FIRST SESSION, AUGUST 12th, 1924.

Reports of James Baxter, Bertha Logue read by Secretary. Reports accepted.

LeRoy Upshaw read his report of Evangelist work. Report accepted.

S. H. Umbarger read report of Evangelist work. Report accepted.

Moved and seconded that extra work of Pastors outside of the pastoral work should be designated as work done elsewhere. Motion carried.

Motion made and seconded that the District Superintendent visit the churches of the district semi-annually. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that the Secretary publish 200 copies of the assembly minutes to be paid for out of the apportionment fund. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we invite Sam T. VanMeter into the assembly bar. Motion carried.

Rev. Ben Brockman read his report of work done in Home Missionary work in the Ozark Mountains. Mrs. C. A. Brockman read her report of work done in the Ozarks. Reports were accepted.

Motion made and seconded that the Chair make a statement explaining the shortage of the Home and Foreign Missionary Funds. Motion carried.

After this statement, special prayer was offered for S. P. VanMeter.

Moved and seconded that the Chair appoint a committee to bring in resolutions regarding Home Missionary work. Motion carried.

S. H. Umbarger, Guy Slate and Grace Nelson were appointed.

Motion made and seconded that we adjourn to give committees a chance to work. Motion carried.

THIRD SESSION, AUGUST 14th, 1924.

After devotional services lead by Rev. Guy Slate, Assembly was called to order by the District Superintendent.

Minutes of last session were then read and approved.

REPORTS

W. J. Webster read the report of Mrs. W. J. Webster as Deaconess. Report accepted.

Harry Solter read report of District Treasurer. Report received by assembly.

Lloyd Waddell read report of examining committee. We recommend that Mrs. R. L. Campbell be given a first year's deaconess license. Received by assembly. We recommend that Mr. and Mrs. Guyer (A. E.) be received by transfer from the Texas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Motion carried.

Motion that the Chair appoint one to fill the vacancy on the committee of changing the manual. Motion carried. LeRoy Upshaw was appointed by the Chair.

Motion that each church of the District take a monthly Foreign Missionary offering and send in to the District Treasurer monthly. Motion carried.

Motion made and seconded that we have a Camp Meeting and assembly in 1925 on the corresponding dates of the 1924 Camp and Assembly. Motion carried.

Motion made and seconded that we have the annual Camp and Assembly at Fredonia, Kansas. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that all preachers working in the District pay their full tithe into the District Treasury for the support of the Home Missionary work. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we pay the Home Missionary \$800.00 per year above traveling expenses, hall rent, etc. This guarantee only apply pro rata as the time engaged in Home Missionary work. He shall use his own judgment in employing help and paying the same. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we elect the officers of the assembly. Carried.

Rev. Thos Willis was elected District Superintendent on the first ballot. Made unanimous on a rising vote.

An offering was then taken to pay the District Secretary for his labors. \$11.00 was taken.

Rev. S. H. Umbarger was elected District Secretary.

Rev. Harley Fortner was elected District Treasurer.

Maggie Hull, Grace Nelson, LeRoy Upshaw, were elected as advisory members of the District Council.

Grace Nelson was elected on the Examining Board for the term of three years.

Lloyd Waddell was elected as Home Missionary.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn.

FOURTH SESSION, AUGUST 15th. 1924.

Devotional Services led by Rev. Ben Brockman. Assembly called to order by Chair.

Roll call and the reading of minutes of last session. Minutes approved as read.

Transfer was granted to Rev. E. B. Galloway to the California District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church

Moved that we pay District Treasurer \$10.00 to be paid out of the apportionment fund. Motion carried.

REPORTS OF EXAMINING COMMITTEE

Motion made and seconded that each church take a special offering for the support of the District Camp, and to be sent to the Dist. Treasurer not later than July 1st, 1925. Motion carried.

Motion that we pay the Home Missionary money that is in the Home Missionary Treasury, and the deficiency as soon as possible. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we send one delegate from the council and one delegate from the ministerial delegation to the General Assembly. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we elect H. L. Solter as a Ministerial delegate. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that the District Superintendent be delegate from the Council. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that the Chair appoint a committee to apportion each church an amount that they should pay to defray expenses of delegates to the General Assembly. Motion carried.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MANUAL

Recommendations to the General Assembly of The Pilgrim Holiness Church Convening at Greensboro, N. C., October 7th, For Change of The Manual.

To the General Assembly at Greensboro, N. C., we the Eastern Kansas and Oklahoma District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convening in District Assembly at Fredonia, Kansas, August 12 to 16, send greetings in the name of our ever conquering Savior.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

No. 1.—Inasmuch as the Pilgrim Holiness Church is a missionary church and as the general church has placed upon the General Missionary Board the obligations to meet in regard to the missionaries' support, in that the Board pays monthly salaries or allowances to her missionaries; Be it resolved that Paragraph No. 4 be added to Article No. 196, to read as follows: "Let each local church send an offering monthly to her District Treasurer who shall send the same

on to the General Treasurer monthly to be used on the monthly allowances to our missionaries."

No. 2.—Inasmuch as our District Assemblies have minutes printed each year, Be it resolved that a copy from each District be sent to our General Superintendent and that Articles 155, 156 and 157 be stricken from Manual.

No. 3.—Inasmuch as our licensed Deaconesses are given more privileges in our church than local preachers, we recommend that the word "deaconess" be dropped from Article 46 and 145 and that Deaconesses be licensed by the local church instead of by the District Assembly and that their rights be similar to those of the local Preachers.

No. 4.—As some men and women receive calls from God to preach and do deaconess work after they have reached a matured age, and now that their minds are shaped and the responsibilities of life are too great for them to take up the general required course of study; Be it resolved that a lighter course be arranged for study and reading for those who have not had these earlier advantages of education.

No. 5.—We recommend that the Budget System be adopted by our General Church for the purpose of financing the Local, District, and General Church needs.

This report was accepted by the assembly.

Motion for adjournment. So moved and carried.

FIFTH SESSION, AUGUST 16th, 1924.

Devotional Services led by Bro. Guy Slate. Assembly called to order by District Superintendent.

Roll call. Minutes of last session was then read and accepted.

Moved and seconded the Home Missionary Workers may take up subscriptions for home missionary work to be paid into Home Missionary Treasurer. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we as an assembly show our appreciation to the people of Fredonia, and community for their royal entertainment and gifts of love by a rising vote. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we send greetings to the Colorado Dist. Assembly. Motion carried.

We recommend that each pastor after consultation with his church and with prayer be granted the privilege of holding a Home Missionary meeting. Motion carried.

We as an assembly extend to Bro. Harry L. Solter, our outgoing Missionary to India, our love and faithfulness in prayer to God for him, by rising vote.

Motion to adjourn was seconded. Assembly closed in prayer by District Superintendent Rev. Thos. Willis.
