# **JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS**

**Gaines, Michigan**

**June 30, 1958**

## **First Sitting**

The First Sitting of the Third Annual East Michigan District Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:00 a.m., June 30, 1958, at the Camp Grounds in Gaines, Michigan.

Rev. W. N. Miller, District Superintendent, called the Conference to order with remarks concerning the good Camp Meeting just closed and the many souls who had found help at our altars. Rev. Gerald MacDonald led in the singing of "I Love To Tell The Story." Rev. Gunsalus, President of Eastern Pilgrim College led in the opening prayer.

Rev. Miller then announced that Rev. and Mrs. Lawrence Neff and Rev. and Mrs. D. Wayne Brown, members of this Conference, would attend funeral services of Mrs. Wm. Neff, wife of our beloved General Superintendent, today; and that Rev. Harold C. Rickner would return to his church to conduct a funeral this afternoon.

Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary-Treasurer, was introduced to the Conference as presiding officer. Rev. Beltz brought a short message on the theme, "Paul a Leader of Men" and used Acts 27th Chapter as the basis for his message. He emphasized that leaders be brave in times of emergency and that we as Christians, are faced with the responsibility that God has called us in this day to be leaders in the things of God.

The roll was called by Rev. G. V. Skinner, District Secretary.

By common consent the Conference Bar was designated to be the first ten seats in the middle sections only those seats opposite to the left and right, and the platform. Also that the time of the sittings be from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00, 1:30 to 5:00 p.m. and from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m.

Rev. Miller read his report, and presented several objectives for the Conference to achieve this year. The report was accepted.

Auditors reports, not read to the conference, accompanied each treasurer's report.

The first sitting recessed by expiration of time, Mrs. Whited dismissed in prayer.

## Second Sitting

The Second Sitting convened at 1:30 p.m. with Rev. Skinner playing on the Piano, "What A Friend We Have In Jesus." Rev. J. I. Bare led in prayer.

Rev. Beltz then told the Conference of the action taken by the last General Conference with reference to union of the Pilgrim Holiness Church with the Wesleyan Methodist Church. He then explained the method by which the Wesleyan Methodist Church would act upon the contemplated union of the two churches.

The report of the Examining and Educational Board was read by the District Secretary in the absence of Rev. Lawrence Neff.

Rev. Andrew Counterman, now pastoring the North River Road Church at Port Huron, was received from the Free Methodist Church into our Conference.

A resolution was read by Rev. C. Hendrick, Secretary for the Resolutions Committee. It was moved and carried. A moment of silent prayer was followed by prayer by Rev. Beltz for Rev. Neff.

The District Superintendent appointed the following tellers: Wm. Doe, Wm. Lyons, R. Diehl, Ted Neely, David Dean, Duwayne Mead.

It was moved and carried that ballots be counted in private and that only the results thereof be announced by the District Secretary.

After a season of silent prayer, ballots were first cast for District Superintendent.

Mrs. Eula Warner, representing Stevens Van Lines, and Rev. Ray Beuthin were introduced to the Conference.

Ballots were cast for Advisory members to the District Council, following which the Conference recessed for ten minutes while tellers counted the ballots.

Examining and Education Board, Rev. Lester Nelson.

Camp Board, Rev. Ted Neely and K. J. Phillips.

It was moved and carried that the Conference elect the Sunday School Promotional Secretary from nominations submitted by the District



Council and that the Council appoint the third member of the committee. Ballots were cast for Promotional Secretary and Rev. Wilbert Walker was elected.

Rev. Wm. Lyons read for the Ways and Means Committee two resolutions, the latter of which was recommended by the Committee, concerning District Budget.

Motion was carried to extend the time ten minutes.

The sitting adjourned by expiration of time with prayer by Rev. Skinner.

### **Third Sitting**

The Third Sitting of the Conference convened at 7:00 p.m., June 30, 1958, with Rev. G. V. Skinner playing the piano. Rev. Harold C. Rickner led in prayer. Rev. Beltz read Ezekiel 2, speaking on the subject "How To Stand Up and Take It." The minutes of the previous sittings were read and approved.

Dr. C. W. Butler was given an honorary seat within the conference bar.

It was moved that the first half of the resolution concerning District United Stewardship Fund be referred to the Ways and Means Committee for re-drafting and to be brought to the Conference in the next sitting. This motion carried.

Rev. R. D. Gunsalus, President of Eastern Pilgrim College, spoke concerning the financial interest of the College.

It was moved and carried that the entire resolution regarding District United Stewardship Fund be referred to the Ways and Means Committee until the morning.

Rev. C. R. Hendrick, reported for the Resolution Committee. It was moved and carried that Resolution No. 1, regarding Standing Rule No. 1 in the Journal, be tabled until Resolution No. 2 has been considered.

It was moved and carried that the last three words of Resolution No. 2 be deleted.

It was moved and carried Resolution No. 2 be accepted.

Rev. Hendrick re-read Resolution No. 1. It was carried.

It was moved and carried that we again reconsider Resolution No. 2.

After much discussion the Resolution was passed. Adjourned by expiration of time.

After announcements and the singing of "We'll work Till Jesus Comes," Rev. A. S. Joppie dismissed in prayer.

## **Fourth Sitting**

The fourth sitting of the East Michigan Conference convened at 9:00 a.m., July 1, 1958. Rev. C. R. Hendrick led in the singing of "Close To Thee." Rev. Ruth Alexander offered prayer.

Rev. Beltz, chairman read I Corinthians 9:16-27.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

Rev. Hendrick reported for the Resolution Committee.

It was moved and carried that all resolutions regarding finance be mimeographed and sent to all pastors and treasurers.

The following resolutions were passed:

No. 5 regarding deletion in Standing Rule No. 3

No. 6 regarding S. S. Committee financial plan.

After announcements the Conference adjourned by expiration of time. All joined in the singing of the "Doxology." Rev. R. A. Beltz dismissed with prayer.

## **District Superintendent Report**

Mr. Chairman, delegates and friends of the third annual conference of the East Mich. District of the Pilgrim Holiness church; Greetings !!

The past church year has been a momentous year (1957-1958), in many respects. Science has discovered and unleashed potential powers which could easily destroy our civilization; or if used for good, could create in our world a literal Garden of Eden.

Rockets powered by a new type of liquid fuel are breaking into the secrets of outer space. National leaders and informed scientists most aware of imminent danger, are constantly fearful of what could happen today or tomorrow. Nevertheless the words of Jesus to the church; "Behold the fields are white unto harvest, pray ye therefore the Lord of harvest that He will send forth laborers into the harvest" "Occupy until I come" "Lo I am with you always even unto the end of the world" give the church the same charge, challenge and direction; whether in peace or at war, prosperity or depression. In fact world conditions should have little effects on the efforts of the christian, since he has a task to perform, and the heart needs of men are the same through all the changing processes of time. Therefore let us be about our fathers business.

### CHURCHES AIDED BY THE DISTRICT

We were thrilled a year ago to report that we organized 3 new churches and opened 3 other new works. With this in mind we were all ready to endeavor to duplicate the same this past year. When the council met to survey the possibilities of starting new churches we were faced with the plain facts that while we might do so, there were three or four churches that were on the edge of failure if they did not receive some District aid. At the same time these churches evidenced real potential for strength and growth if helped at this critical time. We agreed that this was an emergency and that we could gain nothing by starting two or three new churches while closing two or three that did hold possibilities. I am happy to report to you that this decision has paid off. The fact that the District did step in and aid these churches not only pulled them out of financial troubles but also lifted their spiritual morale from discouragement and depression to encouragement and confidence. As a result: **FLINT PASADENA** - erected and dedicated a parsonage valued at \$17,000. at a total cost of \$8,000.

**IDA CHURCH** - which erected a new parsonage last year; should be self supporting this year and ready to organize.

**LENNON** - The District paid off a previous debt against the Lennon church, enabling them to make a number of substantial improvements themselves. This church also has real possibilities.

**NORTH RIVER RD. PORT HURON** - Received some help until they were able to negotiate a loan locally. After receiving this loan from the bank in Port Huron, they have reimbursed the District.

**FENTON & GRAND BLANC RD.** - Our District Missionary society gave this church a lift by contributing over a hundred dollars toward a new water system.

### CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS

I shall only mention the buying or building of new churches or parsonages here; and the rest of improvements will be listed in our District paper "Pilgrim News and Views".

**FLINT PASADENA** - Pastor, Rev. O. McCoy, as I have mentioned erected and dedicated a lovely new parsonage valued at 17,000.

**FLUSHING** - Pastor Rev. B. B. Taylor erected a fine new superstructure and dedicated same. This church is real credit to our District.

**FLINT HILL RD.** - Pastor Rev. Frank Kingen, erected and dedicated a lovely new 4 bedroom ranchtype parsonage, with an indebttness of only \$5,000.

**SAGINAW** - Pastor Rev. J. Bare, erected and dedicated an edifice which gives them a building, practically new size 42 by 64.

**ANN ARBOR** - Pastor Rev. G. MacDonald. Rev. A. F. Osborn, former pastor made negotiations for a new parsonage and Rev. G. MacDonald completed the transaction. They now have a nice new parsonage in a beautiful section of Ann Arbor.

**DETROIT BURT RD.** - Pastor Rev. C. R. Hendrick, purchased a parsonage just opposite the church on Burt Rd., and redecorated it throughout.

**FLINT BROWN ST.** - Pastor Rev. W. D. Phillips, moved the old parsonage to a new location and practically made a new one out of it.

### DISTRICT YOUTH WORK

Our district youth work, Rev. Gerald MacDonald, president and his fine council have made remarkable progress this year. They are purchasing these 13 youth barrack cottages you see on the camp grounds, and are making further plans in cooperation with the District for first class youth camp facilities.

I regret that Bro MacDonald has resigned this position. Rev. Wm. Doe pastor of North Lakeport has been elected to this youth presidency. Let us all give him our noblest cooperation this year.

### DISTRICT SUNDAY SCHOOL

Our district S.S. organization headed by Rev. Wilbert Walker is making fine strides. We have actually shown a small gain in the face of all the tailspins our records suffered by Asiatic Flu (and some other Flu) last fall and winter. I frankly confess that last Jan. I entertained doubts that we could possibly show any gains.

### NEW CAMP GROUNDS

A year ago today we were facing the task of building entire new campgrounds facilities. This picture is now completely changed. All of you probably know how God directed Dr. Butler and his fine board and council to offer these grounds here at Gaines to us if we would promise to carry on the preaching and teaching of FULL SALVATION at least annually until Jesus comes.

With that agreement plus a few minor arrangement, this property was placed fully in our charge, free of debt.

Our hearts have been sweetly blessed and humbled when we think of the stalwart Bible Pilgrims who brought these grounds, erected these buildings and above all, preached salvation and sanctification down through the 49 years till this day. Standing in their midst as a stately tree of God, through all these years, as leader and humble servant, is none other than our present evangelist and Honorary chairman of the association, Dr. C. W. Butler. May his mantle fall on some of us when God calls him home.

### CHURCH EXTENSION FELLOWSHIP

This is the finest organization for starting new churches in our District. Brethern let us not die from disinterest or lack of cooperation. We now have in this district six splendid churches that are largely the result of this plan. We can enhance this to our people if we will.

This last year our members sent in about \$1,110. for a new parsonage at North River Rd., Port Huron. They are in the process of building at this time.

Another call has gone out for Lennon and the results are not all in yet. Keep up the good work.

We hope to aid two new District projects this year through this fine membership.

### DISTRICT PAPER

In January of this year we resumed the publication of our District paper. It has been named "Pilgrim News and Views". Rev. Ruth N. Alexander is the editor. We have heard many favorable comments on our little paper, even from other Districts; and feel this paper is what our people have been asking for.

### SUGGESTED PROGRAM FOR 58-59

#### 1

A united "Prayer and Fasting League", District wide, effected on the local level. I place this first because we know that the finest framework or structure of organization is but a dry skeleton without deep devotion, on our part and the moving of the Holy Spirit through us, on Gods part.

#### 2

A district wide, "Local church lay visitation and evangelism" program. This department of Christ's program has become anemic in our church, not so much from lack of enthusiasm but from lack of teaching, example and a practical organized program. This will be brought to us at the proper time and I wish your consideration and cooperation.

#### 3

A goal for "Church Membership Gain". Our district has had an average annual gain the past 17 years of 157 or 8½% each year

I would like to suggest a goal of at least 5% net gain per church this year. This will only be a gain of 92 members for the district; however, if each church will earnestly attempt to acheive a 5% gain or more should exceed this mere 92 membership gain.

4

The most real gain in membership through the past years in our district has been by the process of opening and organizing new home Missionary churches, while many of our older churches gain membership there are always those who lose enough to offset this gain.

I therefore propose that we by the help of the Lord and interest of our people establish two new churches this year, and at least two new branch Sunday schools.

We have two prospects right now for new churches and one branch S.S.

5

It has always seemed strange to me that, while the government taxes us according to our financial strength and not by the number we have in our families, and Gods financial plan is based upon a tihe of our income and not by how many children we have yet: our church general and district, asks us to pay according to the membership of our church family regardless of our financial income. This is easy on some but works a hardship on others, and, lets face it, discourages increase in church membership.

Therefore I heartily recommend that we give due consideration to the "United Stewardship" plan to be brought to us by the Ways and Means committee.

6

I further recommend that we accept a resolution coming to us by the resolutions committee, concerning a "Pastors Conference" of at least 3 days and in cooperation with our General Supt. Dr. W. H. Neff.

7

Our district Sunday School organization can be a powerful arm of our church, reaching into fields that we have never touched. This department could shift some of the load from the District Supt. and council while still remaining entirely under their supervision. Our District S.S. department is offering some projects and plans through the proper channels to this conference.

8

Our youth department is likewise ready to share the load and is already a live, strong branch, furnishing vision, life and activity to the District program, and its progress. Lets us adopt their program.

9

I also suggest that this conference grant the council the liberty to sell the property at Goodrich, wherever a proper sale can be arranged and that a two point program of exspansion be launched for our present campgrounds.

1. Purchase new acreage
2. New sanitation system.

With deep gratitude to God, without whose directives none of this would be possible; with thanks to a cooperative and considerate council Department and commuttee leaders and appreciation of Gods called ministers and faithful layman; I submit at this my personal report.

## **DISTRICT RESOLUTIONS**

Be it resolved that this conference send flowers and a telegram to our beloved General Superintendent and family expressing our sympathy at this time of bereavement by the homegoing of his wife and loved one.

1. Whereas the closing of the present church year comes in conflict with the changing of Sunday School Quarterlies, Teacher's and Officer's thereby creating confusion.

Therefore be it resolved, that standing rule no. 1, page 26, be changed to read: "The Conference year shall close June 30th, and all reports shall be mailed in by July 10th.

2. Be it resolved that the Camp-Meeting date be set to begin the second Friday in July.

3. Be it resolved that the words, "At Conference Time", be deleted from standing rule No. 10, page 28.

4. Be it resolved that standing rule No 18, page 29 be revised to read that the "First week in June" be designated as the time for our churches to vote on the recall of the Pastor. This vote shall be taken by secret ballot but shall not be counted in the local church but will be sent directly to the Superintendent, who shall report the results of the voting immediately to the pastor and secretary.

No postoral charges will be recommended until the ballots are in his hands.

5. Be it resolved that resolution No. 5, page 24 be placed in the Standing Rules.

6. Be it resolved that the words, "Ministerial convention Committee" be dropped from resolution No. 16, page 28 of the Conference Journal, and the words, "Pastor's Conference Committee" be substituted. They shall arrange the program, set the date, the place, and notify all ministers. Be it resolved that said Committee set the date and make plans for a one day Ministerial Retreat.

7. Be it resolved that the District Council be empowered to sell the land on Highway 15, formerly purchased for a Camp-Site, and to purchase acreage in connection with the present camp site.

8. Whereas the Conference of 1950 adopted what was known as The Michigan Conference Church Extension Plan. And whereas assessments to the amount of \$1.25 appears under the title Budget, page 18 in the minutes of that year, and whereas from editing error, or other reason, nothing is in the Minutes;

Therefore be it resolved that this conference adopt the plan and Constitution presented and accepted by the 1950 Conference, subject to revisions by the Council which are necessary to bring it in line with our present plan of operation. Further, be it resolved that when completed by the council that a mimeographed copy be placed in the hands of each licensed and ordained minister of the Conference, and that a separate and detailed report of this finance be given at each Conference hereafter.

9. Be it resolved that the following goals be adopted for our Sunday School's this year. Namely -

1. A 5% gain in Sunday School Attendance.
2. Enroll 1000 new scholars.
3. Greater cooperation with General and District Sunday School program.
4. Encourage regular Sunday School Board Meeting's, and Sunday School Worker's Conference's.
5. A more accurate method of keeping records.

10. Whereas there is a definite need for a more uniform plan of operation in our Sunday School's and,

Whereas there should be a greater understanding and closer working between Local Sunday School's and the District Sunday School Department.

Therefore be it resolved that there shall be a Pastor's and Sunday School Superintendent's Conference held in each Zone. For the purpose of meeting and solving our problems. And a correlation of ideas that would greatly benefit in promoting Sunday School Work.

11. Whereas it is recognized that to have a sound and aggressive Sunday School, it is necessary that our Teachers, Co-Teachers and Officers be well informed in their field.

Therefore Be it resolved that the District Sunday School Committee promote a Teacher's Training Course in each Local Church.

12. Whereas there is a great need of advancing the work of God, and since it is generally recognized that the Sunday School is a great feeder for established churches, and sometimes the beginning of new ones.

Therefore be it resolved that the District Sunday School Department be responsible for starting five Branch Sunday School's this coming year. Be it further resolved that the method for securing a location and promoting these Sunday School's be as follows:

1. That there be a planning committee composed of the District Superintendent, District Sunday School Committee, and three members in each Zone, who shall investigate and decide on a suitable location for starting a Branch Sunday School within the respective Zone.

2. When a suitable location is decided upon, the churches in that Zone will contribute personnel and finance for carrying on the work under a leader agreed upon by said committee of that Zone. And where it is possible, a preaching service to be held by one of our Licensed or Local Preacher's.

3. That the appointed leader will work under, and be amenable to the District Sunday School Committee and the three members representing the Zone.

13. Whereas the entire program of General Conference seemed to present a forward and aggressive program, and,

Whereas one of the things urged upon each of our District's was a plan for, "Lay Visitation" and "Personal Soul-Winning".

Therefore be it resolved that we adopt the following plan, to be know as "Personal Soul-Winning and Lay Visitation Plan."

1. That a committee of not more than three be appointed by the District Superintendent, who's work will be;

(a) To lay out a course of Study. (b) To appoint committee's and instructor's in each Zone, and advise in organizing classes. (c) To gather information and give reports on progress and accomplishments.

2. Be it further resolved (a) That there be an entense effort on the part of the Pastor to attend all classes, and that he inlist as many of the leyety of his church as possible. (b) That a cerificate of accomplishment be given to all who finish the course.

3. Also be it resolved that at sometime during the period of instructions or immediately after, the Pastor of each church will organize in his or her church a group of Soul Winning and Lay Visitation, and set up files and records recommended by the committee, and that these be kept as permanant records of the church.

14. The Prayer and Fasting League of the East Michigan Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

1. Be it resolved that in keeping with the program of our Church that we urge each Church in our Conference to organize a Prayer and Fasting League.

2. The objectives of the Prayer and Fasting League shall be:

1. The Prayer and Fasting League is not to take the place of the regular church mid-week prayer meeting.

2. The membership of this league shall be directed to pray for the general interests of our church at home and abroad.

(3) We urge that the membership of the League be encouraged to pray for local community needs.

4. That where the Pastor feels it advisable a list of definite needs be provided for each member covering such things as:

Unsaved families in the community.

Unsaved families in the Sunday School.

Unsaved individuals.

Definite church objectives and needs.

### 3. ORGANIZATION;

1. The Pastor shall act as director of the Prayer and Fasting League.

2. SECRETARY: On the recommendation of the Pastor of one or more names the Official Board shall appoint a Secretary to work with the Pastor.

3. The Secretary shall form a membership list.

Membership of the Prayer and Fasting League shall be volunteers members of the Church, Sunday School and Youth Society, and friends of the Church.

4. The membership shall be kept active by being revised twice each year. September 1st. and March 1st., of each Conference year.

5. Whereas this is a new Conference venture, we hereby ask that the next Ministerial Meeting of this Conference set aside one hour for open discussion of this District Project, that a better understanding and organization may be perfected at our next District Conference.

15. Since, in the kind providence of God, we have come to this Conference sessions without the loss of one member of the Ministerial Family of the East Michigan District; be it resolved that the Conference stand for a moment of silent prayer of thanksgiving, after which all shall join in the singing of the Doxology, which shall be led by the Rev. G. V. Skinner, District Superintendent

16. Be it resolved that we give Rev. Miller, District Superintendent, a raising vote of thanks for his efficient leadership during the Camp and Conference.

17. Be it resolved that we give the cooks a rising vote of thanks.

18. Be it resolved that we give Rev. R. A. Beltz, chairman of the Conference, a rising vote of thanks for his efficient leadership during the Conference.

19. Be it resolved that the East Michigan Conference subscribe in principle to the 25c per member per month program of Eastern Pilgrim College, and pledges its prayful support to this new relationship. The amount to be included in the District Budget represents our first year commitment during this transition period

20. Children's Meeting - Be it resolved that we have children's meetings during the afternoon and evening services.

Be it further resolved that the Council secure a youth director and children's director to plan activities between services.

## Ways and Means Committee Resolutions

1. Whereas the General Church has changed the term "Budgets" to "United Stewardship Fund";

Therefore be it resolved that Resolution No. 2, page 26 Conference Journal, where it reads "Church Budget", be changed to read "United Stewardship Fund."

2. Whereas the present method of securing finances to promote the District and General work is irregular and unequal, and some churches with many members have low finance and some churches with fewer members have high finance, and whereas we are in full accord with the plan of God, namely tithes and offerings for financing the work of the Kingdom, and advise our people to tithe their income into the local church:

Therefore be it resolved that each local Church pay 10% of their entire church receipts each month to the District Treasurer,

Be it further resolved that the District Treasurer send the equivalent of \$8.00 per member to the General Treasurer of the General United Stewardship Fund, and that the District United Stewardship Fund be divided as follows:

District Church Extension .....	25%
District Church Extension Loan Fund .....	16%
Eastern Pilgrim College .....	19%
Ministerial Relief .....	8%
General Delegate Expense .....	4%
Administrative Fund .....	28%

3. Whereas there has never been a stipulation as to the entertainment of the District Superintendent and his family during Camp and Conference:

Therefore be it resolved that the District Superintendent, his wife and members of his family under 16 years of age be given meals and lodging without charge during the Annual Camp and Conference. Be it further resolved that the District Treasurer pay out of the Administrative fund, the Pension Plan for the District Superintendent.

4. Be it resolved that paragraph 2, 3, & 4 under District and General Fund, Standing Rule No. 3 be deleted.

5. Be it resolved that the District Sunday School Committee present a more adequate financial plan to the district Council for their ratification, and that this plan when ratified be given to every local Sunday School.

6. Be it resolved that we give Rev. Beltz a vote of thanks and take a loveoffering for Mrs. Beltz.

7. Be it resolved that 10% of the Local Missionary Societies regular offerings to be sent to the District Missionary Treasurer, for yearly projects and District expense.

8. Whereas the majority of Pilgrim Holiness Ministers of the East Michigan Conference have expressed keen interest for their participation in the Blue Cross-Blue Shield movement on a group basis.

Be it resolved that this Conference shall as an integral part of its official functions sponsor and promote the enrollment of its assigned ministers, and full time clerical employees of the District.

The Treasurer of this District Shall be instructed to act for the District and for the ministers and clerical personell in contracting the representatives of Michigan Hospital Service and Michigan Medical Service. The Treasurer of the District shall collect all periodic subscription for the enrolled Ministers and clerical personnel, and deposit the money in the District Treasury. The Treasurer shall be empowered to make payment of the total Blue Cross-Blue Shield subcriptions for the District be check drawn against the District Treasury. This District shall make available to the Treasurer such additional funds as he may require in undertaking this responsibility.

A committee of three ministers from this District shall be appointed by the District Superintendent to assist the Treasurer in such a way as the Superintendent may request. This committee shall be know as the Committee on Blue Cross-Blue Shield Enrollment.

9. Be it resolved that all ministers be required to give five days labor without pay per year to the District at the call of the Council or Camp Meeting Board.

## **Standing Rules**

### **NO. 1 - CONFERENCE YEAR**

The Conference year shall close on June 30 and all reports must be directly to the Statistician by July 10.

### **NO. 2 - UNITED STEWARDSHIP FUND**

Whereas the present method of securing financies to promote the District and General work is irregular and equal and some churches with many members have low finance and some churches with fewer members have high finance, and whereas we are in full accord with the plan of God, namely tithes and offerings for financing the work of the Kingdom, and advise our people to tithe their income into the local church: Therefore be it resolved that each Church pay 10% of their entire church receipts each month to the District Treasurer,

Be it further resolved that the District Treasurer send the equivalent of \$8.00 per member to the General Treasurer for the General United Stewardship Fund, and that the District United Stewardship Fund be divided as follows:

#### **No. 9 - CREDENTIALS**

The District Superintendent shall have read Section 105 and 107 of the Manual instructing all District licentiates that hereafter they shall appear before the District Examining Board before their credentials shall be granted.

#### **No. 10 - CAMP MEETING FUNDS**

The District Treasurer shall submit an itemized report of Camp Meeting Funds as recorded in the 1945 Conference Journal, page 13. This report to appear in the Journal.

#### **No. 11 - APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEE**

The District Council shall appoint all committees. The Standing committees are to be appointed to include new men where possible and to avoid the duplication of men on several committees. It is recommended that the entire constituency be considered.

#### **No. 12 - BUILDING COMMITTEE**

The District Council shall appoint a Building Committee composed of three members who have experience in the work of acoustics, architecture and construction. All churches and church boards must have the approval of said committee before the purchase of building sites or the erecting of buildings or improvements in excess of \$500.00.

#### **No. 13 - BURIAL BENEFITS**

All actively engaged ministers and their wives of the District shall be enrolled in the Ministerial Benefit Association. Cost of membership and calls shall be paid from the Treasuries of the department that employs them. Complete resolution appears in Standing Rule No. 20 of the 1947 Journal.

#### **No. 14 - VACATIONS**

It is recommended that our churches grant their pastors a two-weeks vacation with pay. The District Superintendent shall be given a two-weeks vacation with pay.

#### **No. 15 - PASTOR'S CONFERENCE COMMITTEE**

Be it resolved that a committee of six be appointed as a Pastor's Conference Committee by the District Council; that two be appointed for three years, two for two years, two for one year, and that two shall be appointed each year respectively. The Pastor's Conference Committee shall arrange the program, set the date, the place, and notify all ministers. Be it resolved that said Committee set the date and make plans for a one day ministerial Retreat.

#### **No. 16 - CAMP MEETING BOARD**

Be it resolved that a Camp Meeting Board of six members be elected in the following manner; two members to be elected for 3 years; the next two elected to serve two years, and the last two elected for one year. Following this, two members shall be elected annually for a three year term. Board duties; Secure all workers for Camp and Conference, supervise grounds and building; purchase good and necessary equipment for Camp and Conference; have charge of all advertising.

Whereas, Camp Board Members are pastors, and whereas much of their time must be devoted and their minds occupied with the many duties connected with the manual working of the Camp, and therefore are not free to attend and enjoy the Camp services;

Therefore be it further resolved that after any member of the Camp Board has served for a period of three years, he shall not be re-elected to the Camp Board until at least three years have expired. The District Council shall provide nominations from which Board members shall be elected; Be it further resolved that the District Treasurer, and one other member of the Council serve on this Board, also that the District Superintendent shall by virtue of his office serve on this Board but that he shall not be the chairman.

Be it further resolved that the chairman of the Camp Board shall be appointed by the District Council.

#### **No. - 17 RECALL OF THE PASTOR**

Be it resolved that the First Week in June shall be designated as the time for our churches to vote on the recall of the Pastor. This vote shall be taken by secret ballot and shall not be counted in the local church, but will be sent directly to the Superintendent, who shall report the results of the voting immediately to the pastor and secretary. No pastoral changes will be recommended until the ballots are in his hands.

#### **No. 18 - RETIRING SUPERINTENDENT**

Be it resolved that whenever there shall be elected another District Superintendent, that the Council earnestly endeavor to place said retiring Superintendent in satisfactory position.

#### **No. 19 - ORDINATION SERVICE**

Be it resolved that the order of business on the first night of the Conference be the Ordination Service.

Whereas, the minister's wife makes a vital contribution to her husband's work, therefore we recommend that the wife of the candidate be given an honorary seat with the candidate during the Ordination Service.

Whereas, Ordination is an extremely important event in the life of a Minister and whereas the families of the Candidate may desire to be present and make plans well in advance of the Ordination Day; therefore be it resolved that the Examining and Educational Board review and examine and then notify candidates 15 days prior to the Conference.

#### **No. 20 - CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT**

Be it resolved that all Treasurer's books of the District be audited annually by a certified public accountant so that a report from the auditor can be given to the Conference when called for.



## No. 21 - CAMP MEETING SUNDAY SCHOOL SESSION

Be it resolved that on the two Sundays during Camp Meeting that there be a Sunday School session beginning at 9:30 until 10:15 following the testimony meeting and that said session be arranged and supervised by the Sunday School Committee.

Be it further resolved that a credit card be given to all in attendance, and that each card be signed and returned by the pupil to their local Church Sunday School Secretary for the attendance record and reports to the Conference.

## No. 22 - ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Inasmuch as most religious bodies follow the order of having election immediately after District reports, and inasmuch as many Conferences of the Pilgrim Holiness Church follow this same order, therefore, be it resolved that election of officers be immediately following District reports.

Whereas there has been successive balloting for important offices and whereas this has often resulted in the election of individuals to several positions of officialdom, therefore be it resolved that balloting for respective officers shall be taken care of in regular and proper sequence. Be it further resolved that the elections be posted immediately.

## No. 23 - COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Be it resolved that the chairman of the resolution committee and of the Ways and Means Committee shall call a meeting of their respective committees at least one month before Conference.

No resolutions shall be presented to this Conference until it has been typewritten and signed.

## No. 24 - SUNDAY SCHOOL FINANCE

Be it therefore resolved that the following plan be put into effect; Sunday Schools with an average of 50 and under \$5.00 per year; Averages 50 to 100, 7.50; Averages 100 to 200, \$10.; Averages over 200 \$15.00.

## No. 25 CHURCH EXTENSION

Inasmuch as the present Conference Church Extension Department is not producing the number of new churches that we are capable of producing and whereas the establishing of new churches is necessary for a steady and healthy growth for any District, and whereas there appears to be a definite weakness in our present policy of raising funds for Church Extension work;

Therefore be it resolved that the East Michigan Conference adopt the Church Extension Fellowship which reads as follows:

**CHURCH EXTENSION FELLOWSHIP OF  
PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH, EAST MICHIGAN DISTRICT**

Holding the conviction that God would have us further the cause of Christ by establishing new churches within our District borders, I subscribe the following:

- (a) I will pray for the leading of the Lord in the work of the Church Extension Board.
- (b) I will be alert for any possibilities of new churches and will inform the Board.
- (c) I recognize that the first financial obligations in the opening of a new work are the most difficult to meet and will therefore be responsible for two units, (\$5.00) per unit, to total (\$10.00) for the Church Extension Fellowship.
- (d) I assume this obligation for not more than two new works in any on Conference year. Said works to be approved by the Church Extension Board.
- (e) I will try to secure other members of the Fellowship.
- (f) I understand this agreement may be terminated any time I deem it necessary by notifying the Church Extension Board.
