WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT.

I. We recommend that each class adopt the Tithing system according to church discipline and that each pastor form into an association, those that desire to Tithe. The money to be placed in Church Treasury, to be paid out for Apportionment and other Expenses as the official Board may decide. We further recommend that each Presiding Elder explain the plan at the first Quarterly Meeting and urge the Classes to adopt it at once.

II. We recommend that each pastor hold a Foreign Missionary service on the Fourth Sunday in July and take a free will offering for this work and that each Sabbath School be organized into a Foreign Missionary School and a free will offering be taken at the close of each session.

III. We recommend that each Pastor and Evangelist keep in touch with the Rescue Home at St. Louis, Mo. and the Bible School and Orphanage at Carlinville, Ill., and have special services and take up a free will offering for their support. We also recommend that the Sunday before Thanksgiving be observed as Rescue day. The Fourth Sunday in January be observed as Bible School day and the second Sunday in May be observed as Orphanage day.

IV. We recommend that each Class pay for Beneficiary purposes the sum of Five Cents per capita per month of those over Eighteen years of age. Each class to raise said money the way they deem best.

V. We recommend that the offerings for the Bible School, Orphanage, Rescue Home and Beneficiary fund be paid into the local church treasury and a strict account of each kept, and said money be forwarded immediately to proper persons of each respective board.

We recommend that the Classes on each Dist. take up one or more offerings each quarter to create a fund for Home Missionary work. Said money to be used in opening new fields and to be paid back into the Treasury at an early date as convenient. $\langle \underline{G}, C, MIDDLETON. \rangle$



The last sermon he preached was The Palm Tree experience, Psa, 19-12.


