JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

First Session

Tuesday, June 16, 1959 — 7:00 p.m.

The first sitting of the Sixth Annual Conference of the Florida District convened at 7:00 p.m., June 16, 1959, at the Morrison Memorial Church, Intercession City, Florida.

The Conference was opened with prayer by Rev. Virgil Lashbrook, Rev. Ray Richards, District Superintendent being in charge.

Rev. Fred Sumwalt led the conference in singing, "He Keeps Me Singing" and "He Is Able to Deliver Thee."

Rev. Ray Richards exhorted the conference that in doing business, we can still worship God and called on Rev. Harold Rickner, the new Superintendent, to lead in prayer.

Rev. Richards then introduced and presented Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Extension, to preside in the conference.

Rev. Hawkins gave a very inspiring devotional message from Colossians 1:21-29. "Sin alienated us from God." The unredeemed heart is not at home in God's presence. Jesus bridged the gap—reached up to God the father and down to man to reconcile—it required death to reconcile. He brought out the following points:

Christ's Purpose: "To present you holy, unblameable and unreprouvable in His sight."

The Condition: "If ye continue in the Faith." "Rejoice in my sufferings for you."

The Mystery: "Christ in you the Hope of Glory."

The Ministry: Of warning, of teaching; Reason—"That we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus." Our security lies in depths of hearts that are deeply dedicated. We are "Laborers together with Him."

The District Secretary, Rev. E. O. Howell, called the roll.

The following are the lay delegates from the churches to be accepted in the conference bar: Bradenton—Roy Wiggins; Ft. Lauderdale—Mrs. Bessie Stunkel; Intercession City—Martha Pullium; Lake Worth—none; Miami—Miss Edna MacArthur; Orlando—Clarence Lawson; St. Petersburg—Joseph Stucky; Tampa—Leo Wilson; W. Hollywood—Lena Lyons.

Motion carried that the conference bar consist of the first four rows of seats across the front of the church.

The Reception Committee introduced the following to the Conference.

Rev. and Mrs. Virgil Lashbrook, coming to us from Jackson, Ohio, to pastor the church at Miami.

Rev. and Mrs. Billy Pevy.

A motion carried to accept Rev. Lashbrook into the conference pending transfer from the Ohio District.

A motion carried that the first sitting adjourn at 9:15 p.m. and that we reconvene at 9:00 a.m., then recess at 12 o'clock noon and reconvene at 1:30 p.m.

A motion carried that Rev. Virgil Lashbrook serve on the examining committee in the absence of Rev. Celia Winkle; Mrs. H. B. Kreider serve on the memorial committee in the absence of Mrs. E. O. Howell; Rev. Floyd Gookins serve on the Reception committee in the absence of Mrs. Robert Stunkel.

The report of the District Superintendent was read and accepted with a hearty amen.

Rev. Hawkins then asked the question, "How do you measure a man? By the things he has? How much he is able to gather to himself? By his words? or by his devotion to the cause of Jesus Christ?" Bro. Richards has given of his best and had asked to be relieved from the position of District Superintendent for the coming year. It is too early to measure what has been accomplished. The records of Heaven have a clear accounting of his ministry. He urged that all give a concrete token of our appreciation, love and esteem to Bro. Richards by giving him a good offering. A good response came from all by singing "Amazing Grace" and "When the Battle's Over." After words of appreciation by Bro. Richards, all sang "Blessed Be the Tie That Binds." We are thankful we are not losing Rev. Richards from our District as he is going to be one of our pastors.

Rev. Hawkins then introduced to the conference Rev. and Mrs. Harold Rickner, who have come to us from Port Huron, Michigan, to be the new District Superintendent.

The report of District Statistician, C. M. Andrews, was read and accepted, with the revision that every preaching point and branch Sunday School be included in the report.

The report of the District Youth Promotional Secretary, F. A. Sumwalt, was read and accepted.

The report of the District Treasurer, C. M. Andrews, was read and accepted pending report of the Auditing committee.

Adjourned by expiration of time, prayer by Rev. Husseilton.

Second Session

Wednesday, June 17, 1959 — 9:00 a.m.

Singing of "Standing on the Promises" was led by Rev. Virgil Lashbrook after which Rev. W. C. Bulla of North Carolina led in prayer.

Rev. Hawkins read Revelation I picturing the "Glorified Christ."

The calling of the roll was dispensed with.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and accepted.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted. They commended Bro. Andrews for his fine work as Treasurer.

The report of the Educational and Examining Committee recommended the following:

That Rev. Wm. Easter be placed in the third year license; Rev. Billy Pevy be placed in the second year license; Rev. Mrs. Miriam Calhoun be placed in the second year license; Mrs. Vinia Mutter be given first year license; Rev. R. E. Strickland, transferring from the Indiana District; Rev. Earl Arnett, transferring from the Texas District, both ordained ministers.

A motion carried to adopt this report and recommendation.

A motion carried that Rev. H. C. Rickner be received into the conference.

The Resolutions Committee was called on to report.

Resolution No. 2 was read and tabled, original to stand.

Resolution No. 4 was read and adopted as amended.

Resolution No. 8 was read and adopted as amended.

Resolution No. 9 was read and lost, original to stand.

Business was dispensed with to have special prayer in behalf of Bro. Webb, who had been taken to hospital with serious heart attack. Prayer was also requested for our Editor, Rev. P. W. Thomas, who has a very serious ailment. Prayer by Rev. T. R. York.

Resolution No. 10 was read and referred to the committee.

Resolution No. 11 was read and adopted as amended.
Resolution No. 13 was read and adopted as amended.
Resolution No. 14 was read and adopted as amended.
Resolution No. 15 was read and adopted as amended.
Resolution No. 20 was read and referred to the committee.
Resolution No. 22 was read and adopted as amended.

The Reception Committee introduced the following to the Conference:

Rev. and Mrs. W. C. Bulla
Rev. and Mrs. R. E. Strickland
Rev. J. C. Baynum

They were welcomed with a hearty amen and motion carried to receive Rev. Strickland and Rev. Baynum into the Conference pending the transfers from their Districts.

A motion carried that Rev. W. C. Bulla of North Carolina be given an honorary seat in the conference bar.

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was given and the complete financial program was referred to the committee.

A motion carried to adjourn at 11:15 and reconvene at 1:00 p.m. to give the committees extra time before the afternoon session.

The Memorial Committee report was read and in memory of those who have joined the church triumphant the conference stood for a moment of silence followed by prayer by Bro. Hawkins.

Appreciation was expressed to Mrs. L. A. Carpenter for the gift of 125 hymn books to the Intercession City church in memory of her husband.

The final report of the Committee on Memoirs was read and adopted.

A motion carried to recess until 1:00 p.m. carried.

Benediction by Rev. J. C. Baynum.

Third Session

Wednesday, June 17, 1959 — 1:00 p.m.

Opened by singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" followed by prayer by Bro. Richards.

Resolution Committee continued their report as follows:

Resolution No. 10 was reread and adopted as amended.

Resolution No. 20 was reread and adopted as amended.

Resolution No. 24—new—was read and adopted.

Resolution No. 3 was read and adopted as amended.

The Ways and Means Committee reported with the following changes to be made:

1. We recommend that each church be assessed eight percent (8%) of the regular church offerings, to be applied on the District Budget.

2. We recommend that all ordained and licensed ministers of the district pay fifty percent (50%) of their tithes from ministerial labors, into the District treasury through the local church where their membership is held, the same to be applied on the District Budget.

3. We recommend that the District Budget be prorated as follows: District Administration 88%; District Camp and Conference 10%; General Conference 2%.

4. We recommend that we pay the District Superintendent \$140 per month on his salary.

5. We recommend that other district officials are to receive 5 cents per mile, plus meals and lodging for District travel and business.

The complete report was read and adopted by the Conference.

The report of the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary, Rev. T. R. York, was read and accepted.

In preparation for the election of officers, Rev. F. A. Sumwalt and Rev. Billy Pevy were appointed as tellers by the district superintendent.

The offices of District Superintendent, Treasurer and Secretary are appointed by the General Board. The following appointments had been made:

Rev. H. C. Rickner, District Superintendent

Rev. C. M. Andrews, District Treasurer

Rev. Virgil Lashbrook, District Secretary

Rev. E. O. Howell and Rev. H. B. Kreider were elected as additional Council members.

Rev. H. B. Kreider was nominated and elected to serve on the Educational—Examining Board to 1962.

Rev. James Kreider was elected District Youth Secretary, from the nominations of Rev. F. A. Sumwalt and Rev. James Kreider by the District council.

A motion carried to give our new Superintendent, Rev. H. C. Rickner time in the appointment of committees and all will be informed later.

Motion to adjourn—Prayer Rev. Strickland.

TO THE SIXTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE FLORIDA DISTRICT

In a world that looks for every thing but God and in a time that has every evidence of the last days, we still have much to praise the Lord for. First the Blood still covers us and Psalm 23 is a reality as our resting place in Him. Then it is wonderful to say His Grace is sufficient and His Spirit the captain of our host.

Some one said we only have to stay here until we get our lessons well. Should that be the case Brother Robert Stunkel gained a graduation. However the loss from the District Council, the Church he pastored and the end of present fellowship certainly staggered all of us.

The District Camp Ground at Intercession City suffered a big loss in the burning of the hotel. However by camp meeting time we had recovered sufficiently to carry on.

Rev. R. E. Strickland as manager, and the pastor, Rev. H. B. Kreider and the fine folk at Intercession City are to be commended for their ceaseless efforts. A new dining room, kitchen and lunch room were set up. New dorm rooms and many private hotel rooms were made ready in one of the present buildings. Twelve apartments completely modern and with new furnishings and the boys' dorm with new bath facilities are all complete. Three of the large buildings have been reroofed. The water works has expanded and new equipment has been installed. In fact the Florida Camp in lots, farm, water works, and buildings still add up to well over eighty-five thousand dollars in valuation. It all belongs to the Florida Pilgrims without costing them a penny of budget. It also has a potential income of enough to sponsor a new church each year and a camp ground that maintains itself at no expense to the district. I know of no other conference in our movement with anything equal.

Miami folk are rallying around their new pastor, Rev. Virgil Lashbrook. Three new members have been added to the fold since he came and their work among the Jewish folk on Miami Beach is bound by the Lord's promise to have His Blessing and rewards are coming to the church in numerical gain also.

Fort Lauderdale is setting a good pace with gains in Sunday School and a gain of six members and a good outreach in the community.

Lake Worth has continued to improve their property and more and more is becoming a good asset to our church and a blessing corner on Tenth Ave.

Tampa continues to mature as a church and with new lawn, lighting and a plaster coat it is becoming a beautiful corner.

St. Petersburg marches on and while recorded membership does not show the increase, the evidence will soon show the solid building of their fine program. Now they have \$1,500.00 pledged toward some much needed room.

Bradenton lost the wind to their sails but in the quietness the Lord showed them a branch S. S. and opportunities for a new program.

Intercession City is always on the move. They have improved the parsonage, purchased a new piano and organ, gained some new members and have a prayer group that are the secret of their progress.

The folk at Daytona are temporarily out of a building and home prayer meetings are being carried on.

Clearwater will soon be ready to continue as a branch of the St. Petersburg church.

Satellite Beach will not have a building for another three weeks in which to worship, but the cluster of folk continues to grow. About nineteen hundred dollars has been pledged locally toward the project in material and labor. A new school is to be erected about three blocks from our property on a twenty-five acre plot recently purchased. We believe God is planting a light to shine among the man-made lights and missiles.

The miles we've traveled, the hours we've worked, the prayers we've prayed and all the combined efforts of the year seemed to have accomplished little for this report but Appolos can water and God will give the increase.

To Intercession City and St. Petersburg for making the best average attendance.

The District total attendance for last year was 573, and this year is 569 giving a gain of 4.

We wish to thank every church for their cooperation and interest which you have shown even though you have not finished in first place.

To the Sixth Annual Conference of the Florida District we submit this report:

The Youth Societies in most of the churches have enjoyed a good year. Our Zones are showing a marked increase in interest and help for our youth of the district.

THE SKYWAY ZONE, whose leader is Mrs. Beulah Andrews, has had six rallies, with a very good spiritual tone in them. They have received \$66.32 in their offerings and the expenditures were \$30.76. God is blessing our youth. Let us keep behind them with some profitable programs and activities. We are looking forward to the greatest year the Florida District has ever had.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that the conference year shall end April 30 and that all funds shall be in the hands of the District Treasurer by May 15. The District records shall close May 31 and the annual conference shall be held the third week of June.

2. We recommend that the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees not elected by the conference.

3. We recommend that 200 copies of the conference minutes shall be printed and if possible within thirty days they shall be ready for distribution. We also recommend that each church be charged \$3.50 for ten copies of the minutes and that additional copies be sold for .35 each.

4. We recommend that Resolution No. 4 be amended to read: We recommend that the local church treasurers balance their books at the close of each month and forward all District and General funds to the District Treasurer.

5. Whereas there are many groups engaged in gospel work that continue to solicit the cooperation and financial support of our people; and whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church furnishes us with a full program of gospel work in the local church, the district and the world wide program of church extension and missionary work; and whereas while we do recognize that there are many other worthy groups engaged in gospel work, and we bid them God speed, but we further believe that our church deserves our full support.

Therefore be it resolved that we advise and encourage all our Pilgrims in the Florida District to give undivided loyalty and entire support to the work of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

6. We recommend that all ministers accepted as members by the Annual Conference of the Florida District, shall place their membership in some local church in the district within thirty days following the close of the conference, and that they shall make quarterly reports to the District Superintendent and an annual report to the District Statistician.

7. We recommend that the District Council consist of two additional councilmen to be elected by this conference.

8. We recommend that our District Headquarters shall be located at Intercession City and that our Annual Campmeeting and Conference be held there.

We further recommend that the District Council serve as a Campmeeting Board and that they secure the services of camp evangelists and workers, if possible two years in advance and that the date of the Campmeeting and the names of the workers be placed in the minutes each year as a permanent advertisement for the benefit and information of the public.

9. We recommend that the District Council be the Home Missionary Board, and that they appoint one person in each zone to look for new openings for Sunday Schools and churches.

10. We recommend that there be a District Youth Camp sometime during the conference year. We further recommend that there be a District Youth Board consisting of the District Superintendent, District Youth Secretary, and District Youth Treasurer. Their duties shall be to determine the program, time and place of our District Youth Camp.

11. We recommend that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary publish a news sheet each month showing the attendance of each Sunday School and news items. These reports shall be sent to each pastor in sufficient number that they can be passed to each family of the church.

12. Whereas many of our members are not familiar with the actions of the conference, therefore be it resolved that the pastor shall have a special meeting of his church at the earliest possible date, for the purpose of familiarizing his people with their privileges, and responsibilities for the conference year.

13. We recommend that Resolution No. 13 be amended to read: We recommend that each church provide a parsonage with telephone, and utilities, and at least a refrigerator and cooking stove.

14. We recommend that Resolution No. 14 be amended to read: We recommend that the location of all churches and parsonages, with their telephone numbers, be listed in the minutes.

15. We recommend that Resolution No. 15 be amended to read: We recommend that all resolutions which appear in the current minutes become standing rules unless ordered otherwise by the conference.

16. We recommend that each pastor be granted a two weeks' vacation with pay.

17. We recommend that pastors or church secretaries of deceased members of our District Conference bring to the Committee on Memoirs a copy of the obituary of the deceased and any other information that is available.

18. We recommend that each pastor keep a record of all names and addresses of the subscribers to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate in the vicinity of the pastorate.

19. We recommend that the conference elect a Missionary President for the District, for the coming year, to work in cooperation with the local societies and assist in the organization of new groups where possible.

20. We recommend that there be a Ministerial Meeting to be held at Intercession City, beginning Thursday night, November 19th, 1959, at 7:30 with an Evangelistic Service, and to include at least three services on Friday, November 20th. We further recommend that the District Council appoint a program committee.

21. The District Council shall appoint a program committee for each zone.

22. We recommend that Resolution No. 22 be amended to read: We wish to express our appreciation and praise to all who have made the day school in Intercession City possible, and to the faithful teachers who have labored so sacrificially. We recommend that there will continue to be an ever enlarging school program in Intercession City.

23. Since all of our resolutions adopted at the Conference have to do with regulations and administration we propose to inject one of purely spiritual nature. We therefore recommend that each local church set aside one day each week for fasting and prayer. That we pray for our leaders that they be resigned to the leadership of the Holy Ghost in all matters and that we intercede for revival in the church and over the District. We recommend that the noon hour of each Friday be the time set to come together in the local church and that the doors of the church remain open for those who cannot assemble at that hour. We must stem the tide of Laodiceanism sweeping in on the Church in these closing days.

24. We, the Florida District Conference wish to express our appreciation to our General Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins for his inspiring messages and efficient services. We also wish to express appreciation for services rendered by Rev. Ray E. Richards, District Superintendent, Rev. C. M. Andrews, District Treasurer, and Statistician, Rv. E. O. Howell, District Secretary, and other members of our District and Council. We also wish to thank the Host Pastors, Rev. and Mrs. H. B. Kreider, Business Managers, Rev. and Mrs. R. E. Strickland, and the many members and friends of the church for their untiring efforts and for the efficient and hospitable way they have entertained the conference.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that each church be assessed eight percent (8%) of the regular church offerings, to be applied on the District Budget.
2. We recommend that all ordained and licensed ministers of the district pay fifty percent (50%) of their tithes from ministerial labors, into the District treasury, through the local church where their membership is held, the same to be applied on the District Budget.
3. We recommend that the District Budget be prorated as follows: District Administration, 88%; District Camp & Conference, 10%; General Conference, 2%.
4. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid one hundred and forty dollars (\$140.00) on his salary.
5. Other District Officials to receive five cents (5c) per mile plus meals and lodging when engaged in District business.

MEMOIRS

Rev. Robert V. Stunkel, Pastor of the Miami Pilgrim Holiness Church and District Treasurer, was called home to be with his Lord on January 18, 1959. He was a picture of health two months before his sudden passing and being in the prime of his life, this was a great shock to everyone.

His passing was a keen loss to his many friends as well as his church and the entire District.

Brother L. A. Carpenter passed away during our camp in January. No man had put more of sacrificial giving and labor into the work of Intercession City than he. It was largely through his influence that Central Florida Bible Institute was turned over to the Pilgrim Holiness Church for the continuance of a Bible School. He could rightly have been called Mr. Intercession City.

Mrs. Frank Weisenberger, a faithful member of the Lake Worth church, passed to her eternal reward in May, 1959.
