**FLORIDA CONFERENCE  
JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS**

**First Sitting**

**Monday, May 28, 1962, 7:00 P.M.**

The first sitting of the Ninth Annual Conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 7:00 p.m., May 28, 1962, at the Forest Hills Pilgrim Church at Tampa, Florida.

The Conference was opened by Rev. M. C. Kittle, District Superintendent. Rev. Edward Moore led in prayer. Rev. N. Rickner led the Conference in singing "Glory To His Name", "Down At The Cross", "It Will Never Lose It's Power", and "Isn't He Wonderful".

Rev. M. C. Kittle, District Superintendent, introduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins, Secretary of Church Extension, who expressed regret that Rev. R. G. Flexon, General Superintendent, was unable to be with us.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins, reading from the Book of Hebrews, Chapter 13:5-9, gave a timely message on "The Life Of Evenness", urging all in times of joy and blessing or adversity, to keep our lives "even" by the help of God.

A Quartet from the Tampa Church sang "Heavenly Love".

The Secretary, Rev. Harry M. Lee, called the roll.

It was moved and seconded to receive the following into the Conference, pending their letter of transfer; Rev. Charles Edward Moore, Rev. L. E. Fleming, and Rev. Ronald Evans.

A motion was made and seconded that the Conference Bar consist of the first six pews on both sides of the church, and the platform.

A motion was made and seconded that the first sitting of the Conference adjourn at 10 p.m. and reconvene the following day at 8:30 a.m.

All Ministerial and Lay Delegates were asked to be seated within the Bar.

Rev. M. C. Kittle introduced Rev. Armstrong Pastor of Plant City Nazarene Church; Rev. Robert Emmons, Pastor of Huntsville, Alabama Pilgrim Church and Rev. Kenneth Bowers, Minister in the Weslyn Methodist Church, to the conference. Each gave a victorious testimony and were granted honorary seat within the Conference bar.

The Chair called for the report of the District Superintendent, Rev. M. C. Kittle, which was read and accepted by a standing vote and a hearty AMEN.

The congregation then stood and sang "To The Work".

The newly organized Pinecrest Church of Tampa was received into the Conference by the District Superintendent.

**REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE**

It was moved and seconded to delete resolutions Number 2, 3, 13, and 14-B from the conference minutes. Carried.

It was moved and seconded to delete resolution 14-B from the Conference Minutes.

A motion prevailed to amend resolution 14-B.

Motion to amend resolution 14-B was lost.

The previous question was voted upon and carried.

Due to expiration of time, it was moved and seconded the meeting adjourn. Carried.

### Second Sitting

The second sitting convened Tuesday, May 29, 1962, at 8:30 a.m. Rev. F. A. Sumwalt led the congregation in singing "The Lily Of The Valley". Rev. Ray Richards led in prayer.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins read from the Scriptures, Isaiah Chapter 58, speaking on the subject "The Lord Shall Guide Us Continually". Rev Hawkins pointed out, the Children of Israel had fallen into the snare of fasting, praying and struggling within themselves, in order to have their own way. God did not honor their fasting and praying. Rev. Hawkins instructed us on the ways to get results from fasting and praying. They were as follows:

1. Do all things to the Glory of God.
2. Lift up the Standard of Holiness.
3. Live a consecrated devotional life.

The climax of his remarks were for us to do all things in the will of God, to stay in the middle of the road and never let the devil get us sidetracked.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins called the meeting to order.

Roll call was omitted by order of the Chair.

The minutes of the first sitting were read and approved as corrected.

Rev. N. C. Rickner introduced Rev. Garrett, Minister in The Church of Christ and Christian Union and Rev. Paul White, Minister in the Church of the Nazarene. After giving a warm testimony they were granted honorary seats within the Conference bar.

The Chair called for the report of the Sunday School Promotional Secretary. Since the report was not completed time was granted for him to do so.

Report of the Resolution Committee continued:

Moved and seconded to include Conference Youth Leader to Resolution No. 15. Carried.

Moved and seconded to adopt the Youth Program presented. Carried.

Moved and seconded to adopt the resolution, in regards to, Pastor and Delegate expense to District Conference. Carried.

Report of Ways and Means Committee read and accepted. (See Ways and Means).

Report of District Sunday School Promotional Secretary read and accepted.

The Fort Lauderdale Church, Rev. E. O. Howell, Pastor, received the Annual District Trophy. Presented to the Church with the highest points in "The Decade Of Progress" report. Scoring 6,895 points. This is the second consecutive year for this church to receive the trophy.

Rev. N. C. Rickner read a poem "The Pastor's Wife".

The Chair asked for invitations to host the 1963 Annual District Con-

ference. A number of churches responded. A vote was taken. The invitation to Satellite Beach was accepted.

The Educational and Examining Board recommended that, Larry M. Lee and Mrs. C. H. Tincher, be listed in Licensed Song Evangelists.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins reported the following appointments had been made by the General Board:

Rev. M. C. Kittle, District Superintendent.

Rev. Harry M. Lee, District Secretary.

Rev. E. O. Howell, District Treasurer.

Rev. M. C. Kittle appointed Brother Snyder, Rev. Billy Pevy and Rev. F. Sumwalt as tellers.

Ballots were cast and the following officers were elected: Advisory Council Members, Rev. N. C. Rickner and Rev. James Cunningham.

The District Council's nominations for the Examining and Educational Board were as follows: Rev T. R. York and Rev. N. C. Rickner.

Rev. N. C. Rickner was elected to serve three years

Rev. R. C. Hawkins expressed thanks and gratitude for the excellent unity, in the manner the Conference had been conducted, and thanked God for the unusual progress that had been made in the District.

The Resolutions Committee recommended that a rising vote of thanks be given Rev. R. C. Hawkins and Rev. M. C. Kittle, the local Church and all who had a part in making this Conference a successful one.

Moved and seconded for the District Council to take care of any unfinished business. Carried.

Moved and seconded to adjourn the Conference. Carried.

The congregation arose in singing, "Blest Be The Tie That Binds".

Rev. Charles Edward Moore dismissed in prayer.

## DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Ninth Annual Conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Dr. Hawkins, our Chairman, the Ministers, Delegates and Greetings in His name who loved us and gave Himself for us. friends,

Through another Conference year God has been good to us and to my knowledge we haven't lost a minister from our rolls and for this we give thanks. We have released some valuable laymen to His care and their reward, and while we inevitably miss them we rejoice in the deliverance from decaying bodies, earthly problems and Satan's darts. May their labors follow after them.

We have much to be thankful for in a material way as again God has been good to us, new property acquired, improvements made indebtedness discharged on most of our loans.

We can never be satisfied with our spiritual progress for this is not an age of devout living. We have had some splendid conversions and some good revivals but not nearly enough. When we measure the responsibility, entrusted to us in this great state, our first prayer is for spiritual fires to burn in our breasts that all may see the reality of our salvation as it is reflected in us.

We shall consider with thanksgiving our MATERIAL PROGRESS as follows:

BRADENTON is remodeling and preparing Sunday School rooms.

CLEARVIEW PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH, formerly Pinellas Park, received a fine building from the Clearview Association with a minimum equity of \$8,000 and will have a small indebtedness of approximately \$3,700 on the entire property. We rejoice with them.

BEVERLY PARK has completed a beautiful parsonage valued at \$15,000. Installed air conditioning valued at \$1,000. Rev and Mrs. Ronald Evans have donated a beautiful organ, altogether this gives the property a valuation of approximately \$50,000.

FORT LAUDERDALE is building 7 new Sunday School rooms with cash to complete them, have painted the Church and put in new sidewalks.

INTERCESSION CITY has redecorated the parsonage.

TAMPA FOREST HILLS, formerly Tampa 1st, has put a new roof on the church, installed two furnaces in the church and one in the parsonage, finished the study for the pastor, and are completing Sunday School rooms.

TAMPA PINE CREST have purchased lots valued at \$3,300.

SATELLITE BEACH has filled and graded the parsonage lot, done the finish work and decorating on the church, also the landscaping on the church property.

ST. PETERSBURG installed a heating and air conditioning unit valued at \$2,500.

WARRINGTON has added 2 Sunday School rooms, put on a new roof, enlarged the Auditorium, in fact the Church has been completely remodeled, now has brick veneer and limestone front. Central heating and a new water heater have been installed in the parsonage. They have followed the pay as you go plan.

WEST HOLLYWOOD has redecorated the church, installed a new electrical system, and a new ceiling in the church, and have new chairs for the choir.

LYNN HAVEN has completed the bathroom and redecorated the par-

sonage.

All of the churches have completed some project.

## OUR FUTURE

The problem of the Church today is not that the Gospel has lost its power but that the Church has lost its audience. On a group level, frequently no one is listening when the Gospel is preached, this is usually because contact has been lost with non christians on a personal level. Someone has said "The Holy Spirit cannot save Saints or Seats". In how many churches is the Gospel preached week after week to the same people? The result is sterility, deadness, and increasingly a feeling that the Gospel is unattractive and powerless. This result in a growing inferiority complex.

It has been a common teaching in our churches that separation from the world means isolation from the world, as a result we have largely retreated within our own walls and have ceased to be militant and are in many instances just holding on. Holding on does not win battles, WE MUST BECOME AGGRESSIVE, WE MUST REACH PEOPLE.

I recommend a more active part in Civic affairs.

I recommend a more active part participation in Youth activities. We must strive to provide legitimate recreational and social activities for our Young People.

We must train our laymen for Christian service.

We must understand that we have goals to meet and that each of us is responsible to reach our part of these goals. We must understand that a 10% increase in membership annually is expected of us and THAT is to be our minimum gain. We must understand that a 10% increase in Sunday School attendance is our annual goal and that it is necessary for our continued existence as a church.

I recommend that we earnestly strive to build MEN'S Bible classes.

I recommend instituting men's fellowship groups in our churches.

We must have PRAYER meetings in our churches.

We must have more revivals. This is our emphasis.

We must remember that GOD'S PROMISES are coupled to OUR FAITH, and the answer is dependent on that faith.

We must have a program, hap-hazard church work cannot make progress, "Monotony Kills".

To have a winning team we must have team work. Sometimes this requires the sacrifices of some of our own methods and ideals, and the adopting of those that lead to united efforts. No man is big enough to be an individualist in the face of today's problems.

I recommend that each pastor on the District be responsible for the assigned financial obligation of the District on a MONTHLY BASIS, this to be a sacred obligation on his part.

I recommend that each pastor make clear to the members of his congregation the financial plan adopted by this conference, the first Sunday following this Conference.

I recommend that one prayer meeting a month be given over to praying for souls, new churches and revivals.

I further recommend that the first day of each month be known as a day of fasting and prayer, a time of soul searching as to our fervor, soul burden and consecration.

**RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT**

**No. 1 Appreciation**

We, the Florida District Conference wish to express our appreciation to our General Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, for his inspiring leadership and efficient services. We also wish to express appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. M. C. Kittle, members of the District Council, and the many members and friends of the Church for their labors of love in making this conference a successful one.

**No. 2 Committees**

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees not elected by the Conference or appointed by the District Council. (Standing Rule)

### **No. 3 Conference**

Be it resolved that the Conference Year shall end April 30th and that all reports shall be in the hands of the District Statistician and all funds in the hands of the District Treasurer by May 15. The District records shall close May 31 and the Annual Conference shall be held the third week of June, the place to be determined by the District Council. (Standing Rule)

### **No. 4 Conference Delegates**

Whereas the conference delegates give their time to attend the conference, and whereas there is additional expense involved, be it resolved that six cents per mile be paid for travel. Cost of meals and lodging shall also be paid for. This cost shall be borne by the local church. Each church shall sponsor one car.

### **No. 5 Finance**

Be it resolved that the local Church Treasurers balance their books at the close of each month and forward all District and General funds to the District Treasurer immediately. (Standing Rule)

### **No. 6 Ministerial Meeting**

Be it resolved that we have an annual Ministerial Meeting, the time and place to be determined by the District Council. Be it further resolved that the District Council appoint a program committee. (Standing Rule)

### **No. 7 Ministers**

Be it resolved that all Ministers accepted as members by the Annual Conference of the Florida District, shall place their membership in some local church in the District within thirty days following the close of the Conference and that they shall make quarterly reports to the District Superintendent and an annual report to the District Statistician (Standing Rule)

### **No. 8 Missionary Societies**

Be it resolved that the Conference elect a Missionary President for the District for the coming Conference year to work in cooperation with the local missionary societies and assist in the organization of new groups where possible.

### **No. 9 Parsonages**

Be it resolved that each local Church provide a parsonage with at least a telephone, utilities, refrigerator and cooking stove. (Standing Rule)

### **No. 10 Pastors**

Be it resolved that each Pastor be granted a two weeks' vacation with pay annually.

### **No. 11 Revival**

Be it resolved that each local Church set aside one day each year for fasting and prayer and that we pray for the leadership of the Holy Spirit in all matters that we intercede for a Revival in our Churches.

### **No. 12 Sunday Schools**

Be it resolved that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary

publish a news sheet each month showing the attendance of each Sunday School and news items. These reports shall be sent to each pastor in sufficient number that they can be passed to each family in the Church. (Standing Rule)

#### **No. 13 Youth**

Be it resolved that there be a District Youth Board consisting of the District Superintendent, Conference Youth Leader and the District Youth Treasurer. Their duties shall be to determine the program, time and place of our District Youth activities. (Standing Rule)

Since the pastor has various activities to plan, be it resolved that the youth zone leader, local youth leader and the pastor plan the programs, set the date and chose the place of the zone meetings. When convenient, we request that the District Superintendent meet with the group when making these plans.

Be it further resolved, that the zone leader, local youth leader, local treasurer and the pastor be known as the executive committee.

They shall raise funds in the youth zone meetings and disburse the same.

### **WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT**

#### **BUDGET**

1. Be it resolved that each Church pay eight (8%) per cent of the regular and Sunday School offerings to be applied on the District Budget. Be it further resolved that the United Stewardship Fund be \$8.00 per member as recommended by the General Conference.

2. Be it resolved that the District Budget be pro-rated as follows: District Administration, 88%; District Camp and Conference, 6%; General Conference, 5%; Southern Pilgrim College, 1%.

#### **DISTRICT MINISTERS**

3. Be it resolved that all ordained and licensed ministers of the District pay fifty (50%) per cent of their tithes from ministerial labors, into the District treasury, through the local Church where their membership is held, the same to be applied on the District Budget.

#### **SALARIES**

4. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be paid one hundred and sixty (\$160.00) dollars on his salary monthly.

5. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer be paid \$50.00 annually and the District Secretary be paid \$25.00 annually.

6. Be it resolved that the District officials, other than the District Superintendent be paid 6c per mile, by auto, plus lodging and meals when engaged in District business.

#### **DISTRICT EXPENSE**

7. Be it resolved that the District Statistician shall be paid for all mailing and publishing expense.

8. Be it resolved that there be 250 copies of the District Minutes printed, each Church to be assessed \$5.00 for 10 copies, additional copies 50c each.
