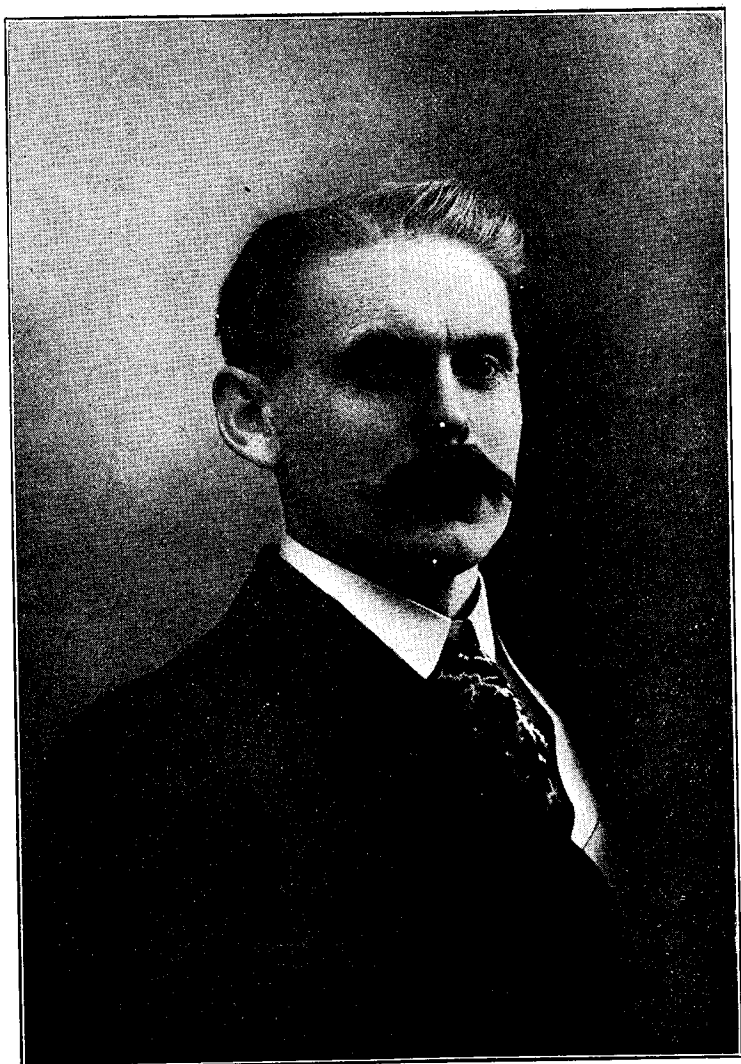

C. E. Ellsworth conference treasurer, gave his report, which was accepted and referred to the auditing committee.

C. E. Ellsworth was re-elected conference treasurer by acclamation, after which a free will offering of \$5.15 was taken for him.

The Myers family then sang a song which was soul stirring.

Next was the election of the foreign missionary board. N. B. Herrell, M. F. Pratt and G. C. Middleton were elected.

B. H. Grimes then gave a report of the Beneficiary Board, which was received and referred to the Auditing Committee.

M. L. Stewart, B. H. Grimes and N. B. Herrell were re-elected as the Beneficiary Board.

Next was the election of five trustees for the Voice From Canaan Rescue Home located in St. Louis Mo. The election resulted as follows: M. F. Pratt, five years; W. G. Bogue, four years; C. C. Brown, three years; N. B. Herrell, two years and W. J. Webster, one year.

Conference then elected the following publishing committee for "A Voice from Canaan," published at Carlinville, Ill.; G. C. Middleton, C. C. Brown M. F. Pratt, C. E. Ellsworth and E. J. N. Bradshaw.

M. F. Pratt was elected as trustee for five years for the Bethel Holiness Orphanage located at Carlinville, Ill.

Bro. J. W. Trout then gave us a very encouraging address.

M. F. Pratt then gave Home Missionary report for Illinois and Missouri, which was received and referred to statistical committee.

### WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT.

1. We recommend that the pastors of each class appoint a committee of one to collect an amount equivalent to 25 cents per capita quarterly on members over eighteen years of age for conference expenses and Home Missions. We further recommend that the Presiding Elder and the pastor urge all members to respond.

2. We recommend that each pastor hold one foreign missionary service during the year, and take up an offering for this work. Also that this service be held the fourth Sunday in July.

3. We recommend that each pastor appoint two quarterly con-

ference stewards to collect the presideng elders' money before each quarterly conference.

4. We recommend that each pastor and evangelist keep in touch with the Bible School and Orphanage at Carlinville, Ill. and have special services in their behalf, and take offerings for their support. We further recommend that the second Sunday in December be known as Orphanage Day all over the field.

5. We recommend that any class or individual giving money for any purpose must pass receipt for same through conference treasurer's hands to receive credit.

6. We recommend that the Sunday before Thanksgiving be known as Rescue Day, and that each pastor preach a sermon on rescue work and take a free will offering for same.

7. We recommend that each pastor take two (2) or more offerings on his or her charge during the year for the purpose of helping the needy sick, and burying the worthy dead. That each pastor raise the equivalent of five cents per capita each month. That each pastor explain what these offerings are for and urge the people to do all they can t support this branch of charity.

8. We recommend that the offerings for Bible School Orphanage Rescue Work and Beneficiary fund be paid into the local church treasury, and a strict account of each kept.
