Minutes of the Sixth Annual Assembly Virginia

District

OF THE

PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

August 23-26, 1927.

The sixth annual assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Virginia District convened under the tabernacle at Roanoke, August 23, 1927, at 10:00 A. M., with the District Superintendent, Brother Butner in the chair.

Brother Butner read and commented on the Hundredth Psalm after which communion was administered. The presence and blessing of the Lord was very real during this service; some wept while others shouted and praised God.

Committee on Conference bar recommended the first three benches in the two middle sections. Amended to include the fourth bench also. Carried.

Motion made that Grace A. Schneider be given place and vote in the Conference. Carried.

Sister E. Phillippe was introduced to the Conference by Brother Butner and welcomed by the Assembly.

Sister R. G. Flexon was introduced by the Courtesy Committee and granted a seat in the Conference bar.

Motion made that the chair appoint the hours for the business sessions. Carried.

A. M. session: Devotional, 9:00 A. M.-9:30 A. M.

Business: 9:30 A. M.-12:00 A. M.

P. M. session: Business, 2:00 P. M.-4:30 P. M.

Motion made that a committee be appointed by the chair to set the order of business for the days of the conference. Carried. E. Phillippe, R. G. Flexon, C. H. Flexon appointed.

Motion made that no minister or delegate leave the conference until the end of last session unless excused from the conference floor and he resign from any committee on which he is serving that all committee work may be finished. Carried.

Moved that money be taken now to pay the balance for minutes of two years ago. Carried. \$14.00 raised on conference floor.

Meeting adjourned and dismissed by R. G. Flexon.

Second Session, Tuesday, August 23, 1927, 2 P. M.

Scripture lesson read by E. W. Lowry. Prayer offered by Sister E. Phillippe.

Roll call. Minutes of the morning session read and corrected.

Report of the order of the Day Committee, Ministers' and Church reports to be given Tuesday P. M. Election of officers Wednesday, at 9:30 A. M. Report accepted.

The District Superintendent, G. H. Butner, then read his report. Motion made that the District Superintendent's report be accepted and he be given a vote of thanks for his services as District Superintendent. Amendment offered that his report be spread on the District Minutes. Carried.

Sister J. H. Milby was then granted a seat in the Conference bar,

in consideration of her services in the District.

Motion made that the report of the new church be included in the District Superintendent's report. Carried.

The following pastor's reports were read and accepted: R. G. Flexon, C. H. Flexon, W. F. Jones, Mrs. W. C. Kirkman, E. W. Lowry, Mrs. E. W. Lowry, J. V. Roberts, E. I. Shemelia; with corrections, Lottie Gibson, E. Phillippe, Beatrice Van Vranken, Mrs. J. F. Short.

Motion made that Sister Schneider give report. Carried.

The following church Statistical and Financial reports were read and accepted: Staunton, Mineral, Streets, Bent Mountain, with corrections, Warm Springs.

Brother Tormohlen was then introduced by the Courtesy Committee and granted a seat in the conference bar.

Meeting adjourned. Benedicition by Brother Tormohlen.

Third Session, Wednesday A. M., August 24, 1927.

Devotional services led by Brother Lowry.

Prayer offered by Sister Gibson. Brother Tormohlen gave an encouraging and inspiring address from Isaiah 58.

Business session called at 10:15. Roll call. Minutes of the preceding session read and approved.

Motion made to set aside the order of the day because of resolutions affecting District officers. Carried.

The following reports were read and accepted: Richmond, Petersburg, Roanoke, East Radford, and an oral report of Biller's Crest.

Sunday School reports read and accepted: Staunton, Mineral, Streets, Bent Mountain, Richmond, Warm Springs, Petersburg, East Radford, Roanoke.

Foreign Missionary's report read by Sister Gibson and accepted.

District Treasurer's report read and accepted with the additional report of sums received since balancing books.

Church Extension report by Brother Roberts. Accepted.

Motion made that we hear Brother Kirkman's report. Report read and accepted with correction.

Meeting adjourned. Dismissed by E. I. Shemelia.

Fourth Session, Wednesday, August 24, 1927, at 2:00 P. M.

Devotional service led by Brother Jones. Roll call. Minutes read and approved.

The Resolutions' Committee submitted their report. Resolutions I-VIII read.

Resolutions I, II, III, and IV adopted.

Resolution V referred for redrafting.

Resolution VI carried.

Resolution VII lost.

Resolution VIII adopted.

Moved that we rescind action on resolution VI. Lost.

Moved that we reconsider action on Resolution VI. Lost.

Order of the Day called for election of officers. Ballots cast for District Superintendent, resulted in the election of G. H. Butner.

Brother R. G. Flexon was elected Assistant District Superintendent but declined the office.

Moved that his resignation be accepted and revote taken. Carried.

Four ballots were cast but no election.

Meeting adjourned by expiration of time. Dismissed by B. Van Vranken.

Fifth Session, Thursday, August 25, 1927, at 9:45 A. M.

Devotional service led by Mrs. J. H. Milby. E. Phillippe led in prayer, after which the women's quartet of Beulah Holiness Academy sang a special number. Brother Tormohlen then gave a helpful and instructive Bible reading.

Roll call omitted. Minutes of preceeding session read and approved.

Motion made that we rescind action on Brother Flexon's resignation, lay aside rules, and declare him by acclamation Assistant District Superintendent. Carried.

Motion made that we combine the offices of District Secretary and Treasurer. Carried.

Beatrice Van Vranken unanimously elected.

Motion made to vote for the four remaining members of the District Council on the same ballot and the four receiving a majority vote be declared elected. Lost.

Separate ballots were then cast for each of these members resulting in the election of W. F. Jones, D. B. Driver, J. V. Roberts, E. W. Lowry.

E. W. Lowry tendered resignation. Accepted.

Motion made to declare C. H. Flexon elected in his place by acclamation. Carried.

Brother Butner was re-elected on the Examining Board for another three year term.

Brother Lowry tendered his resignation from the Examining Board. Accepted. J. V. Roberts was elected to finish the unexpired term of two years left vacant by Brother Lowry's resignation.

Motion made that we elect a Missionary Board of three members, said Board to elect Secretary-Treasurer. Carried.

Motion made that the Board be appointed by the District Council. Carried.

Motion made that the District Council appoint the School Board. Carried.

Motion made that the District Trustees be re-elected by acclamation. Carried.

Report of Publication Committee read and accepted.

Motion made to extend the time ten minutes to raise the money for the publication of the minutes. Carried. \$43.10 raised in cash and pledges.

Meeting adjourned. Dismissed by J. V. Roberts.

Sixth Session, Thursday, August 25, 1927, 3 P. M.

Roll call omitted. Minutes of the preceeding meeting read and approved.

Examining Board report. We recommend E. Phillippe and Beatrice Van Vranken for ordination. Accepted.

The ordination service was announced as the first business of the afternoon session. Brother Tormohlen delivered the ordination charge, after which Brother R. G. Flexon led in prayer. The windows of heaven were opened and showers of blessing fell on the entire assembly.

Beulah Church and Sunday School reports read and accepted. School report read by Brother R. G. Flexon and accepted.

Motion made to extend the time one hour for the completion of business. Carried.

Examining Board recommends for renewal of license, Otis Bogan, Mrs. J. F. Short, Lottie Gibson. Accepted.

For Ordination: Garnett Phillippe. Granted.

For straight license: G. H. Knopp, and Mrs. E. Phillippe. Ratified.

Moved to receive Grace A. Schneider as a member of the Virginia Conference and that she get a letter of transfer from the Ohio District. Carried.

Resolutions Committee then offered resolution V, as revised. Accepted.

Motion made to remove District Camp and Assembly to Beulah. Carried.

Motion made to rescind action on Resolution I. Carried.

Auditing Committee report read and accepted as follows:

District Treasurer's Book, O. K.

Missionary Treasurer's Book, O. K.

Church Extension Book, O. K.

Beulah Bible School not O. K.'d because of various accounts not balanced. Signed, Grace A. Schneider, Ruth Lowry.

Moved that we omit report of the statistical Committee. Carried.

Offering of \$33.58 taken for the expenses of the District Assembly.

Motion made to recess for 15 minutes for District Council meeting and that we reconvene until business is finished. Carried.

Reconvened at 6:15 P. M.

Appointments read. All sang "Where He Leads Me I Will Follow."

The Resolutions Committee then offered courtesy resolutions IX, X, XI, XII, which were heartily received by the Assembly after which Brother Butner closed the Assembly with prayer.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE ASSEMBLY.

No. I. Be it resolved that we ask our churches for three dollars (\$3.00) per year per member; further, be it resolved that it be divided thus: 30% for District Superintendent, 25% for Home Mission work, 10% for incidental expenses, 35% for General Superintendent and church work. Lost.

No. II. Resolved, that each pastor of the District who will attend the camp for the entire ten days, shall receive twenty dollars (\$20.00) in cash, and board for their families during the Camp.

Be it further resolved that each church shall subscribe to the camp the amount ordinarily given to their pastors for the two weeks. Carried.

No. III. Be it resolved that the District Council outline the work of the District Superintendent and the District Secretary for the ensuing year. Carried.

No. IV. Resolved that each minister report to the Annual Assembly or furnish an acceptable excuse. If he or she fails to do this, it shall be deemed sufficient cause to withhold their license. Carried.

No. V. Resolved that the conference year close two weeks prior to the Assembly. Carried.

No. VI. Resolved, that since the spirit of this age is one of worldliness this conference shall hereafter recognize no one as a delegate, who, according to the discretion of the District Council, cannot measure up to the standards of the manual in life and dress. Carried.

No. VII. Be it resolved that each church advisory Board see to it that all names of preachers who are serving as pastors of other churches, be transferred to said churches. Lost.

No. VIII. Resolved, that the pledge card system adopted last year for the extension work in this District, be continued and that the District Secretary-Treasurer shall handle all correspondence and finance.

Further, be it resolved that the District Council be authorized

to advise, plan for, and control the work and workers through the year. Carried.

No. IX. In appreciation of the faithful, efficient and sacrificial labors of our Superintendent and Secretary, be it resolved, that we as an Assembly, express our thanks by a rising vote. Carried.

No. X. Resolved that this Assembly by a standing vote, express their hearty appreciation to the pastor and church for the hospitable entertainment during this meeting.

No. XI. Resolved, that this body express their gratitude to Brother Tormohlen for his presence and soul inspiring messages by a rising vote of thanks and a free will offering. Carried.

No. XII. Resolved, that this Assembly stand and sing "Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow," after which the Superintendent shall lead in prayer to express our praise for God's blessings and goodness during the past year, and the marked blessings and guidance and unity during this Assembly.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

The shadows of another assembly year are gathering. History has been written which can never be erased.

The District work being somewhat new to us it required some time to get a survey of the field before us, and having been engaged with pastoral duties we haven't had much opportunity to concentrate our efforts on helping the churches of the District. Our efforts have been poor indeed and sometimes we have felt, almost in vain, yet, with the help of the Lord we have done our best.

God has been pleased to bless us in soul and body for which we praise Him.

The co-operation of the pastors and workers and the fellowship of the saints as we have gone from place to place has been refreshing and encouraging. Battles have been fought and victories won in the name of our blessed Lord. The Gospel has been preached, sin uncovered, and the blood of Jesus Christ held up as the only remedy for sin. His power has been demonstrated in the salvation and sanctification of precious souls. The world needs a gospel that shows each man what he really is; that shows up sin in its true light, not merely as a misfortune, a blunder, or the helpless result of unfavorable environment; that shows that nothing, however good in itself, will avail for the salvation of a soul. For neither respectability, morality, culture, development, ceremony, baptism, joining church, nor any other thing will atone for sin. Every human prop must be re-

moved and the sinner fall back on redemption through the Blood.

Though our district is the smallest and youngest in our church it need not remain the smallest for we have a vast field and a great people all about us, with great opportunities to extend our work if our people will only catch the vision. A strong District work is the desire of our hearts, but in order to have this we must build up what we already have, and then, we will be in position to extend our stakes. There is a great need of evangelistic and church extension work but we have felt for some time that our greatest need is pastors who are dead to the world, and have a burning passion for souls and a determination to build up a work that will be a credit to our God and to our church and to spread the great cause of Christianity in the world, in spite of anything and everything that may be against them.

And now what shall I say about the child, Beulah Holiness Academy, so long neglected but who, in spite, of the neglect has had a determination deep rooted to rise above all obstacles and to take her own place in the world. Placed as she has been among the groves of God's great out-of-doors, away from the allurements and attractions of the city life which would tend to detract from a deep spirituality, she affords wonderful opportunities for the child of God to steal away with Jesus and get alone somewhere with God. Then, too, there are many open doors in the country round about for the students called of God to the work of the ministry.

By way of improvements, even the great corporations of the country are helping in a most acceptable way. The Tidewater Trail, a State highway leads past the school. Within the past year poles have been set and wires stretched for both electric and telephone service. Now the great responsibility of seeing the child nourished, built up, and assisted in taking her place in the civic as well as the spiritual world rests upon you and me, not only as a few individuals, but upon us as a District. Let us rally to her side and see that she gets the proper support. As churches of the District let us see that she is given the proper material help by way of finances, house furnishings, etc., but above everything else let us send her our young people. Let us send them for all departments, grade, high school, theological, and musical.

During the year we have traveled more than eight thousand miles at a cost of \$198.12. Preached 221 times; conducted 28 prayer meetings; attended 60 other services; made 245 calls; taught Sunday School classes 27 Sundays; married one couple; dedicated four children; conducted 3 funerals; written 150 letters. Number professing regeneration, 64; sanctification, 29. For remuneration as pastor, we received \$1,384.16 and in offerings from the churches and revivals, \$367.38, making a total of \$1,751.54. We also have one new church in the District.

Brother W. F. Jones held a meeting at Gwyman's Island, at the close of which we organized a church with ten splendid members.
