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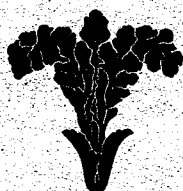

GONE TO HIS REWARD.

Benjamin Harrison Hines was born Sept. 27, 1842, near Eagletown, Hamilton county, Indiana. He departed this life August 29, 1919, at the age of 76 years 11 months and 2 days. Bro. Hines was united in marriage to Elizabeth Wicker October 15, 1862, and to this union was born two children, Charles Hines, of Anderson, and Florence Inman, of Westfield. Mrs. Elizabeth Hines preceded him to Glory in the year 1903 and he was again united in marriage to Mrs. Anna Shirley, in 1904, who has certainly been a great blessing to Bro. Hines in his last few years that she spent with him and not only to him but to every one, especially the household of faith. At the age of 15 years Bro. Hines was saved and lived a Christian life on, and preached the gospel for 48 years. In the year 1907 he entered the Holiness Christian conference as an ordained Elder, and we found him an efficient member and deem him worthy of his title, Rev. B. H. Hines. He also enlisted in the war of the rebellion and was in the 147th Inf., Co. C. A few days before our camp this year Bro. Hines said to me: "I want to go to camp once more and see the boys," and testified "I expect it will be my last camp." So it was. God let him attend it through and on the last day of the conference he took sick and within seven days was in Glory. I, E. J. Clem and Rev. O. W. and H. Cornelius conducted the funeral services and shurely the Glory lingered near. Sister Hines will miss him, the Anderson class will miss him, children and friends will miss him and when we call the conference roll, we'll miss him, but he will answer "present" when the roll is called in Glory. Our loss, his gain.

OBITUARY

Mrs. Katherine Nemyer, nee Miss Katherine Pitts, was born Dec. 17, 1868, in Waldgrehweiler Rhine Pfalz, Germany. Departed this life Jan. 12, 1918, at 12:25 o'clock at the age of 49 years and 26 days. After suffering a long time. Death was due to cancer. She had been ailing for the past several years and was bedfast since Dec. 18, 1917. She emmigrated to the United States in 1884, and located in Coshocton, Ohio, where she lived for one year. She came to Wabash in 1885. She was united in marriage to John Nemyer August 4, 1887. To this union there was born five children, one having died in infancy, four survive.

She entered the Indiana Conference of the Holiness Christian church in 1913, as an evangelist. She was a good wife and mother, one whom her husband and children could love with a tender affection. And a neighbor possessing the esteem of them all.

JOURNAL OF THE SESSION

First Day—Morning Session

The twenty-fourth annual conference of the Holiness Christian church convened in the Tabernacle on the camp ground, at Frankfort, Ind., Monday morning, Aug. 18, 1919.

Song service followed by prayer by Bro. Brown, General Supt., after which was sung "We Praise Thee, Oh God," and scripture lesson from Acts 6:3-4 was read by Bro. Brown, who also delivered the opening address. "When We All Get to Heaven" was sung and conference was opened with General Supt. in chair. Roll was called and revised.

Moved and seconded that all names that are doubtful or inactive be referred to examining committee. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we accept the rules for conference bar the same as 1918. Carried.

RULES FOR GOVERNING CONFERENCE

Conference Bar—First four row of seats from North aisle around South.

Hours of session—8:30 a. m. to 12:00; 1:30 to 5:00 p. m. Each session preceded by fifteen minutes devotional service.

No member leave the conference bar without permission of chair.

All reports to be read without comment.

All members tardy at roll call give reasonable excuse for absence.

No member make more than one speech until every member has spoken who desires to do so and then only with consent of chair.

It is agreed that all members on boards be excused from roll call.

Moved and seconded that all questions arising which conference votes on shall not be voted upon until all committees are called in. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we dispense with the reading of all reports. Motion lost. Song, "The End Is Not Yet."

Moved and seconded that committees be dismissed for service. Carried.

Hattie Dunkleberger was appointed by the chair in Bro. E. C. Rhodes' place as auditor.

Moved and seconded that all names of preachers that are to go before the examining committee are to do so at once. Carried. Names are as follows: Martha Collvil, E. F. Ewers, J. F. Morris, Tilla Morris, Hattie Lacy, L. E. Ewers, A. Plunkett, Martha Gilispy, J. Gilispy, Arthur McQueen.

Aurora and Marion knocked for admittance into conference and were admitted.

Moved and seconded that Seymour be accepted as a mission this year. Carried.

Moved and seconded we receive Mooresville as a mission. Carried.

Moved and seconded we read all reports. Carried. Read and accepted.

Moved and seconded to release the Andrews church and let it return to owner, Mrs. George Marker. Carried.

Moved and seconded that Secretary write this person that property will be returned with exemption of organ and aisle carpet.

Moved and seconded that no one accept any church property without a clear title. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we drop Carlisle church from list. Carried.

Moved and seconded to adjourn. Carried.

Benediction by Rev. C. C. Brown.

Afternoon Session--First Day

After devotional services, conference was called to order by C. C. Brown, in chair. First in order was the calling of the roll, after which the minutes of the last session were read.

Moved and seconded that Edw. Davis explain concerning his report as to the new church for North Kokomo. Carried.

Recommended that Arthur Plunkett be admitted into conference bar with speech.

Recommended that Alma Sherer be admitted into conference bar as advisory member.

Recommended that Brother H. O. Fanning be accepted into conference bar with speech.

Orphanage report read and accepted.

Moved and seconded we adjourn. Carried.

Benediction by N. Bradshaw.

Second Day—Morning Session.

The morning session of conference opened by devotional services, prayer by Brother Buck and scripture lesson by C. C. Brown, found in First Corin. 1.9-10.

The roll was called after which conference proceeded.

Moved and seconded that Arthur Plunkett be referred to examining committee.

We recommend that J. F. Morris and wife, Brother Sexton and W. M. Hall be admitted into conference bar as advisory members.

Recommended that W. H. Cox and M. F. Pratt be admitted into conference bar as advisory members.

Next in order was the reading of the Foreign Missionary report by Brother Pratt. Accepted.

Rescue Home report was read and accepted.

Presiding Elders' reports read and accepted.

Song, "When We All Get to Heaven."

Talk by Rev. W. R. Cox, of Greensboro, N. C., upon the subject of "Church Consolidation."

Moved and seconded to adjourn until call of the chair. Carried. Benediction by B. H. Hines.

Afternoon Session—Second Day

After devotional services the conference was called to order with Brother C. C. Brown in the chair, after which the roll was called.

Moved and seconded that the secretary write J. J. Sinclair letter of recommendation. Carried.

Home Missionary report read by Brother W. Sherman and accepted.

Moved and seconded that we call all committees in and proceed to elect officers.

The following were nominated for Presiding Elders:

E. J. Clem, A. M. Ewing, W. Sherman, Edw Schoeff, O. W. Barnes, W. A. Fry, A. M. Ewing and Edw. Schoeff elected by ballot.

Song, "When We All Get To Heaven."

The following were nominated for conference secretaries: J. Shue, E. J. Clem, H. W. Cornelius. E. J. Clem elected unanimously.

Moved and seconded that the secretary be paid \$15 and expenses. Carried.

Collection taken accordingly.

Moved and seconded Brother Barnes be elected treasurer by acclamation. Carried.

The following were nominated as conference trustees: W. Sherman, A. M. Ewing, D. C. Middleton, E. W. Wright, A. M. Ewing elected by ballot.

Moved and seconded that trustees shall be elected and

hold office until their successors are elected. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we re-elect same Foreign Missionary prayer band. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we re-elect same Foreign Missionary Prayer Band, except Sister Berle Wisemantel fill the place of Sister Rogers.

Moved and seconded we hear the ways and means article on the Burial Association. Carried.

Moved and seconded we accept I. J. Snyder's resignation as secretary of Burial Association. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the article of Ways and Means be tabled. Carried.

Brother Wright was elected by acclamation as secretary of the Burial Association. Other officers same as last year.

Moved and seconded we elect old educational board. Carried.

Moved and seconded we re-elect the following committees: Examining, Ways and Means, Statistical, Auditing, Resolutions. Carried.

Moved and seconded we re-elect old camp meeting committee except the pastor of Frankfort take the place of Brother Snyder. Carried.

The reception committee were appointed by the chair.

Report on Home Missionary work was read by Brother Ewing. Accepted.

Moved and seconded we adjourn to meet at 6 o'clock. Carried.

Benediction by Brother Fouts.

Evening Session—Second Day

Conference was opened by devotional services and prayer by E. A. Davis.

Moved and seconded we dispense with the calling of the roll and reading of the minutes. Carried.

Delegates were elected for general conference. Moved we adjourn until 8 o'clock a. m. Carried.

Moved we adjourn. Carried.

Benediction.

Wednesday Morning Session.

Conference was opened by devotional service and prayer.

N. Bradshaw reads the Voice report to be received aft-

er correction.

I. J. Snyder read the Burial Association report. Accepted.

Moved and seconded we elect lay delegates for the general conference. Carried.

Berle Wisemantle and Mary Waymeyer were elected from South district. Delegates from North District, Owen Pritts and Henry Riber.

Moved and seconded that trustees read the deed of Camp Ground. Read and accepted.

Moved and seconded we elect home missionary evangelist. Carried. Brother Thornton elected.

Moved and seconded we guarantee the Home Missionary Evangelist minimum of \$20 per week. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the Home Missionary Evangelist confine himself to new fields only. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we re-open the nominations for Home Missionary Evangelist. Carried.

Nominations were closed. Brother Thornton elected.

Moved and seconded we elect Brother Bradley as Home Missionary Secretary by acclamation. Carried and elected.

Moved and seconded that we elect Brother Bradley Home Missionary Treasurer by acclamation. Carried and elected.

Moved and seconded that a page be given in the minutes for addresses of all unstationed and stationed ministers. Carried.

Moved and seconded that all ministers forward their names and addresses to conference secretary stating whether they are stationed or not, within ten days after conference. Also pastors send names and addresses of local preachers.

Moved and seconded that no preachers make dates conflicting with Camp Meeting dates.

Moved and seconded that all local churches release preachers on full pay to go to camp. Carried.

Moved and seconded each class make two comforts for camp next year. Carried.

Moved and seconded that all pastors have their membership where they are pastors and all conference preachers names on some local church roster.

Moved and seconded we elect a committee to get out blanks. Carried. Nominations were made as follows. Brother Ewing, Brother Wright, Brother Ed Schoeff. All elected.

Moved and seconded that the camp committee be authorized to engage two evangelists for camp meeting next year. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we have two ministerial conferences, one in North and one in South District.

Moved and seconded that the presiding elders select a place and time for the ministerial conference to be held on his district, on his first quarterly round. Carried.

Afternoon Session—Wednesday.

After devotional services conference was called to order with C. C. Brown in chair.

First in order was report of Examining Committee.

Elders ordained and gave Brother Buck right hand of fellowship while song was sung, "By and By When the Morning Comes."

Report of Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

Preachers report read and received.

Ways and Means Committee reports read and accepted.

We recommend that each member over eighteen years of age be required to pay 75 cents into the annual conference and that the pastor insist that the same be paid.

Moved and seconded that the resolution on Burial Association be referred to committee.

Moved and seconded that Burial Association secretary be paid \$12 and assessment. Carried.

We recommend that each class vote by ballot as to the retaining of their pastor at the last quarterly round of presiding elder.

Moved and seconded that the apportionment money that Brother Sherman turned in not be accepted and the \$4.51 be made up in offering. Carried and offering was made up.

Moved and seconded that we refer the setting of apportionment of classes to Ways and Means Committee. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the motion on presiding elder's salary be rescinded. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we pay each elder \$1,000 including camp offering. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we send greetings by General Superintendent to the two Western conferences. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we send letter of greetings to Brother Higgs in Central America.

Moved and seconded that we send one of our elders to Orleans to carry greetings to Apostolic Association. Carried.

Vote was taken and Brother Schoeff goes to Association.

Moved and seconded that we raise car fare for Brother Schoeff by a collection. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn until call of chair.

Benediction by Brother Brown.

After recess Conference proceeded by hearing the reading of the statistical report. Same accepted.

A report was read from Lillian Rogers and accepted.

Moved and seconded that Rev. I. J. Snyder be elected as Conference Evangelist. Carried.

A report was read of resolutions by Sister Bradley.

Moved and seconded we adjourn until 7:30 Thursday morning. Carried.

Benediction by H. W. Cornelius.

Morning Session—Fourth Day.

After devotional services Conference was called to order by E. J. Clem, secretary in charge.

First in order was roll call, minutes were read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that Brother Clem sing. Carried. Sung "I Am Nicely Saved Today."

Moved and seconded that churches pay moving expenses of pastors. Carried.

Moved and seconded that all local churches having a pastor as delegate to General Conference, pay pastor full salary while gone. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we make an Honor Roll of all deceased members of Conference and that they be placed in minutes.

Moved and seconded we adjourn for fifteen minutes. Carried.

After recess first in order was report of Ways and Means committee on apportionment for classes. Accepted.

Stationing Committee meets for the purpose of stationing the preachers, after which the report was read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that we borrow money from camp treasurer to finance Marion Camp Meeting and that the same be paid back from conference treasury. Carried.

Moved and seconded we adjourn. Carried.
