### Journal of the Session

THE Twentieth Indiana Annual Conference of the Holiness Christian Church convened at Frankfort, Ind., Monday morning, Sept. 6, 1915.

Hours of Session, 8:30 a.m., to 12. 1:30 p.m. to 5. Each session preceded by fifteen minutes devotional service.

All members tardy at roll call give reasonable excuse for absence.

Moved and carried that no member make more than one speech without consent of conference.

Willie Pratt was chosen reporter for city papers and "Voice From Canaan." Moved and carried to adjourn. Benediction by C. C. Brown.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION-FIRST DAY.

After devotional service the conference was called to order with A. M. Ewing in the chair.

After roll call the minutes of last session were read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that the P. E.'s appoint a committee one from each district on elders and districts, carried. They appointed E. C. Rhoades, C. C. Brown and George Huff.

#### SECOND DAY-MORNING SESSION, SEPT. 7th.

After devotional service conference was called to order with M. F. Pratt in the chair. After roll call the minutes of previous session were read and approved.

Moved and carried that all members on committees be released from giving excuse for tardiness.

J. H. Julian then read his evangelistic report which was received.

On motion the conference showed their appreciation of the labors of Brother Julian by a rising vote.

The pastoral reports were continued. (see tables)

The evangelists reports were then taken up. (see tables,

The following reports were read and refered to the auditing committee: Bethel Holiness Orphanage, Bible School, Voice From Canaan, Carlinville Camp treasurer's, Foreign Missionary treasurer's, Beulah Rescue Home, and Conference treasurer's.

The reports of P. E.'s N. Bradshaw, A. M. Ewing, W. G. Bogue and M. F. Wratt were received and referred to statistical committee.

An official letter of greeting from the secretary of Kansas and Oklahoma conference was read. On motion it was received and the secretary instructed to write a letter of greeting in reply.

On motion the conference adjourned. Benediction by A. M. Ewing.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION—SECOND DAY

After devotional service conference was called to order by W. G. Bogue, P. E. The roll was called and the minutes of previous session were read and approved.

The pastoral reports were then continued. (see tables)

The Foreign Missionary report of K. H. Jackson was received and referred to committee on minutes.

The Foreign Missionary school report of Walter G. Henschen was received and referred to committee on minutes.

The Home Missionary report of J. W. Clark was received and referred to auditing committee.

The report of committee on Minutes was received and referred to to auditing committee.

A letter of greeting from Lillie Oliver was read and on motion conference made special prayer for her led by Brother Jackson.

Moved and seconded that we table all unfinished business, and enterinto new business. Carried.

After a season of prayer, the conference entered into the election of officers for the coming year.

Moved and seconded that the P. E.'s in Indiana be elected by districts. Carried.

- W. G. Bogue was elected by acclamation as P. E. for North dist.
- W. G. Bogue then took the chair.
- A. M. Ewing was unanimously elected P. E. for the South dist.
- C. C. Brown was elected by acclamation as P. E. for the Illinois and Missouri district.
- N. Bradshaw was chosen as conference secretary and W. E. Bradley as his assistant.
  - S. W. Bland was chosen as conference treasurer.
  - A collection of \$5.42 was taken for the retiring secretary.

Moved and seconded that the Illinois and Missouri district be granted the privilege of forming a seperate conference. Carried.

Moved and carried that W. G. Bogue be sent to organise said conference.

Moved and seconded that the election of officers for institutional work be deferred until the General conference. Carried.

W. G. Bogue was elected fraternal delegate to visit the next Wesleyan Methodist conference at Fairmount, Ind.

Moved and seconded that this conference ratify the action of the foreign missionary board's appointment of K. H. Jackson as superintendent of our Missionary work in Central America. Carried.

Moved and carried that conference adjourn.

Benediction by W. Sherman.

### THIRD DAY-MORNING SESSION, SEPT. 8.

After devotional service the conference was called to order by A. M. Ewing, P. E.

The roll was called, and the minutes of previous session were read and approved.

The treasurer was instructed to return \$2.40 to the class at Osawatomie, Kansas, this being the balance due them on apportionment.

Moved and carried that the Conference Secretary be paid \$15.00 for services this year.

The auditing committee gave their report which was received and referred to secretary.

Moved and carried that conference adjourn. After adjournment the Illinois and Missouri conference was organized, with twenty two Charter members.

### FOURTH DAY-MORNING SESSION, SEPT. 9.

After devotional service the conference was called to order by A. M. Ewing, P. E.

The roll was called and minutes read and approved.

Washington Sherman, J. W. Clark and K. H. Jackson were selected for the Educational Board.

Moved and carried that I. G. Snider have charge of one tent, he was also appointed Home Missionary for Ohio.

The members of the Illinois Conference were received as advisory members.

The following reports too late to be included in the statistical report were received and referred to the secretary, H. G. Solomon, W. E. Ketchum, Katie Nehmeyer, Flo E. Andrews, G. W. Chamberlin and O. P. Barker.

Moved and carried we adjourn. Benediction by G. C. Middleton.

### AFTERNOON SESSION-FOURTH DAY

After devotional service the conference was called to order by W. G. Bogue, P. E.

The roll was called and minutes read and approved.

Washington Sherman was appointed Conference Evangelist by the P. E.'s; conference ratifying the same.

The Ways and Means committee brought in their reports. (see reports) Moved and seconded that the conference elect the burial board, and that after election the said board meet and organize. Carried.

The following were elected for said board: K. H. Jackson, J. W. Clark, Geo. Huff, Ed. Schoeff and W. G. Bogue.

The Ordination service was then entered into by singing the hymn, "If ever I loved thee." Prayer by C. C. Brown. The Ordination sermon was then delivered by W. G. Bogue, P. E. He was assisted in the service by the Presiding and Ex-Presiding Elders. The following were duly ordained:

Moved and carried that Washington Sherman be granted the use of one Gospel tent for his evangelistic work.

Moved and carried that the chair appoint a tabernacle board.

The chair appointed N. Bradshaw, Ed. Schoeff and W. Sherman.

It was also decided that the conference parafine the tents before they leave the ground.

Moved and seconded the conference meet in a night session after the evening service. Carried.

On motion conference adjourned

#### NIGHT SESSION-FOURTH DAY.

The conference was called to order by A. M. Ewing in chair.

Moved and seconded that the calling of the roll and the reading of the minutes be suspended. Carried.

Moved and Seconded that we enter into the election of General conference delegates. Carried.

The fellowing were elected: Geo. Huff, E. C. Rhoades, B. H. Hines, Ed. Schoeff, N. Bradshaw, J. H. Julian, J. W. Clark, G. C. Middleton, J. W. Trout, E. A. Davis. Alternates—H. G. Solomon, W. C. Canary, Lucinda Rhoades, W. S. Jewell, Anna Hines, J. Cruser. Lay Delegates—North District, Ella Taylor; South Dist. John Simmons.

On motion conference adjourned.

### FIFTH DAY-MORNING SESSION, SEPT. 10th

After devotional service the conference was called to order by W. G. Bogue, P. E.

The was called and the minutes were read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that the next annual conference be held at Frankfort. Carried.

It was resolved that fourteen days be allowed for camp meeting and conference next year, the last four days being for conference and that we retain A. L. Whitcomb for the night services.

Moved and carried that the chair appoint a committee on blanks.

Report of committee on minutes was read and referred to secretary. Beneficiary report was read and referred to secretary.

It was decided that the balance from beneficiary found be handed to the conference treasurer, and kept for beneficiary purposes.

Moved and seconded that the pastor, class leader, secretary and treasurer of each class constitute the beneficiary board of each class. Carried

The committee on resolutions reported. (See committee reports)

Moved and seconded that the travelling expenses of the P. E.'s be paid out of the conference treasury. Carried.

Statistical committee reported. (see table)

Moved and carried that the P. E 's and secretary be a committee to arrange with the other conferences as to time and place for Gen. conf.

The committee on Elders and Districts recommended first that the two classes in Ohio be added to the Northern District, second that the west state line of Indiana and the east state line of Illinois be the boundry line between the two conferences.

On motion these recommendations were accepted.

It was resolved to print 500 copies of the minutes.

It was decided to accept the offer of the Illinois conference to join us in publishing the minutes, they to pay \$15.00 for 100 copies.

It was decided that each class raise at the rate of 5c a member to help pay for the conference minutes.

Moved and seconded that camp ground board be changed to camp ground trustee. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we request the next General conference to include the books "Common Sence," and "Impressions" in the Course of Study.

Moved and seconded that conference request General conference to make three tests of membership, viz: First, one must be saved. Second, must believe in sanctification as a second work of grace. Third, must promise to keep the discipline. Carried.

Moved and seconded that each class furnish two comforts for camp and conference purposes. Carried.

On motion conference adjourned. Benediction by A. M. Ewing.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION-FOURTH DAY.

After prayer conference was called to order by W. G. Bogue. The calling of roll and reading of minutes were dispensed with.

Moved and seconded that the management of tents be placed in the hands of the tabernacle board. Carried.

Moved and carried that the delegates of this conference to general conference send a special invitation urging the Pennsylvania Conference to meet them in General Conference.

Conference retired for a short time and was again convened.

A. M. Ewing tendered his resignation as P. E., of the Southern District, which, on motion, was accepted.

Moved and seconded that W. G. Bogue be the P. E. for both districts with the privilege of appointing an assistant. Carried.

P. E., Bogue named Washington Sherman as his assistant.

Conference retired for the stationing committe to take up their work On convening the conference was called to order by W. G. Bogue, P. E. The report of the committee was then read by the secretary, Mary St. Clair.

Presiding Elder Bogue gave a few words of advice followed by P. E., Brown and assistant P. E., Sherman.

Moved and seconded that the report of the Stationing Committee be received. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we give Rev. A. L. Whitcomb a specal invitation to attend our General Conference. Carried.

Adjournment. Benediction by A. M. Ewing.

#### WAYS AND MEANS REPORT.

1. We recommend that each member be assessed ten cents per month to help our worthy needy, said amount to be paid monthly to a beneficiary steward appointed by the pastor who shall make his report quarterly to the Board of beneficiary trustees appointed or elected by the quarterly conference who shall have power to dispense said money at their discretion.

- 2. Inasmuch as tithing is scriptural and according to our discipline, we recommend that each pastor preach, practice and urge his members to tithe and with pencil and paper, keep account with God, said money to be paid into the local church treasury.
- 3. In as much as we have launched our own mite box plan for our missionary work and have our own missionaries, to support, we recommend:

1st—That each pastor assist in launching the mite box plan by acting as secretary on his charge or appointing a secretary.

2nd—That the pastor report a minimum amount to be raised for Foreign Missionary work during the year.

- 4. We recommend that each member of the local church over 18 years, be assessed 50c as a membership fee. (Apportionment,
- 5. We recommend that each member be assessed 5c for General Conference expenses, said money to be paid into the Gen. Con. Treas.
- 6. We recommend that each member of the Conference pay into the Conference treasury at least 1/4 of his or her tithe, said tithe to be used as an extension fund.
- 7. We recommend that the Minimum amount of \$500 on the Northern District and \$600 on the Southern District be given our Presiding Elder, said money to be raised by apportioning the local class according to its abilty and to be paid in equal quarterly amounts.

Amendment—In case the above amounts are not raised on the districts, the Conference will make up the deficiency.

- 8. We recommend that a free-will offering be taken at each quarterly conference for the Presiding Elder.
- 6. We recommend that a rousing free-will offering be taken the first Sunday morning of the camp-meeting for the Presiding Elder.
- 10. Inasmuch as the support of many our pastors in the past has not been sufficient, We recommend that the presiding Elder see that each class promise a minimum amount to be paid weekly, monthly or quarterly, and that we use the envelope system.
- 11. We recommend that each pastor and evangelist act as agent for the "Voice From Canaan;" take new subscriptions, secure renewals, and inform the editor of those who wish the paper discontinued.
- 12. Inasmuch as we have our own Institutions and each local church desires to co-operate in the support of the same, we recommend that, where desired, arrangements be made by the paster for a representative of either or all of said Institutions to conduct a special service in behalf of their institution at some time during the year.
- 13. We recommend that this conference adopt the By-Laws of the Holiness Christian Burial Association as printed in tract form and published in the "Voice From Canaan."
- 14. We recommend that these recommendations as accepted by this conference be read by the pastor at as early a date as possible before their classes and any explanation necessary be made and an exhortation to their strict observance be emphasized.
- 15. We recommend that these recommendations be published in the "Voice From Canaan."

### Journal of Hession

The first Illinois and Missouri Conference of the Holiness Christian Church, convened at Frankfort, Indiana, Sept. 8, 1915.

COMMITTEE ON BLANKS-Clyde Shearer and C. C. Brown.

Moved and carried that chair appoint Ways and Means and Camp Meeting Committees. Chair appointed on Ways and Means: M. F. Pratt, Mary V. Myers and Martha Noggle. Camp Meeting Committee: M. F. Pratt, D. C. Shearer, O. C. Myers, W. C. Canary and C. C. Brown. Adjournment. Benediction.

### AFTERNOON SESSION, SEPT. 9, 1915.

The meeting was called to order with C. C. Brown in the chair. After prayer the roll was called and the minutee were read and approved. The secretary was instructed to purchase a new secretary's book, and the P. E. was instructed to purchase a conference seal. The P. E. appointed O. C. Myers as District Evangelist. Moved and carried that the Illinois and Missouri Camp Meeting and Conference be held in July, but the exact date was left with the camp meeting committee.

The following were elected as ministerial delegates to the General Conference: M. F. Pratt, D. C. Shearer, A. R. Higgs and O. C. Myers and Martha Noggle as lay delegate.

Moved and carried that we send greetings to the Pennsylvania Conference and invite them to join with us in the General Conference.

Moved and carried that we hold our Camp Meeting in East St. Louis. Adjourment. Benediction.

After supper and prayer, business was continued without roll call.

The Camp Meeting Committee was instructed to secure an evangelist for our Conference Camp.

The Ways and Means Committee reported, which was accepted.

M F. Pratt, O. C. Myers and Clyde Shearer were appointed to apportion the Presiding Elders salary. (see report).

Adjournment. Benediction.

#### MORNING SESSION, SEPT. 10, 1915.

After devotional service, the roll was called and the minutes of the previous session were read and approved. The P. E. was instructed to see about getting a Conference charter and recording the conference trustee. Moved and carried that the P. E. be chairman of a committee of three to confer with like committees of other conferences in fixing the place and date of the General Conference. The chair was instructed to appoint the other two committeemen.

Carried that the pastors take special notice to Article 55 of our discipline and take an offering for General Conference expenses immediately. Adjournment. Benediction by M. F. Pratt.

### REPORT OF COMMITTEES.

#### WAYS AND MEANS.

- 1. Inasmuch as we have adopted a mite box plan of our own to support our mission workers, we recommend that each pastor (or one appointed by him) assist in launching the mite box plan by acting as secretary on the charge.
- 2. We recommend that the pastors report the minimum amount to be raised for Foreign Missions during the year
- 3. We recommend that local church members over fifteen pay 10c per month to help needy, worthy church members. Said money shall be paid to the secretary of the local Beneficiary board appointed by the pastor, or elected by the church. Said board shall have power to dispense said money at their discretion. Treasurer of said board shall report quarterly.
- 4. We recommend that each member of the annual conference pay quarterly into the conference treasury one-fourth of his, or her, tithe, or if he, or she, prefers, he shall pay two per cent of all the tithes and offerings paid in by the members of the local class. Said money shall be used for church extension work and shall be paid out by the Conference Extension Board. Said board shall lend said money to District Evangelist and to local classes at a reasonable rate of interest.
- 5. We recommend that the superintendents (or their agents) of the Orphanage, Bible School, Rescue Home and Foreign Missions, confer with the pastors and that the superintendents of said institutions be granted the privilege of presenting the work and of taking an offering for the same.
- 6. We recommend that each local class send two comforts to the annual conference.
- 7. We recommend that the chair appoint a committee to apportion the minimum amount the classes shall pay the P. E. this year.

8. We recommend that each member of the local class shall pay his, or her, tithe into the church treasury, except as provided in article 4 concerning annual conference members.

9. We recommend that these recommendations be read to the classes by the pastors and their design explained. The pastors shall

urge their strict observance.

- 10. We recommend that each pastor act as agent for the "Voice from Canaan," take new subscriptions, secure renewals, and inform the Editor of those who wish the paper discontinued.
- 11. We recommend that this report be printed in the "Voice", and that any other business pertaining to pastor and local church be published also.
