#### CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

#### MORNING SITTING, AUGUST 12, 1957

The Thirty-sixth annual Conference of the Virginia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:30 A. M., on August 12, 1957, at the District Camp Ground. Rev. W. A. Cresswell led the congregation in singing "At the Cross." He was accompanied by Rev. Eldon Hotle at the piano, Mr. D. B. Driver led the Conference in prayer.

Rev. J. E. Guill, District Superintendent, presented Dr. William H. Neff, General Superintendent, to the Conference with warm words of appreciation for his presence. Dr. Neff brought greetings from the general church. He called attention to the fact that, since this was the last District Conference before the General Conference in June, 1958, the additional business of electing Ministerial and Lay Delegates to the Conference would have to be taken care of and passing of Memorials for action by that body.

Dr. Neff declared God has given us the most extravagant variety in nature. Over six thousand patterns of lowly snow-flakes have been recorded and each tree gives forth a different song in the wind, so God knew that His people would be different in likes and opinions. However, differences should be covered by an all-encompassing love. The Manual of the Church is plain in standing against sin, but it provides a wide area for private opinions and personal difference in things which are not sinful.

Following the message of the General Superintendent, the roll call was completed by the District Secretary. The Conference Bar was established as the first seven rows of seats in the center and right hand sections of the tabernacle.

The following ministers were received from other Confer-

Rev. John Abshure of the Florida Conference was introduced to the Conference as a visitor, and granted an honorary seat within the bar.

Rev. Garnet Phillippe, Virginia District missionary who has labored for many years under the Oriental Missionary Society,

was welcomed home and to this Conference.

Following the reception of new ministers the General Superintendent called for reports from the various officials.

Report of the District Superintendent presented and accept-

ed by the Conference.

Report of Assistant District Superintendent offered and accepted.

District Treasurer's report given and accepted.

District Statistician's report presented with an analysis of certain factors found therein. A rising vote of thanks was given to Rev. J. E. Kraus for a fine work done in this report.

The Promotional Secretary of the District Sunday School Committee presented his report which was accepted by the

Conference.

Hours of the three sessions of the Conference were set as follows:

Morning: 8:30 A. M. to 12 Noon Afternoon 2:00 P. M. to 5:00 P. M. Evening: 7:00 P. M. to 9:30 P. M.

Report of the Auditing Committee was received.

The Chairman called for the presentation of Memorials to 1958 General Conference:

Memorial No. 1. Lost by Conference action.

Memorial No. 2. "Because a financial hardship is worked against local churches, when non-employed teen age young people are budgeted for general budget at the rate of \$6 each and since there is a tendency to refrain from admitting those of this age group who are otherwise fully qualified into full church membership, be it resolved that Section 149, Paragraph 7 of the 1954 edition of the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church be amended to read as follows: ALL MEMBERS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 SHALL BE LISTED AS NON-ASSESSABLE MEMBERS." Recommended by Council and passed by Conference vote.

Memorial No. 3. Referred back to committee for redrafting with instructions to resubmit at later sitting.

The Reception Committee presented the following visitors:

Rev. Melvin Dieter, Assistant to the President of Eastern Pilgrim College.

Rev. W. C. Wheedleton from Eastern District Rev. A. E. Blann from the New York District Rev. J. W. Kraus from the Capitol District

These vistors were welcomed to the Conference and granted honorary seats within the bar.

The morning sitting was dismissed in prayer by Rev. A. E. Blann.

#### AFTERNOON SITTING-2 P. M.

The Conference reconvened at 2:00 P. M. by singing "I'll Live For Him," after which Rev. Garnet Phillippe led the congregation in prayer. Dr. Neff brought a timely exhertation on "Mobilizing Our Resources for God."

General Conference Memorial No. 4 was then presented:

"Since former General Superintendents of the Pilgrim Holiness Church possess a wealth of experience and wisdom which should be available to the General Board and the General Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and since at present, former General Superintendents, in good standing have neither voice on the General Board, nor in the General Conference (unless elected as Ministerial Delegates from their own Conferences) be it resolved that by virtue of the high office which they formerly held, that all former General Superintendents be granted honorary lifetime membership on the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and be given voice and vote as a member of each General Conference of the Church." Recommended by Council and passed by Conference.

Resolutions Committee presented a partial report:

Resolution No. 1. Recommended by Committee and carried by Conference vote.

Resolution No. 2. Recommended by Committee, amended by deleting the words "slating best workers available" and passed as amended.

Resolution No. 4. Not recommended by Committee. Lost by

Conference vote.

Resolution No. 5. Not recommended. Referred to Committee for redrafting.

Resolution No. 6. Recommended by Committee and carried

by majority vote.

Rev. Melvin Dieter, Assistant to the President of Eastern Pilgrim College, was given a seat on the platform.

Ways and Means Committee presented its report:

Recommendation No. 1. Carried.

Recommendation No. 2. Carried.

Rev. Earl Gentry, Pastor of the Valley View Wesleyan Methodist Church, was recognized as a visitor to the Conference and granted an honorary seat within the bar.

Rev. Ralph Burch and Rev. E. D. Howells were received by letters of transfer from the Pittsburg District.

Election of officers became the order of the day. Election results were as follows:

The District Trustees were reconfirmed by voice vote on recommendation of the District Superintendent.

Rev. J. E. Kraus was elected to succeed himself as a member of the Board of Education and Examination. (Council nominations for this office had been Rev. J. E. Kraus and Rev. Frank Schweitzer.)

Council nominations for Ministerial and Lay Delegates to the General Conference were presented to the Conference.

The final sitting of the Conference met at 6:30 P. M., with singing and prayer. A refreshing period of testimonies and praise preceded the opening of the business session.

The Council presented additional General Conference Memorials:

Memorial No. 3 (redrafted). "In view of the increasing emphasis on the importance of raising all budgets, district and general in full each year and since the numerous drives by the general departments of the church make it difficult for local churches to raise their budgets, be it resolved that Section 149, paragraph 9 of the 1954 manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church be amended to read as follows: "In order that our people may be enlightened concerning our church institutions, local churches shall open their doors once annually to representatives of the Department of Foreign Missions, Department of Church Extension and Educational Institutions. At such gatherings the representatives may present the needs of their institutions. All such offerings, cash or pledges, shall apply against that specific part of the local church's general or zone eduactional budget until such budgets are paid in full after which additional funds from this particular offering may be specified within that department." Recommended by Council and passed by Conference.

Memorial No. 5. "Whereas there is growing dissatisfaction because specified monies for general interests has no general budget merit, therefore be it resolved that all specified items sent from the district to the General Treasurer be reported in a parallel column on the spread sheet which goes out to the church with that of general budget payments or that credit be given budget wise on such specified items." Recommended by Council and passed by Conference.

Following the presentation of the last General Conference Memorials the District Council presented two resolutions for consideration by the Conference:

District Council Resolution No. 1, "Inasmuch as for varying reasons the Roanoke church must relocate its church plant and build elsewhere in the near future and since this vicinity needs a strong Pilgrim Holiness Church in the neighborhood of the District Camp Ground, therefore, be it resolved that a plot of ground approximately 4 acres in area from the driveway to the northern boundary of the ground be blocked off and that the District Council be authorized by this Conference to negotiate sale of this land to the trustees of the Roanoke Pilgrim Holiness Church at a price of \$1000 per acre. Be it further stipulated that if this congregation does not erect a church upon the land that the property will revert to the district at the same price paid for it." Recommended by Council. The motion was amended to substitute sum of \$6500 for the original price of \$1000 per acre and the motion was passed as amended. The Roanoke church representatives, Rev. Charles Stout, Pastor, and Mr. J. H. Fralin on behalf of the church declined the offer and it was understood by Conference and announced by the chairman that the offer and the resolution was null and void.

District Council Resolution No. 2. Be it resolved that the District Council be granted permission by this Conference to sell at earliest opportunity, to an advantage, the lot of approximately  $2\frac{1}{2}$  acres located on the southeast corner of ground across the creek. Recommended by the District Council and passed by Conference vote.

Resolutions from the floor were received in appreciation for the fine services rendered by the Camp Meeting workers, and all whose untiring efforts had gone into making this meeting a success. A rising vote of thanks was given to our General Superintendent, Dr. William Neff, for the fine work rendered in presiding over this Conference in such an able way.

The evening session of the Conference recessed for five minutes awaiting the ordination service. An Ordination Committee from the District Council was appointed by the General Superintendent. This committee was composed of: J. E. Guill, Superintendent, Byrd Puffenbarger, J. A. Howard, I. T. Dunn and O. W. Bogan.

Scripture lessons were read by Rev. J. A. Howard and Rev. Byrd Puffenbarger.

The congregation sang "A Charge to Keep" after which Dr. Neff delivered the ordination message to the candidates. The District Superintendent led in the dedicatory prayer and the General Superintendent gave the commission. Dale Reynolds, Elden Hotle and Lloyd Edge were ordained to the ministry amidst tears of joy and the manifestation of a wonderful spirit. With thanks to God for His goodness and His presence the Conference closed with prayer.

#### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the beloved chairman, ministers, delegates and friends of the thirty-sixth Annual Conference of the Virginia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Grace and peace be multiplied in your hearts. We have come together in this Conference for the transaction of business for our Heavenly Father in Whom we are a part of the great family in Heaven and upon earth.

Gains-

In our District in the past year we have made some gains. We have paid to General Headquarters Two Thousand dollars more than we did last year, one thousand to General Budget and one thousand to specified funds.

We are not paying our General Budget in full for which I am very sorry. I am asking every pastor and church to bring your General Budget up in full next year. We have no right to say a thing cannot be done until we have done our best and failed. Do we appreciate our church, and the great work of the Lord, which is done through the church? If so, let us set our goals to come up with all budgets paid next year.

Several of the churches in the District have made material gain this year. We have build the lounge, laundry, shower and rest rooms for women and shower and rest rooms for men, on the Camp ground, which are an improvement to our camp

grounds.

Our Losses-

We have some losses which we regret. The statistical report shows a loss in membership. Several of our churches show a loss in Sunday School. We had a loss in our District Budget this year.

The Future—

Our future is in our own hands. United our District will grow! We have three home missionary projects. Two of the places have lots to build on, and each of the three have a small amont of money. Each of these places are asking the District for financial help. We also feel that in Pulaski and Galax there is an open door for us as a church.

If our District Camp Meeting is to be a success in the future, the entire District will have to get behind it with prayer, attendance and support.

Our District has a fine group of Ministers and lay members. They are people we have the utmost confidence in and I trust that we will accept the great challenge before us.

#### REPORT OF THE S. S. PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

To Virginia District Conference August 12, 1957

Greetings:

Having been honored and privileged to serve you in the capacity of District Promotional Secretary of Sunday Schools, I humbly submit the following report.

Statistical:

25 Sunday Schools in Virginia District

1936 average attendance in 1957

1855 average attendance in 1956

81 net increase over previous year

4% increase percentage-wise

77 average attending in Va. Sunday Schools-1957

13 Sunday Schools report a loss in average attendance

11 Sunday Schools report a gain in average attendance 1 shows no change

#### Analytical:

An analysis of the statistics given above brings a real concern and burden directly to my heart for the Sunday School work of our District. Every teacher, every Sunday School officer, and every church board should study these figures. Consider well our God appointed task. Look at the whitened harvest fields. Face our weak points as well as our strong ones and let's improve the picture at once for God and the kingdom. From the ranks of the Sunday School come 85% of our church membership. This alone is sufficient motive to labor zealously in this area.

During the past year, Danville Church under the direction of Rev. Lloyd Edge and the superintendency of Mr. C. F. Croder, has led the way in our District. Our congratulations to these men and their fine constitutency. Danville's numerical gain was 25 for the year which represented a 33% increase

over 1956. This brought them both certificates.

Norfolk did a splendid job and but for some difficult breaks would have been much higher. They have a gain of 23% for the year. Charlottesville came through wonderfully with a gain of 20%. Cristo was fourth with a gain of 15% and Christiansburg was fifth with a gain of 12%. We indeed sincerely honor the schools and staffs that have done so commendably. But our burden is to see the rest of our District catch fire and get into the joyous task of working together with Christ.

During the year we were highly honored to have Dr. Elliott and his staff with us in our District for two Zone Sunday School Institutes. These were a great blessing to those at-

tending. It has been a real privilege to serve on the planning committee for the 1st National Pilgrim Sunday School Convention and we earnestly hope that a number from our District will attend. If every church could only have one representative there, it would mean so much to the Sunday School in the coming years. Our conviction is that such gatherings as this convention will start something that will bring new life to our Sunday Schools.

Looking Ahead:

During the coming year, it is our earnest wish to be able to visit each of the Sunday Schools. Prayerfully we desire to assist in creating interest in this vital arm of the church. The District Council has given their approval to this plan and we hope to work with you and see an increase that we can be proud of in the coming year.

Be it resolved that we request the District Conference to appoint two from the District Council and the Youth Executive Council to plan the date and place for the 1958 Youth Camp.

Resolution be amended to read "that we request the District Conference to empower the Council to appoint two from the District Council."

Resolution and amendment passed.

Dorsey Howard and James Warner were appointed by Rev. Godwin as tellers for the election of officers.

Election was as follows:

Executive Secretary—Rev. James B. Godwin Treasurer—Rev. Dale Reynolds Recording Secretary—Rev. Eldon R. Hotle

Motion for adjournment was made by Miss Elsie Hurlburt at 4:30 P. M.

Motion carried.

Meeting closed with prayer by Rev. I. T. Dunn.

#### STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that as far as possible all appointments of committees shall be made so that each committee may meet simultaneously. Further that all committees shall meet on the last Saturday of District Camp, at the call of the chairman, and have their business ready for presentation.

2. Be it resolved that we have a District Camp Committee. The District Superintendent shall be the chairman. Other members of the committee shall be chairman of the following committees: Advertising, Finance, Tabernacle and Dining

Room.

.3 Be it resolved that our Youth Zone Chairmen have a minimum of two zone rallies each year.

4. Be it resolved that a set of rules be drawn up by the

District Council governing the dormitory and the camp ground. These shall be posted in conspicious places. Further the District Council shall appoint two men to serve as policemen to enforce these rules.

5. Be it resolved that each pastor support the District Camp by his presence and that he strongly urge his people to attend and support the camp. It is further recommended that the local churches provide the regular support for the pastors while they are at camp.

6. Be it resolved that Sunday School enrollments be corrected not oftener than the first of each quarter. Names shall not be dropped from the roll unless they were absent at least

4 Sundays of the quarter, sickness excepted.

7. Be it resolved that Sunday School workers meetings be held in strategic locations over the District to accomodate

groups of our churches.

- 8. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appound a Home Missionary Committee of two members to serve along with him in formulating the District Home Missionary program.
- 9. Be it resolved that each pastor try and bring the total Advocate subscriptions in his church up to the church membership that he serves.

10. Be it resolved that the District Council appoint two of its members to serve with the Youth Executive Council in

planning the date and place of the Youth Camp.

11. Be it resolved that a permanent date be set for the District Ministerial Convention with the District Council arranging the program and the workers.

12. Be it resolved that the report of receipts and expenditures for the District Camp be prepared and placed in the

minutes of the District the following year.

13. Be it resolved that all pastors within a radius of one hundred miles of the Camp Ground be required to come two days before Camp to help set things in readiness for the Camp and that those who live beyond this radius shall be required to stay over to dismantle and store things until needed again.

14. Be it resolved that the Youth Executive Secretary visit each church once during the year to encourage and inspire

our Youth work.

#### WAYS AND MEANS RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. We recommend that each church pound its pastor at least once a month.
- 2. We recommend that the Conference fee be \$4.00 per ministerial and lay delegate; and we further recommend that

each church having unstationed ministers within its membership who shall be present for the Conference shall pay said fee for them.

3. We recommend that each local treaurer forward to the district treasurer all offerings for general and district funds and the pastor's tithes by the last day of each month and that a receipt for same be sent to the sender immediately. We further recommend that all general church funds shall be sent to the General Treasurer by the last day of each month.

4. We recommend that each church contribute 10% of the REGULAR offerings of the Church, the Sunday School and the Youth Society to be sent to the District Treasurer each month for district obligations. Each church shall raise its General Budget of \$6.00 per member as assessed by the General Church in a manner best suited to the local situation. We further recommend that this General Budget be raised and sent in to the District Treasurer on a monthly basis.

5. We recommend that the District Conference pay the following amounts to these respective officers:

District Statistician .....\$35.00 District Secretary ...... 50.00 District Treasurer ......100.00 District Sunday School Promotional Secretary 50.00

- 6. We recommend that the ministers of the Virginia District pay their ministerial tithes through the local church treasurer to the District Treasurer for the support of the District Superintendent. It is further stipulated that the Superintendent's salary shall be set at \$65.00 per week with the addition of the following utilities, gas, lights and telephone. Any difference between the state salary and the tithes received shall be supplied from or applied on the Contingency Fund of the District Budget.
- 7. We recommend that when the Y. P. Executive Secretary shall visit each Church or Society, he shall be paid the sum of Five Dollars, plus travel expense at the rate of 3¢ per mile, The Executive Secretary shall visit churches or societies in groups of two or more at a time. In these services an offering shall be taken, any amount in excess of Five Dollars to go to the Young People's Treasurer, from which account the Executive Secretary's travel expense shall be paid. In his visits the Executive Secretary shall remind the church or society of its assessed obligation to the District Young People's organization.
- 8. We recommend that each YPS send \$1.00 per month to their District Treasurer and that each church or unorganized

society send a free-will offering to the District YPS Treasurer. This sum shall be used for operational expenses, with any balance being reserved for the next District Youth Camp. We further recommend that the District YPS Treasurer send quarterly notice of the assessments to the societies which shall be read in a regular Young People's Meeting.

- .9. We recommend that the District Council is authorized to rent the District Parsonage with the provision that the premises will be vacated for use during the Youth Camp and the regular District Camp. The proceeds from this rental shall go into the regular District Treasury to help defray expenses.
- 10. Whereas the Virginia Conference is committed officially and morally to the Eastern Pilgrim College Zone, and whereas the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has twice turned down a petition to rezone the Virginia District be it resolved that this Conference go on record as continuing our support of Eastern Pilgrim College and that a representative of said college be requested to visit each church in the Virginia District to assist in raising the budget for the Eastern Pilgrim College.

#### 11. We recommend the following:

- (1) That each pastor and local church board be responsible for each member of the local church becoming a member of the Camp Association or raising an offering equal to \$1.00 per member. These funds should be sent in to the District Treasurer before the beginning of the fourth quarter.
- (2) The engaged singers of the Camp be paid a sum not to exceed that paid to one exangelist. The sum to be reserved for the singing of the Camp whether the party workers consist of one, two or more workers.
- 3) The assessment of \$10.00 for all ministers with a salary of \$40.00 or less per week and \$15.00 for those ministers with a salary exceeding \$40.00 per week and this amount shall be placed in the Camp Expense Fund.
- (4) In no service shall an offering be taken for both camp expense and camp ground notes. Further that no preaching service (morning, afternoon or night) shall be devoted exclusively to raising moniees for this or any other purpose.
