JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

First Session

The Fifth Annual District Conference of the Wisconsin District opened by singing "There Shall Be Showers of Blessing". Rev. Edward Miller led the singing. Rev. James Hertel, President of Frankfort Pilgrim College led the conference in prayer.

Rev. R. G. Flexon, General Superintendent, was presented to the conference. He spoke on the work of the Church Extention districts. If the church has a program the people will work for a goal, and God will prosper that church. He stressed also the importance of our schools. Their primary object is not only to educate, but to have spirit-filled men to preach His Word.

It was moved and seconded that the ten seats in the middle aisle and the platform constitute the conference bar. (Carried)

It was moved and seconded that David Hollman be seated as a delegate from the Sparta Church. (Carried)

It was moved and seconded that the hour of sittings be from 10:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon, and from 1:30 p.m. until the business was completed. (Carried)

The Superintendent, Rev. R. A. Pegram, introduced Rev. and Mrs. Wingrove Ives, pastoring at Hills-boro Church, and Rev. and Mrs. Edward Miller from the West Virginia District, pastoring at Exeland Church. They all gave wonderful testimonies of God's blessing on their lives. A motion was made and seconded that they be received into the Wisconsin District. (Carried)

The report of the District Superintendent was read. A motion was made and seconded that it be accepted. (Carried)

The reception committee presented to the conference Rev. James Hertel, President of Frankfort College, Frankfort, Indiana, and Rev. John Blann. Superintendent of Jembo Mission, of our foreign missionary work in Africa. A motion was made and seconded that they be granted honorary seats within the conference bar. (carried)

It was moved and seconded that we accept the Treasurer's report of the District and Camp Meeting funds. (carried)

The Sunday School Committee's report was given by Rev. Clinton Woods. It was moved and seconded that the report be accepted. (carried)

The report of the Youth Committee was given by Rev. Carroll Upton. God blessed His Word, and twelve out of the thirty-nine campers sought the Lord for salvation. It was moved and seconded that we accept this report. (carried)

The Educational and Examining Board recommended that Rev. Edsel Goins be ordained. A motion was made and seconded to accept this recommendation from the Educational and Examining Board. (carried)

The report of the Conference Action Committee was read. (All resolutions that were carried, or amended and carried, may be found in detail in these minutes, in the committee report.)

The secretary of the Conference Action Committee read the resolutions. All Resolutions were adopted with the exception of Resolution 5, which was amended to read "advise", instead of "approve". It was moved and seconded that this report be accepted with its amendment. (carried)

A motion was made to recess. (carried)

Our District Superintendent opened the service with prayer. He then introduced the General Superintendent, Rev. R. G. Flexon. He read from Romans 10: 14. The theme of his message was "The Need of the Preacher as a Leader". His four points were as follows:

- 1. The pastor and his preaching
- 2. The pastor and his planning
- 3. The pastor and his people
- 4. The pastor and his praying

A motion was made and seconded to dispense with roll call. (carried)

The District Statistician's report was given. It was moved and seconded that the report be accepted. (carried)

The pastors' reports were given with the glow of their victories in their present fields. God is on the move in Wisconsin. A hearty "Amon" was given to receive these reports.

A motion was made and seconded that the Secretary of the District write a letter of appreciation to Miss Ethel Jordan. (carried)

Rev. R. C. Hawkins, Church Extension Secretary, reported of the action of the General Board of May, 1960, that the following be appointed for the year:

Rev. R. A. Pegram, District Superintendent Rev. Paul Hollmann, District Secretary Rev. Carroll Upton, District Treasurer

The election of officers was the next order of business. Rev. R. A. Pegram, Superintendent, appointed tellers: William Blann and David Hollmann. Rev. Edsel Goins and William Blann were elected to the District Council. Rev. R. W. Ives was elected for three years and Rev. Clinton Woods for one year to the Educational and Examining Board.

Mrs. Clinton Woods gave a report of the Memorial Committee. It was moved and seconded that we accept this report. (carried)

A motion carried that our conference year be from July 1st to June 30.

The Rev. R. C. Hawkins spoke on District Finances and asked everyone to try to raise the 5% budget for the District welfare.

A motion was made and seconded that we adjourn by prayer. Carried.

REPORT OF CONTERENCE ACTION CONNITTEE

- 1. Be it resolved that the Local Church District Expense Assessment be set at 5% of all local church offerings. This amount not to include Sunday School Offerings, building funds, evangelistic offerings or other special offerings raised for General Church purposes:
- 2. Be it resolved that the financial budget for the district be composed of the following income sources:
 - Approx. Est. Amt.
 - A. General Church Service Fund (from Church Extension Dept.)....\$4800.00
 - B. Local Church District Assessment (© 5% of regular offerings)..........750.00
 - C. District Supt. Meetings Offerings. (28 meetings @ \$15.00 average).....400.00
 - D. District Youth Zone Rallies and S. S. Promotional Mtgs. Offerings (14 meetings @ \$10.00 per meeting)..140.00
 TOTAL...\$6090.00

The local church District Expense Assessment Fund must be collected to cover the following items:

- 1. District Supt. Expenses Beyond church meetings.
- Expense of District Delegates to General Conferences.
- 3. Council Members! travel expense.
- 4. S. S. and Youth Convention speaker expenses.
- 5. Ministerial Convention expenses.
- 6. Miscallaneous expenses in connection with opening new churches.
- 7. Pilgrim Pension Plan Payment for Dist. Supt.
- 8. General miscellaneous.
- 3. Be it resolved that the Conference Action Committee meet before the publication of the Official Minutes in order to advise the Editing Committee concerning the standing rules and report.

STANDING RULES

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- 1. Be it resolve that the existing memorial Committee also function as a memoirs committee: and in a separal e portion of the district minutes, tribute be payed to those of our membership who have deceased during the conference year.
- 2. Be it resolved that each church be required to have adequate insurance protection, including public liability.
 - 3. Be it resolved that a meeting be held each September and called by the District Super-intendent to familiarize the ministers of the district with the current program of the district for the new year.
 - t. Be it resolved that an installation service be conducted by the District Superintendent, or someone appointed by him, for each incoming paster to a local church within the district.
 - 5. Be it resolved that we adhere to the frequency of the Lord's Supper no less as often as is set forth in the manual.
 - 6. Inasmuch as the Lord's Supper is a meaningful and important service, be it resolved that care be taken to keep this service in the hands of the respective pastors.
 - 7. Inas such as Christian baptism is a sacrament held by the Church, be it resolved that each pastor take care to give his congregation sufficient opportunity for baptism.
 - 8. Be it resolved that the district trustees be compose of three members of the district council, appointed by the council.
 - 9. Be it resolved that the district council be the camp meeting board.

- 10. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appoint all committees. A list of appointment shall be submitted to the District Council for approval.
 - ll. Be it resolved that all district resolutions become standing rules one year after their adoption. Be it further resolved that the date of adoption be inserted parenthetically.
 - 12. Be it resolved that the lo cal treasurers balance their books at the end of each month and forward all District and General funds immediately to the District Treasurer.
 - 13. Be it resolved that all evangelists within the church and also all Christian workers that represent works outside our denomination, be approved by the District Council or the District Superintendent before conducting services in our churches.
 - 14. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and pastors of our churches be given two weeks vacation with pay.
 - 15. Be it resolved that our pastors be limited to 15 days away from their respective fields in revivals unless otherwise approved by the District Council.
 - 16. Be it resolved that all plans for building, remodeling and financing of any construction to cost in excess of \$500.00 be submitted to the District Council for approval before construction is begun.
 - 17: Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be chairman of the Educational and Examining Boards.
- 18. Be it resolved that a Filgrim Fellowship be formed in our unorganized churches.
 - 19. Be it resolved that all unstationed ministers submit annual reports to the District Superintendent and the District Statistician.

20. Be it resolved that a committee be formed to bring all matters of legislation and finance to the conference. The committee shall be called "The Conference Action Committee." Be it further resolved that 5 persons be appointed to serve on this committee, and to meet at least one month prior to the District Conference. The Committee Secretary shall send all pastors a copy of the Resolutions proposed by the committee to be presented to the local churches.

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- 21. Be it resolved that the offerings taken at District Sunday School Promotional meetings and District Youth Zone Rallies, be sent to the district treasurer. It is to be expected that these offerings adequately cover the expenses involved (\$10.00 minimum average per meeting).
- 22. Be it resolved that an offering be received at the District Superintendents visits to the churches. This amount to be sent by the local treasurer to the District Treasurer in addition to the budget. It is to be expected that these offerings adequately cover his traveling expenses.
- 23. Be it resolved that all District officials be paid travel expense at rate of 3¢ per mile, plus meals when traveling for District work approved by Council.
- 24. Be it resolved that the 4% assessment of the Pilgrim Pension Plan for the District Superintendent be paid by the District Treasurer.
- 25. Be it resolved that no assessment be levied against the District churches without the conse of the Conference or Council.
- 26. Be it resolved that 5% of the District Budget be set aside for General Conference delegate expenses.
 - 27. Be it resolved that the following amounts be paid toward the United Stewardship Fund in

keeping with the legislation of the 1958 General Conference.

- 28. Inasmuch as our District activities should have the full support of each pastor and his constituency, and whereas there is a possibility of conflicting dates due to local and district planning, be it resolved that the various committees and their district leaders submit to the District Secretary, by September 15th, the dates of plained conventions, rallies, etc.; these and other dates of importance shall be included in a calendar of events which shall be compiled by the secretary and distributed to each pastor.
- 29. Inasmuch as publicity is important in churc work, especially in the work of church extersion, and where we as a district have no for all news agency, be it resolved that the district reporter to provide news coverage regarding district and general church activities. The articles shall be written in the best form possible and be approved by the district superintendent. A copy of news articles shall be given to each pastor to submit to his local newspaper.
 - 30. Inasmuch as it is fitting to honor retired Pilgrim ministers and their wives who have given
 years of service in the Lord's work, be it resolved that due recognition be given when possible for services rendered to the church. Be
 it further resolved that they be given any concessions due to the regular ministry; such as
 reduction of rates during camp meeting; etc.
 - 31. Addition to Resolution #21 (amendment), and meet one month prior to the District Conference and send pastors a copy of the proposed resolutions.

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- 32. Be it resolved that in the election of church delegates to the District Conference, specific consideration be given to the following objectives:
 - 1. He shall be able to properly represent his local church in any conference action.
 - 2. The local church shall instruct the delegate with regard to any proposed conference resolution.
- 33. Be it resolved that each pastor teach a class in Manual for all new members or other members of his church who have not had the opportunity to attend such a class before. This class to be offered at least once a year.
- 34. Inasmuch as it is good business policy, and for the good of all concerned, be it resolved that the district treasurer be bonded.
- 35. Be it resolved that Resolution #7 of last years Ways and Means Committee report be deleted until such time as we again acquire a District Parsonage.
- 36. Be it resolved that the amounts to be paid toward the United Stewardship Fund in keeping with the Legislation of the 1958 General Conference, be revised to \$4.00 per member for this conference year. The Membership basis used to be that reported at the 1959 District Conference.
- 37. Be it resolved that we adopt the following goals which have been established by District Superintendent Pegram:
 - 1. Continued effort in the direction of a goal for 12 churches by 1962.
 - 2. Fully organize 3 churches this year.
 - 3. District membership totaling 200 by next conference.
 - 4. District Sunday School attendance average of 400 by next conference.
