JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE INDIANA STATE ASSEMBLY, AUGUST 18-20, 1924

Monday Morning Session, August 18

The second annual session of the Indiana Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church met at the Tabernacle at Frankfort, Ind., August 18th, 1924, for the purpose of promoting our work for the coming year.

The Assembly was called to order at 8:30 a. m. by Rev. W. R. Cox, general superintendent, in the chair. After devotional service which was opened by singing "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name." Rev. Cox gave the Assembly a very effective talk in regard to our ability in conducting our business. Scripture read was from Proverbs 1:20-29.

Rev. G. Arnold Hodgkin, assistant general superintendent, also gave an interesting speech in regard to our spirituality while in business sessions. after which Rev. W. S. Dean lead in prayer.

Next in order was a motion that the conference bar be fixed the same as bar last year, i. e., the three central sections of seats, ten seats back with an addition of the first section of seats in the right wing of the tabernacle. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the rules governing our Assembly, relative to

time of sessions be as last year, i. e.: 8 to 12 a. m., 1:30 to 5 p. m. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that rules governing the Assembly be as found in Manual, paragraph 215, page 94. Carried.

Next in order was the reading of committees, and the following vacancies were filled: Cora A. White was appointed by Rev. Ewing on the auditing committee. Martha Nogle was appointed to fill the place of Pearl Dean on the resolution committee. John Williams and W. A. Frye were appointed to fill vacancies on the reception committee.

Moved and supported that we dispense with the minutes of last year and enter into business immediately. Carried.

Next in order was the roll call by the secretary which was accepted as read.

The following names were dropped after action had been taken by the Assembly: F. A. Callahan, W. C. Canary, Birdie Canary, Frank Myers, R. H. Wilkerson, and W. C. Urschell.

The following were dropped on account of transfer: Orth McCune to Kentucky district; Chester McCarty to Nebraska district; Plen Smith and E. L. Pendry to the Illinois district.

Next in order was the admitting of new churches into the conference, names as follows: Second church at Muncie, with twenty-seven members; Edinburg, with thirty-five members; Beulah church, with seventeen members; New Castle, with thirty-five members; Weisbach, with twelve members; Anderson Second church, with thirty-two members; Greenwood mission, Terre Haute, with twenty-four members; Fountainette, with nine members; Rising Sun, with thirteen members; So. 2nd St. church, Terre Haute, with nine members; Woodstock church, Woodstock, Wis., with seven members; Woodlawn church, all of which were accepted into the conference.

The following ministers were introduced to the Assembly as advisory members and took their place in the conference bar: R. J. Bennett, Mrs. W. R. Cox, J. R. Edwards, Arthur Hayhurst, V. E. Wade, O. L. and Mrs. King, Miss M. E. Perty, C. H. and Mrs. Daul, J. F. Rogers, Harry Shepherd, Frank Cox, John Carroll, W. M. Hall, W. A. Sexton, P. D. Guyer, W. G. Bogue, M. E. Dice, H. N. Bassett, C. L. and Mrs. Slater, Earl and Mrs. Baldwin, and Nora Hayworth.

Moved and supported we adjourn. Carried. Benediction by Rev. Frank Cox.

Afternoon Session, Monday, August 18, 1924

After devotional service conducted by Rev. D. E. Snow and singing the song entitled, "In the Service of The King," we were led in prayer by Rev. W. A. Frye. We then entered into business with Rev. W. R. Cox, general superintendent, in the chair.

Moved and supported we list the Sunday school delegates and admit them into the conference. Carried.

Moved and supported that we dispense with the reading of reports. Carried.

Moved and supported that a committee be appointed to check church reports. Carried.

The following appointment was made by Rev. A. M. Ewing: P. D. Guyer, Fred Johnson.

Moved and supported that the district superintendent, district treasurer, foreign missionary and home missionary reports be read. Carried.

Moved and supported these reports be accepted as read. Carried.

Next in order was the appointment of a committee to bring in resolutions relative to the adjusting of the Burial Association by-laws. The committee as appointed were: R. W. Chatfield, John Williams and Geo. E. Huff.

Moved and supported we give Sister Harrington ten minutes to discuss our claims in Japan. Carried.

By request of our chairman, Rev. Cox, Rev. Chas. Slater sang a song entitled, "Jesus is a Friend of Mine."

Rev. Slater was given the privilege to speak concerning our Orphanage at Kingswood.

Moved and supported we adjourn. Benediction by Rev. Chas. L. Slater.

Night Session, August 18th, 1924

After devotional service conducted by W. R. Cox, in which the song entitled "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart" was sung. The Scripture lesson was read from Eph. and prayer was offered by Rev. G. Arnold Hodgkin. The Assembly was called to order by Rev. W. R. Cox in the chair.

Moved and supported we dispense with the roll call. Carried.

Next in order was the reading and acceptance of the minutes of the last session.

Next in order was the reading of the report of the committee, concerning the Burial Association.

Moved and supported that the first resolution, as read, relative to a Ministerial Benefit Association, be carried, as recommended to the General Assembly. For reference see Recommendations to General Assembly.

Moved and supported that the hour of 1:30 Tuesday p. m. be set for the accepting of licensed preachers into the conference. Carried.

Moved and supported we increase the committee on by-laws of the Burial Association from three to five, the committee to be appointed by the district superintendent. The appointments were as follows: Rev. E. W. Wright and Rev. W. E. Bradley.

Moved and supported we have a memorial service in behalf of our deceased brethren, Rev. Paul Prichette of Indianapolis, and Rev. Don Davis of North Vernon, at 10:30 a. m., August 19, 1924. Carried.

Moved and supported we adjourn. Carried. Benediction by Rev. Bassett.

Morning Session, August 19th, 1924

After devotional service in which the Scripture lesson was read from Eph. 4th chapter, and prayer was offered by G. C. Middleton, the assembly was called to order, with Rev. W. R. Cox, general superintendent, in the chair.

Moved and supported we dispense with the roll call in each service except morning. Motion lost.

Moved and supported we call all committees to the various sessions. Carried.

Next in order was the reading of the Home Missionary report by Rev. A. H. Plunkett, and was received.

Next in order was to suspend business for the memorial service at 10:30, in behalf of our beloved deceased Rev. Paul Brichette and Rev. Don Davis.

The memorial service was conducted by Rev. A. M. Ewing, in which Rev. Chas. Slater sang a song entitled "In The New Jerusalem," after which Rev. G. C. Middleton lead in prayer and Rev. W. G. Bogue delivered the memorial address from the Scripture text Ps. 87:1 and spoke in regard to the greatness of a Holiness preacher. The service was closed by singing "We Will Never Say Good-Bye in Heaven." Benediction by Rev. W. R. Cox.

The Assembly was dismissed for a ten-minutes recess, after which we continued the discussion relative to the Burial Association.

Moved and supported we suspend the rules regarding the hours and convene at 2 p. m. instead of 1:30 p. m. Carried.

Next was a report of the auditing committee. Report received. (See Reports.)

Moved and supported that we set the time for the election of officers. Wednesday, 9:30 a. m. Carried.

Moved and supported we adjourn. Carried. Benediction by Rev. G. C. Middleton.

Afternoon Session, August 19th, 1924

After devotional service led by Rev. W. R. Cox, in which a song was sung, and prayer offered by Rev. Chas. Slater, the Assembly was called to order, with Rev. Cox in the chair.

Moved and supported we dispense with the roll call. Carried.

Next in order was the reading and acceptance of the minutes of the last session.

Moved and supported we rescind the action in regard to the election of officers. Carried.

Moved and supported we rescind the action in regard to the receiving of

preachers into the Assembly. Carried.

At this time an offering was taken for the support of the dining hall.

Moved and supported we enter into the election of officers at 2:30 p. m. Tuesday. Carried. (For reference, see report.)

Secret prayer was called and after this, proceeded to elect officers.

The tellers appointed were W. A. Frye, W. E. Bradley, E. W. Wright, John Williams, Earl Davis, W. B. Fugate.

Moved and supported, as we have elected Bro. Ewing on 123 ballots out of 136, we grant him an unanimous vote by standing. Carried.

Moved and supported that our district treasurer be paid \$100, to be drawn out of the district treasury. Carried.

Moved and supported we suspend the rules and elect Alice Hart foreign missionary secretary-treasurer by acclamation. Carried.

With her, Beryl Weismantle and E. E. Davis were appointed as members of the district foreign missionary board.

Moved and supported we suspend the rules and elect Rev. D. E. Snow secretary-treasurer of Home Missions by acclamation. Carried. Elected unanimously.

Moved and supported we make arrangements to remunerate Sister Hart for her labor as secretary-treasurer of Foreign Missions. Carried.

Moved and supported we give Sister Hart \$100 for services and to be paid from the Missionary Treasury.

Moved and supported we suspend the rules and re-elect the Burial Association committee by acclamation. Carried.

Moved and supported that the district superintendent appoint the camp meeting committee. See official record. Carried.

Moved and supported that the district superintendent be given the right after suspending the rules, to nominate delegates both ministerial and laymen, to be voted upon by the Assembly, for the purpose of a delegation to the General Assembly. Carried. They were appointed and favorably voted upon. See list.

Moved and supported the superintendent appoint alternates. Carried, and were appointed.

Moved and supported we elect fifteen alternate ministerial and five alternate lay. Carried.

Partial report of the Ways and Means committee was read by Area Montgomery, and rejected.

Next in order was the report of the Resolution Committee by Miss Clyde Titus, and was received. See report.

Moved and supported we have a ministerial convention. Carried.

Moved and supported we accept the invitation extended from Lafayette and Anderson. On voting, Anderson was accepted.

Moved and supported the convention subjects be sent in earlier this year. Carried.

The committee was appointed by the district superintendent, on selecting and distributing subjects for the convention, Pearl Dean, Cora White and Martha Nogle.

Moved and supported we have the reception and ordination services immediately after convening at 7 o'clock. Carried.

Moved and supported that the time be extended to 5:30. Carried.

Moved and supported we adjourn. Carried. Benediction by Rev. Ed. Schoemaker.

Night Session, August 19th, 1924

After the devotional service, conducted by Floyd Goins, Rev. E. C. and Mrs. Rhoads were called to the platform to sing their favorite song, "Where the Living Waters Flow." Prayer was offered by Rev. Chas. Hall, after which Rev. Chas. Slater sang "Get a Transfer."

The Assembly was called to order by Rev. Cox in the chair.

Moved and supported we dispense with the roll call. Carried.

Next in order was the reading of the minutes of the last session, and accepted.

Next was the receiving of ministers into the conference. Rev. Cox gave an address to the ministers from the standpoint of what it meant to be a Pilgrim Holiness preacher.

Next in order was the reading of report of the Resolution Committee, by Miss Clyde Titus. See report.

The ordination service was conducted by the Ordination Council. Those ordained were as listed above.

Moved and supported we adjourn until 8 a. m. Wednesday, August 20. Carried. Benediction by Jesse Hayhurst.

Morning Session, August 20th, 1924

After devotional service conducted by Rev. Cox, we entered into business.

Next in order was the calling of the roll, and accepted.

Minutes of the last session were read and accepted.

Next was the reading of the district superintendent's report which was received.

The numerical report was read by Sister Dean and accepted. See report.

Moved and supported we take an offering for the work in Japan. Offering taken amounted to \$19.68.

Moved and supported we excuse Rev. E. C. and Mrs. Rhoads from the Assembly on account of sickness. Carried.

Moved and supported we excuse Rev. B. H. Colen from the Assembly. Carried.

Moved and supported that we rescind the former action in regard to the electing of officers for the Ministerial Benefit Association and leave it in the hands of the present Burial Association Board. Carried.

Mss Emma Perdy, a missionary, was given a few minutes to speak of her foreign missionary work.

Moved and supported that we grant an increase to Bro. Wright, B. A. Sect., the increase to be from 20-30 and from 35-50 single and double calls. Motion lost.

Moved and supported we leave the matter of increase of salary of B. A. Sect. to the Burial Association Board. Carried.

Moved and supported the B. A. Board be excused. Carried.

Next in order was the reading of the final report of the Statistical Committee by Rev. W. P. Senn. Report read and accepted.

Next in order was the resolutions read, to be carried to the General Assembly and accepted. See Resolutions.

The resolution in regard to the election of officers 60 days prior to the Annual Assembly was amended by reading, the officers to take their offices at end of conference year. Carried.

Report of B. A. committee on by-laws are as follows: Add to Art. 5, paragraph 7, "Certificates of Membership shall be."

Moved and supported we excuse the B. A. committee to decide on the amount to be paid to the B. A. Sect. Carried.

Moved and supported that all business relative to a ten and twenty cent certificate in regard to the Burial Association be spunged from the minutes. Carried.

Moved and supported the district superintendent appoint a committee

to correct minutes before going to the printer. Carried. A. M. Ewing and D. E. Snow appointed.

Report of the Burial Association committee relative to the secretary's salary was read as follows: Thirty dollars for a single call and fifty dollars for a double call. Received.

Moved and supported we adjourn. Benediction by Rev. G. A. Fouts.

Afternoon Session, August 20th, 1924

After devotional service the Assembly was called to order, with Rev. Cox in the chair.

Moved and supported we dispense with roll call. Carried.

Minutes of last session were read and received.

Moved and supported a committee be appointed by the chair for the purpose of receiving information relative to the expenses of carfare to the General Assembly. Carried. Rev. R. W. Chatfield was appointed.

Moved and supported that the district superintendent appoint a committee for the purpose of handling the arrangements for moving our pastors. J. H. Cruser, Edward Schoeff and R. W. Shattfield.

Moved and supported that Fraternal Greetings be sent to the Nazarene Assembly at Alexandria by our Dist. Supt. carried.

We were favored with a solo by Sis. George, entitled "Leaning By Faith."

Moved and supported that the churches take an offering for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Gen. Assembly. Carried.

Moved and supported after pastors get on their pastorates that the State Supt. appoint Presidents over zones where there has been changes or need be and that all Pastors who have changed zones notify their State Supt. Carried.

Moved and supported we rescind the action relative to the increase of delegates to the Gen. Assembly. Carried.

Next was the receiving of Ministers into the Assembly, Ethel Ballard was received as a Licensed Deaconess.

Moved and supported that each church make and send into the Camp two comforts and straw ticks. Carried.

Moved and supported we adjourn until call of chair. Carried.

Night Session, August 20, 1924

After devotional service the assembly was called to order with Rev. Cox in the chair.

Next was the reading of the minutes and accepted. We recommend that the zone president with the assistant superintendent, who shall act as chairman, shall constitute the station committee in the annual assembly. Carried.

Moved and supported that our next annual camp be held August 7-16 inclusive, 1925. Carried.

Moved and supported that District Council purchase two sets of the study course for preachers who are not able to purchase them. Books to be bought after the General Assembly. Carried.

Moved and supported that W. E. Bradley be the state Librarian and all books be cared for by him and if any preacher has books not needed send them to him. Carried.

Rev. W. G. Bogue was called to the front as an ordained minister, being received into the conference. He was extended the right hand of fellowship. Rev. E. P. and Mrs. Schrock's daughters sang a song, "Everybody Ought to Love Jesus."

Moved and supported that all preachers attend the assembly and answer to roll call next year. Carried.

Next in order was a card of thanks offered by Rev. Morris in regard to the kindness shown to Sister Morris while sick at Camp.

Also a card of thanks was offered by John Carroll in behalf of Sister Wilson in her sickness during camp.

Inasmuch as the bunk crew has so faithfully taken care of the bunk wark, I move you we show our appreciation by a rising vote. Carried.

Moved and supported that this assembly suggest to our General Secretary to provide badges for our General Assembly. Carried.

Next in order was the report of the stationing of preachers. See report. Brother and Sister DaueI expressed their appreciation to the Indiana

assembly for the fellowship shown to them .

Moved and supported that E. J. Clem frame a resolution in regard to our Young People Work. CCarried.

Our appreciation was shown to our visiting brethren by a rising vote of the assembly.

Moved and supported we adjourn. Benediction by Rev. A. M. Ewing.

Report of the Resolution Committee

Resolution 1—Inasmuch as God has poured out His spirit and given us the best Camp Meeting in the history of our church; and such beautiful weather; therefore, be it

Resolved, That we show our gratitude for the same by rising and singing the Doxology.

Resolution 2—Inasmuch as God has again favored us with the presence of our General Superintendent, W. R. Cox; therefore, be it

Resolved, That we express our appreciation of the same by a rising vote.

Resolution 3—Inasmuch as our District Superintendent Rev. A. M. Ewing, and district officers have so ably and faithfully taken care of our state work, be it

Resolved, That we by a rising vote pledge our co-operation and prayers for the coming year.

Resolution 4—Inasmuch as God has seen fit to call from our midst Rev. Paul Bricketts, E. D. Davis (a memorial service was held Tuesday morning) therefore, be it

Resolved, That we bow our heads in submission for one minute's silent prayer.

Resolution 5—

Resolved, That this District Assembly recommend to our General Missionary Board the advisability of accepting the work in Japan being done by Brother Latsuya Funada, presented to this assembly by our Sister Harrington, and that steps be taken at once for its proper organization.

Resolved, That this District Assembly also take an offering for the support of the work in Japan, and that we as a church pledge ourselves to pray for this extension of our missionary work.

Resolution 6—

Resolved, That any minister leaving the church shall procure from the District Superintendent a recommendation, and be it further

Resolved, That any minister failing to do this shall be dismissed from the assembly by the request of the same, and such action shall be so mentioned in the minutes of the Annual Assembly. We further

Resolve, That this action shall apply to those whose names have been dropped at this present assembly.

Resolution 7—Since our General Assembly is so near at hand, be it

Resolved, That we have an agreement according to scripture to pray for the success of same and the unity of the brethren.

Resolution 8—Inasmuch as the city papers have so liberally contributed to the success of the Camp Meeting, therefore, be it

Resolved, That our District Superintendent convey to them our thanks.

WAYS AND MEANS

We recommend that the District Secretary be paid \$30.00 for editing the Assembly Minutes.

We recommend that the District Secretary have seven hundred copies of the Minutes published.

We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid \$2500.00 for his labor this year and this amount to include his traveling expenses.

We recommend that churches calling other preachers for trial sermons or other occasions at least pay their car fare.

We recommend that each church pay into our state treasury 10 per cent or its equivalent of all grace offerings, 60 per cent of this amount to go for state work, the other 40 per cent to be divided as follows: 40 per cent for Home Missions, 15 per cent for rescue work, 15 per cent for Orphanage, 15 per cent for Educational purposes and 15 per cent for Foreign Missions, and each church shall pay into our church treasury the equivalent to 25 cents per member for the support of our General Superintendent.

We recommend that our pastors do not forsake their own appointments to hold evangelistic services in other places with this provision: that said church of which they are pastor is supporting them.

We recommend that the workers in the camp meeting and assembly be appointed by the camp meeting committee and no pastor or church have the authority to send persons for such purposes unless duly authorized by the camp committee.

We recommend that the budget consist of 10 per cent of all money raised by the church and Sunday school except that raised for building purposes.

We recommend that our Burial Association General Secretary be paid \$30.00 for each single death and \$50.00 for each double death.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR GENERAL ASSEMBLY

We recommend that each local church hold their annual business meeting sixty days before their district annual meeting at which time all church officers for the ensuing year shall be elected; also the changing of pastors if there be any shall be considered at this meeting and acted upon but officers elected shall not take office until the end of the year.

We recommend that the church advisory board meet the week previous to the annual assembly for a business meeting and furnish the pastor a complete financial and numerical report of the church for the past year to submit to the annual assembly.

We recommend that each pastor be required to furnish the district assembly with a complete report from his church or churches covering his work of the church. A failure to do so on his part will be considered by the assembly a part of discredit. He will also be required to submit a quarterly report to his District Superintendent, covering the work of the church he pastors.

A majority vote of the church will be sufficient to dismiss or call a pastor, providing seventy-five per cent of the resident members are present and voting.

We recommend that each ordained and licensed minister come to his assembly recommended by his local advisory board.

We recommend the right of suffrage to an absent member of the church who is kept away on account of sickness or some unavoidable circumstance.

We recommend we elect one General Superintendent and one General Secretary of Foreign Missions, and that our missionary interest be managed by our General Secretary as directed by the General Superintendent.

We recommend that this assembly launch a Ministerial Benefit Association composed of all conference preachers who desire to affiliate and are members of the Pilgrim Holiness church, the officers of which shall be elected at the assembly to serve one year without pay. This association is in no way connected with our present burial association.

We, the Indiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, relative to the consideration of moving the general church headquarters and the general publication headquarters, also the general church college, to Frankfort Ind., offer to transfer the camp grounds, including the publishing building valued at about \$40,000.00, also the Old Peoples Home, valued at about \$6,500.00, making a total of \$46,500.00 and comprising fourteen acres of ground with buildings and equipment, to the General Church for general church headquarters with the reservation of the grounds and buildings for district annual camp and assembly meetings and that the Indiana committee be retained.

We recommend that Chapter 5, Paragraph 33, be changed to read as follows: Also a lay delegate selected from the local churches of each district at the ratio of one to every two ministerial delegates, no district to have less than two delegates.

Recommend that the last clause of Paragraph 166 to read: any change of books in the course of study to be made by the General Superintendent.

Recommend we add to Paragraph 169, Article 2, to read as follows: Examination questions on educational work be furnished each district board of education, same to be forwarded to each District Superintendent preceding the annual assembly.

We recommend that Paragraph 176, covered by the study, be changed, the matter of changing books be left to the choice of the General Board of Education.
