FLORIDA CONFERENCE

Journal of Proceedings First Sitting

Monday, June 19th., 1967, 7:00 P.M.

The first sitting of the Fourteenth Annual Conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 7:00 P.M. June 19th. 1967, at Morrison Memorial Church, Intercession City.

The conference opened with Rev. H. A. Lewis leading the congregation in singing songs, "Such Love, Holiness Unto the Lord, and At Calvary." Rev. Kittle was then called upon to lead the congregation in prayer.

Rev. W. H. Neff then welcomed the pastors, delegates and friends to the conference.

A special song was then sung by Bro. and Sister Lewis, "All Things in Jesus".

Rev. W. H. Neff then introduced Rev. W. N. Miller, General Secretary of Church Extension, to the conference. Rev. Miller then brought the message of the hour, "Building the local Church." He based his message on two passages of scripture--matthew- Chapter 16 and verse 18 and also from St. John, chapter 17 verses 20-22. The emphises being on Jesus will build his church if we will let Him. This can be done through unity with one another in love by the spirit. Bro. Miller stated that there are three major points that will help build our churches. #1 Atmosphere #2 Attitude #3 Adjustment. We are to have an atmosphere of love for all and our attitude should be optimistic toward our work in the church and if not to make adjustment looking for help from God for unity of the spirit. Climaxing his message by stating that forgiveness is an important phase of our christian perfection.

The conference then entered into the business session.

A motion was made and seconded that the Conference bar consist of the first 15 rows of pews of the south side of the church and also the front of the church.

A motion carried for the conference to adjourn at 9:30 and reconvene at 8:30 A.M. Recess at 12:00 noon and reconvene at 1:30 P.M.

The roll was called by the Secretary.

Rev. and Sister Jackson, Rev. and Sister Duda and Rev. Newton were introduced to the conference by the District Superintendent. Rev. Jackson, Rev. Duda, and Rev. Newton were then given seats within the conference bar.

It was moved and seconded to grant honorary seats in the conference bar to Rev. Lemon of the Michigan District and also to Rev. Cecil W. Shaffer pastor of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of Intercession City Fla.

The chair then asked for the report of the District Superintendent, Rev. W. H. Neff, which was then read and accepted by a hearty "Amen."

The treasurer's report was then given and accepted, subject to the auditors report.

The chair then asked for the report for the statisticians report. The report was read and accepted by a rising vote of thanks.

The report of the District Youth Promotional Secretary, Ralph Baynum was read and accepted.

The report of the Sunday School Promotional Secretary was then called for. The report was then read and accepted. Certificates were presented to the Sunday Schools showing attendance gains.

Rev. Miller then asked the congregation to stand and the meeting adjourned in prayer by Rev. Billy Pevy.

SECOND SITTING

The second setting convened Tuesday morning, June 20th, at 8:30 A.M. Rev. H. A. Lewis opened the service by leading the congregation in singing "Majestic Sweetness". Brother Darter from Ft. Myers led in prayer.

Bro. Neff then spoke to the congregation, especially to the preachers on "God's men are called and are to be disciplined men." Using II Corinthians, Chapter 6, verses 1-10 as the basis of the message. Stating that we are to check ourselves and to keep ourselves under discipline. Paul says to give no offence to the gospel. Live naturally and spiritually as to give no offense. But in all things approving ourselves in all patience, in affliction, hardships, necessities etc, drives one to the secret closet of prayer. In all things we are to approve ourselves that the ministry be not blamed.

Brother Miller then proceeded on to the business of the conference.

The education and examination report was given and accepted.

The auditing committee report was given and accepted.

The resolution committee report was given and accepted. Resolution #1 was tabled. To appoint a camp meeting committee. Carried. (See resolution on camp meeting.)

Resolution #2 on Youth work carried. (See resolution on youth work.)

Resolution #3--The annual conference be held after the General and merging conference was carried. The District council to decide the conference and merging conference with the Wesleyan council. Carried.

Resolution #4--District Parsonage (amended) a committee appointed and bring their recommendations to the first merging conference was carried. (See resolution on District parsonage.)

Resolution #5--Youth zone leaders become a part (members of the youth council) Carried. visit every church respectfully. Carried.

The ways and means committees report was carried. (See report) Resolutions 2 and 3 were carried. 9 by common consent, and 10 youth program was carried.

A recess was called at 10:15. The meeting to be reconvened at 10:30.

Brother Miller then asked that two members of the council be elected to the council. Rev. Ray Richards and Rev. Floyd Gookins were then elected to the Council.

Brother Miller then stated that for the next year, 1968, for the General conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church we were to have one lay delegate represented from our district and for the merging conference of the Wesleyan and Pilgrim conference we were to have two delegates represented from our district. A motion was made and seconded for the council to bring recommendations of lay delegated back to the conference floor. The motion was carried. R. V. Baynum was elected as ministerial delegate with Rev. Richards as the 1st. alternate and Rev. York as the 2nd. Alternate. Brother Miller then talked about the special offer that Brother Beltz had made the church extension districts. He stated that all ministers who would like to become members have a wonderful opportunity at this time.

Rev. Neff then introduced Brother and Sister Duda to the congregation. Rev. and Mrs. Duda are to be the pastors of the Deverly Park church in Hollywood Fla. Sister Bassett also was presented to the conference with Miss Ruth who had come to America from South America to help Sister Bassett in translating the New Testament into her native language. Sister Bassett then gave her testimony how that this work was on her heart.

The meeting was recessed by prayer by Brother Virgil Lashbrook.

THIRD SITTING

The third sitting convened with Brother Lewis leading the congregation in singing "Joy Unspeakable." Rev. Audley Freed led the congregation in prayer.

Two laymen then were elected for the General and merging conference. The one with the highest number of votes will go to the General and merging conference and the other will just go to the merging conference.

Elected were---Don Gookins for both of the conference and the merging Conference. Brother Sprunger to the merging conference with Don Gookins. Alternates were Brother Benjamin and Brother Browning.

Brother Miller then called upon Brother Hilson to come forward and report to the conference about group life insurance for the district ministers.

Ways and means reported again. Resolution to increase the salaries of the treasurer, secretary and statistician.

Memories report was given. A time of silent prayer after which Rev. J. C. Baynum led in prayer.

Rev. Neff then recommended the committees for the following year. A motion was made and accepted on his recommendations.

Rev. Neff then thanked the church and Intercession City for the fine reception we had received in behalf of the conference.

All matters of unfinished business to be referred to the Council. Motion made and carried.

A motion was made that we enter into the minutes our gratitude to Rev. Miller and Rev. Neff for the efficient work that has been done this year by these men. The motion was seconded and carried.

The conference was asked to stand and sing the Doxology and Rev. Neff asked Brother George Ransom to dismiss in prayer.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

SALUTATION: To General Superintendent Elliott, Secretary Nelson Miller, delegates and friends of the 14th. Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Florida:

I must say that it is a real surprise for me to find myself on this platform making this kind of a report, when last June I withdrew from the General Church work. I had no idea that I would land in Florida in this capacity. However, I can honestly say that it has been good to be here. God had been good, Secretary Miller had been good, and you have been good to me.

Since I have served only six months of the Conference year, ending April 30, my reports will, of necessity, be comparatively brief.

Most of what I have discovered upon taking over the Administration work has been very gratifying. Of most importance, I have found as a whole, a group of preachers who want to see the work advance, who are making real sacrifices to see it advance, and who want to see it go forward with scriptural marks of authenticity upon it. Supporting the ministers is a body of dedicated laymen who know what it takes for a Church Extension District to succeed and are giving, working, and praying to this end.

THE DISTRICT CHURCH

The District Youth Committee, under the chairmanship of Ralph Baynum has been alive and alert to the needs of our youth. It has sponsored zone meetings, under regional leadership, that have been much enjoyed and very profitable. Thank God for a growing group of youth in most places! Last August a highly successful Youth Camp, in conjunction with our Wesleyan youth, was conducted and another is planned for this coming August.

The District Sunday School Committee, H. A. Lewis chairman--I think you will find a substantial increase in Sunday school interest. Brother Lewis' monthly reports have been very exciting.

I do not yet know what the statistician's report will reveal. Indications point to a plus report. People are necessary, you know, to the on going of the work.

LOCAL CHURCHES

A brief report of the local churches shows weaknesses and strengths. Some churches showed gains in

membership; others, loss. Some showed gains in Sunday School; others, loss. Some paid all or part of their budgets; others paid little or none. This year we will do better, work harder, give more, and pray more. Amen! It is not good when the same churches year after year undercut the advances of other churches.

This report will not show the physical improvements that have been made. In fact there has not been a great deal of this except for a few: Ft. Lauderdale, Warrington, and Lynn Haven. Most of the churches are kept in reasonable good repair. Heaven had the record of all that has been done for His cause.

I have found the spiritual tide to be running high in certain places: revival and spiritual freedom prevail. This is good and must be our outstanding characteristic.

PERSONAL REPORT

I have traveled approximately 7500 miles, preached 85 times, chaired 3 council meetings, visited the churches 52 times, conducted two revivals on the District, and attended 5 youth meetings. In March I attended a Pension Board meeting in Indianapolis and also spent three weeks in deputation work for the Church Extension Department.

I want to propose the following for this year:

- #1 That we do more to save our youth, through the Sunday school, Junior Church membership, CrC, and other wholesome activities.
- #2 That we keep our eyes and ears open for missions or church, tired of their independency, who may want to unite with a growing and spiritual denomination.
- #3 That we have a renewed concern for keeping the blessing on our services, have revivals, not necessarily for 3 days or 3 weeks, but revival whatever form it takes.
- #4 That we go after new saved members.
- #5 That we emphasize the three point program of Clyde Dupin: Prayer, witness, visitation--these are primary.

Before concluding my report, I wish to state a real personal loss to me and to the district, in the death of Vergil Caldwell. He was a brother beloved by all and we shall miss him here, but plan to meet him over there.

I wish to thank you all for your acceptance of me as your district superintendent and for your prayers in our behalf. I do appreciate the fine cooperation and the good spirit on the district.

I do believe that Florida has the highest potential for growth of all of our Church Extension districts. A bright future is in store.

REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

To the Fourteenth Annual Conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church:

Greetings in Jesus Name:

I am indeed grateful to the Lord for the things that have been accomplished during the past conference year. I appreciate the cooperation of each pastor and Sunday School worker. To those who helped make the Sunday School workshops a success, I want to say a special "Thank You!" The work of the Sunday School board consisting of Bro. Freed and Bro. Pevy, is deeply appreciated.

There were eight churches reporting gains totaling 45, while eight reported losses totaling 33. Therefore there is a net gain of 12, or 1.3% gain, for the conference year. St. Petersburg achieved the highest numerical gain of 15. Zephyr Hills achieved the highest percentage gain of 33%.

To the eight Sunday Schools showing a gain for the year, the Sunday School Board presents certificates of recognition.

Zephyr Hills with a 33% gain
Ft. Myers with a 18% gain
St. Petersburg with a 16% gain
Warrington with a 10% gain
Clearview with a 8% gain
Orlando with a 8% gain
Miami with a 7% gain
Intercession City with a 2% gain

I feel these are the greatest days that have ever been for kingdom building. A greater part of this building is done through our Sunday Schools. Realizing this, let us strive throughout the coming year to make this the best Sunday School year the Florida District has ever known. With God's help this goal can come to pass and the victory can be ours.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

No. 1 Committees

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees not elected by Conference or appointed by the District Council. (Standing Rule)

No. 2 Conference

Be it resolved that the Conference year shall end April 30 and that all reports shall be in the hands of the District Statistician and all funds in the hands of the District Treasurer by May 10. The District records shall close May 15.

No. 3 Conference Delegates

Whereas the Conference delegates give their time to attend the Conference, and whereas there is additional expense involved, be it resolved that five cents per mile be paid for travel. Cost of meals and lodging shall also be paid for. This cost shall be borne by the local church. Each church shall sponsor one car.

No. 4 Finance

Be it resolved that the local Church Treasurers balance their books at the close of each month and forward all District and General funds to the District Treasurer immediately. (Standing Rule)

No. 5 Ministerial Meeting

Be it resolved that we have an annual Ministerial Meeting, the time and place to be determined by the District Conference. Be it further resolved that the District Council appoint a program committee. (Standing Rule)

No. 6 Ministers

Be it resolved that all Ministers accepted as members by the Annual Conference of the Florida District, shall place their membership in some local church in the District within thirty days following the close of the Conference and that they shall make quarterly reports to the District Superintendent and an Annual report to the District Statistician. (Standing Rule)

No. 7 Parsonage

Be it resolved that each Church provide a parsonage with at least a telephone, utilities, refrigerator and cooking stove. (Standing Rule)

No. 8 Pastors

Be it resolved that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay annually.

No. 9 Pastors Recall

Be it resolved that the vote on the pastors recall shall be taken in the first week of April and the results be immediately forwarded to the District Superintendent. Be it further resolved that where the pastor intends to resign or change churches, that he shall notify the District Superintendent not later than April 1st. This shall not apply to those serving under unexpired extended calls.

NO. 10 Revival

Be it resolved that the Florida Conference set Friday noon meal as a time of prayer and fasting and we urge each local church when possible to observe the same.

No. 11 Sunday Schools

Be it resolved that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary publish a news sheet each month showing the attendance of each Sunday School and news items. These reports shall be sent to each pastor in sufficient number that they can be passed to each family in the church. (Standing Rule)

No. 12 District Youth

Be it resolved that there be a District Youth Board consisting of the District Superintendent, Conference Youth Leader and the District Youth Treasurer. Their duties shall be to determine the program, time and place

of our District Youth Activities. Be it further resolved that all youth zone leaders be automatically appointed to become the district youth council, and they shall be asked to visit each church in their zone during the conference year, to promote the organization of the youth societies and promote the youth work in general (Standing Rule)

No. 13 Zone Youth

Be it resolved that the Zone President, Secretary, Treasurer, Local Youth Leaders and the Pastor constitute a committee. They shall plan the programs, set the date and choose the place of the zone meeting. They shall raise funds in the youth zone meetings and disburse the same.

No. 14 Building Committee

Since the location and type of building is of much importance, therefore we recommend that a District Building Committee be set up to work with the local church board and the local building committee when new buildings are to be constructed. Any cost involved shall be borne by the local church.

No. 15 Progress

Whereas the Wesleyan and Pilgrim Conference are vitally interested in a district parsonage: Be it resolved that a committee of three be appointed from our conference by the council to work with the committee of the Wesleyan conference, to bring plans and recommendations to the merged conference. Passed

No. 16 District Sunday School

Whereas the District Sunday School Board has taken steps to promote Sunday School Workshops and feel these Workshops are of vital importance to the life of our District Sunday School: Be it resolved that the District Conference take definite action to continue and support this phase of district work. Passed

No. 17 General Conference

Whereas the merger of the Wesleyan and Pilgrim churches will be consummated at the next General Conference which meets in June of 1968: Be it resolved that the annual conference of the Florida District be convened after the General Conference of 1968. This action is being followed by the Wesleyan Conference. Passed

No. 18 Revivals

Be it resolved that the Church Board and Pastor consult the District Superintendent, when calling an evangelist from outside our denomination.

No. 19 Insurance

Be it resolved that the District Council appoint a committee to secure information about a True Group Hospital Plan. When sufficient information has been obtained, the District Council shall have power to put the plan in force.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Be it resolved that each church pay 10% of the regular and Sunday School offerings to be applied on the District Budget.
2. Be it resolved that the United Stewardship fund be \$9.50 per member as recommended by the General Conference.
3. Be it resolved that the District Budget be prorated as follows: District Administration 85%; camp and conference 5%; General Conference 2%; Sunday School District Promotion 3%; District Youth promotion 3%; and Southern Pilgrim College 2%.
4. Be it resolved that all ordained and licensed ministers of the District pay fifty (50%) per cent of their tithes from ministerial labors, into the District Treasury, through the local church where their membership is held, the same to be applied on the District Budget. (Standing Rule)
5. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be paid two hundred (\$200.00) dollars on his salary monthly
6. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer be paid \$75.00 annually and the District Secretary be paid \$50.00 annually, the District Statistician be paid \$25.00 annually, and District Publications be paid \$25.00 annually.
7. Be it resolved that the District officials, other than the District Superintendent be paid 6 cents per mile, by auto, plus lodging and meals when engaged in District business.
8. Be it resolved that the District Statistician and Sunday School Promotional Secretary shall be paid for all mailing and publishing expense.
9. Be it resolved that there be 250 copies of the District minutes printed, and that each church be assessed \$5.00 and given ten copies. Additional copies 50 cents each.
10. Be it resolved that actual travel expense of the Zone Chairman be reimbursed from their respective Zone for promotional work in the Youth program.

REPORT OF THE YOUTH DIRECTOR

To the 1967 Annual Conference,

Secretary Miller, District Superintendent Neff, Ministers, Delegates, and Friends:

Florida Pilgrim Youth are continuing to make good progress in areas of organization and spiritual development. Although it is quite apparent there is much territory yet to be taken, it is our feeling that pilgrim Youth are ready and willing to shoulder the responsibility and effort required to develop a solid district youth program.

Again I am happy to report a highly successful Youth Camp. We broke all records with over 130 campers. About 65 of these were Pilgrim Youth. There were many spiritual victories, and the result of these transformations are still being felt by many of our churches. I would say again, at the risk of repeating myself, that Youth Camp Pays, if you want real revival in your church, send your unsaved teen-agers to Youth Camp and in a large percentage of cases, they will return with the zeal and compassion of their newly found Savior to bless and revitalize their home church.

All Zones have been active this year. The Gold Coast Zone, under the leadership of Mr. Ken Evans, has had good Attendance and interesting programs.

We had the privilege of speaking at a Skyway Zone meeting and was very impressed with the high enthusiasm and large crowd. Mr. George McCrory continues to do an excellent job as Zone Chairman of this Zone.

The Orange Belt Zone, under the leadership of Rev. Ray Richards, has been meeting jointly with the Wesleyan Youth. According to reports there has been an excellent spirit of cooperation, and the services have been well attended.

Although separated by great distance from the rest of the Zones, the Western Area has continued to function admirably. We want to express our appreciation to Rev. Leonard Davis for a job well done.

Recommendations

We would urgently recommend that Zone and District attention be given to formulation of P.Y.S. organizations in every one of our churches. By way of suggestion, may we further state that a good time to start your P.Y.S. is immediately upon return of your teen-agers from Youth Camp. We desperately need P.Y.S. to assure the development of youth leadership in our churches.

May we again take this opportunity to thank the Youth Council, the Youth Camp workers, the Zone Chairmen and all of you who have worked so hard to make our Florida

Pilgrim Youth program the success that it is.
