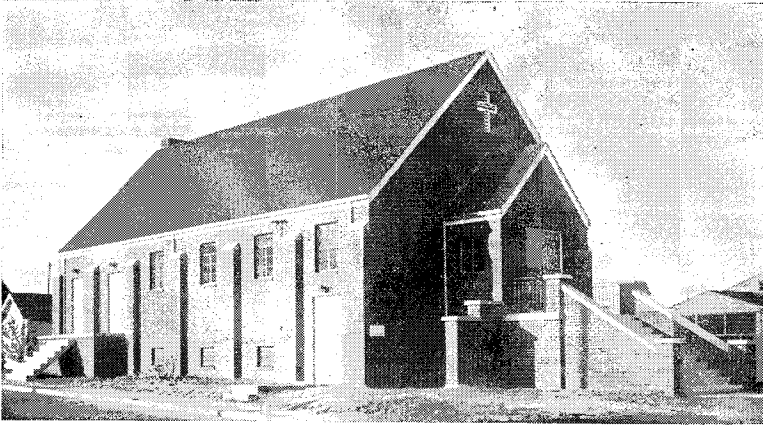

The Pilgrim Holiness Church in Hopewell, Virginia was organized in March, 1931, by the late Rev. C. H. Flexon, under the direction of the District Superintendent, Rev. J. W. Covington. There were ten charter members.

The congregation worshipped in a store building on Fifteenth Avenue for a number of years until lots were purchased and the basement unit of the present building was constructed.

Pastors of the Hopewell church have been: Rev. C. H. Flexon, Rev. O. W. Bogan, Rev. James Flexon, Rev. W. C. Wheedleton, Rev. Oscar Seifken and Rev. J. A. Howard.

Construction of the new church was started January 1, 1953 with most of the labor donated by men of the congregation and friends of the church. The building was opened for public worship in October, 1953 and dedicated a year later in October, 1954. Rev. R. W. Wolfe delivered the dedicatory message and Rev. G. W. Puffenbarger rendered special music.

The building constructed of block and faced with brick is valued at \$40,000.00. By using over 2,000 manhours of donated labor, the congregation was able to finish the building with a total indebtedness of \$11,000.00. Included in this loan was \$2500.00, spent for church pews and pulpit furniture. The loan is financed over a ten year period and probably will be liquidated before that date.

Located in Virginia's fastest growing industrial community, this church has a marvelous open door for God and the cause of holiness. The church recognizes and honors the vision and sacrifice, Rev. C. H. Flexon bestowed upon it, and prays that it may ever be the light house God designed His church to be.

# Conference Proceedings

MORNING SITTING, AUGUST 15, 1955

The Thirty-fourth Conference of the Virginia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:00 A.M., on August 15, 1955, at the District Camp Ground. Rev. E. T. Storey led the congregation in singing, "Standing on the Promises of God." Rev. W. S. Allred led in prayer. Rev. C. M. Muse read II Peter, chapter 1 as a Scripture lesson. District Superintendent, Rev. J. E. Guill introduced the Presiding Chairman, Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary-Treasurer of our church, to the Conference. The chairman explained that inasmuch as our General Superintendent was presiding elsewhere, he had been directed to come to Virginia Conference. He brought an inspiring message from I Cor. Chapter 9, verse 25. "*Now they do it* to obtain a corruptible crown but we an incorruptible." His subject was: "Claiming the Narrow Margin." Between success and failure, and between barely making it in our work and being an outstanding success—often there is just a narrow margin. Claiming this narrow margin, makes the difference. Our calling of God is to succeed and accomplish something for Him. Using the game of baseball, Rev. Beltz called our attention to the fact that six inches may be the difference between an "Out" or a "Run." In horse-racing, just a "nose" may determine who gets \$100,000.00. In the fields of business and politics the same analogy applies. After impressing these facts, he called our attention to ways we could claim the narrow margin for success in our Christian work. He called for a well planned program that would minister to all phases of our church work.

Following the inspiring address by the chairman, the roll was called. By the action of the Conference Mrs. G. E. Laws was seated as a delegate from the Martinsville church. The Conference bar was set as the first seven rows across the center and right hand sections of the tabernacle. The hours of sitting were established as follows:

Morning: 9 A.M. to 12 noon

Afternoon: 2 P.M. to 5 P.M.

Evening: 7 P.M. to 9:30 P.M.

The District Superintendent made the following interim appointments to fill existing committee vacancies:

The District Superintendent's report was presented and accepted by the Conference.

The Reception Committee presented: Rev. and Mrs. Gurney E. Laws, Rev. and Mrs. Franklin Greenley, Rev. D. E. Babcock and Rev. Earl J. Spring to the Conference. After welcoming them into the fellowship of the Conference, these were all granted honorary seats within the Conference bar, by unanimous action of the Conference.

Rev. Byrd Puffenbarger then gave his report as Assistant District Superintendent. This was received by vote of the Conference.

The Auditing Committee gave its report of the splendid condition the District Treasurer's books were in. Their report was accepted. The District Treasurer then presented his report. Following this presentation, it was moved seconded and carried that his report be accepted.

The Statistical Report was given next. This report was accepted by the Conference. Conference adjourned due to expiration of time. Dismissal prayer was by Rev. Oscar Felsburg.

#### AFTERNOON SITTING

Rev. Walter Cresswell led the congregation in singing: "When We All Get To Heaven." Prayer was offered by Rev. Lillian Elliott.

Rev. Beltz spoke to the Conference then on the need for Zeal in the work of God.

Minutes of the morning sitting were read and approved. The Board of Education and Examination made the following recommendations to the Conference:

The report of this committee was accepted with the understanding that letters of transfer would be forwarded for those coming into our Conference.

The Resolutions Committee reported as follows:

Resolution No. 1. Be it resolved that the Youth Camp be held July 9-13, 1956, on our District Camp Ground but in a smaller tent than we use for regular camp. Further, be it resolved that the District Youth Conference be held on Friday afternoon of the Youth Camp. This was amended to read that the details of Youth Camp would be worked out with the District Council. The resolution as amended was adopted.

Resolution No. 2. Be it resolved that our Zone Chairmen be requested to have a minimum of two zone rallies each year. Adopted by Conference action.

Resolution No. 3. Be it resolved that the Executive Secretary be instructed to visit each church once each year to encourage and to inspire our Youth work. Adopted by Conference action.

Resolution No. 4. Whereas the present ruling allowing only one delegate from each local society for 25 members or major fraction thereof has created a handicap and confusion, therefore be it resolved that we petition the General Board of our Church to permit our District Youth Conference to seat each local Youth President in addition to the designated delegate in our District Youth Conference. Adopted by Conference action.

Resolution No. 5. Inasmuch as our District Camp Meeting is suffering from the lack of a permanent tabernacle, be it resolved that a committee of three members and the District Superintendent be appointed to formulate plans for the construction of a tabernacle. Be it further resolved that this committee be known as the Tabernacle Construction Committee and that this committee shall present a report to the 1956 Conference, with a detailed building plan and recommendation for construction in the immediate future. Be it further resolved that this committee shall supervise the construction of the tabernacle. Adopted by Conference action.

The Ways and Means Committee then reported as follows:

Recommendation No. 1. We recommend that when the Exec-

utive Secretary shall visit each society, he shall be paid the sum of Five Dollars, plus travel expense at the rate of 5¢ per mile. We further recommend that he shall visit our churches or societies in groups of two, or more, at a time. In these services an offering shall be taken, any amount in excess of Five Dollars to go the Young People's District Treasurer, from which account the Executive Secretary's travel expense shall be paid. In his visits to the churches the Young People's Executive Secretary shall remind the church or society of its assessed obligation to the District Young People's organization.

An amendment carried to reduce the travel expense from 5¢ per mile to 3¢ per mile. It was further amended to make the recommendation read "Church or Society" whenever the word "Society" appeared. This amendment passed. The recommendation as amended reads:

We recommend that when the Executive Secretary shall visit each Church or Society, he shall be paid the sum of Five Dollars, plus travel expense at the rate of 3¢ per mile. The Executive Secretary shall visit churches or societies in groups of two or more at a time. In these services an offering shall be taken, any amount in excess of Five Dollars to go to the Young People's District Treasurer, from which account the Executive Secretary's travel expense shall be paid. In his visits the Executive Secretary shall remind the church or society of its assessed obligation to the District Young People's organization. This recommendation was adopted.

Recommendation No. 2. We recommend that Ways and Means Recommendation No. 4, on page 24 of the 1954 Conference Minutes be deleted and the following recommendation be adopted:

We recommend that each YPS send \$1.00 per month to their District Treasurer and that each church or unorganized society send a free-will offering to the District YPS Treasurer. This sum shall be used for operational expenses, youth council meetings, incidental expenses with any balance being reserved for the next District Youth Camp. We further recommend that the District YPS Treasurer send quarterly notices of the assessment to the societies which shall be read in a regular Young People's Meeting. This recommendation was passed.

Recommendation No. 3. We recommend that Ways and Means Recommendation No. 8, page 24 of the 1954 Conference Minutes be deleted and the following be adopted:

We recommend that each church pay its apportioned amount of \$5.00 or \$7.50 or more for the District Superintendent's travel expense according to its membership, to the District Treasurer immediately following each visit and that the District Treasurer shall make up any difference.

This recommendation was adopted.

Recommendation No. 4. Inasmuch as the cost of constructing the new entrance to the District Camp Ground is a permanent improvement to our property here, be it therefore recommended that this obligation, approximately \$2,000.00, be paid from monies on hand in the Camp Land Fund. Special attention is directed to the fact that Mr. J. H. Fralin donated over \$200.00 in materials and labor for this work. This recommendation was adopted by Conference action.

Recommendation No. 5. We recommend that the District Council be authorized to rent the District Parsonage with the provision that the premises will be vacated for use during the Youth Camp and the regular District Camp. The proceeds from this rental shall go into the regular District Treasury to help defray expenses. This recommendation was adopted.

A motion prevailed to refer the matter of a rent allowance for the District Superintendent to the District Council for study, recommendation and report for action to this Conference.

The election of officers was called for. The District Superintendent appointed the following tellers: C. M. Price, Alfred Moore, James Godwin, and E. T. Storey. Ballots were cast and the following officers were elected:

Ass't Dist. Supt.....Byrd Puffenbarger

District Secretary.....J. A. Howard

The afternoon sitting adjourned by expiration of time. Rev. Victor Bateman dismissed with prayer.

#### EVENING SITTING—7:00 P.M.

Rev. George W. Puffenbarger opened the final sitting of the 1955 Conference by leading the congregation in singing, "Leaning On The Everlasting Arms." Rev. E. C. Price led in prayer. Minutes of the afternoon sitting were read and approved. Rev. Beltz spoke of the District's obligation to the General Church, in loyally supporting the financial requirements of the General Budget.

In reply to the matter of referral of a rent allowance for the District Superintendent, the District Council recommended: "Be it resolved that we allocate a sum of Fifty Dollars a month, for a monthly rent allowance to our District Superintendent. This amount to be retroactive to the time the District Parsonage was vacated and shall be paid until the close of the 1956 Conference. Be it further resolved that proceeds from renting the District Parsonage, be reserved by the District Treasurer, to offset this additional expense. If there should be any deficit it shall be paid from the District Treasury." Note: Explanation was made by Council that this was neither "adequate nor reasonable" in amount, but it represented the maximum amount possible to be allocated without

raising the church budgets. This recommendation was adopted by the Conference.

Balloting continued for the election of the following:

Recommendation No. 10, page 15, of the 1954 Conference Minutes, which was tabled at that time, until this Conference was lifted from the table. After full discussion the Conference again voted this motion down.

The Resolutions Committee then concluded its work with the following resolutions:

Resolution No. 6. Be it resolved that in compiling the statistical reports pastors shall report all seekers in their church. Any seekers elsewhere may be designated as such. Adopted by the Conference.

Resolution No. 7. Be it resolved that all who have so willingly rendered their services to make this Conference successful, viz.,

Rev. R. A. Beltz, who acted so graciously as our Chairman;

Rev. J. E. Guill, our beloved District Superintendent;

Our Cooks, who have prepared such fine meals for pastors and delegates to this Conference;

be given a rising vote of thanks in appreciation for their services. This resolution was heartily adopted.

A motion prevailed that we take a love offering for Rev. and Mrs. Beltz in appreciation for the fine services rendered.

A motion was introduced that churches of the District send in the money immediately for the number of minutes ordered by pastor or delegate at the rate of 50¢ per copy. This motion was adopted.

A special request for prayer was brought in for Brother Scott, of the Boissevain Church, who was ill.

A vote of appreciation was given Sister Allred for her fine work in collecting donations for the Camp.

In concluding the Conference, all joined in singing "Blest Be The Tie That Binds" after which Rev. Beltz dismissed the Conference in prayer. Ministers and laymen alike left the Camp Grounds feeling that the Thirty-Fourth Annual Conference had been one of the best in the history of our District.

**DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT**

To the Thirty-fourth Annual Conference of the Virginia District Greetings:

We give thanks to God for His goodness and blessings that He has so graciously bestowed upon our District throughout the past year. Many of our churches have reported good revivals with sinners being converted and believers sanctified.

Over the past few years quite a bit of building has been going on. We greatly appreciate the spirit of labor and sacrifice that has been manifest on the part of our ministry and laymen. During the past year Waynesboro has bought a ten room parsonage which has a full basement being used for Sunday School rooms. Emmanuel Church in Richmond has about completed their new church building and are soon to be worshipping in it. Many of our churches have made improvements upon their properties and we rejoice at the gains in the field of church properties.

Church buildings and parsonages however are not the chief aim of the church but a means to an end. As never before I see and feel the great responsibility resting upon us as a church. **STANDING RESOLUTIONS**

1. Resolved that as far as possible all appointments of committees shall be made so that each committee may meet simultaneously. Further that all committees shall meet prior to Conference, at the call of their chairman, and have their business ready for presentation.

2. Resolved that we have a District Camp Committee composed of five members. The District Superintendent shall be the chairman. The other members shall be the chairman of the following committees: Advertising, Finance, Tabernacle and Dining Room.

3. Resolved that a state-wide Youth Convention be held each year. The District Superintendent shall be chairman of this convention, assisted by the Executive Secretary of our Youth organization and the Zone Chairmen.

4. Be it resolved that a set of rules be drawn up by the District Council governing the dormitory and camp ground. These shall be posted in convenient places for all to see.

5. Resolved that provision be made in our District Budget to cover the portion of General Conference expense that we shall be expected to pay.

6. Inasmuch as our pastors are expected to attend and support our annual camp meeting, therefore be it resolved that all of our churches shall provide the regular support for the two Sundays of camp for their pastors in their absence at camp.

7. In order to obtain uniformity in reporting enrollments for Sunday School reports, be it resolved that Sunday School enrollments shall be corrected at the first of each quarter based on the experience of the attendance during the previous quarter. Names shall not be dropped from the roll unless they were absent at least four Sundays of the quarter. (Sickness excepted.)

8. Be it resolved that our District Sunday School Committee sponsor Sunday School Workers meetings in strategic locations to accommodate groups of churches.

9. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appoint a Home Missionary Committee of two other members to serve with him. They shall formulate a home missionary policy for the District with the guidance and approval of the District Council.

10. In order that our churches may know shortly after Conference of changes by the Conference, each pastor shall be supplied with three mimeographed copies of said changes within 30 days of Conference.

11. Be it resolved that each pastor try and bring the Advocate subscriptions in his church up to the membership of his pastorate.

## WAYS AND MEANS RECOMMENDATIONS

1. We recommend that each church pound its pastor at least once a month.

2. We recommend that the Conference fee be \$4.00 per ministerial and lay delegate; and we further recommend that each church having unstationed ministers within its membership who shall be present for the Conference shall pay said fee for them.

3. We recommend that each local treasurer forward to the district treasurer all offerings for general and district funds by the last day of each month and that a receipt for same be sent to the sender immediately. We further recommend that all general church funds shall be sent to the General Treasurer by the last day of each month.

4. We recommend that the first Sunday of June be designated as District Camp Day on which the pastors of the various churches of the Virginia District will present the cause of the Camp Membership Association and raise an offering to help defray the cost of the camp.

5. We recommend that the District Conference pay the following amounts to these respective officers:

6. We recommend that the ministers of the Virginia District pay their ministerial tithes through the local church treasurer to the District Treasurer for the support of the District Superintendent. It is further stipulated that the Superintendent's salary shall be set at \$65.00 per week with the addition of the following utilities, gas, lights, and telephone. Any difference between the stated salary and the tithes received shall be supplied from or applied to the Contingency Fund of the District Budget.

7. We recommend that each church in the District be assessed a certain amount to reduce the indebtedness on Camp Dining Room and Kitchen and that this be prorated as follows:

The total of \$800.00 to be apportioned to each church as indicated and is to be paid to the District Treasurer quarterly to be applied against said note.

8. Since some of our churches are laboring under severe financial strain, be it resolved that the Sunday Schools with enrollment of less than 40 persons shall be asked to pay only fifty cents per month to the work of the District Sunday School Committee while those schools with enrollment exceeding 40 shall continue to pay the one dollar per month as assessed.

9. Whereas the Virginia Conference is committed officially and morally to the Eastern Pilgrim College Zone and whereas the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has twice turned down a petition to rezone the Virginia District be it resolved that this Conference go on record as continuing our support of Eastern Pilgrim College and that a representative of said college be requested to visit each church in the Virginia District to assist in raising the budget for the Eastern Pilgrim College.

10. We recommend that the following items be considered by the Conference to effect economy in the expenses of the District Camp Meeting: viz.

- (1) Each pastor shall work to raise 100 percent Camp Membership of \$1.00 per member to be sent by the Pastor to the District Treasurer prior to Camp.
- (2) The engaged singers of the Camp be paid a sum not to exceed that paid to one evangelist. The sum to be reserved for the singing of the Camp whether the party workers consist of one, two or more workers.
- (3) The assessment of \$10.00 for all ministers with a salary of \$40.00 or less per week and \$15.00 for those ministers with a salary exceeding \$40.00 per week and this amount shall be placed in the Camp Expense Fund.
- (4) In no service shall an offering be taken for both camp expense and camp ground notes. Further that no preaching service (morning, afternoon or night) shall be devoted exclusively to raising monies for this or any other purpose.
