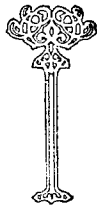

Journal of Proceedings

of the

NINTH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF VIRGINIA DISTRICT OF THE
PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH.

Many of the preachers and delegates being present, an evangelistic service was held in the Staunton Church, Monday evening, August 18, 1930. Rev. R. G. Flexon, the District Superintendent, preached on the subject of "Separation and Loneliness," a message that was a blessing to all the preachers as well as the laymen.

FIRST SESSION.

TUESDAY MORNING, AUGUST 19, 1930, 9 O'CLOCK.

The first session of the Assembly convened at 9 A. M., in the Church at Staunton, Va., with the District Superintendent, Rev. R. S. Flexon, in the chair. After the Assembly joined in singing "A Charge to Keep I Have," the chairman read the 133rd Psalm and exhorted briefly on "Christian Unity." The Assembly was led in prayer by Rev. J. W. Covington.

The Assembly then proceeded to the business of organizing, and the ministers and delegates were enrolled. The roll call, when complete, was as follows:

Motion made that the first six benches in the Church constitute the Conference bar. Carried.

Motion made that the Chair set the hours for the Conference ses-

sions, and that there be evangelistic services at night. Carried. The hours set were 9 to 11:30 A. M. and 2 to 4 P. M.

By motion, the Chair was authorized to appoint the necessary committees. Those appointed were as follows:

Resolutions and Ways and Means—J. W. Covington, G. H. Butner, C. H. Flexon, J. V. Roberts, and D. B. Driver.

Statistical—R. S. Powers, Lizzie Lowry, and Nellie Cummins.

Auditing—E. W. Powers and E. E. Hosteter.

Editing and Printing—J. V. Roberts and B. Van Vranken.

Courtesy—W. C. Kirkman and J. W. Covington.

Worship—W. F. Jones and Otis Bogan.

Motion made that R. G. Flexon also serve on the Resolutions Committee. Carried.

The Courtesy Committee then introduced Bro. Norton, of Delta-ville, and he was voted a seat in the Conference bar.

Motion made that the Statistical Committee arrange the reports according to the form used last year. Carried.

Pastors' reports were then called for.

Motion made that all reports be accepted by silent consent, except when an objection is raised. Carried.

Pastors' reports were read and accepted, as follows: B. Van Vranken, J. V. Roberts, J. W. Covington, W. C. Kirkman, C. H. Flexon, G. H. Butner (reports from Mrs. G. H. Butner and Grace Schneider were read by the Secretary), E. J. Moffitt, E. E. Hosteter, Lottie Gibson, G. H. Knopp, Mrs. J. F. Short, and Harry Michael.

Motion made that no preacher be given credentials for another year who does not subscribe to the "Advocate," tithe, and place tithe in the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Carried.

W. R. Whitenack's report was read by the Secretary.

Mrs. Nannie Mason's deaconess' report was read and accepted.

Motion made that the Church financial and statistical reports be read at the same time. Carried.

Motion made to adjourn. Dismissed by the Chairman.

SECOND SESSION.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON, AUGUST 19, 1930, 2 O'CLOCK.

Devotional services led by Bro. Kirkman.

The roll was then called and the minutes of the morning session read and approved.

Bro. Everett Phillippe's report was read by the Secretary.

Motion made that the Secretary write Brother and Sister Phillippe, sending greetings from the Assembly and expressing appreciation for their labors as our missionaries. Carried.

Church statistical and financial reports were read and accepted, as follows: Warm Springs, Staunton, Roanoke, Richmond, Petersburg, Mineral, Beulah and Staunton.

The young people's report from Roanoke was accepted, and Beulah's returned for correction.

The Resolutions Committee then read Resolution No. 1, which was adopted. (See resolutions.)

Motion to adjourn. Carried. Session dismissed by R. G. Flexon.

THIRD SESSION.

WEDNESDAY MORNING, AUGUST 20, 1930, 9 O'CLOCK.

Devotional service led by Bro. Hosteter.

The roll was then called.

Minutes of the previous session read and approved.

Motion made that the preachers' wives be given a seat in the Conference bar and the privileges of the floor. Carried.

The Church reports from Mineral and Streets and Otis Bogan's pastor's report were read and accepted.

The District Secretary-Treasurer's report was read and accepted. (See District Treasurer's report.)

The District Superintendent's report was read and accepted. (See District Superintendent's report.)

Motion made that the District Superintendent be given a rising vote of thanks by the Assembly for his sacrifices and services in the District this year. Carried.

By motion of the Assembly, the Secretary was also given a rising vote of thanks.

Moved that Sisters Driver and Stone sing at this time. Carried.

The Assembly was exhorted to use these singers in revival meetings whenever they could and keep them busy.

The District Superintendent's evangelistic report was read; also the Sunday School report from East Radford.

Motion made that the election of officers be the order of the day for the 2 P. M. session. Carried.

Resolutions Nos. II, III, IV were presented by the committee and adopted. (See resolutions.)

Memorial No. I for the General Assembly was read and adopted. (See memorials.) Also memorials II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, and VIII were adopted.

Motion to adjourn was carried. Session was dismissed by Bro. Moffitt.

FOURTH SESSION.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, AUGUST 20, 1930, 2 O'CLOCK.

Devotional service led by Bro. Norton.

The roll call was omitted by vote of the Assembly.

Minutes of the previous session read and approved.

The order of the day called for election of officers. Bros. Roberts and E. W. Powers appointed tellers. The following officers were elected by secret ballot:

District Superintendent—J. W. Covington.

Assistant Superintendent—R. G. Flexon.

Motion made to lay aside the rules of the "Manual" and to combine the offices of District Secretary and Treasurer. Carried.

Secretary-Treasurer—Beatrice Van Vranken.

Advisory Council Members—J. V. Roberts, G. H. Butner, D. B. Driver, and E. W. Powers.

Member of Examining Board (for three years)—J. V. Roberts.

Motion made that the Council appoint the Missionary Board. Carried.

District trustees were re-elected by acclamation.

Motion made that the Cabinet members of the District Council select both the ministerial and lay delegates to the General Assembly. Carried.

Motion made to extend the time for the pledging of the money for the publishing of the District Assembly Minutes. Carried. Pledges for this purpose amounted to \$37.00.

Session was adjourned and dismissed by R. G. Flexon.

FIFTH SESSION.

THURSDAY MORNING, AUGUST 21, 1930, 9 O'CLOCK.

Devotional service led by Sister Cummins.

The pastors' reports of W. F. Jones and A. C. Hudgins were read and accepted.

The report of the Examining Board was read and accepted. (See reports.)

The Resolutions Committee then read Memorial No. IX, which was adopted by the Assembly. (See memorials.)

Motion made that the budget plan of last year be incorporated in the resolutions of this year. Carried.

Motion made to annul Resolution No. V of last year. Carried.

Motion made to give the Staunton Church a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality and splendid entertainment. Carried.

Auditing Committee's report was accepted. (See reports.)

Motion made to recess for fifteen minutes and reconvene until business is done. Carried.

An additional recommendation of the Examining Board was accepted.

The report of the Statistical Committee was read and accepted.

An invitation was extended to have the 1931 Assembly meet at the Beulah Church. The invitation was accepted.

Resolution No. V was offered the Assembly, and returned to the Resolutions Committee for redrafting. It was then accepted.

A resolution to amend the District Budget was accepted. (See resolutions for outline of amended Budget.)

Motion made that all birthday offerings be turned into the Orphanage. Carried.

Motion to adjourn was carried, and the Assembly was dismissed by the District Superintendent.

Memorials

I. Resolved, That the Pilgrim Holiness Church be divided into five geographical divisions, as follows: Eastern, to include New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and the present Eastern District; Southern, to include North Carolina, Virginia and West Virginia; East-Central, to include Ontario, Michigan, Ohio and Kentucky; West-Central, to include Indiana, Illinois and Missouri; Western, to include Rocky Mountains, California, Idaho, Washington, Oklahoma, Kansas and Texas.

II. Be it further resolved, That there be one general Correlated Board to represent all Church interests, consisting of fifteen members and the general Church officers.

III. Resolved, That said Board shall organize itself into three divisions, consisting of five members each, to care for (1) foreign missions; (2) home missions and charitable institutions, and (3) education and publication.

IV. Resolved, That each of the five divisions shall have one representative in each division of said Board, elected as follows: Each District Assembly shall nominate six men, of whom the General Assembly shall elect three, these to be proportionately selected from the Districts.

V. Resolved, That there be one General Superintendent.

VI. Resolved, That each geographical Division be organized into one District organization.

VII. Be it further resolved, That the Correlated Board be empowered to appoint, dismiss, or transfer District Superintendents for each of these Districts, said Superintendents to give their entire time to the District work and be compensated from the general Church treasury at the rate of \$1,800 per year.

VIII. Resolved, That there shall be a General Church Budget, at the rate of \$5.00 per member, to be disbursed as follows: Foreign missions, \$30,000; home missions, \$15,000; General and District Superintendents, \$11,500; publishing interests, \$5,000; Orphanage, \$10,000; one general Church Bible school, \$5,000, and overhead expenses, \$3,500.

IX. Resolved, That no missionary be sent to the foreign field until he or she has had at least two years' experience as pastor in the homeland.

RESOLUTIONS.

I. Resolved, That ministers failing to report and attend Conference for two consecutive years shall have their credentials revoked, unless they have a lawful excuse.

Furthermore, be it resolved, That no preacher be given credentials for another year who does not subscribe to the "Advocate," tithe, and place the tithe in the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

II. Resolved, That each Church shall organize a Young People's Society.

III. Be it further resolved, That the District Superintendent appoint a State Superintendent of the Young People's Society and arrange for a Young People's Society State Convention.

IV. Resolved, That each Church in the District shall call the District Superintendent for at least one revival meeting during the year.

V. Resolved, That the Virginia District compensate the District Superintendent \$1,200 per year for his services, which shall be confined to said District, said salary to be paid him from the District treasury at the rate of \$100 per month. Salary to be raised thus:

In addition to the percentage from the financial system, all offerings raised for him shall be turned into the District treasury. Traveling expenses shall be paid him monthly from the District treasury.

VI. Resolved, That 15 per cent of all general Church offerings be sent to the District Treasurer monthly, distribution to be made as follows: District Superintendent, 60 per cent; foreign missions, 10 per cent; home missions, 10 per cent; Orphanage, 5 per cent; General Superintendent, 2 per cent; publication interests, 3 per cent; general Bible schools, 4 per cent, and District incidentals, 6 per cent.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT.

August 17, 1930.

To the Assembly of the Virginia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, in Session at Staunton, Va.:

In taking an introspective view, I am made to thank God for the progress that has been made by my soul through spiritual territory this past year. It has certainly been a year of heart-enlargement and soul-growth.

The prospective view of the Virginia District causes my heart to pulsate with holy optimism and a progressive determination.

The retrospective view holds both its bright and dark spots. The dark spots are because of my inability to serve the District as I longed to do, and because many things I desired to accomplish have not been realized. The bright spots have been because of the patience you have manifested with my shortcomings, the co-operation I have received from every part of the District, and the results that have been attained by the faithfulness of the pastors.

The reports from our District Evangelist have been encouraging, good revivals being reported in many places where he has been. Some of the Churches and camp-meetings can report the best revivals since their inception. We have succeeded in the reorganization of two of the Churches which had been disbanded.

I have given to the District about fifty full days of time, mostly to the smaller Churches, where I felt I was most needed. I received for support \$190.61, and paid out for traveling expenses \$118.84.

Under conditions, I can clearly say that I did what I could.
