MONDAY MORNING

THE TWENTY-SECOND DISTRICT CONFERENCE OF THE VIRGINIA DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH CONVENED IN STAUNTON, VIRGINIA, MONDAY MORNING, JULY 26, 1943.

A devotional service, conducted by Rev. J. H. Norton, preceded the business session. Prayer was offered by Brother Albin Ohlson.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook, our highly esteemed General Superintendent, was presented to the Conference by District Superintendent, Rev. D. E. Snow. Brother Surbrook brought a very helpful, practical and inspirational message to the preachers, using as his text the fifth verse of the fourth chapter of II Corinthians and speaking on the subject, "Some Pungent Points for Preachers". His message was divided as follows: (1) The Minister's Religion; (2) The Minister's Ruts; (3) The Minister's Revivals. Many expressions of appreciation were voiced by those who heard this splendid message.

Rev. H. D. Dieter, president of the Allentown Bible Institute, was asked by the Chairman to take a seat at the front with the officials.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

The Twenty-Second Annual Conference, Virginia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church:

Dear Brethren, Co-Laborers with me in Christ, Greetings:

As I make this report to you, I am reminded of August of 1939, when I made my first trip to Staunton and found you as fine a group of Pilgrims as I had never met before. It seems that the Divine leadings of the Lord in the past four years has enabled us to labor with you for the promotion of the Cause of Christ, and the Church, and I can say these have been good years in my ministry. I consider it a privilege to have known and labored with you.

I do desire to express to you, one and all, my sincere thanks and appreciation for your kind co-operation and your many personal kindnesses to me and my family. May God bless every one of you.

The past year has been one of many changes the world over, hardly a home, or family but what have felt the terrible horrors of this awful war. The Church has been challenged as never before, but we can rest assured that she will outride every storm. "The gates of hell shall not prevail against her."

The Statistical report will show that this has been a very good year for us; we have gained numerically, and our finances have been the best in years. Most of our pastors have received substantial raises in salaries, and the general interests of the Church have been well cared for.

We have organized one new Church this year, at Hampton, Virginia, at the time of organization there being eighteen members. They now report a membership of twenty-six, and they have a most encouraging report. Our Brother Michael has done a good work, and the Lord has blessed his ministry. We wish for this new work God's richest blessings.

We have, also, this encouraging news for you: the Church at Roanoke, Virginia, has voted by the Church and Board to come into the Conference this year. They have their delegates here to be seated in this Conference. The annual meeting at that Church resulted in the calling of Rev. E. J. Hocking to the pastorate of this Church.

We would like to ask the Conference to accept these two good Churches into the Conference, and to seat their Delegates as members of the Conference with all the full rights of duly elected Delegates. Roanoke has ninety-nine members, and Hampton has twenty-six.

We have labored with you for the past four years, and have also labored in the evangelistic field. Last September we accepted the pastorate of the Church at Huntington, West Virginia, and at the request of our General Superintendent, and the Brethren of the District, I have finished the year, giving the time necessary to the work of the District.

My labors consisted in visiting all of the Churches once, and to nine of the Churches I have made two visits, and to one I have made three calls.

General Board meetings, 1; District Council meetings, 2; traveled approximately 9,000 miles; received from District Treasurer as salary, \$1,007.94.

My traveling expenses were paid in full by the Churches.

I will always remember you in my prayers, and I wish for the District the Blessings of the Lord. I can say, with the Apostle Paul, writing to the Philippian Church:

"And it is my prayer that your love may be more and more accompanied

by clear knowledge and keen perception for, testing things that differ so that you may be men of transparent character, and may be blameless in preparation for the day of Christ, being filled with these fruits of righteousness which come through Jesus Christ. To the Glory and Praise of God."—Phil. 1:9-10 (Weymouth).

The Statistical Report was read and, by motion, was received with appreciation for the splendid work.

Rev. and Mrs. W. R. Dudley were received into the Conference and seated within the bar.

The Committee on Resolutions reported:

Resolution No. 1, Carried, to delete Resolution Number 6 on page 12 of the Minutes, reading, "Resolved that a Sunday School Rally be held at least once a year under the supervision of the Pastor."

Resolution No. 2, Carried, to delete Resolution No. 12, page 12, reading, "Resolved that the District build a Parsonage for the District Superintendent."

Resolution No. 3, Carried, "Resolved that the Annual District Young People's Rally be held the last Saturday of the District Camp.

Resolution No. 4, Carried as substituted, "Resolved to elect one lay member to the District Council from the Conference floor."

The BOARD OF EDUCATION AND EXAMINATION REPORTED and by motion was accepted:

We, the Board of Education and Examination, recommend the following to the Annual District Conference:

(1)—For Ordination at this Conference:

Rev. I. T. Dunn of our Charlottesville Church, who has successfully passed all requirements both spiritually and educationally.

Rev. J. E. Swinney, of our Martinsville Church, who also has passed the needed requirements both spiritually and educationally.

(2)—For Renewal of District License:

Mollie Davenport, Mrs. Lillian Elliott, W. N. Fort, Lottie Gibson, Ada Heironimus, Samuel Massey, William Dudley.

(3)—For Renewal of Deaconess License—

Nannie Mason, Mattie Mullenex, Mrs. William Dudley.

(4)—In compliance with the Church Manual the License of P. A. Casto is automatically forfeited, by his failure to make a report for the past several years (Page 105, Sec. 149).

At the suggestion of the Chairman the Conference recessed for ten minutes.

On re-convening, Rev. H. D. Dieter offered prayer.

The matter concerning the note on Camp Dormitory was presented and accepted by the Conference.

Moved and seconded that five hundred copies of the Minutes be printed. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the Conference recess until the afternoon sitting. Carried.

Brother Snow dismissed with prayer.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Two verses of "What a Friend We Have In Jesus" were sung and the District Secretary, Rev. G. A. Castevens, led in prayer.

The Reception Committee presented Brother and Sister Moffatt of the Church of the Nazarene from California. They responded to a request for a special song and sang to the edification of all who heard.

Rev. H. D. Dieter was asked to speak to the Conference, which he did to the encouragement and information of all.

The REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE was called for. The following recommendations were presented:

Recommendation No. 1. Carried.

Recommendation No. 2. Carried.

Recommendation No. 3. Carried.

Recommendation No. 4. Carried as amended.

Moved and seconded that the election of officers be the order of the day.

The following Ministers were appointed as tellers: J. A. Howard, Byrd Puffenbarger, Alvin Jackson, E. J. Hocking, and C. M. Muse.

The following officers were elected:

District Superintendent—Rev. G. A. Castevens.

Assistant District Superintendent—Rev. J. E. Guill.

District Secretary—Rev. J. A. Howard.

District Treasurer—Rev. J. E. Kraus.

Advisory Council Members—Revs. H. H. Michael, C. A. Cooper, and Mr. D. B. Driver.

Brother Michael was elected to the Board of Education and Examination for three years.

Brother Black was elected for three years as a District Trustee.

Moved and seconded that Brother Surbrook be released in time to catch his train. A very impressive Ordination Service was conducted in which Rev. I. T. Dunn and Rev. J. E. Swinney were set apart to the Ministry.

The AUDITING COMMITTEE reported and by motion was accepted.

The DISTRICT TREASURER'S REPORT was read and accepted by motion.

Moved and seconded that the personal gift be applied to the Dormitory.

Moved and seconded that the Recommendation No. 2, page 13, be deleted. Carried.

Moved and seconded that Resolution No. 2 and Recommendation No. 11 be deleted from the Minutes. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn. Carried.

Dismissed in prayer by Rev. Harold Dieter, President of Allentown Bible Institute.

WAYS AND MEANS RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommendation No. 1. We recommend that the Churches pound the Pastors at least once a month.

Recommendation No. 2. We recommend the Missionary Budget of \$1.90 or more be raised as a Foreign Missionary Fund by best methods suited to local conditions.

Recommendation No. 3. We recommend that each local Church pay \$1.00 for each representative attending the District Conference. Each evangelist and unstationed minister will pay one dollar (\$1.00) towards the expense of the Conference.

Recommendation No. 4. We recommend that each Church take a special offering and also a pounding or donation for the support of the District Camp Meeting. Said cash offering to be sent to the District Treasurer at least thirty days previous to the Camp. (Added recommendation of 1938). We recommend that the pledges for donations be taken from the Conference floor.

Recommendation No. 5. We recommend that the Evangelistic League shall be free to raise money in addition to the Budget for Church Extension work.

Recommendation No. 6. We recommend that each local Treasurer forward to the District Treasurer all offerings for General and District Funds by the 20th of each month.

Recommendation No. 7. We recommend that we have a Church Extension Fund, this fund to be raised by each Church paying on an average of at least one per cent of the regular offering. This fund is to be used for buying or building Church property in the District only. Any Church borrowing from this fund shall give a note signed by the Trustees and a deed of trust for the amount borrowed. This fund shall be under the control of the District Council.

Recommendation No. 8. We recommend that the Young People's Societies of the District send in an offering to the District Camp to help defray the expense of free entertainment at the Young People's Rally. These offerings may be taken in the Young People's Societies.

Recommendation No. 9. We recommend that our Pastors present the Penny-a-Day proposition, relative to the Allentown Bible Institute to the local Churches, and do their best to raise the same.

Recommendation No. 10. We recommend that the amendment of last Conference year be dropped from Recommendation No. 12. Amendment: "That all our Home Missionary funds be applied on the Hampton project."

Recommendation No. 11. We recommend that Recommendation No. 13 be dropped.

Recommendation No. 12. Resolved that we take pledges from the Conference floor from the various Churches to be applied on the Dormitory note. These pledges are to be paid within thirty days to the Camp Meeting Treasurer.

Recommendation No. 13. We recommend that we elect one of our District men to serve as District Superintendent. His salary to be the full tithe of the District Ministers received from the ministerial labors. That he granted the privilege of holding three meetings out of the District.

Recommendation No. 14. We recommend that our District and General Budgets be set at the same amount as last year, which is as follows:

\$2,985.00. This to cover General Budget; District Incidentals; District Home Missions; General Conference Expense; Contingency Fund; last year's Deficits; and Church Extension Fund. From the Home Missionary Fund we recommend that \$5.00 per week be allocated to help finance the Hampton project. The above budget is prorated to the Churches as follows:

RESOLUTIONS

Resolution No. 1. Whereas there are so many that do not know all the By-Laws and Resolutions of the past years, be it therefore resolved that they be printed each year in the Conference Minutes.

Resolution No. 2. Resolved that the District Council be empowered to take charge of any unfinished business of the Conference after its adjournment.

Resolution No. 3. Resolved that no resolution presented to the Conference and lost shall be printed in the Minutes.

Resolution No. 4. Resolved that as far as possible appointments of Committees be arranged so that each Committee can meet at the same time.

Resolution No. 5. Resolved that the workers for the District Camp Meeting be left in the hands of the District Council.

Resolution No. 6. Resolved that we have a Camp Meeting Committee of five who shall have full supervision of the Camp.

Resolution No. 7. Resolved that all Licensed Ministers who have been denied the privilege of attending Bible School be required to take the Correspondence Course from the Allentown Bible Institute leading to Ordination.

Resolution No. 8. Resolved that the Evangelistic League revert to the former custom: the District Superintendent being Chairman, and appointing two others to serve with him.

Resolution No. 9. Resolved that all Resolutions be Grouped in one group and numbered accordingly.

Resolution No. 10. Resolved that the Annual District Young People's Rally be held the last Saturday of the District Camp.

Resolution No. 11.—Resolved that the Conference elect one lay member of the District to the Council; said lay member to be elected from a nomination of three from the Conference floor.

REPORT OF Y.P.S. DISTRICT RALLY

SATURDAY, JULY 24th, 1943

The Annual Rally of the Young People's Societies of the Virginia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Staunton, July 24th, 1943. The meeting was presided over by Rev. J. A. Howard.

The Societies of the various Churches rendered helpful and inspirational numbers during the program.

The business session was conducted by Rev. D. E. Snow, District Superintendent. The minutes were read and approved. The following officers were elected for the Conference year: Mrs. Elmer J. Hocking, Secretary; Howard M. Diggs, Treasurer. It was further voted that the District Council elect the Zone Chairmen.

The Treasurer's report was read as follows: Paid on Pledges by local Societies, \$75.00; Offering for Bible School student, Lillian Malcom, \$13.00. Total Receipts, \$78.00.

Three new Societies were presented to the District: Martinsville with 25 members, and three associates, with Mrs. C. A. Cooper, President; Radford, with 12 members, with Rev. C. E. Muse, President. The Church at Hampton also reported an active Society. It was voted that they be accepted into the Conference.

The Statistical report was read, which was very favorable. Commendable gains were made during the past year.

A motion prevailed that the various Societies' pledges toward Home Missions should be as follows:

Staunton, \$30.00; Hopewell, \$15.00; Richmond, \$20.00; Covington, \$25.00; Martinsville, \$10.00; Beulah, \$10.00.

Other Societies gave no report, but it is presumed that they will meet their pledges for another year.

Invitations for the District Rallies were as follows: Western Zone, Roanoke; the Eastern Zone, Remlik, and Beulah.

The Y. P. S. Zone paper was then introduced, entitled, "Your News and Views of the Zones," by Rev. Howard. It was moved and seconded that the paper become a District paper. The expenses of the paper to be met by the Societies.

Session adjourned, and dismissed by prayer.
