**GENERAL PROCEEDINGS**

The Seventh Annual Conference of the Gulf States District convened at the Pineville Pilgrim Church Sept. 2, 1946 at 9 A.M. with Rev. J. C. Williams in charge. Bro. Price Allen led the conference in singing "Where He Leads I Will Follow." Sister Herman Baden led in prayer. After singing "Living By Faith" Bro. Williams introduced Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Sec'y of Home Missions.

Bro. Beltz addressed the conference using as a subject, "Making the Best of A Bad Situation," using for a scripture lesson Titus 1:1-5, Text V. 5 "For this cause I left thee in Crete, that thou shouldest set in order the things that are wanting." After the address Bro. Beltz took the chair and opened the business session of the conference.

The Conference Bar was established being the first three pews of the auditorium and the platform. Roll was called by the secretary.

Four ordained ministers and one ordained deaconess were presented and received into the conference with letters from their respective conferences. They were, Rev. L. T. Crute, Indiana; Rev. Ed York, Ohio; Rev. Stewart Reprogle, Indiana; Rev. C. E. Johnson, Kentucky, and Mrs. C. E. Johnson, Kentucky.

Rev. Hill of Ohio was presented to the conference and granted a seat within the bar.

At the suggestion of the presiding officer, the conference time was set as follows: 9 to 11:30 A.M., 2 to 5 P.M. and 7 P.M. until finished.

The Dist. Supt. appointed several committees with the approval of Rev. Beltz.

Dist. Supt. report was read and accepted.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee read as a whole, recommendations re-read and acted upon separately.

First sitting of conference adjourned by expiration of time.

### Second Sitting

The second sitting of the conference convened at 2 P.M. Rev. S. P. Creech led the conference in singing "Blessed Assurance," after which prayer was offered by Bro. McCord.

Bro. Beltz again addressed the conference using as a scripture Ezekiel 37.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and accepted.

Report of the Statistician was read and accepted.

Report of the Resolution Committee was read as a whole, the resolutions were re-read and acted upon separately.

Report of District Treasurer read and accepted.

Motion made and carried that Bro. Williams and Bro. Carter sing. They sang "He's Coming Back Again."

Examining board report read and accepted. (See directory).

Final report of Ways and Means Committee read and accepted.

Final Report of Resolution Committee read and accepted.

The Conference elected C. E. Johnson and S. P. Creech as additional councilmen.

The conference ratified by election the nomination of C. E. Johnson, and G. B. Carroll as District Trustees in addition to Dist. Supt. J. C. Williams.

At the instruction of the presiding officer, Bro. Beltz, the Dist. Supt. appointed the committees to act for the coming year. The appointments were ratified by the conference. (See Directory).

Minutes were read and approved.

Motion made and carried that the council be empowered by the conference to take care of any unfinished business.

The Conference was closed with words of counsel from the Gen. Sec'y of Home Missions, and the ministers and lay delegates bowing at the altar of prayer, petitioning God Almighty to help us this coming year.

## RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. That all licensed and ordained ministers shall pay their ministerial tithe into the District Treasury and it be applied on the District Superintendent's salary.
2. That all birthday offerings be paid to the District Treasurer and applied on District Home Missions.
3. That each church pay 10 per cent of all regular tithes and offerings to the District Treasurer, the same to be applied on the District Budget.
4. That the District Superintendent's traveling expenses, while traveling in the interest of the district be paid at the rate of three (\$.03) cents per mile, also correspondence and communications shall be paid by the district treasurer.
5. That on each quarterly visit of the Dist. Supt. each church shall take an offering to be applied on traveling expenses.
6. That all monies shall be sent to the district treasurer not later than the tenth of each month.
7. We recommend that each church be asked to pay the equivalent of fifty (\$.50) cents per member per year, the same to be applied on General Conference Expenses.
8. That there be a camp meeting registration fee of \$1.00 for all above the age of 18. The same to be applied to the expense of the camp.
9. We recommend that each church be asked to contribute the equivalent of twenty-five (\$.25) cents per member per month to District Home Missions.
10. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$25 for his services, the same to be paid out of the District Budget.
11. We recommend that the District Supt. be paid \$100 per month, the same to be paid out of ministerial tithe and Dist. Budget.
12. We recommend that all ministers who hold conference license and are not stationed shall pay into the District Treasury \$1 per month.
13. We recommend that the District Sec'y be paid \$15 for his services.

## RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that all ministers and workers attend the camp meeting throughout.
2. Resolved that the churches pay their pastors while attending the camp and conference same as if they were on the charge.
3. Resolved that our Christian Workers Convention be held the second Friday, Saturday and Sunday of January.
4. Resolved that our conference year close on the 30th of June.
5. Resolved that the quarterly reports shall be mailed to the Dist. Supt. and that the yearly reports be made in duplicate, one copy being mailed immediately to the Dist. Statistician and the other be retained to be brought by the delegate to the conference.
6. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of their reports to the Dist. Statistician not later than ten days after the conference year closes which is the 30th day of June, and that

- the statistician disregard any and all reports received thereafter. Be it also resolved that the Dist. Treas. books close at noon on the 10th day of July.
7. Resolved that all persons attending the camp shall bring their own bed linens.
  8. Resolved that on the last Wednesday of each quarter a Dist. meeting shall be held at one of our churches, eventually visiting each church.
  9. Resolved that the district treasurer send out to each church a quarterly financial report of all churches in the District.
  10. Resolved that since our conference is no larger than it is, that the conference be conducted in the last Thursday and Friday afternoon of the camp.
  11. Resolved that we register all who come to camp.
  12. Resolved that license shall not be granted to anyone who does not tithe to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.
  13. Resolved that the Gulf States Camp commence the second Friday of July which is July 11.
  14. Resolved that as ministers and Christian workers we especially emphasize the portion of the church covenant referring to dress — "Whose adorning let it not be that outward adorning of plaiting the hair, and wearing of gold, or putting on of apparel, but let it be the hidden man of the heart, in that which is not corruptible, even the ornament of a meek and quiet spirit which is, in the sight of God of great price." 1 Pe. 3:3-4 and according to 1 Tim. 2:9-10 "In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; not with braided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array; but (which becometh women professing godliness) with good works."
  15. Whereas our Dist. Supt. has faithfully and untiringly served the Dist. the past year, therefore be it resolved we show our love and appreciation by standing and saying a hearty "God Bless You" and sing first verse of "Blest Be The Tie That Binds"
  16. Where as the world situation is critical and need for prayer is urgent, therefore be it resolved that we as a Pilgrim Holiness Church as well as other groups have a daily season of special prayer. The time suggested is whole or part of the hour between 7 and 8 each morning when family groups might pray.
  17. Be it resolved that each church give a pounding for the pastor the first prayer meeting night of each month.
  18. Be it resolved that we the Gulf States Conference advise the publishers of the P. H. Advocate that we desire the Advocate to remain as it is a weekly paper.
  19. Be it resolved that we as a conference show our General Sec'y, Bro. Beltz, that we greatly appreciate his presence with us and pledge our utmost loyalty to him. This being done by a rising vote and a hearty "God Bless You."
  20. Be it resolved that we as a conference show our appreciation to Bro. Leadingham, our camp evangelist, by sending him a letter thus stating our appreciation .
  21. Be it resolved that we as a conference show our appreciation to

our cooks and all those who so kindly assisted in the kitchen and dining hall, also the janitor who kept the church very neat and orderly. This being shown by a hearty Amen.

### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Seventh Annual Conference of the Gulf States District.

Greetings:

Through the Mercies of God we have come through another year with Victory in our souls and though the world has been a place of changing events, yet we have moved on to definite victory in Christ. It is not our wish to become satisfied with past results. God has helped the churches this year to achieve something. Nearly every church has increased in membership, Sunday School attendance has increased in a remarkable way, and financially we have gone beyond our expectations.

There have been improvements going on in all the churches.

In Shreveport, La., they have purchased a parsonage and the debt is paid in full. They are in the midst of an improvement program now. The remodeling of the church, which will make this church one of the finest in the District, especially on the inside. Bro. Creech and his loyal folk deserve a lot of credit.

At Simms, La., they have done quite a bit of improving this

year. They completed the belfry and installed a gas system in the church and parsonage. We dedicated the church free of debt, we were also there in two revivals and God surely came on the scene.

In Pineville, La., Bro. and Sis. Carroll are doing a splendid job, seems as though each pastor has had their share of improvements, at this church they are finishing the basement and God is helping them to secure the needed materials, this will be a credit to any District.

Our church at Baton Rouge, La., has had a forward move on there also. They have had several revivals, pitched a tent in a new location, stood by their pastor, had a nice increase in Sunday School, they have paint on hand to paint the outside of the church and plans are laid to install a ventilating system. There is a good future in Baton Rouge.

In Birmingham, Alabama, the work on First Church has shown a splendid increase in all departments, they have one of the liveliest Sunday Schools to be found anywhere. The pastor has at last been able to move into a house close to the church. They have purchased a corner lot and will be able to build a nice parsonage in the future.

Birmingham Second Church, a new work, has been blessed of God. They have had a good start, the Sunday School having gone to 69 on one occasion. We now have a nice lot in a good location, 100 ft. by 140 ft. on the corner of a through street. Plans are being laid to build a church and parsonage in the near future. Bro. Simmons, the pastor at Baton Rouge, plans to take over the work here.

In Montgomery, Alabama, Bro. Strong has been faithful and God has rewarded by helping us to get a building program started, everything looks good for a worm in Montgomery.

In Mobile, Alabama, Bro. C. E. Johnson and his faithful followers are going forward. God has helped Bro. and Sister Johnson since going there and they are looking forward to a new church some time soon, this work is not very old yet, they have averaged 45 in Sunday School, far better than some older churches. Finances have been good.

In the church at Magnolia Springs, Ala., God has blessed in their new brick church, they plan a lot of improvements in the near future. The winter camp proved a success, we had many visitors and some purchased lots on the camp ground. God blessed Bro. C. C. Brown while there, now we have to take their place one of God's very best, Bro. S. Repogle from the Indiana District. We have purchased a splendid parsonage for the place.

At Bogalusa, La., Bro. and Sister McCord carry on. God gave them a good meeting, let us pray for the work there.

We have held seven revivals on the District, helped to promote another, have seen 240 seekers bow at the altar, dealt with a number personally, prayed for a number of sick people, made several visitations, preached around 100 times, helped to start one new work, worked and labored on three building programs, helped to raise several hundred dollars to purchase buildings and pay off debts. The Parsonage was purchased in Shreveport, La., and cash raised

and debt paid off, dedicated the Simms Church free of debt, assisted in another dedication, helped to promote two camps and one preachers meeting. Held five deputational services for the Home Missionary Dept., attended the General Conference, traveled around fifty thousand miles in interest of the Dist. work. Visited each church at least three times or more, helped out in some of their revivals, toured the Dist. with Bro. O. L. Ruth in interest of the Bible School. Have had splendid cooperation with the pastors.

Conducted 7 annual business meetings, had an extra ministerial meeting at Baton Rouge. Pastored the church in Magnolia Springs for two months.

As we look forward to the next year we earnestly covet the prayers of God's people for strength and courage to carry on the program of the Lord, and that many new places will be opened up and souls be brought to God.
