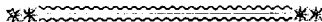

Journal of the Session

FIRST DAY—MORNING SESSION

THE Twenty-second Indiana Annual Conference, of the Holiness Christian Church, convened in the Tabernacle on the Camp ground, at Frankfort, Indiana, Monday morning, September 3, 1917.

Song service followed with prayer by E. J. Clem. The General Superintendent, Bro. C. C. Brown, read the lesson from 1st Tim. 4th chapter, and then delivered the annual conference address.

Conference was called to order with C. C. Brown in the chair. The conference roll was then call and revised.

Moved and seconded that all doubtful names be referred to the examining committee. Carried.

The minutes of the last session of the last annual conference were then read by the secretary and accepted.

It was agreed that the chair and the two Presiding Elders appoint all standing committees.

The following rules to govern this conference were adopted:

RULES GOVERNING CONFERENCE

CONFERENCE BAR—First four rows of seats from North ile around South.

Hours of session: 8:30 a. m. to 12:00; 1:30 to 5:00 p. m. Each session preceded by fifteen minutes devotional service.

No member leave the conference bar without permission of the chair.

Reports to be read without comment.

All members tardy at roll call give reasonable excuse for absence.

No member make more than one speech until every member had spoken who desired to do so, and then not without consent of the chair.

It was agreed that members on all boards be excused from coming to the roll call.

Next in order was the reception of new churches and missions. The first one knocking for admission into this conference was the Original Methodist Church at Indianapolis. On motion this was received into the conference as were also the following new classes: Mt. Carmel. Green Valley, and East Columbus.

On motion it was decided to have a committee on Reception appointed by the chair. Edward Schoeff, George E. Huff, and I. J. Snider were appointed.

The following were received as advisory members and taken into the conference bar: J. H. Garretson, J. W. Graham, L. E. Garver, J. Wallace, A. R. Higgs, E. M. Cornelius, C. Pollet, R. Moore, W. C. Ketchum, H. Goins, G. W. Brown, K. Klepfer, I. N. Ammerman, E. L. Buck, A. H. Blume, F. Wheeler, L. T. Crute, J. Fika, C. Abraham, A. Plunkett, W. Pratt.

The pastoral reports were then taken up, and on motion, were referred to the statical committee. (see tables)

Bro. I. J. Snider was appointed reporter for city and Voice papers.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn. Carried.

Benediction by A. M. Ewing.

FIRST DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION

After devotional service the conference was called to order with C. C. Brown, the Gen. Superintendent in the chair.

The first in order was the calling of the roll after which the minutes of last session were read and accepted.

The reading of pastoral reports were continued. (see tables)

The Gen. Superintendent ruled that with regard to local preachers who have not passed the 2nd years course of study that it be left to the Presiding Elders to examine them, or appoint some ordained Elder of the same conference to do so.

Bro. Jewell reported that the Shelton Mission has 16 members on the roll.

The Foreign Missionary and Beulah Rescue Home reports, were read by Brother Pratt.

On motion these were referred to auditing committee.

Evangelistic reports were then taken up. (see tables)

After reading they were, on motion, referred to statistical committee.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn. Carried.

Benediction by N. Bradshaw.

FIRST DAY—NIGHT SESSION

Conference was called to order by C. C. Brown, the Gen. Superintendent in the chair.

This was a special session for the purpose of ordaining E. W. Wright, who was compelled to leave.

The committee on course of study reported that E. W. Wright had successfully passed examination and they recommended that he receive ordination.

Moved and seconded that he be duly ordained.

The Gen. Supt. had charge of the ordination service. He was assisted by Edward Schoeff and Geo. Huff, P. E's. of this conference and by John Wallace, A. E. of the Illinois and Mo. conference.

SECOND DAY—MORNING SESSION

After devotional service the conference was called to order with C. C. Brown, the Gen. Supt. in the chair. The roll was called and minutes read and accepted.

Pastoral and Evangelistic reports were then taken up. Examining committee brought in a partial report. (see Reports of committees)

The secretary read a letter from Bro. Webster sending greetings to this conference from the Western conference.

Moved and seconded that we receive these greetings and that the secretary be requested to send them greetings from this conference. Carried.

The Presiding Elders read their reports.

On motion they were received and referred to committee.

Moved and seconded that we make up the deficiency in the Northern District Elder's report. Carried.

A collection was taken up that more than covered the deficiency.

Sister Hart reported for the Prayer Bands.

On motion it was received and ordered to be placed on the minutes.

It was decided to have a committee on Elders and Districts, and that the chair appoint same.

Moved to adjourn. Carried.

Benediction by W. E. Ketchum.

SECOND DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION

After devotional service conference was called to order by C. C. Brown, Gen. Supt. in the chair.

The roll was called and minutes read and accepted.

The H. C. Burial Association report was then read.

On motion it was received and referred to auditing committee.

Home Missionary report was read by the conference evangelist.

Moved and seconded that it be received. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we enter into the election of officers. Carried.

George Huff and Edward Schoeff were elected for Presiding Elders, by acclamation.

J. Clark and N. Bradshaw were nominated for secretary. N. Bradshaw was elected,

Sam S. Bland was re-elected treasurer by acclamation.

C. A. Fouts was elected a conference trustee.

Moved and seconded that we re-elect the Foreign Missionary Board. J. W. Clark and J. Higginbotham declined. O. W. Barnes and O. Sheets were selected to take their place. Thus constituted the board was elected by acclamation.

The Foreign Missionary Prayer Band was re-elected by acclamation.

The chair appointed W. Sherman, J. W. Clark and A. M. Ewing for the Educational Board.

It was decided to have a conference evangelist. A. M. Ewing was elected.

The following were unanimously elected as Camp Ground Trustees for 3 years viz.: J. W. Clark, A. M. Ewing, C. A. Donoho, Edward Schoeff and George Huff.

Examining committee reported. (see reports)

Moved and seconded we meet at 6 o'clock in the morning. Carried.

Moved and seconded we adjourn. Carried.

Benediction by George Huff.

THIRD DAY—MORNING SESSION

After devotional service conference was called to order by the Gen. Supt. C. C. Brown in chair.

Rev. Walter Thompson brought greetings from the Indiana conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. He gave an interesting address.

Song—"Blest be the tie that binds."

The secretary responded.

Moved and seconded that we send greetings to the Wesleyan Methodist Conference and that Bro. Schoeff be sent as a fraternal delegate. Carried.

Treasurer's report was then read and received.

The chair announced the committee on Elders and Districts, viz: C. A. Fouts, A. M. Ewing, O. S. Sheets.

The following were unanimously elected for the Camp Meeting Committee, viz: O. W. Barnes, O. S. Sheets, A. M. Ewing, E. J. Clem and Lee Goins, and Edward Schoeff, George E. Huff honorary members.

It was decided to have two Ministerial Meetings, one in each district. Kokomo was selected as the place for the North district and Indianapolis for the South.

Moved and seconded that the dates and other arrangements be left with the Presiding Elders, and announced in the Voice as early as possible. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this conference pay Bro. Bogue the amount due him on disciplines out of conference treasury. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we take up an offering for Brother Bogue. Carried. This amounted to \$25.76.

Conference adjourned for breakfast.

On re-assembling the order of the day was taken up.

On motion it was decided to leave John Fika's case to his P. E. to get his discharge from the army.

The following officers were chosen for the Burial Association board, viz.: Geo. E. Huff, Edward Schoeff, A. M. Ewing, I. J. Snider and E. J. Clem.

It was decided to leave the fixing of the fee and other regulations with the board.

It was decided to take up a collection for the General Superintendent on the first Sunday morning of the next annual camp, and one for the Presiding Elders on the last Sunday morning.

A telegram was received from Rev. W. G. Bogue requesting that his name be dropped from the conference roll and from all boards.

On motion his request was granted.

15 minutes recess.

Ways and Means Committee recommended. (see reports)

Examining Committee reported. (see reports)

Auditing Committee reported. (see reports)

On motion conference adjourned.

THIRD DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION

After devotional service conference called to order with C. C. Brown, in the chair.

The roll was called and minutes read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that all preachers who are members of this conference shall have their membership in the annual conference and not in the local church. Motion lost.

Moved and seconded that all pastors have their membership where they are pastors and that all other conference preachers have their names in some local church. Carried.

The Camp Meeting Committee announced that Geo. Kulp and F. W. Cox were the engaged evangelists for next years camp.

Moved and seconded that inasmuch as this camp meeting is conference camp meeting, that none of our preachers make any engagement that will conflict with camp meeting date. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the local churches release their pastors for the camp meeting giving them full pay. Carried.

On motion it was decided to carry on the Beneficiary work the same

as last year. The pastor, class leader, secretary and treasurer of each class constitute the beneficiary board of each class. Each member pay 10 cents monthly to the steward of the board to help our worthy needy.

It was decided to send letters, of greetings, one to the Eastern and the other to the Wesrern conference.

Ways and Means Committee reported further.

Moved and seconded that this conference release the Voice from the amount it borrowed from it. Carried.

It was decided that we pay the publisher \$25.00 for advertising next Camp Meeting 4 issues in the Voice.

It was also decided to retain the cent a week plan to support the the Voice and urge every class to come up to it.

Moved and seconded that this conference go on record as favoring an eight page paper issued weekly. In cutting down the size of the paper to reduce the Institutional reports and articles accordingly. Carried.

Conference also favored having a Preacher's Directory in the Voice.

Time extended to 5:30.

Educational Board and Examing Committee reported. (see reports)

Adjourned for night session.

THIRD DAY—NIGHT SESSION

Conference was called to order with the General Superintendentint in the chair.

The calling of the Roll and reading of the minutes were dispensed with.

On motion it was decided to enter into the ordination of Elders. This service was in charge of the General Superintendent assisted by Edward Schoeff and George E. Huff, the two Presiding Elders and A. M. Ewing ex-P. E. The following were duly ordained: O. W. Barnes, W. S. Adams, Jas. Pursley, Clarence Dye, E. Fulkerson and Lulu Bowman.

Conference extended to them the right hand of fellowship.

Harry Adams was received into Conference as a first year itinerant.

Statistical committee's report was read and received.

Moved and seconded that the amount in the treasury for church extension purposes can be loaned for Home Missionary purposes for three months when it can be used for any new church that is recommended by the P. E.

A collection was taken up for the conference secretary. It was decided to pay him \$15.00 for his services the present year.

The P. E's. announced that they had selected A. M. Ewing as district evangelist.

On motion it was ordered to pay the one-fourth conference tithe into the conference treasury once a month.

Stationary committee retired.

On reassembling it was decided that the P. E.'s make the 4 quarterly rounds.

The Stationing Committee's report was then read and accepted.

Moved we adjourn. Carried.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

EXAMINING

We recommend that E. W. Wright, O. W. Barnes, W. S. Adams, Jas. Pursley, Clarence Dye, E. Fulkerson and Lulu Bowman be ordained.

We recommend that W. A. Fry be received into Conference in full connection as an ordained Elder.

We recommend that the following be received into Conference on

their credentials, as preachers on trial for one year, J. A. Garretson, Chas. Pollett, W. E. Ketchum, I. N. Ammerman, Kyrie Klepfer and J. H. Siberal, and that the latter take the course of study.

We recommend that Katie Nemyer be granted renewal of Evangelist license.

We recommend that J. O. Eacret, Oliver Barker, G. W. Chamberlin, Grover Colter and B. F. Winingier be granted renewal of itinerant license.

We recommend that Marion French, A. Holcomb, L. Thornton and Chas. Eddy be granted renewal of itinerant license after examination by their Presiding Elder.

We recommend that Geo. Brown be received into conference on his credentials, as preacher on trial for one year, and that he be granted second year itinerant license.

We recommend that Elmer Buck be received into conference on his credentials, as preacher on trial for one year, and that he be granted first year itinerant license.

We recommend that Harry Adams, A. H. Blume, J. W. Graham, J. J. Sinclair, L. F. Crute, F. Wheeler and W. F. Hinds, be granted first year itinerant license.

We recommended that Lowell Morris and C. Shoemaker be granted first year itinerant license after examination by their presiding elder.

We recommend that R. L. Hollenback be granted a letter to the Pentecostal church of the Nazarene.

We recommend that Elmer Fishner be referred to his quarterly conference for local preachers license.

We recommend inasmuch as K. H. Jackson has united with another denomination that his name be stricken from the conference roll.

We recommend that H. F. Roberts and Wayne Minton be dropped from the conference roll.

WAYS AND MEANS

I. We recommend inasmuch as tithing is scriptural and according to our discipline that each preacher, preach and practice it and urge his, or her, members to tithe, and with pencil and paper keep strict account with God; said tithe to be paid into the local church treasury.

II. We recommend that our preachers use our own evangelists as much as possible. And each pastor see that he be paid not less than at the rate of \$25.00 for ten days service. And each pastor provide a suitable room for his convenience.

III. We recommend that each church be assessed at the rate of 75c per member for each and every member over 18 years of age for apportionment, and that 10% of amount raised be paid into the General Conference Treasury.

IV. We recommend that each member of the Annual Conference pay into the conference treasury $\frac{1}{4}$ of his, or her, tithe to be used for

Mome Missionary Work. Said amount to be forwarded to the man in charge in the field. He to report the use of same to the Annual Conference.

V. We recommend that the minimum amount of \$600 be given our P. E. on the Northern District and \$700 the P. E. on the Southern District. Said amount to be raised by apportioning the local churches according to their ability. And that this amount be payed out in equal quarterly amounts. If the districts fail to raise the amount the Annual Conference will make up the deficiency, including the Camp Meeting offering.

VI. We recommend that the General Superintendent be paid not less than \$100 for his services, said amount to be raised by Camp-meeting and Conference Committees. And that a rousing free will offering be included in this amount.

VII. Inasmuch as in the past the salaries have not been sufficient for many of our pastors, we recommend that the P. Elders see that each class promise a minimum amount to be paid weekly. And that we use the envelope system.

VIII. We recommend that each pastor and Evangelist work for and push the Voice, and its collections. Including the plan of one cent a week per member.

IX. We recommend that in organizing a mission, or class, that the Pastor, or Evangelist, appoint a Superintendent to keep the names of its members and to see that the preacher in charge and the P. E.'s are paid.

X. We recommend that the Annual Conference pay the traveling expenses of the Presiding Elders.

XI. We recommend that there be a reconstruction of the Burial Association.

AUDITING COMMITTEE.

We, the auditing committee, have examined the reports and accounts of the Foreign Missionary Treasurer, Beulah Rescue Home, Holiness Christian Burial Association, Home Missionary Financial Account and find them correct. The Presiding Elder's Apportionment account, with the exception of 39c over plus to Bro. Huff, we find to be correct.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE.

I.

Inasmuch as God has smiled upon us and made possible the erection of such a splendid tabernacle, therefore, be it

Resolved, That we first of all render thanks to God, and show our appreciation of the service of Brother Ewing and others who have labored so faithfully in its erection, by a rising vote.

II.

Inasmuch as God has helped us to launch the "Foreign Missionary Prayer Band" and has answered prayer in giving us Brother and Sister Higgs as Missionaries to C. A. Be it

Resolved, That we earnestly unite our prayers with theirs in behalf of the Foreign field and also push the Prayer Band work on our respective charges.

III.

In as much as Bro. Bogue has been a great blessing to our church for years past, as Pastor, Evangelist, P. E. and Gen. Supt. and in as much as he has now seen fit to leave us. We recommend that we as a conference express our heartfelt thanks for all his sacrifices and labors of love. While we regret to lose him from our ranks, we pray that God's richest blessings will go with him.

IV.

In as much as God has blessed us by giving to us Bro. Brown, as our General Superintendent and as the greater responsibilities and burdens of the churches will fall upon him and our Presiding Elders. Be it

Resolved, That we unite our prayers at the throne in their behalf and that we extend to them the right hand of fellowship pledging them our prayers and heartiest co-operation for the coming year.

V.

In as much as God has so graciously blessed our church paper, "A Voice from Canaan," and made it such a blessing to us and has also given us such a consecrated man as Bro. Bradshaw for Editor. Be it

Resolved, That we give him our hearties co-operation in pushing the "VOICE" and also doing our very best financially.

VI.

WHEREAS, God's judgements are in the land humbling the hearts of men and making them susceptible to the entreaties of the gospel, therefore, be it

Resolved, That we give ourselves to a more earnest study of the Word and greater diligence in prayer that we may not be entangled in the snare of the fowler and that we may be endued with wisdom and power to make the most of our opportunities for the salvation of souls and hasten the return of our Lord.

VII.

We the Resolution Committee of old have resolved not to resolve any more unless you keep the resolutions.
