FLORIDA CONFERENCE  
JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

First Sitting

Tuesday, May 17, 1960, 7:30 P. M.

The first sitting of the seventh annual conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 7:30 p.m., at the Morrison Memorial Church, Intercession City, Florida.

The conference was opened by Rev. H. C. Rickner, District Superintendent, after which Rev. H. B. Kreider, the host Pastor, led in prayer and Rev. V. R. Lashbrook, District Secretary, led in the congregational singing.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Extension, led the conference in another season of prayer, asking God's direction for the conference.

Rev. H. C. Rickner, District Superintendent, welcomed the ministers and delegates and introduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins. Following appropriate remarks, Rev. R. C. Hawkins introduced Rev. R. G. Flexon, General Superintendent, who brought a stirring and challenging message on the subject, "The Program of Jesus in Soul-Winning," in which he set forth goals for the Florida Conference using for his text, Luke 9:1-2 and Luke 10:1-2. Following the message, all Pastors and Laymen were invited to meet together around the altar for a season of prayer to enable every department of each local Church to carry on a more fervent program of soul winning. God's Presence was felt by all in a refreshing moment of stirred hearts and re-dedicated service to a lost world.

Second Sitting, Wednesday, May 18, 1960

Rev. H. C. Rickner opened the sitting by having Rev. Billy Pevy lead the congregational singing after which Rev. Floyd Gookins led in prayer. Rev. Rickner introduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Extension, who in turn, introduced Rev. R. G. Flexon, General Superintendent, to preside over the conference.

Rev. Flexon gave a very challenging message on the subject of "Good Organization" taking for his text, I Cor. 12:12-21. Rev. Flexon stated that the benefits of good organization are: Satisfaction of Fellowship; Appeal of Permanency; Ease of Shared Responsibilities, and the Blessing of The Power of Added Ability.

Rev. Virgil R. Lashbrook, District Secretary, called the roll.

A motion was made and seconded that the Conference Bar consist of the first ten rows of seats on the north side of the Church. Motion carried.

The names of the Lay Delegates were called and they were seated within the Conference Bar.

A motion was made and seconded that the Second Sitting of the Seventh Annual Conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church adjourn at 12:00 Noon and re-convene at 1:30 p.m. and remain in session until 5:00 p.m. Motion carried.

The Reception Committee introduced the following: Mr. and Mrs. Frank Salvador, Mrs. R. G. Flexon, and Miss Ruby Wyant. The courtesy of the Bar was extended to our guests.

District Superintendent, Rev. H. C. Rickner, presented the new Church at

Satellite Beach to the Conference. The Pastor, Rev. Floyd Gookins, and the Lay Delegate, Mr. Alvin Benjamin, were accepted into the Conference Bar.

The Examining Board recommended that Mr. and Mrs. Frank Salvador, be accepted into the Florida District. The Conference accepted this recommendation pending receipt of their transfer from the North Central District.

The Examining Board also recommended that we extend the courtesy of the Bar to those Ministers whose letters of transfer are pending from other districts, namely; Rev. R. E. Strickland, Rev. J. C. Baynum, and Rev. W. C. Bulla. This recommendation was accepted by the Conference.

The District Superintendent's report was read and accepted.

The Auditing Committee's report was read and accepted.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The District Statistician's report was read and accepted.

The Youth Secretary's report was read and accepted.

The Sunday School Secretary's report was read and accepted.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried. Rev. E. O. Howell, dismissed in prayer.

### Third Sitting, Wednesday Afternoon

Rev. Virgil R. Lashbrook led the congregation in singing after which Rev. H. E. Osborn, Sr. led in prayer.

As the roll was called each Pastor responded by giving the number of Advocate subscriptions they will try to get in the coming Conference year. When the roll was completed 137 Advocate subscriptions were pledged.

The minutes of the morning sitting were read and approved as read.

Mr. Lionel Eyman, an Insurance Representative, presented his group plan for Life and Hospitalization insurance to the Conference.

A motion was made and carried that a committee be appointed by the District Council to investigate the possibilities of our Ministers being covered by group insurance. Motion carried.

The Memorial Committee's report was read and accepted by everyone standing for a moment of silent prayer followed by Rev. R. G. Flexon offering prayer in memory of those who died in the faith.

The Examining Board's report was read and accepted. Rev. Billy Pevy was recommended for Third Year License.

The Ways and Means Committee reported.

A motion was made and seconded that this Conference recommend Rev. J. H. Morningstar as an Evangelist with his daughter assisting him in his work. Motion carried.

In preparation for the election of officers, Rev. H. C. Rickner, appointed Rev. William Easter and Rev. Billy Pevy as Tellers.

The Offices of District Superintendent, Treasurer and Secretary were appointed by the General Board. The following appointments were made:

Rev. Virgil R. Lashbrook, District Secretary

Rev. C. M. Andrews, District Treasurer

Ballots were cast and Rev. E. O. Howell and Rev. H. B. Kreider were elected as Advisory Council Members.

Following a five-minute recess the balloting continued with Rev. Ray Richard being elected to serve on the Educational - Examining Board.

Rev. William Easter was received into the Conference pending the receipt of his transfer from the Illinois District.

The District Council's appointments were read.

The District Superintendent's appointments were read.

An Insurance Representative, Mr. Belcher, presented to the Conference the benefits of his company's insurance coverage for the Ministers of the District.

The report of the Pilgrim District Camp was read and accepted.

An Expression of Appreciation was made to all officials and workers who helped to make this Conference a success.

A motion was made and seconded that the District Council take care of any unfinished business. Motion carried.

The Conference was dismissed with prayer by Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Extension.

## DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To General Superintendent Flexon, Secretary Hawkins, fellow - ministers, delegates and friends: Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior!

As we are assembled for the 7th Annual Conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, the eyes of the people of the world are turned toward the "Summit Meeting." Leaders of the most powerful nations on earth are struggling to find a solution to the ills of our present time. May God be merciful in this tragic hour. We gather to report, to formulate plans, and to receive blessings and inspiration to carry out the Heavenly directions of our Lord.

This year has been filled with many new things for me. For over 20 years the experiences of a pastorate have been my wonderful privilege. This matter of administration has broadened my concept of church life. Any accomplishments have been the result of an understanding and cooperative group of ministers and gracious laymen. I could only desire that I might do the work better. Needless to say this has been a busy year, and it has been a privilege to labor for Jesus and the church.

Real hard work and the help of God will be needed if we attain the status of an organized District by General Conference of 1962. God will help us if we make an honest effort to reach the lost.

### Notes Of Praise

Our debt is being slowly retired. Some payments have been made to the loan fund. We received \$2,435.00 from the State for settlement of road rights involving our Avon Park property. Most of this was applied on the debt Avon Park owed the Loan fund. Several pastors have reported good revivals. Times of refreshing in many of our churches have been helpful. We are thankful to God for seekers for spiritual help and happy over the new Pilgrims who have joined our ranks. The sad reminder remains that we sustained a loss in membership this year.

### Property Improvements

Pastors and people have been active this year to do necessary work on property. The following are some of the major accomplishments.

Bradenton — installed new pews, laid tile in the Sunday School annex, redecorated the interior of the Church and Sunday School rooms.

St. Petersburg — erected a new Sunday School unit, which when completed will give a fine set-up.

Tampa — installed carpet and laid tile in the Church auditorium.

Lake Worth — painted the exterior of the church, prepared a parking lot with curbs and new sidewalks, installed indirect lighting in the church and laid tile on the church floor.

Miami — completely redecorated the interior of the church and painted the exterior.

Many other improvements have been made in the other churches, all with a deep desire that God's House and property may be kept in good repair and presentable.

It has been a privilege to work with a fine understanding Council. We have had some difficult situations and God has helped these good men as together we sought Divine direction.

### New Churches

The pastor and delegate from our new church in Satellite Beach are here

and are ready to be received into this Conference at the call of the chair. These fine people are now constructing a lovely church. Thank God for this church.

#### New Sunday Schools

In September of 1959 a new work was opened in Sarasota. Good progress has been made and we are looking forward to seeing a fine church here.

On Easter of 1960 we launched a new work in Lakeland. Please pray for this work, it looks like a good prospect for a church.

Fort Myers and Pinellas Park are needy areas. May God grant finances and men to enter the doors as they open to us.

## RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

### No. 1 Appreciation

We, the Florida District Conference, wish to express our appreciation to our General Superintendent, Rev. R. G. Flexon and our General Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, for their inspiring leadership and efficient services. We also wish to express appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. H. C. Rickner, members of the District Council, the host pastors, Rev. and Mrs. H. B. Kreider, Business Managers, Rev. and Mrs. R. E. Strickland and the many members and friends of the Church for their labors of love in making this Conference a victory.

### No. 2 Camp

Be it resolved that the District Council serve as a Camp Meeting Board and that they secure the services of Camp Evangelists and Workers, if possible, two years in advance; and that the date of the Camp Meeting and the names of the workers be placed in the Minutes each year as a permanent advertising for the benefit and information of the public.

### No. 3 Committees

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees not elected by the Conference or appointed by the District Council.

### No. 4 Conference Year

Be it resolved that the Conference Year shall end April 30th, and that all reports shall be in the hands of the District Statistician and all funds in the hands of the District Treasurer by May 15. The District records shall close May 31 and the Annual Conference shall be held the third week of June, the place to be determined by the District Council.

### No. 5 District Council

Be it resolved that the District Council consist of two additional advisory members to be elected by this Conference.

### No. 6 Finance

Be it resolved that the local Church Treasurers balance their books at the close of each month and forward all District and General funds to the District Treasurer immediately.

### No. 7 Ministerial Meeting

Be it resolved that we have an annual Ministerial Meeting, the time and place to be determined by the District Council. Be it further resolved that the District Council appoint a program committee.

### No. 8 Ministers

Be it resolved that all Ministers accepted as members by the Annual Conference of the Florida District, shall place their membership in some local church in the District within thirty days following the close of the Conference,

and that they shall make quarterly reports to the District Superintendent and an annual report to the District Statistician.

**No. 9 Missionary Societies**

Be it resolved that the Conference elect a Missionary President for the District for the coming Conference year to work in cooperation with the local missionary societies and assist in the organization of new groups where possible.

**No. 10 Parsonages**

Be it resolved that each local Church provide a parsonage with at least a telephone, utilities, refrigerator and cooking stove.

**No. 11 Pastors**

Be it resolved that each Pastor be granted a two weeks' vacation with pay, annually.

**No. 12 Revival**

Be it resolved that each local Church set aside one day each week for fasting and prayer and that we pray for the leadership of the Holy Spirit in all matters and that we intercede for a Revival in our Churches.

**No. 13 Schools**

Inasmuch as there was a temporary exception made by the General Board for the operation of the School at Intercession City:

Therefore, Be it resolved that if the School continues to operate, it shall do so according to the policy of the General Board concerning Schools.

**No. 14 Sunday Schools**

(a) Be it resolved that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary publish a news sheet each month showing the attendance of each Sunday School and news items. These reports shall be sent to each Pastor in sufficient number that they can be passed to each family in the church.

(b) Since a number of our Sunday School students from our local churches attend the District Camp Meeting:

Therefore, Be it resolved that the local Church of which they are members be permitted to count their attendance.

**No. 15 Youth**

Be it resolved that there be a District Youth Board consisting of the District Superintendent, District Youth Secretary, and the District Youth Treasurer. Their duties shall be to determine the program, time and place of our District Youth activities.

## WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

### BUDGET

1. Be it resolved that each Church pay eight (8%) per cent of the regular Church offerings to be applied on the District Budget. Be it further resolved that the United Stewardship Fund be \$6.00 per member as recommended by the General Conference.
2. Be it resolved that the District Budget be pro-rated as follows: District Administration, 88%; District Camp and Conference, 8%; General Conference, 4%.

### DISTRICT MINISTERS

3. Be it resolved that all ordained and licensed ministers of the District pay fifty (50%) per cent of their tithes, from ministerial labors, into the District treasury, through the local Church where their membership is held, the same to be applied on the District Budget.

### SALARIES

4. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be paid one hundred and forty (\$140.00) dollars on his salary monthly.
5. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer be paid \$30.00 annually and the District Secretary be paid \$15.00 annually.
6. Be it resolved that District officials other than the District Superintendent be paid 6c per mile, by auto, plus lodging and meals when engaged in District business.

## REPORT OF MEMORIAL COMMITTEE

Mrs. Etta Morningstar, wife of Rev. J. H. Morningstar of Intercession City, Florida, departed this life at Ypsilanti, Michigan on August 10, 1959, at the age of 73 years and 5 months. All her life, until recent years when in failing health, was spent in the Lord's work with her husband. They belonged to the Pilgrim Holiness Conference of the Michigan District until she was no longer able to be in the active work. Then they moved to Intercession City and put their interests in the church there. The funeral was in the new Pilgrim Holiness Church at Ann Arbor, Michigan. Rev. Lawrence Neff was the speaker. The special song, a favorite of hers was sung "O, Come Angel Band." She was laid to rest in a little country cemetery near Ypsilanti, Michigan, there to await the sound of the trumpet and the resurrection of the righteous dead.

Michael Bennett, a devout Christian carpenter, abundant in sacrificial labors for the Lord and builder of Morrison Memorial Church, passed away October 22, 1959. He was also a board member of Central Florida Bible Institute, and a pioneer of Intercession City.

Rev. Joel Webb, a supporter and board member of Central Florida Bible Institute for many years, died June 20, 1959. His wife, Cora Webb, a graduate of Columbia University and teacher of the Primary Department of Central Florida Bible Institute for many years, went to her reward November 19, 1959, just five months after the death of her husband.

They rest from their labors and their works do follow them.
