Revs. E. E. Phillippe and C. E. Winslow appointed on the Auditing Committee.

D. B. Driver appointed to the Ways and Means Committee.

Motion made that this Assembly advise the ministry and the laity to refuse all literature from the Emmanuel Missionary Church, and deny them our influence and support. Carried.

Motion presented that the hours for sessions be from 8:30 to 11:30 a. m.; from 1:30 to 4:30 p. m., with a 15-minute recess at 10 a. m. and 3 p. m., and evangelistic services at night, excepting Monday. Carried.

Motion carried that reports of ministers and churches be read at this time, and one minute be allowed to each reporter for comments.

Motion prevailed that the Chair interpret and explain all report blanks and that our reports be made accordingly.

Chair's interpretation is as follows: Homes prayed in and pastoral calls are each to be reported separately. A pastoral call is explained as any call made at a home when spiritual help is offered.

Pastors are to report revivals, professions of regenerations and sanctifications on both ministers' and evangelists' report blanks in cases where he holds his own meeting. But when there is an engaged evangelist, the pastor shall report all regenerations and sanctifications from such meetings in the ministers' report blank.

Motion prevailed that time be extended 15 minutes.

Chair appoints E. T. Boswell on Worship Committee.

Motion that Rev. John Lunden be given a seat in the Assembly carried.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

District Superintendent's Report

The Fifteenth Annual Assembly,
The Pilgrim Holiness Church,
Virginia District,

Beloved: We wish to present the following report of our labors for the year ending August 15. In the very beginning we want to express our appreciation to our Heavenly Father for His kind care of us in our traveling, His presence in our lives, and we trust His unction and blessing upon us in our ministry. What has been worth while has been because He has helped us and has unctionized us. To God be all the glory.

We want also to express our appreciation for the fellowship of the brethren and their co-operation. Without this we could have done but little, and we are glad that we are laboring among brethren that extend to their leaders such co-operation.

We have made 85 visits to the various churches, preached 75 times and have held 80 business meetings in our visits to the churches. We have traveled 13,056 miles, and in doing so have made two trips to General Board meetings and three such trips to our School Board meetings. We have made some 30 calls at homes or hospitals during the year. In remuneration for this we have received \$492.06, and we have in turn paid out \$210.67. Counting the time that we have spent in attending to our correspondence we have given to the district something around four months' time.

As to the spiritual state of the district, I feel that we have made progress. Three churches especially have made a great advance, having had revivals that have netted results in souls getting to God and in the addition of members to the church in appreciable numbers. Some five or six others have had good revivals,

that might be regarded as above the average. Practically all others have had good meetings.

In our home mission work we have been somewhat disappointed. The meeting at Newport News was refreshing to the church, but accomplished but little in reaching the outside. The meeting at Lynchburg was a good meeting and about 40 souls sought God. It seemed, however, that the meeting closed too soon and we were unable to conserve the results as we would like, and it looks as though we might have to write it all up to profit and loss.

We have been putting some money into small places and we feel that it has been well spent. This has been done to get some places on their feet.

Two churches have secured lots during the year for parsonages and will, no doubt, be doing something toward building in the not far distant future.

During the year the tents have been in use and have about spent themselves. We shall have to consider getting one at least for the year coming.

We are looking forward to real advance in the work of the Lord in the district.

Report of Bro. and Sister E. Phillippe, returned missionaries:

To the Brethren of the Virginia District Assembly:

Our last year, spent in British Guiana, proved to be the best and most successful of the seven years of our missionary work. The field is small compared with the whole of the great neglected continent of South America, but it is a needy field, being populated with many nationalities and is white unto harvest.

At the present time the Pilgrim Holiness Church has eleven stations in British Guiana, with other preaching points, one being among the Aboriginal Indians. Two of these stations and several of the preaching points have been open during the past year, and converts added to the number in all the other stations. Also the year's report on the field shows good gains towards self-support.

We arrived home in May and since then have visited eleven camp meetings in the interest of missions. It has been a real pleasure to meet so many old friends, make new ones, and to see the good interest our people are taking in the work in the regions beyond. We covet your continued prayers for missions and that we may be able to soon return.

Rec. No. 2. We recommend that our churches shall pound the pastor at least once each month.

Rec. No. 3. Recommend that pledges be taken from the floor to cover the publication of minutes of this

Assembly same to be included in budget. (\$50.00 pledged.)

Rec. No. 4. We recommend that an offering be taken for the District Superintendent on each of his visits to the local churches, in cash or donations, to cover not less than his expenses.

Rec. No. 5. We recommend: That all licensed and ordained ministers and deaconesses pay one-half (1-2) of their tithe from remunerations received from their ministry into the local church treasury, to be forwarded to the District Treasury for support of the District Superintendent.

Rec. No. 6. We recommend, That we raise a general and district budget equal to \$2.00 or more per member, to be divided: 50 per cent. for General Budget, 50 per cent. for District Budget. The District Budget to be divided thus: 70 per cent. for church extension work, 25 per cent. for incidentals, and 5 per cent for General Assembly expense.

It is understood that the Evangelistic League shall be free to function and raise money in addition to the budget percentage for church extension work.

Rec. No. 7. We further recommend that the Missionary Budget of \$2.00 or more per member be raised as Foreign Missionary funds, by methods best suited to local conditions.

Rec. No. 8. Recommended, That each local church, each pastor, and each evangelist, forward to the District Treasurer through the local church treasurer, an offering equivalent to \$1.00 per representative of the Annual Assembly, to help defray expense of the Assembly.

Rec. No. 9. We recommend, That each church take a special cash offering. and also a donation or pound- ing for the support of the district camp meeting. Said cash offering to be sent to the District Treasurer at least 30 days previous to the camp.
