## CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

### First Sitting

The sixth annual conference of the Gulfstates District of Pilgrim Holiness Churches convened at 1:00 P.M., August 5, 1966, at the Paul B. Johnson State Park, near Hattiesburg, Miss.

The sitting was called to order by the District Superintendent, Rev. Edsel Goins. Rev. T. L. Garrison led in the singing of "Spirit of the Living God" and "Amazing Grace". The conference was led in prayer by Mr. Van Davis, lay delegate from Columbia, Miss.

The Chairman of the conference, Rev. William N. Miller, was introduced and presented a challenge to the gathering. Rev. Miller stressed the importance of the work of the district. Matt. 4:18-22, "Follow me and I will make you fishers of men", was the basis for his remarks. He observed, "If we are not fishers of men, we are not following Him". He outlined his message with these points: 1. He called them; 2. He convinced them; 3. He led them; and 4. He sent them. Rev. Miller challenged the conference to have the right atmosphere and go forward in the work of the Lord.

The conference secretary was asked to call the roll. A total of 13 delegates, 1 district trustee, 1 council member, 10 ordained ministers, and 5 licensed ministers were present. This was accepted as presented.

A motion carried to set the conference bar to include the four benches center and left of the Chairman.

A motion to accept the proposed agenda carried.

The Superintendent then called for those persons who were to be introduced to the conference. Rev. Russell Rodriguez, a member of the reception committee, introduced Rev. J. M. Bowers, pastor of Columbia, Miss. He was accepted as a member of the conference.

The District Superintendent, Edsel Goins, read his report, which was accepted.

The Statistician, Rev. Edward Moore, read his report which was accepted.

The Sunday School Promotion Secretary, Rev. T. L. Garrison, read his report, which was accepted as read.

District Auditor, Rev. F. W. Strong, read his report indicating that the treasurer's books were in order. His report was accepted.

Rev. Paul Scheuermeier, District Treasurer, read his report which was accepted.

The report of the Education and Examining Board was read by Rev. E. E. Crowder, and it was accepted as read.

The Chairman called for the report of the Conference Action Committee. A motion carried calling for the reading of all the memorials before any voting.

The agenda adopted by the conference provided for a recess at 3:00 P.M.

The conference resumed its proceedings at 3:15, with Rev. T. L. Garrison leading the group in the song, "Bringing in the Sheaves".

Since the agenda called for the election of district officers at 3:15, the report of the conference action was set aside.

The Chairman called for the selections of tellers. Rev. Goins appointed F. Strong, W. V. Hines, and J. Brewer.

Rev. Miller discussed the list of nominations for the office of District Superintendent. The conference was led in prayer by S. V. Repogle, pastor of the Magnolia Springs Church.

The first ballot for District Superintendent failed to give an election. The Chairman called for a second ballot. A motion carried to vote on the three highest. The second ballot revealed no election. The Chairman instructed the conference to prepare another ballot. Rev. C. K. Crowder asked that his name be withdrawn from the voting. Rev. Goins asked the conference not to consider his name further. The third ballot elected Rev. M. C. House to the office of District Superintendent of the Gulfstates District.

Ballots were cast for the office of Assistant Superintendent. The first ballot showed no election. A second ballot was called for, at which time Rev. Edsel Goins was elected.

Ballots were cast for the office of District Secretary. Rev. C. K. Crowder was elected on the first ballot.

Ballots were cast for the office of District Treasurer. Rev. Paul Scheuermeier was elected on the first ballot.

The Chairman reminded the conference that by action of the conference, at least one member of the council must be a layman. Ballots were cast for the advisory member of the District Council, and Mr. Robert Norris was elected.

The first ballot for District Trustee showed no election. The Chairman called for the second ballot, and Mr. Robert Norris was elected.

The ballot cast for the Educational and Examining Board member showed Rev. S. V. Repogle elected.

Elections having been completed, Rev. Goins read the list of committee appointments. This was accepted.

A motion carried extending the conference time to 5:00 P.M.

The Chairman called for the continuation of the report of the Conference Action Committee. The following memorials appear as they were adopted by the conference:

Be it resolved that the District Council be responsible for a monthly publication to include information from the District Superintendent, news regarding district churches, monthly Sunday School averages, youth news, and other information pertinent to district churches.

Be it resolved that all churches send to the district secretary a list of newly elected church officers with addresses. The secretary shall make a master list and make a copy available to all district officials.

Be it resolved that the conference adopt the Calendar of Events as presented by the Council.

Be it resolved that a list of nominees for district offices be sent to each local church at least 15 days before the annual conference.

Be it resolved that the Conference Action Committee prepare copies of proposed resolutions and these be given pastors and delegates prior to the conference. Resolutions and recommendations must be received by the Committee Chairman by May 30th.

Be it resolved that we continue the "Waging the War" program with the exception of the following changes:

1. Use the 1966 goals this year and continue quadrennial goals through 1970 by adding 10% to the previous year's goal.
2. Item 6 should be deleted and substituted with the findings and recommendations of the District Council.
3. Awards should be given to Sunday School Superintendent and pastors who reach their goals.

Be it resolved that the Assistant District Superintendent shall receive \$60.00 per year for his services. The District Treasurer shall receive \$120.00 a year for his services. The District Secretary shall receive \$50.00 a year for his services.

Be it resolved that the District Council shall be paid car expenses at the rate of 5¢ per mile for meetings called or authorized by the Superintendent.

We recommend that the district pay its share of the Superintendent's salary and Social Security. His travel expense shall be paid at the rate of \$100.00 per month. His postage, stationery and telephone expenses (as used in connection with the district duties) along with the utilities and parsonage shall also be furnished.

Be it resolved that our Sunday School fund be adopted by the following plan:

1. The first Sunday of May shall be known as "Sunday School Dollar Day" in our churches wherein adults shall be urged to give one dollar. All Sunday School offerings received the first Sunday of May shall be sent no later than May 15th to the Sunday School Treasurer.
2. Offerings taken at Sunday School Conventions.
3. Offerings taken at Sunday School sessions at Family camp.

These monies shall be used to promote District Sunday School work.

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent with the Editing Committee, determine regulations that should become standing rules, no longer needing review each year.

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appoint all standing committees subject to the approval of the conference.

Be it resolved that the District Family Camp continue through the weekend and close on Sunday evening.

The conference was adjourned by expiration of time.  
A motion carried to resume at 6:00 P.M.

### Second Sitting

Business reconvened with the singing of the chorus, "It's Just Like Jesus", led by Rev. T. L. Garrison. The Chairman called for the committee secretary to continue the report of the Conference Action Committee:

Motion carried to delete No. 4, Section I, Regulations, of the 1965 conference minutes.

Be it resolved that the District Missionary Society be granted one service during Family Camp.

Be it resolved that the District Treasurer be a member of the Conference Action Committee.

Be it resolved that there be a District Sunday School Treasurer elected from among persons appointed to the Sunday School Committee.

Be it resolved that Sunday School Fund include the following: 1. The first Sunday of May shall be known as Sunday School Dollar Day. This should be sent to the Sunday School treasurer no later than May 15th. 2. The offering taken at the Sunday Convention. 3. The offering taken at the Sunday School session at the Family Camp.

No. 2, Section 1 of Regulations is to be edited to read: "Each unstationed minister or deaconess".

Delete No. 3, Section 1, Regulations of the 1965 minutes.

Motion carried to delete No. 16, Section 1, of the regulations.

Section 2, Finance, No. 3, changed to read, "The Assistant Superintendent shall receive \$60.00 per year for his services. The District Treasurer shall receive \$120.00 for his services. The District Secretary shall receive \$50.00 for his services.

Section 2, Finance, No. 3, changed to read, "The District Council shall receive 5¢ per mile traveled for meetings called or authorized by the Superintendent."

Section 2, Finance, No. 7, is changed to read, "We recommend that the district pay its share of the Superintendent's salary and Social Security. His travel expense shall be paid at the rate of \$100.00 per month. His postage, stationery, and telephone expenses (as used in connection with the district duties) along with the utilities and parsonage shall also be furnished.

The proposed budget for the Gulfstates District was presented and approved.

Rev. Goins expressed his appreciation for the passing of the budget, and gave suggested budget goals for each church.

Rev. Miller expressed his desire that the conference support the Superintendent-elect with prayers and cooperation.

Appreciation was expressed by the Chairman for the fine work done by Miss Audrey Brown, who served as recording secretary for the Conference.

Rev. Miller commended the Conference for the fine atmosphere that prevailed. The meeting was adjourned with the singing of "Blest Be the Tie That Binds".



## REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. William N. Miller, district officers, delegates, and friends of the sixth annual Conference of the Gulf States District:

Greetings in Jesus' Name for whom we labor in the whitened harvest fields! My report will of necessity be short due to the length of my service in this capacity. I have traveled an approximate total of 3,500 miles while engaged in district activities. I have conducted five annual meetings and one meeting of the Board of Trustees

## REPORT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

To the Gulf States District Conference, now in session at Paul Johnson State Park, Mississippi, this fifth day of August 1966.

This report for the conference year from July 1, 1965 to June 30, 1966 includes sixteen churches reporting. Six churches report a total gain of 33, while ten churches report a total loss of 69, for a net loss of 36.

Numerical gains are as follows:

Birmingham, Alabama .....	13
West Monroe, Louisiana .....	9
Magnolia Springs, Alabama.....	4
Columbus, Mississippi.....	3
Bayou La Batre, Alabama.....	2
Alexandria, Louisiana .....	1

Percentage gains are listed below:

West Monroe, Louisiana .....	43%
Columbus, Mississippi .....	19%
Birmingham, Alabama .....	15%
Bayou La Batre, Alabama.....	6%
Magnolia Springs, Alabama .....	5%
Alexandria, Louisiana .....	2%

Churches attaining their assigned "Waging the War" goals for 1966 were Birmingham, Alabama, and West Monroe, Louisiana, both surpassing their goals by five. Honorable mention goes to Bayou La Batre, who fell short by one.

The Committee would make special mention of the commendable job that Rev. C. K. Crowder and his able superintendent, Billy Smothers, have done in the past year in the area of Sunday Schools. Birmingham won the "Division C" award of our denominations "March to Sunday School in March" contest. They reported a gain of 57 scholars and a percentage gain of 76% over March 1965, the previous year.

## ANNUAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent with the editing committee determine regulations that should become standing rules which no longer need to be reviewed or passed on year by year and enter such in the minutes as standing rules.

2. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appoint all standing committees subject to the approval of the District Conference.

3. Whereas the work of the Resolution Committee and the Ways and Means Committee is of a nature, at times, that it necessitates a combined meeting of the two; be it resolved that this conference establish a "Conference Action Committee" consisting of five men to take the place of these committees.

4. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer be a member of the Conference Action Committee by virtue of his office.

5. Be it resolved that the District Council be responsible for a monthly publication to include information from the District Superintendent, news regarding district churches, monthly Sunday School averages, youth news, and any information pertinent to the district, to be sent to all churches.

6. Be it resolved that all churches send to the district secretary a list of newly elected church officers and addresses who shall make copies of these names available to all district officials.

7. Be it resolved that the conference adopt the district calendar of events as outlined by the District Council.

8. Be it resolved that a list of nominees for district offices be published and sent to each local church at least 15 days before each annual conference.

9. The proposed budget for Gulfstates District was presented. It was moved and carried that we approve this budget.

## STANDING RULES

### Camp Meeting

1. Be it resolved that the District Family Camp continue through the weekend and close on Sunday evening.

2. Be it resolved that the District Missionary Society be granted one service during Family Camp. This motion carried.

### Conference

1. Be it resolved that our conference year close on June 30, and that all reports be in by July 10th.

2. Be it resolved that we continue the Waging the War Program with the exception of the following changes:

a. Use the 1966 goals for this year and have quadrennial goals continue through 1970 by adding a 10% increase to the annual goals for each church. This should be done in both Sunday School and Church goals.

b. Item 6 should be deleted and substituted with the findings and recommendations of the committee on Church Extension or the District Council.

c. Awards should be given to Sunday School superintendents and pastors who reach their goals.

3. Be it resolved that the first Friday of each month be known as a day of fasting, prayer, soul-burden and consecration.

4. Be it resolved that the Gulf States Conference, in accordance with action of the General Board, elect a CYC Director and a Director of the PELT Program.

5. Be it resolved that the Conference Action Committee prepare copies of the proposed resolutions and recommendations to be issued to each delegate prior to the committee report. Any resolutions or recommendations must be received by the Committee Chairman by May 30.

6. Be it resolved that each unstationed minister and deaconess send a copy of his or her annual report to the District Statistician, no later than 10 days after the conference year closes.

7. Be it resolved that two copies of monthly reports be made. One copy of which shall be received by the District Superintendent no later than the 10th of the month.

8. Be it resolved that three copies of the annual reports be made. One shall go to the District Superintendent, one to the Statistician, and one copy to be retained for local files.

9. Be it resolved that the names of all evangelists be put into the district minutes, providing they are passed on by conference.

10. Be it resolved that any church desiring to call an evangelist of another denomination should first consult the District Superintendent.

11. Inasmuch as the laymen of the Gulfstates District constitute the larger part of the total membership, and whereas a good share of the support of this district comes from the laymen; and whereas an active cooperating lay group is an asset to the district program; Be it resolved that at least one member of the District Council shall be a layman.

12. Whereas the District Superintendent is in closer relation with our ministers of the district and their ministerial standing than the Educational and Examining Board; Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be a standing member of the Educational and Examining Board.

13. Inasmuch as the General Board has rezoned our district as a part of the Central Pilgrim College School Zone; Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and one lay member serve as our representative on the school board during the coming year.

14. Be it resolved that there be a District Sunday School Treasurer elected from among persons appointed to the District Sunday School Committee.

15. We recommend that our Sunday School Promotional Secretary and Executive Youth Secretary attend the Workers' Conference held annually at Church Headquarters. Expense for same shall be taken from these separate departmental funds.

#### Finances

1. Be it resolved that the entire Simms camp fund be used only at the discretion of the District Conference; Be it further resolved that the District Council have access to this fund on a "Short Term Loan" basis.

2. We recommend this conference adopt a unified budget of 15% of regular church and Sunday School offerings. This 15% to cover District and General interests. This money to be prorated by the District Council.

3. We recommend that our conference adopt a home missionary plan: a dollar a year per member for each new church.

#### Ministerial

1. Be it resolved that no pastor be absent from his church more than 30 days a year, camp meeting exempted.

2. Be it resolved that the date for the District Ministerial Meeting be set for the month of January, beginning on the third Tuesday at noon and ending Wednesday evening.

3. Be it resolved that each church consider a hospitalization plan for its pastor.

## YOUTH CONFERENCE

The annual Youth Conference of the Gulfstates District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, was held on August 5, 1966, at 10:00 A.M., and was opened in prayer by Rev. Jerry Brewer.

Rev. Goins read a scripture.

A motion was made and seconded that the conference bar be set up. It was carried. The Secretary called the roll.

A motion was made that we continue our business until the business be finished. It was carried.

Rev. Scheuermeier gave his zone leaders report. Rev. Rodriguez gave his zone report. Rev. Reprogle reported on their zone in the absence of the zone leader. A motion was made and seconded that we accept the oral zone leaders' reports. The motion carried.

Rev. C. K. Crowder, Youth President, stressed the point of an organized youth society.

Tellers for election of officers were appointed: Michael Stancil, Steve Norris and Bobby Cruthirds.
