleyan Methodist Church was welcomed to the conference along with a delegation from his church. In the light of the coming merger and the need to know each other better the district superintendent asked that we take three minutes to move about and get acquainted with one another.

Rev. Timothy Rovenstine led the congregation in singing "The Solid Rock" and "All The Way My Saviour Leads." Rev. Rhoades led in prayer. Mrs. Donna Doolan from the local church favored us with a special song, "The Lord is My Shepherd." After the offering the delegation from the Spanish speaking churches sang, "At the Cross" in Spanish. Rev. and Mrs. Rovenstine then sang, "Jesus, Use Me."

Brother Powell introduced Rev. J. D. Abbott, our General Superintendent, and the Conference stood in recognition of our leader. Brother Abbott spent several minutes giving some details of the Merging General Conference, speaking of the "Keys of Unity." His message of the evening was based on the scripture found in Galatians 2:9, "James, Cephas, and John, who seemed to be pillars in the church." He stated that we need all kinds of men in the church for pillars. He closed his message with this challenging question, "Will you be a pillar in the church?"

SECOND SESSION, 10:00 A.M., JUNE 5, 1968

The first business session of this conference was called to order at 10:00 A.M. Brother Rovenstine led in singing, "It Is Mine" and "Showers of Blessing." Rev. Powell called for prayer for our Country, Church and District, in view of the tragic events during the past few hours, in which Senator Robert Kennedy was shot. He also requested prayer for our General Denomination and the Merging Conference which will be held in Anderson, Indiana in just three weeks. Brother Allen Thomas led in prayer. Brother Powell then introduced the chairman of this Conference, General Superintendent, Rev. J. D. Abbott, also making presentation of two lovely vases of flowers donated by the local church, one for Rev. and Mrs. Abbott and the other for Rev. and Mrs. W. N. Miller General Secretary of Church Extension, the Department under which the Texas District operates.

Brother Abbott based his remarks to the conference on II Thessalonians 3:1, stating that there is always a frontier for the church while there are prayerful hearts, open eyes, and willing hands. He mentioned that our principal concern should be others. That we have a "Holy Merchandise" to distribute, that the Gospel is unfettered, that there will be a "Redemptive Triumph", while we have an earnest solicitation and an inner confidence.

The sitting was called to order followed by the roll call. Brother Rovenstine moved that the Conference Bar be the first three pews on the Conference Delegates' right and the front of the church. The motion carried and ministers and delegates were instructed to move within the Bar.

The hours of sessions were set as follows: 10:00 to 11:50 A.M., 1:45 to end of business at hand, and the Ordination Service at 7:30 P.M.

Rev. Isidoro Hernandez was introduced to the Conference. He is transferring from the Central District of Mexico to become the pastor at Raymondville after August first.

The report of the District Superintendent was read and accepted with appreciation for the leadership given by Brother Powell. The superintendent then gave an additional verbal report.

The pastors at Corpus Christi and Dalhart, namely, Rev. Rovenstine and Rev. Nettleton, were publicly commended by the General Superintendent, Rev. J. D. Abbott, for having attained Three Star status under the Board of General Superintendents' recognition for having paid in full the amount assigned them of the United Stewardship Fund. He informed them their certificates of recognition will be mailed within a few days.

Sister Rovenstine gave a C. Y. C. report from Corpus Christi as follows: "The C. Y. C. group of Corpus Christi, Texas was a real asset to our church. We had an enrollment of 20 with an average weekly attendance of 12. The Heralds had an enrollment of 10 but an average attendance of 12. There were 11 awards given at the Honor Council on May 26, 1968. The Cadets had an enrollment of 10 and average attendance of 12. There were 30 pin awards presented at the Honor Council. The C. Y. C.'ers of the year were Gloria Sanchez of the Heralds and Oscar Sanchez of the Cadets. The local Missionary Society donated several sashes for the Honor Council. For this we are grateful. Our two assistants, Mrs. Farr and Mrs. Sanchez, did so very much to help make the C. Y. C. a success. We praise the Lord for the gains in each child's life. We pray they may always remember what they have learned and grow up to serve Jesus."

The above report was accepted with appreciation. The District Superintendent, in the absence of the Youth President, gave a verbal report of the success of the District Youth Camp, stating that there were 67 registered at the Camp, that the greatest moments of the camp were those spent around the altar praying with the young people who sought the Lord.

The Educational and Examining Board Report was read and approved as read. It was subsequently announced that the Ordination of the two candidates to the ministry and the four candidates as Deaconesses would be conducted in the evening service.

We adjourned by expiration of time. Rev. Nettleton dismissed us with prayer.

THIRD SESSION, 1:45 P. M., June 5, 1968

The third sitting of the Conference was called to order with Brother Rovenstine leading in the singing of "The Cross Is Not Greater." We then stood while Mr. Charles Ward, the lay-delegate from Houston led us in prayer.

Rev. J. D. Abbott, General Superintendent introduced Mrs. Nellie Soltero to the conference. Mrs. Soltero, the wife of Rev. F. H. Soltero, Field Superintendent of the Pilgrim Missionary Work in Mexico and Peru, was given the opportunity to address the conference and bring greetings from Rev. Soltero.

A motion prevailed to grant an honorary seat within the Conference Bar to Sister Soltero.

The Auditing Committee Report was read and accepted.

The Treasurer's Report was read by the District Secretary in the absence of the District Treasurer. It was accepted.

It was moved and seconded that the secretary send a telegram to the Treasurer, Mr. Thomas Dillingham, expressing the love and interest of the Conference at this time of the illness of his wife. Carried.

A motion prevailed to authorize the Secretary to send a telegram to Brother Reed of Corpus Christi expressing our regrets that due to illness he was unable to meet with us this year. We recognize he has attended almost all the conferences since Texas became a District.

The Statistical Reports were read, and accepted.

The Conference Action Committee reported. Resolutions numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 10, 12, 13, and 15, were passed as read.

Resolution number 7 was read. It was amended to insert the word "Family" after "member", making it "per member-family." It was again amended to substitute \$1.00 for 50¢, making it read, as amended (part b) "and each local treasurer shall be authorized to send a sum equal to \$1.00 per member-family, plus a free-will offering to the District Treasurer to pay for the printing of the minutes. The motion, as amended, carried.

Resolutions numbered 9, 11, and 14, as recommended by the Conference Action Committee, were approved.

The District Superintendent read a resolution presented by the Comitty Committee of the Texas District, the Central District, both of the Pilgrim Holiness Church and the Oklahoma-Texas District of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. The resolution follows:

"Minutes of the meeting of the Superintendents of the Central and Texas Districts of the Pilgrim Holiness Church and the President of the Oklahoma-Texas District of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, Enid, Oklahoma, May 2, 1968.

There are many problems inherent to the merger of the Pilgrim Holiness Church and the Wesleyan Methodist Church. Some of these cannot be solved quickly, therefore, we make the following recommendations:—

A

The Oklahoma-Texas District shall include all of the State of Texas and that part of the State of Oklahoma that lies West of U. S. Highway 75 which runs from Colbert in the South to Dewey in the North. With the exception that all cities, towns and villages on said boundary line, to the extent of their present corporation limits shall be a part of the Arkansas-Missouri District.

B

The Arkansas-Missouri District shall include all of Arkansas and Missouri, and that part of the State of Oklahoma that lies East of U. S. Highway 75 that runs from Colbert in the South to Dewey in the North. All cities, towns and villages on said boundary line, to the extent of their present corporation limits shall be a part of the Arkansas-Missouri District.

C

We recommend; that all deeds and legal details shall be handled by the present existing conferences and superintendents of these three Wesleyan and Pilgrim Districts; That there be a merging conference of each new District in the summer of 1969; The date and place to be set by the Councils of each area involved."

"Signed, Richard T. Powell, Sec'y"

It was moved to recommend this action to the new Board of Administration of the Wesleyan Church, for adoption immediately after the merger of the Denominations, or, as soon as feasible thereafter. The motion carried unanimously.

General Superintendent Abbott announced that the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has appointed the following officials of the District:

District Superintendent, Reverend Richard T. Powell

District Secretary, Reverend S. Allen Thomas

District Treasurer, Mr. Thomas Dillingham

The pastor of the Lyford Church presented a letter of appreciation to Brother Powell. A motion prevailed to record it in the minutes. It follows:

The Miscellaneous Resolutions were read, approved, and executed.

The Motion prevailed to refer the reading of the Conference Minutes and any other matters that may have been overlooked to the District Council for action.

The report of the Memoirs Committee was given. The Conference stood in memory of the departed, and there was a short period of silent prayer. Rev. Rovenstine then prayed, requesting that God would bless to our hearts the memory of these saints, and that we, like them, will be empowered to live the life of an overcomer.

The Conference was formally adjourned, and dismissed with prayer by Sister Soltero.

FOURTH SESSION, 7:30 P. M., JUNE 5, 1968

The Ordination Service was opened with Rev. Richard T. Powell, District Superintendent, leading in singing, "A Charge To Keep." Rev. Herman Nettleton offered prayer. Brother Powell again led us in singing, "Rock of Ages." Sister Powell rendered a vocal solo, "Take My Life, and Let It Be." Rev. S. Allen Thomas read I Timothy, chapter 3. II Timothy chapter 4, verses 1 through 8 was read in Spanish by Rev. Josue Zamarron and Mrs. Nellie Soltero read Titus, chapter 3, verses 1 through 11.

Rev. Powell then presented the candidates to Rev. J. D. Abbott, certifying that the following had fulfilled the requirements necessary for ordination: Rev. Timothy Rovenstine and Rev. Isidoro Hernandez, for ordination as Ministers; Mrs. Elodia Hernandez, Mrs. Roberta Rovenstine, Mrs. Debora Zamarron and Mrs. Florence Thomas, for ordination as Deaconesses.

Rev. Abbott took note of the fact that this was a unique service, in that three of the candidates had completed their training in the Bible Institute at Valles, Mexico, under the supervision of Rev. and Mrs. Soltero, of the World Missions Department; and, in effect, this was missionary work in reverse. In view of this fact, Mrs. Soltero, representing Rev. Soltero, was given the opportunity to speak to those candidates in Spanish. She charged them to be faithful to their ministry.

Rev. J. D. Abbott then addressed the candidates. The theme of his message was, "A Distinguished Service Record," using as a basis Paul's own testimony as recorded in Acts 20:13 - 27. At the close of an excellent message, Rev. Abbott requested the candidates to kneel at the altar, and the Ordination Council consisting of Rev. Abbott, Rev. Powell, Rev. Nettleton, Rev. Zamarron, Mrs. Soltero and Rev. Thomas, laid hands on the candidates, ordaining the men to the ministry and the ladies as deaconesses.

After singing the Doxology, the candidates were congratulated by the congregation, and the service was closed with the dismissal prayer by Mr. Charles Ward.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To our General Superintendent, Reverend J. D. Abbott, Fellow Ministers, Delegates and friends of the eighteenth annual Conference of the Texas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Greetings in the Name of our Wonderful Saviour.

You can travel from district to district, and from church to church but there is no place that you will find a more dedicated and loyal group of Pilgrim ministers and their wives than right here in Texas. It is through the tears, hard work and sacrifice of men and women like these that the real church is built. No church nor people is any stronger or more spiritual than the leaders. May God bless you all in my earnest prayer.

The Laymen of Texas are in a class by themselves. To my knowledge without exception, they have stood by their pastors and the programs as outlined for their church. The District and General Church interests are also

a part of their dedication and love. All of the churches purchase their Sunday School literature from our headquarters. Our Pilgrim homes have two books that are read, loved and followed, namely, the Bible and the Church Manual. Our laymen are not legalists but inquiring and loving christians. I predict that these local leaders will soon see the desire of their hearts in a strong district here in Texas.

The church at Dalhart has shown good growth this year. They have seen several fine young men pray through. Some that Brother and Sister Nettleton have worked with for years are now attending and supporting the church, The Sunday School is the largest since 1959. This is good progress. They have paid all District and General Budgets.

Hillsboro started out with a good spirit at the beginning of this year but like so many other places, the enemy got in and the pastor left in mid-year. These dear people have been through so much. We pray God will send them a pastor who will be able to lead them to greater victory.

The Corpus Christi church has had a good year. The church was painted outside, and the parsonage was painted. New siding was installed on the back of the Educational unit. The new doors on the church have certainly changed the appearance of the building. Brother and Sister Rovenstine have a growing C. Y. C. Their Sunday School has the highest average since 1959. All budgets have been paid in full. We pray God will bless these young people as they move into another field.

Houston has had a good gain in spite of all the forces that have been arrayed against her. This year the inside of the church and some of the Sunday School rooms have been redecorated. New lights were installed over the pulpit and in the vestibule. New stained glass was also installed in all the windows in the sanctuary. Just recently a new porch replaced the old one at the front of the church. All bills are paid in full with the exception of monies owed to the General Church. There was a good increase in the Sunday School average and a spirit of revival is in the church.

Raymondville has had a rough year. First came the hurricane and flood which added much extra work for Brother and Sister Thomas but they have led their people to new horizons of faith and a deepening of their spiritual life. This year a new lighted sign was installed, new vinyl flooring was laid in the church and all the pews refinished. The work here is in a good spiritual place for growth. Brother Thomas, the faithful pastor has resigned after almost fifteen years. They have built well and we trust God's richest blessings will be their's as they go into new areas of labor.

The church at Lyford has had a wonderful growth this year. They have finished their new church and dedicated it. Then last fall the hurricane hit the old church and parsonage with such fury that it had to be replaced. God, who answers prayer, saw our need and sent in enough money to replace this building with a new three bedroom parsonage. This was dedicated in April with only an added increase of indebtedness of \$500.00. For all of this we Praise the Lord. Brother Zamarron has led his people to first place in the March to Sunday School contest in his division. We predict great days ahead for this pastor and people.

We wish to express our deep appreciation and gratitude to all who have helped us so much during these five years of labor in Texas. It has been a pleasure to work with men like Brother Dillingham, our District Treasurer and Brother Thomas our Secretary. Sister Powell and I feel very unworthy of the many kindnesses bestowed upon us and the gifts we have received. We know God will richly reward you one and all.

To our loyal Pilgrims I say, "Let us lift up our eyes, gird our loins and press the battle for souls and new churches. In the coming merged church there will be greater opportunities and a wider field of labor. May we not look back — except to see where we have been that we may gain courage to press forward to new frontiers that are to be conquered through the Grace of our Wonderful Lord."

Note is herewith made of the following actions of the District Council: Rev. Harold Crosser was transferred to the Michigan Dist. of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, Rev. & Mrs. H. A. Downing were transferred to the Rocky Mountain District, Rev. Joseph Jackson was transferred to the Michigan District, and Rev. & Mrs. Garland Tucker were transferred to the Florida District. Rev. Schauner P. Vance has not responded to any letters, and a registered letter sent to his last known address was returned marked, "Unknown", therefore, we are dropping his name from our roll.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON MEMOIRS

During the past year three of our faithful Godly members left their temples of clay to go to be with their Lord. These were all dearly loved, and were outstanding in their services in the Pilgrim Holiness Church in Texas.

Sister Onie Reed, born in 1872 in Tipton, Indiana, passed away May 12, 1967 in a Corpus Christi Convalescent home. She was a charter member of the First Pilgrim Church at Corpus Christi. Her conversion pre-dated her marriage. All her Christian life she was a "prayer Warrior." Her faith was in the Lord and we feel assured that we will meet her in glory.

Sister Jesusa Gutierrez died January 5, 1968. She was one of our best and most faithful members in the Lyford Church. Her death came so suddenly and even though she has been gone six months, she still lives in the hearts of the other members. We pray that the Lord will give us more members like her.

Sister Pearl Ward, a charter member of the Houston Pilgrim Church departed this life at her home on April 6, 1968. Practically all of her life was given in faithful service to her God, her church and her family. She was first affiliated with the Pilgrim Holiness Church at Delphi, Indiana. She will be greatly missed by her family, friends and her church.

REPORT OF THE CONFERENCE ACTION COMMITTEE

1. Resolved, that the Resolutions Committee and the Ways & Means Committee shall be combined into one committee called the "Conference Action Committee."

2. Resolved, that the Total Budgets, including District and General, shall be \$2.00 per month per member, or a total of \$24.00 per year per member. This shall be used to, firstly pay the entire United Stewardship Fund of \$9.50 per member; secondly, to place \$1.00 per member in the International Conference Reserve Fund; and the remaining \$13.50 shall be used by the District as deemed necessary by the District Superintendent and/or District Council. It is provided that the Central Pilgrim College shall be permitted to raise offerings in our churches, but shall not be included in the District Assessment.

3. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall meet with each pastor and/or Church Board to help set up a program to raise the budgets of \$2.00 per month per member.

4. We recommend that the District pay \$50.00 monthly on the salary of the District Superintendent.

5. We recommend that the Phone and utility bills of the District Superintendent be paid by the District.

6. We recommend that the District pay any mailing or traveling expense authorized by the District Superintendent.

7. We recommend that each pastor, upon receipt of the District Minutes, take a Sunday Morning Service to read and discuss with the church congregation all the actions of the District Conference pertaining to the local church; and each local treasurer be authorized to send a sum equal to \$1.00 per member-family, plus a free-will offering to the District Treasurer to pay for the printing of the minutes.

8. We recommend that the annual business of the church be closed on April 30th. We also recommend that the District Treasurer's books be closed on May 10th and that each church send all District funds to the District Treasurer before May 10th.

9. We recommend that a Ministerial Convention be held during the year, including all Wesleyan and Pilgrim ministers, the time and place to be agreed upon by the District Superintendents, the Secretary of Church Extension and the District Councils.

10. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and the Editorial Committee print and mail to each pastor a District Paper at least once each quarter, preferable monthly. This shall contain the monthly Sunday School report, the Quarterly report of the District Treasurer, which latter shall list the amounts paid by each church on the total budgets.

11. We recommend that the District Superintendent on his visit to each church check with the deacons and/or deaconesses regarding the regularity of donations for the pastor. (See Manual page 38, Section 52.)

12. We recommend that the location of the churches and parsonages appear in the minutes. We further recommend that where the parsonages are equipped with telephones, the name of the pastor and the church name be listed in the telephone directory, and that the phone number appear in the District Minutes.

13. Be it resolved that no church or church group in this District shall build or cause to be built any structure or improvement exceeding a cost of \$100.00, without the authorization of the District Superintendent.

14. Resolved, that the Texas District shall have a Youth Camp in 1969. Details shall be worked out by the District Superintendent and the District Youth Officers.

15. We recommend that there be a Sunday School Promotional Secretary. We further recommend that each pastor send him a report on Monday following the last Sunday of each month, on the report cards provided, which report shall include the average Sunday School attendance, and the Rally Day Offering, Self Denial Offering, Easter Offering, Bible School Offering, etc.

MISCELLANEOUS

1. Whereas our General Superintendent, Rev. J. D. Abbott, has provided excellent leadership as Chairman of this Conference, therefore, be it resolved that we show him our appreciation for his time and efforts by standing and saying, "God bless you."
2. Be it resolved that this Conference express appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. Richard T. Powell, and his wife, for their untiring and inspiring efforts in leading our District, and that they be accorded a rising vote of thanks, and a hearty, "Amen."
3. Since our efficient District Secretary, Rev. S. Allen Thomas, has served faithfully another year; therefore, be it resolved that we express our sincere appreciation by a rising vote of thanks.
4. Be it resolved that this Conference show its heartfelt appreciation to our efficient and faithful District Treasurer, Mr. Thomas Dillingham, by standing and saying a hearty, "Amen."
5. Be it resolved that the local church be accorded our appreciation for the entertainment enjoyed by this Conference, and for their efforts to properly house us, and that the District Treasurer be authorized to reimburse the local church for any additional expenses involved.
6. Whereas Almighty God has been with us on our District, and has permitted us to enjoy another Conference; therefore, be it resolved that we express our appreciation to God by standing and singing the Doxology.

REPORT OF THE AUDITING COMMITTEE

We have examined the books of the District Treasurer, and have found them to be in a satisfactory condition. There is much proof that the Treasurer has given valuable time to the work involved.
