REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE.

We the Resolution Committee submit the following:

We are taught in the word of God to respect the elders and those in authority, and to esteem them very highly in love for their works' sake. Remembering without ceasing their work of faith and labor of love and patience, of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ, in the sight of God our Father.

Therefore be it resolved that we show our appreciation of the services of the Elders, Superintendents, and Matrons by giving them the right hand of fellowship, pledging them our support and prayers.

The following were ordained, J. E. Barrow, Oliver Tony, C. E. Culbertson, S. E. Lacy, S. T. VanMeter, J. W. Anderson, Ora C. Myers, J. J. Summerill, K. H. Jackson.

The Ways and Means Committee reported:—(See Special Com.)

We recommend that each class decide the minimum amount they shall pay their pastor. This was received.

We recommend that no pastor should be assigned to a station or circuit paying less than \$300. Recommendation was received.

Amendment, Except where places cannot be circuited. Carried.

We recommend that each member of the Holiness Christian Church be assessed by the Official Board, according to their ability to pay for the support of the gospel. Recommendation was received.

We futher recommend that each pastor urge tithing. Recommenda-

tion was received.

We recommend that the pastors on the charge of the various churches, teach and instruct their people in the articles of importance contained in our discipline. Recommendation was received.

We recommend that each station or circuit hold one or more special days for Bible School, Rescue Home, Orphanage, Iva May's Infant Home, Foreign Missions. Recommendation was received.

We recommend that this Conference set the amount of the reserve to be held in trust for emergency purposes. Recommendation was received.

We recommend that the Foreign Missionary Board be instructed by this Conference to take steps to use money taken for Foreign Misssions down to reserve. Recommendation was received.

We recommend that this Conference organize a burial Association, and that a fee of 25 cents be required per capita, and that an additional 25 cents be charged at the death of a member. Recommendation lost.
