MONDAY MORNING SESSION, AUGUST 20, 1923

The first session of the 1923 Annual Assembly of the Indiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness church opened at the Tabernacle on the Camp Ground at Frankfort, Ind., at 8:30 o'clock on Monday morning, Aug. 20th, 1923.

The devotional service was conducted by Rev. W. R. Cox. The song "Is Dearer Than All." The Scripture lesson read by Bro. Cox was from Eph. 4:1-6, and he gave a very searching talk on the Scripture lesson in regard to the manifestation of the spirit of the sanctified. Prayer was offered by Bro. W. S. Dean.

After the devotional service the Assembly was called to order with Rev. W. R. Cox, Gen. Supt. of the Pilgrim Holiness church in the chair.

A gavel made by Rex Wright of Terre Haute, Ind., son of Rev. E. W. Wright, was presented to the Assembly by the young man's father, Rev. Wright. An expression of appreciation of this gift was given by the State Supt., Rev. A. M. Ewing.

The roll call and response was next in order.

Moved and supported that the names that did not appear on the Assembly roll be referred to the Committee on Morals. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that our Assembly bar be fixed the same as last year, i. e., three central sections of seats, ten seats back with the addition of the first section of seats in the right wing of the tabernacle. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that Samuel Stephenson be received as the delegate from Concord church. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that the matter be taken up later regarding the delegate from Cory church. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that Mrs. Christina Goins serve as delegate from the Elwood church until the regularly elected delegate arrive. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that Bro. L. W. Stanger be excused from the Assembly on account of funeral. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that the Examining Committee be excused from the Assembly to examine candidates. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that G. A. Davis, Wm. Urschell, H. C. Dickerson, Alma Shearer, Bros. Bassett, Fortner, Orville Maish, and Wilbert McCrory be invited to take their place within the Assembly bar and serve as advisory members. Motion carried. These ministers came forward and were presented to the Assembly and took their place within the Assembly bar.

Moved and supported that the rules governing last Annual Assembly be adopted as the rules for this Assembly. Moved and supported that we

amend this motion to place the time of sessions as: 8 to 12 A. M. and 1:30 to 5 P. M., and 7 to 9 P. M. Motion carried as amended.

Moved and seconded that the Chairman, with the assistance of the State Superintendent appoint the standing committees to serve this year following this Annual Assembly and throughout next year's Assembly. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the Chairman with the assistance of the State Superintendent shall make appointments to fill vacancies on the standing committees serving during this Assembly. Motion carried. Rev. M. F. Pratt was appointed to serve on the Ways and Means Committee in the absence of Rev. L. W. Stanger, and Rev. W. P. Senn was appointed to fill the vacancy on the Statistical Committee, and Rev. O. W. Barnes to serve on the Reception Committee in the absence of Rev. Lowell H. Coate.

The Minutes of the last session of the Annual Assembly of 1922 were called for and were read by the Secretary.

Moved and seconded that the action of the Assembly in regard to the reading of pastor's and evangelist's reports be rescinded and that the reading of these reports be dispensed with. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we receive all reports as submitted and that they be referred to the Statistical Committee. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that the District Chairman return to the chair. Carried.

Moved and seconded that Pilgrim Holiness ministers and Deaconesses of other Districts be permitted a voice in the Assembly. Motion lost.

Next in order was the reception of new churches into the Assembly. First the report of the church at Fergerson Chapel was read and that church was received into the Assembly.

Sanford church, with 25 members, a lot and a building, was received into the Assembly next.

Then Jackson Hollow church with a membership of 30 was received.

Connorsville church also, a church of 35 members, was received into the Assembly.

Moved and supported that we adjourn. Motion carried.

MONDAY AFTERNOON, AUGUST 20, 1923

After devotional services conducted by Rev. W. R. Cox and prayer by Bro. Geo. Huff, the Assembly was called to order with Gen. Supt., W. R. Cox in the chair.

Next in order was the roll call.

Moved and supported that we accept names to be put on our Assembly roll as follows:

A report was made at this time of the new church at Green St. Mission, Terre Haute, and a motion carried that this Mission, as a mission, be received into the Assembly.

Moved and supported that Rev. Chester McCarty, after being presented to the Assembly be referred to the Examining Board. Motion carried.

The following names were presented to the Assembly to be referred to the Examining Committee:

Moved and supported that the Illinois and Missouri District be given an official invitation to unite with the Indiana District. Motion carried.

Next in order was the reading of the State Treasurer's report.

Moved and seconded that, in as much as the State Treasurer has closed his books and balanced them that the sum of \$600 relative to the State Budget shall not be pro-rated but shall be applied to indebtedness already created. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that Bro. Wright and Bro. Schoeff be excused to get ready the Burial Association report. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that each church make two comforts and one straw tick, full size, for the use of the camp meeting. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that each church shall send a pillow or two to the camp-meeting next year. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the time for the election of officers be set as Tuesday morning at 9 A. M. This motion was carried.

Moved and supported and carried that we excuse the Ways and Means Committees and the Examining Committee.

Moved and supported that we take a 15-minute recess. Motion carried. After recess the Foreign Missionary report was read by Sis. Hart and was accepted.

At this time the Ways and Means Committee read a partial report.

Moved and supported that drop the support of Foreign missions, Educational interests, Orphanage and Rescue work by means of the Budget system and that all Budget money be used for support of the State expenses, the said institutions to be supported by special solicitations. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that the recommendation in regard to Home Missionary work be referred back to the committee to be revised. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the article in regard to the pastor's not evangelizing outside his own parish be referred back to the committee. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the Chair appoint a committee to apportion our churches according to membership for the purpose of paying the \$900 indebtedness on the Publishing Building, and that the pastors raise their apportionment. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn. Carried.

Benediction by Rev. Geo. Huff.

NIGHT SESSION, MONDAY, AUGUST 20, 1923

The evening session was called to order after prayer by Rev. Edw. Schoeff, with Rev. W. R. Cox in the chair.

The Minutes of the last session were read and adopted.

First in order was the presentation of Rev. B. H. Grimes by the Reception Committee into the Assembly bar as an advisory member.

The Burial Association report was read by Bro. E. W. Wright and was accepted.

A motion was offered by Bro. A. M. Ewing and supported that this Assembly give to Rev. Edw. Schoeff, his wife and children, free membership in the Burial Association so long as Bro. Schoeff shall remain Treasurer of the Association. This shall be granted in token of the faithful services rendered by Bro. Schoeff to the work of the Burial Association. Motion carried.

A motion was made, supported and carried that the Burial Association Board be instructed to bring in amendments to the B. A. By-Laws and that these be read at this Assembly. Motion carried.

The preachers, licensed and Ordained, who had planned evangelistic work for the coming year were asked by the State Superintendent to come forward and give in their names in order that the pastors might obtain names and addresses of evangelists to engage during the coming year. (For the names of these evangelists see the list in back of Minutes.)

The Home Missionary report was read and accepted.

Moved and supported that we have a Ministerial Convention at Elwood this year and that the dates of the Convention, the distribution of subjects and the writers be left in the hands of the State Superintendent, he to supply the list of subjects and writers to put in the Minutes. Motion carried.

Next in order was the reading by Rev. O. W. Barnes of a recommendation of the Ways and Means Committee. This recommendation was referred back to the Committee.

Moved and supported that there be an apportionment made of 75 cents per member to cover State expenses. Motion lost.

Moved and supported that the recommendation with regard to the Budget system presented by the Ways and Means Committee be rejected. Motion carried.

Rev. W. R. Cox vacated the chair, calling the State Superintendent to the chair while he spoke on the financial system of the church.

Moved and seconded that we extend the time of this session until some decision be reached in regard to our financial system. Motion lost.

Moved we adjourn. Motion carried. Benediction by Rev. A. M. Ewing.

MORNING SESSION, TUESDAY, AUGUST 21, 1923

After devotional services conducted by Rev. E. E. Davis and prayer by Rev. M. F. Pratt and reading of Scripture the Assembly was called to order

with Rev. W. R. Cox, Gen. Supt., in the chair.

Moved and supported that we dispense with the roll call. Motion carried. Minutes of last session read and adopted.

Next in order was a partial report of the Ways and Means Committee. The recommendations read at this time by this committee complete their work for this Assembly.

Moved and supported that we accept the six recommendations presented by the Ways and Means Committee. Motion carried. (See report of this committee on page)

Moved and supported that the State Superintendent frame an article explaining the Budget system and have article printed in the Minutes. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that all preachers and delegates remain until this Assembly closes. Motion carried.

The time for the election of officers having been set for 9 o'clock this A. M. the next business of the Assembly was this election. The chairman called the Assembly to prayer before beginning of this work.

The tellers and distributors of ballots for the election were appointed by the chair and were as follows: Tellers—O. W. Barnes, R. W. Chatfield, Edw. Schoeff. Distributers—Paul Brichetto, E. P. Schrock, Geo. Huff.

Rev. A. M. Ewing was elected as State Superintendent on the first ballot by an overwhelming majority.

Rev. William S. Dean was elected as Assistant State Superintendent by a majority when the vote for Assistant Superintendent was cast.

Moved and supported that this Assembly empower the District Superintendent to divide the District into zones and appoint superintendents over these zones to help the Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent of the District in settling of problems and the work of the Zone. Carried.

Next was the motion which was seconded to have a song by the Moser Sisters. They sang, "I'll Leave Without Saying Good-bye."

The District Secretary was next elected. Rev. E. J. Clem was elected on first ballot.

Moved and supported that this Assembly send Fraternal greeting by telegram to the Nazarene Assembly now convening at Indianapolis. Motion carried. The following telegram was prepared and sent by the Secretary:

Moved and supported Bro. and Sis. Rhoades now sing for us the song, "Where the Living Waters Flow." They sang at this time.

The report of the tellers was given and Rev. R. W. Chatfield was declared elected District Treasurer.

Moved and supported that the three advisory members of the District Council be elected on one ballot. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the three who receive the highest number of votes in this election shall be declared elected as advisory members. Motion carried.

On a motion to have a song Sis. Minnie Hankins of Kokomo sang at this time.

Moved and supported that Rev. W. R. Cox give an address to the pastors along the line of their pastoral duties while we wait for the report of the tellers. Motion carried. Rev. Cox gave a short address at this time.

Moved and supported that we suspend the rules of the Assembly and elect by acclamation Sis. Alice M. Hart to serve as Dist. Foreign Missionary Secretary-Treasurer. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the appointment of the District Home Missionary Evangelist be left in the hands of the District Council. Motion carried. Moved and supported that the amount of remuneration to be the Home Missionary Evangelist be left in the hands of the State Council. Motion carried.

Next was the election of two members of the District Foreign Missionary Board. Votes were cast at this time for these. Moved and supported that the two receiving the highest number of votes of this ballot shall be declared elected. Motion carried.

Moved and supported we suspend the rules and elect by acclamation Rev. D. E. Snow to serve as District Home Missionary Secretary-Treasurer. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we adjourn until the afternoon session in order that the tents on the camp ground may be rolled before the rain. Motion carried. No benediction was pronounced.

Close of day's record.

AFTERNOON SESSION, TUESDAY, AUGUST 21, 1923

The afternoon session Tuesday began with devotional services conducted by Rev. W. R. Cox. The song, "A Charge to Keep I Have," was sung, the Scripture lesson was read from Rom. 12:9-13 by Rev. Cox and prayer was offered by Rev. G. C. Middleton. We then proceeded to business with Rev. W. R. Cox in the chair.

Moved and seconded that we dispense with the roll call. Motion carried.

The report of the tellers was read and the report given that Rev. E. E. Davis and Rev. Beryl Weismantle were elected to serve on the District Foreign Missionary Board together with Rev. Alice M. Hart, already elected.

Moved and seconded that we suspend the rules and elect by acclamation the Educational Board of last year to serve this year. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the Camp Meeting Committee be appointed by the chair, assisted by the District Superintendent, the same as other Standing Committees are appointed. Motion carried.

Next in order was the report of the District Council in regard to the appointment of a District Home Missionary Evangelist and the amount of remuneration to be given him. Rev. A. H. Plunkett was appointed by the Council to serve as Home Missionary evangelist and was promised the remuneration of \$25 per week and traveling expenses while employed in Home Missionary duty for the District.

Rev. A. M. Ewing, District Superintendent, read the list of names appointed on the Camp Meeting Committee. (See list in front of Minutes.)

Moved and supported that this Assembly instruct the District Council to purchase a safe for the use of the District Treasurer. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the District Treasurer be paid \$50 for his services this year. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the District Superintendent appoint a committee to draft a proposition to present to this Assembly in regard to a church home for the aged. Motion carried. Those appointed on this committee were: Geo. Huff, A. H. Plunkett and W. A. Frye.

Moved and supported that this Assembly go on record as favoring a General Church Home for the Aged and that we have published in the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate an article expressing our attitude of the matter. Motion carried.

Next in order was the presentation of Woodlawn church by Miss Mary Friend. This church of 10 members is located near Shoals, Ind. The Assembly received this small body with open arms and expressed the hope that this church may be blessed and that it shall increase.

The Burial Association read a report on the revision of its By-Laws. This report was adopted.

Moved and supported that the Burial Association purchase a safe for the keeping of valuables. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that, in the event that the proceeds of the assessment of the Burial Association does not cover the expenses, that the Treasurer be privileged to draw from the Treasury to meet deficit. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the Resolution on Burial Association By-Laws be returned to committee for re-drafting. Motion carried.

The report of the "Committee on the Home for the Aged" was read and adopted. Their report is as follows:

"In view of the fact that there is an urgent need pressing upon us concerning the care of our aged and needy members we therefore offer the following recommendation: We recommend that each member in our District be assessed the sum of 10 cents for the creating of a fund to care for aged ministers and members, the same to be placed at the disposal of the District Council.

We further recommend that a copy of this Recommendation be placed in the hands of the General Superintendent, that other states and Assemblies may be instructed as to our action and as to the need of such a Home in

order that they may take some action on this matter before the time of our next General Assembly."

A report of the Resolution Committee was read and accepted.

Moved and supported that this Assembly ratify the action of the District Council in regard to Rev. John W. Clark. This action was taken in a meeting of the Council on April 4-5, 1923, during the Ministerial Convention at Frankfort, Ind., Motion carried.

Moved and supported that this Assembly instruct the District Council to purchase three sets of the study course books and place them in the hands of the Educational Board to be used as a circulating library for our preachers. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn. Motion carried.

Benediction by Rev. W. R. Cox.

NIGHT SESSION, TUESDAY, AUGUST 21, 1923

Devotional services of the evening session were conducted by Rev. W. R. Cox. The hymn, "There Is a Fountain," was sung, prayer was offered by Rev. M. F. Pratt, and we continued to business with General Superintendent Cox in the chair.

Moved and supported that we dispense with the roll call. Motion carried.

The Minutes of the afternoon session were read and accepted.

Moved and supported that we proceed at once to the service of the Ordination of preachers. Motion carried.

The candidates came forward. The Scripture lessons were read by Rev. A. M. Ewing and Rev. W. S. Dean. The charge was given by Rev. W. R. Cox, General Superintendent, after he had read a Scripture lesson from II Tim. 4:1-5.

After the charge had been given the candidates for Ordination they knelt at the altar where the Ordination Council, by prayer and laying on of hands duly ordained them.

The ordination service closed by the singing of the hymn, "Blest Be the Tie," and handshakes of fellowship by members of the Assembly.

The report of the Statistical Committee was read and accepted.

Moved and supported that we excuse Bro. J. L. Thornton from the Assembly on account of sickness. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we now accept the preachers into the Assembly who come to us with their Credentials. Motion carried. These preachers are as follows: Wilbert McCrory, Minister from Church of the Nazarene; D. D. Fortner, Pilgrim Holiness church, Kentucky District; Chas. Wilson, from the M. E. Church, for First Year License.

The Committee on Examination brought in a report and recommended a list of those for First Year License. (For this list see report of Examining Committee.) Moved and supported we accept this report. Motion carried.

Those who were recommended for First Year's License came forward and were introduced to the Assembly and then took their places inside the Assembly bar.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn. Motion carried. Benediction by Rev. W. S. Dean.

MORNING SESSION, WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 22, 1923

The morning session of Wednesday opened with devotional services conducted by Rev. W. R. Cox. The members of the Assembly stood and repeated the First Psalm. Rev. C. A. Fouts, of Linton, Ind., offered prayer.

Moved and supported that we dispense with the roll call. Motion carried.

The Minutes of the last session were read and adopted.

Moved and supported that each Minister bring to the Annual Assembly a recommendation from his local church for a renewal of license. Motion carried.

The report of the Committee on the Apportionment of the \$900.00 to be raised for the Debt on the Publishing Building was read and accepted. (Find report with the Statistical Report.)

Moved and supported that the Assembly authorize the rules to be suspended and a number less than three-fourths of the Assembly to do business if many delegates leave the Assembly and make such action necessary. Motion carried.

Next in order was the report of the Burial Association Committee on Revision of By-Laws. Their report is as follows:

"This report to be inserted in Article VII, Pp. 1 in the By-Laws of the Burial Association between the words "members" and "all" in this article:

"Provided further that only every other assessment shall be collected until funds shall diminish to \$2,000, at which time each assessment shall be collected until funds reach \$4,000, then only alternate assessments collected again until minimum fund of \$2,000 is reached, then proceed to collect each assessment again."

Moved and supported we adopt this recommendation of the Committee on Burial Association By-Laws. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the Secretary of the Burial Association be paid at the rate of \$35 per month for his work. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we buy an Addressograph machine for addressing of cards of the Burial Association. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we rescind the action of sending out cards once a month by the Burial Association Secretary and leave the arrangements of the cards at each death as formerly. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we rescind the former motion in regard to the amount to be paid the Burial Association Secretary and that he be paid \$20 at each single call and \$35 at each double call for his work as before. Motion carried.

The Auditing Committee's report was read by Rev. J. H. Baughman and was accepted by the Assembly.

Moved and supported we suspend the rules and elect by acclamation the former Board of Burial Association to serve this year. Motion carried. (See list with officers in official record on front pages.)
