# JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

## FIRST SITTING

The Forty-third Annual Session of the Indiana Conference Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Frankfort, Indiana, August 19, 1946 at eight-thirty a. m.

The Conference was opened with devotions in charge of Rev. Harold Mason. Rev. Moreland Yundt led the congregation in singing, "Rock of Ages" after which Rev. Edward Schoeff led in prayer. After prayer, the Conference joined in singing "The Doxology" in thanksgiving to God for the gracious and glorious Camp Meeting just closed.

Rev. Melvin Snyder introduced Rev. L. W. Sturk, General Superintendent, to the Conference and he took the chair.

Rev. L. W. Sturk delivered a splendid message based on the first portion of the second chapter of Acts. His subject was, "What Kind of a Church Should Our Church Be?"

The Conference joined in singing, "Amazing Grace" and "Blessed Be His Name."

The Secretary, Rev. Carl Reed, called the roll.

A motion prevailed that Sister Malone be appointed delegate for Burns City inasmuch as there was no other delegate present.

A motion prevailed that the hours of session be from 8:30 a. m. to 11:30 a. m.; from 1:30 p. m. to 4:30 p. m. and from 7:00 p. m. to 9:00 p. m.

Revs. W. P. Voshell, Eddie Moran, E. Hanna, L. S. Lancaster, D. W. Montgomery, Ben Colen, Lucian Mahoney, Vaughn Whited, Ray Williams, and I. J. Snyder were introduced to the Conference. Each gave his testimony.

A motion prevailed to grant these brethren honorary seats within the Conference bar.

The report of Rev. Floyd Goins, District Superintendent of the Southern District, was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

By common consent, Rev. Mark Storey and Rev. Ralph Nibarger, Assistant Superintendents, were requested to sit on the platform.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

The report of the District Treasurer was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

The Camp Meeting Treasurer's report was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

The report of the Young People's Treasurer was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

A motion prevailed to recess until the 1:30 session.

The Conference joined in singing, "Oh How I Love Jesus" after which Rev. O. G. Hahn dismissed with prayer.

Conference re-convened with Rev. Emery Wood leading in singing, "The Solid Rock." Rev. Ralph Nibarger led in prayer. Rev. Armour Peisker read the sixth chapter of Matthew verses one through thirteen. He gave a very splendid exposition on the Lord's prayer.

A motion prevailed that Rev. Earl Brunton be granted a seat within the Conference bar.

The report of Rev. Ralph Nibarger, Assistant District Superintendent of the Northern District was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).



The report of Rev. Mark Storey, Assistant District Superintendent of the Southern District was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

The District Statisticians' reports were called for.

A motion prevailed that the Statisticians report first for their respective districts and then give a combined report for the whole Conference.

Rev. Lindley Arnett gave the report for the Northern District.

Rev. Ernest Carroll gave the report for the Southern District.

A motion prevailed to rescind the previous action and omit the hearing of the combined report.

The splendid reports of the two District Statisticians were accepted.

The report of the Frankfort Pilgrim Bible School was read by Rev. Herschel Hughes in the absence of Rev. O. G. Hahn. It was accepted. (Printed in Reports).

The report of the Resolutions Committee was called for.

A motion prevailed that the new churches be introduced to the Conference and that the delegates be seated before any action be taken on the resolutions.

Rev. R. G. Flexon was introduced to the Conference and invited to sit on the platform.

Rev. Melvin Snyder introduced the pastor and delegate from the Richmond Second Church. The pastor from Lagrange was not present.

Rev. Floyd Goins introduced the pastors and delegates from the Greenfield, Deputy, Seymour, and Petersburg churches.

A motion prevailed to receive these churches and their delegates into the Conference bar.

The Resolutions Committee gave a partial report. (Printed in Reports).

A motion prevailed to extend the time until 5:00 o'clock.

After more discussion on the report of the Resolutions Committee, Conference recessed by the expiration of time.

Rev. R. G. Flexon dismissed with prayer.

Conference re-convened with Rev. Clarence Hamilton leading in singing, "Love Lifted Me." Rev. Clyde Moreillon led in prayer. Rev. L. W. Sturk read a portion of Scripture found in John 17:14-21. He very briefly pointed out the importance of Spiritual Unity using the following points: Unity of Marriage, Unity of Opposition and Sinfulness, Unity of Purpose, and Unity of Perfection.

Rev. and Mrs. E. O. Howell and Mrs. L. W. Sturk were introduced to the Conference. They each gave splendid testimonies.

A motion prevailed to grant them honorary seats within the Conference bar and they were invited to be seated on the platform.

The Conference joined in singing, "Jesus Keep Me Near the Cross." Rev. Sturk called for a few testimonies and the Lord came upon the scene and there was a glorious testimony service after which the Conference sang, "When the Saints Go Marching In."

The Resolutions Committee gave a further report.

The report of the Memorial Committee was read.

A motion prevailed to extend the time thirty minutes.

After further discussion, the report of the Memorial Committee was accepted. (Printed in Reports).

A motion prevailed that the order of the day be the election of officers at 2:00 o'clock Tuesday.

Conference adjourned by the expiration of time.

Rev. Mark Storey dismissed with prayer.

## SECOND SITTING

The second sitting opened with Rev. E. J. Clem leading in singing, "I am Thine, Oh Lord". Rev. Lee Goins led in prayer after which the Conference joined in singing "Unsearchable Riches."

Rev. E. J. Clem read the Scripture after which Rev. L. W. Sturk gave a short and inspiring message on the Church motto. The Conference joined in singing, "There is a Fountain Filled with Blood". Rev. Area Montgomery led in prayer.

The minutes of the first sitting were read and approved.

A motion prevailed asking Rev. L. W. Sturk to sing. He sang the beautiful number, "The Lost Sheep".

The Resolutions Committee gave a partial report.

A motion prevailed to reserve the two front seats for the use of the committee.

A motion prevailed to recess until 1:30. Rev. L. W. Sturk dismissed with prayer.

Conference re-convened with a Memorial Service in honor of Rev. Frank Hotle, Rev. Joseph Posey, Mrs. Harry Hayes, and Sis. Lillian Dressler, deaconess.

Rev. C. D. Jester led in singing, "The Solid Rock". The School Quartette sang, "Heartaches". Rev. George Huff led in prayer.

Rev. C. D. Jester spoke briefly on the life of Mrs. Harry Hayes.

The Conference was then favored with another song, "Jesus is Always There" by Mary Kirk.

Rev. Area Montgomery read the obituary of Rev. Frank Hotle, and spoke briefly about Rev. Joseph Posey and Sis. Lillian Dressler. He then delivered a brief but inspiring message using as a text, "Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ." II Tim. 2:3.

The Conference joined in singing, "When the Saints Go Marching In."

A motion prevailed to postpone the order of the day until the reports of the Examining Board, the Ways and Means Committee, and any further report by the Resolutions Committee were heard.

Rev. and Mrs. Wm. Pratt, Rev. and Mrs. Marvin Baker, and Rev. and Mrs. A. M. Jackson were introduced to the Conference and each gave a word of testimony.

A motion prevailed to grant them honorary seats within the Conference bar.

Rev. A. M. Jackson, fraternal delegate from the Wesleyan Methodist Church, was presented to the Conference by Rev. Melvin Snyder and gave a brief word of greeting.

Bro. Jackson and his wife were invited to sit on the platform.

A motion prevailed that the report of the Examining Board be heard so the Secretary could proceed with his work.

The report of the Examining Board was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

The Resolutions Committee gave a further report.

The Ways and Means Committee gave a partial report.

A motion prevailed that no person be allowed to hold more than two major offices unless he held them by virtue of his official position.

A motion prevailed to extend the time until five o'clock.

A motion prevailed that the Ordination Service begin at 6:30.

A motion prevailed to adjourn.

The Conference joined in singing, "The Doxology" after which Rev. Jack Donovan dismissed with prayer.

The Conference re-convened with the Ordination Service. Rev. Goins led in singing, "A Charge to Keep I Have."

Rev. W. J. Crider and Rev. George Huff read verses of Scripture after which Rev. Area Montgomery led in prayer.

Rev. L. W. Sturk read a portion of Scripture from the Third Chapter of Second Timothy after which he gave a wonderful message of instruction to the candidates for ordination. His subject was, "The Minister." The three major points were: The Minister's Responsibilities, Requirements, and Rewards.

The following were ordained to preach the gospel: Revs. Emery Wood, Lee Kearby, Dorsey Schenck, Mabel Jeffries, Marvin J. Young, Stella Critchfield, Delmont Bowden, Broadus H. Deal, Elton V. Call, R. W. Brown, G. R. Bateman, Vernon R. Webb, Wilbur Moore, and Everett Shelhamer.

The order of the day was the election of Officers.

The two District Superintendents appointed 8 tellers. Rev. F. J. Goins appointed, Revs. Moreland Yundt, J. M. Burcham, Murray Boothe, and Walter Daugherty. Rev. Melvin Snyder appointed Revs. Thurman Pruesz, Leonard Fletcher, G. R. Bateman, and Walter Keeney.

The Conference bar was cleared.

The Conference joined in a few moments of silent prayer after which Rev. L. W. Sturk led in prayer for Divine guidance in the election.

By common consent it was decided to place three names on the ballot in electing the three Superintendents.

Ballots were cast.

A motion prevailed to extend the time until ten o'clock.

The report of the tellers showed Rev. Melvin Snyder and Rev. Floyd Goins re-elected by an over-whelming majority as two of the Superintendents.

Rev. R. K. Storey withdrew his name.

Rev. Ralph Nibarger was elected as the third Superintendent on the fourth ballot.

Each of the three men gave brief speeches of gratitude for the expression of confidence shown them.

Conference adjourned by the expiration of time.

A motion prevailed to meet at 8:00 Wednesday morning.

Rev. F. J. Goins dismissed with prayer.

---

### THIRD SITTING

The third sitting opened with the Conference singing, "Let the Lower Lights be Burning" after which Rev. Walter Daugherty led in prayer.

A motion prevailed that the District Council act as a nominating committee to bring in names for members to serve on committees and boards.

Rev. Nibarger spoke briefly in regard to serving as the third Superintendent.

A motion prevailed that the Conference Council bring in nominations for the three Assistant Superintendents.

The Secretary read the nominations. Revs. Clarence Hamilton, W. J. Crider, and Area Montgomery were nominated from the northern district; Revs. George Huff, Clarence Morrison, and Thurman Pruesz from the central district; and Revs. Gilbert Noel, James Hertel, and Mark Storey from the southern district.

Ballots were cast for the three Assistant District Superintendents.

Rev. Mark Storey was elected for the Assistant Superintendent of the southern district.

Rev. George Huff was elected on the second ballot for the Assistant Superintendent of the central district.

Rev. W. J. Crider was elected on the fourth ballot for the Assistant Superintendent of the northern district.

Ballots were cast for the Conference Secretary and Rev. Carl Reed was re-elected.

Rev. L. W. Sturk favored the Conference with the song, "I Won't Have to Cross Jordan Alone".

The Evangelists and Evangelistic singers were introduced to the Conference.

The nominations for the office of Conference Treasurer were submitted. They were: Revs. E. V. Halt, Angus Jeffers, and Lester Henry. Rev. E. V. Halt was re-elected on the first ballot.

A motion prevailed that the Council nominate the men to be voted on as members of the Council from the three districts.

A motion prevailed that the District Superintendents be members of the School Board.

A motion prevailed that the Council bring in two names from each district and that one man be elected from each district to serve on the School Board.

Ballots were cast for the two members at large to serve on the Council.

The report of the Young People's Committee was read and received. (Printed in Reports).

The Resolutions Committee gave a report.

A report of the tellers on the vote for the two members at large was given, and a motion prevailed to vote on the six receiving the highest vote.

Ballots were cast.

Rev. L. W. Sturk appointed three more men to act as tellers.

Rev. Area Montgomery and Rev. F. B. Dunn were elected as members of the Council on the second ballot.

The nominations for the remaining members of the Council were read. They were: Revs. Ernest Carroll and Leonard Fletcher from the north, Revs. Ralph McCrory and C. D. Jester from the central, and Revs. James Hertel and Ray Smith from the southern district.

Ballots were cast. Rev. Ernest Carroll was elected from the northern district, Rev. C. D. Jester from the central district, and Rev. James Hertel from the southern district.

A motion prevailed to extend the time until 12:00 o'clock.

The Council presented the nominations for members to serve on the School Board. They were: Revs. Lester Henry and Area Montgomery from the northern district, Revs. George Huff and Clarence Morrison in the central district, and Revs. Mark Storey and E. W. Wright in the southern district.

The Conference ratified the nominations of the Council for members to serve on the remaining Boards and Committee. (See the Official Directory).

A motion prevailed that the Council appoint the Conference Statistician.

The Resolutions Committee gave a further report.

Invitations for the Ministerial convention were received from Evansville Forest Hill, Terre Haute Hulman Street, English and East Columbus.

The members elected to the School Board were Revs. Lester Henry from the northern district, George Huff from the central district, and Mark Storey from the southern district.

Conference adjourned by the expiration of time. Rev. Melvin Snyder dismissed with prayer.

Conference re-convened with Rev. Gilbert Noel leading in singing, "Unsearchable Riches". Bro. Clarence Hamilton led in prayer.

Ballots were cast for the members at large of the School Board.

After some discussion, the Conference voted to accept the invitation for the Ministerial Convention to East Columbus.

The Council designated that Rev. Melvin Snyder serve in the southern district, Rev. Ralph Nibarger in the central district, and Rev. Floyd Goins in the northern district.

The Conference is to be divided as follows: Zones 1, 2, and 3 with Lebanon, Muncie, and Winchester are to make up the northern district; Zone 4, except Lebanon, and Zones 6 and 7 are to make up the central district; and Zones 8, 9, and 10 are to make up the southern district.

The final report of the Resolutions Committee was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

There was no election on the first ballot for the members at large of the School Board, so a motion prevailed to vote on the four highest.

The four highest were: Revs. Area Montgomery, E. W. Wright, Clarence Morrison, and R. K. Storey. Ballots were cast.

Revs. Area Montgomery and E. W. Wright were elected.

A motion prevailed that the Council be authorized to ratify the Minutes of the last sitting and take care of any unfinished business.

A motion prevailed that the Council and the School Board make necessary adjustments to take care of the matter regarding the property holdings of the Conference and School.

Rev. Ralph Nibarger gave a few words of acceptance of the position of District Superintendent.

The Report of the Stationing Committee was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

A motion prevailed to adjourn.

The Conference joined in singing, "We'll Work 'Til Jesus Comes".

Rev. R. K. Storey dismissed the Forty-third Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church with prayer.

Note: The following matters were taken care of by the Council:

1. The minutes of the third sitting were read and approved.

2. Rev. George Huff resigned from the School Board and Rev. Clarence Morrison was appointed to fill the vacancy.
3. Rev. Leonard Fletcher was appointed Conference Statistician.
4. Rev. Clarence Klopfenstein was appointed to serve as one of the Conference Young People's Officers to replace Rev. James Hertel.
5. Rev. Dale Williams was appointed to the Committee on Ministerial Convention to replace Rev. Area Montgomery.
6. Rev. Walter Daugherty was appointed to the Conference Sunday School Committee to replace Rev. James Hertel.

## REPORTS OF OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT (Southern District)

To the Forty-third Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Indiana District: Grace unto you and peace, from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ. We are bound to thank God always for you brethren, as it is meet, because that faith groweth exceedingly.

Through the kind and merciful providence of God we are assembled in another Conference. We do thank God and praise the Name of Jesus for the faithful ministry of the Holy Spirit which has been manifest in our churches and in the 1946 Camp Meeting. The Lord has been precious to my soul and I greatly appreciate the fellowship of the Ministers and laity. I herewith submit a concise report of my activities:

With the action of last Conference, my duties were multiplied and responsibilities increased. Being elected to the Superintendency of the Southern District in which were 79 churches, I went forth keenly conscious of my inability and dependency upon God.

It has been a pleasure to work with my co-Superintendent, Bro. Snyder. Our fellowship has been sweet. We have endeavored to keep a vision and burden for the entire Conference and have shared each other's burdens and victories, while confining our supervision to our respective Districts.

**CO-OPERATION AMONG THE MINISTERS AND LAITY.** As I have traveled from church to church, meeting the brethren in churches, Zone Meetings and Revivals, I have sensed a beautiful spirit of Christian fellowship among our Pastors and Evangelists. To be sure, "where there is unity there is strength." Our ministers have proven they are not out for selfish gain but to advance the Kingdom of God and build up the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Our laymen are not a whit behind. The General Church with all of its interests has had the backing of our laymen. The District interests and local responsibilities have not been neglected. For this co-operation we Praise God and thank you and say with the poet "With Jesus we shall win."

**ZONE MEETINGS.** I feel it would be impossible to actually tell all that these zone meetings have meant to both ministers and people. In these meetings problems are discussed, methods and means of promoting the cause of Christ are considered, forces are united, plans made and money raised for opening new churches. May every pastor feel the responsibility of attending the monthly gatherings.

**NEW CHURCHES.** God in His providence has enabled us to organize four new churches, which churches will be submitted to this Conference for acceptance.

**Greenfield:** We organized the group here with 16 charter members. Bro. Caudell has been faithful and successful in this work.

**Seymour and Deputy:** For the churches organized at these two places, we are indebted to Rev. Ben Colen. They are both small but have some very splendid people who will make good Pilgrims. At Seymour they were known as the Trinity Gospel Tabernacle and have voted unanimously to bring both church and parsonage to the Pilgrim work.

**Petersburg:** At Petersburg where we organized with 21 members, we have a monument to the faith, prayer and sacrifice of the ministers and churches of Zone 10. In September of 1945 we opened in a building purchased by this Zone. Bro. Raymond Street gave up a good church to pastor this new work. I held the opening two weeks' meeting. Then Bro. Jackson, Ragsdale, and Bro. McQueen each conducted a revival. Bro. Dennis Barber held the last meeting and following this meeting we organized the church. I am persuaded it pays where possible to buy our property and then start as it suggests the thought of permanency.

**New Goshen:** This church was organized last year and will soon be housed in its new church building which is nearing completion under the leadership of Sis. Edith Trotske.

**HOME MISSIONARY WORK.** In addition to the churches organized we have a new work started in Brizal. Having purchased the United Brethren in Union Church, we called on Bro. Dunn, our High School Principal, to conduct a revival. The attendance was good and a number found God. It looks as though we will soon have a good organized church in Brazil. We are looking for a good man who can take over and help these dear people to establish a spiritual church.

**Spurgeon and Ayshire:** We have paid the Trinity Tabernacle Assn. \$250.00 down payment on two tabernacles in these places. They were closed up and it remains to be seen what we can do but we want to step in every open door God gives us.

**Sycamore.** For some years this has been a Holiness group and now they are asking that we organize a Pilgrim Holiness Church.

**OUR YOUNG PEOPLE.** God has given us a good clean spiritual group of young people, many of whom are attending Frankfort Pilgrim College. To these we look for leadership in the years to come. Even now do they give evidence of ability. I feel we should encourage their hearts, hold them up in prayer and help them to develop their talents and abilities by giving them an active place in our churches. Often a young man is called to preach and given a pastorate without ever having been on a local Church Board. To be sure, discretion must be used. Yet, our young people need to develop.

**A BUSY YEAR.** This has been one of the most busy years of my ministry. In addition to the responsibilities of my work, I was providentially privileged with Bro. R. K. Storey to visit the Conference and some of our churches in Mexico. This was indeed refreshing. You may rest assured the money the Indiana Conference has spent in Mexico has been well spent.

The General Conference which was held in the Camp Meeting Tabernacle required much time and hard work—the attendance being a record one. Through the co-operation of all I feel we did our best with our limited accommodations to care for all.

**THE FUTURE.** There is a great future for the Pilgrim Holiness Church in Indiana so long as we keep spiritual, aggressive and on fire for God. In this light, loose and trifling age, let us fight the good fight of faith and lay hold on Eternal Life. It seems we are definitely in the grip of inflation. This means as others receive increases in salaries, the pastors and evangelists also must be remembered. It is true our men are not out for dollars, but to keep in the work they must have adequate support.

In my activities I have visited each church two times and many three times. I have dedicated the new churches at Wheatland, Greenfield and English. I believe I can truly say the church at English is one of the most beautiful churches in the State. It is well built, spacious and a tribute to the sacrifice and liberality of the good people at English.

I have dedicated one parsonage and had the mortgage burning service at Ft. Branch. I have attended all of the Camp Board, School Board and Council Meetings as well as a number of committee meetings. It has been my privilege to counsel with most of the Advisory Boards and conduct several Annual Meetings as well as to attend 21 Zone Meetings.

I have made 235 visits to churches and missions and preached 237 times, during which time I have traveled approximately 30,000 miles.

## DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

### (Northern District)

To the Forty-third Annual Indiana District Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, greetings.

Another busy year of trials, tears, joys, and triumphs has passed into eternity and through the infinite mercy of God we are again privileged to gather for this Annual Conference of 1946.

When we consider the terrible days we are passing through, it is no wonder we are constrained to shout the loud praises of God for His marvelous grace. The words of the songster seem to have a deeper meaning to my soul than ever before when he said,

"Through many dangers, toils, and snares,  
I have already come.

'Tis Grace hath led me safe thus far,  
And Grace will lead me home."

"Hallelujah," saith my soul!

**OUR CHURCHES**—In spite of the fact that sin is rampant all about us and our nation is in the throes of an adjustment period, our churches, by the grace of God, have been able to move forward along many lines. A number report very encouraging revivals. Marion First and Forest have rather extensively remodeled their churches, Kokomo North Side has put in a modern heating plant and a number of new Sunday School rooms. Walkerton purchased a new parsonage and Nappanee remodeled their parsonage.

**HOME MISSIONS**—Two new churches will be presented to the Conference from the Northern District; Lagrange, with 24 charter members, and Richmond, Second, with 11 charter members. Rev. and Mrs. Ray Martin labored tirelessly in order to establish the church at Lagrange and God has rewarded their efforts with wonderful success. God give us many like them. Rev. Emery Wood was appointed to the Tabernacle work turned over to us by Brother Worly of Richmond and God has blessed his labors in a very gratifying way. Already their Sunday School has grown to such an extent that they have found it necessary to enlarge their building to twice its original size. We also have Home Missionary preaching points at Yeddo, Churubusco, Pendleton, and Lawrence. In this field we have also reopened the works at Darlington and Clarks Hill. Many openings are presenting themselves to us in the field of Home Missions and our greatest need is for men of God called to this work—men with vision and faith who will do and dare for God.

**OLD PEOPLE'S HOME**—This year we have taken two new members into the Old People's Home Family, Mrs. Anna Webb of Elwood and Mr. L. G.

Richards of Fairmount. Sister Webb was received on assignment and Brother Richards as a boarder. This brings the total membership to 13. All of which, with the exception of two, are 80 years of age or older. We appreciate the way our workers have stood by us this year.

**FRANKFORT PILGRIM BIBLE SCHOOL**—It has been my privilege and responsibility as chairman of the School Board to labor in the interest of the Bible School throughout the year. Much time and effort has been devoted in co-operation with Brother Hahn and the Board in the matter of incorporating the School under the laws of the State of Indiana, in obtaining recognition of the Veterans' Administration for G. I. assistance, and in negotiating with the government through what seemed endless red tape for the obtainment of additional housing for our married veterans. At last we have the word that ten expandable trailers and a modern laundry and toilet facility will be moved in by September 18th.

**NEW CHURCHES**—Five new churches are under construction in the Northern District at the present time. They are Lagrange, Marion, Grant Street, Swayzee, Monon, and Churubusco.

**NEW PARSONAGES**—A splendid new 8 room parsonage is nearing completion at Indianapolis, North Side. Though they had a small summer cottage to start with, the parsonage at Norway can be called a new parsonage as it is so completely rebuilt and added to making a nice six room house with a full basement. Both of these pastors have labored untiringly and against great odds in constructing these buildings during times like these.

**OUR SUNDAY SCHOOLS**—The Sunday Schools in the Northern District have enjoyed a splendid over-all increase in attendance due to the efficient work of our Sunday School Committee and a fine spirit of co-operation on the part of Pastors, Sunday School Superintendents and Teachers. Let us keep the good work up.

**A PERSONAL WORD**—It has been indeed a great privilege and honor to labor with you during the past year. Both pastors and people have been so congenial and co-operative that I have been able to carry on my work with pleasure. Your prayers and support have been a great encouragement in every hour of trial. May God bless you richly.

I have made 146 visits to the churches, preached 186 times, made 51 business trips, attended 10 Zone Meetings, 3 Sunday School Conventions, held 4 week-end meetings, one camp meeting, 2 Youth for Christ Rallies, one Home Missionary Revival, had two funerals, attended all Council and School Board Meetings, and the Prayer Convention held at Marion.

I have traveled 26,996 miles and have received my traveling expenses in full.

### Special Sections From the Manual

Section 198, paragraph 1, 2 and 3:

Those entering a ministerial office shall immediately enter upon the prescribed course of study and pursue same until completed. To this end they shall place themselves under the direction of the District Educational Board which has charge of this work unless the same course or its equivalent is taken in school.

Examinations required by the Educational Board shall be submitted in writing and shall be conducted at the time and place of the Conference or during the year upon completion of a book or subject, either personally or through the mails.

The passing grade of any subject or study shall not be less than an average of 70 per cent.

Section 154:

No person shall be eligible for ordination until first having served at least two years in active ministry.

Section 155:

The licentiate who has held his license at least three years and has successfully completed the required course of study shall be eligible for ordina-

tion as a minister of the Gospel, unless the District Council will have deemed it wise to have ordained before the expiration of the three-year period.

Section 149, paragraph 1:

All licensed ministers failing to complete and report on at least two subjects a year in their required Course of Study, for two consecutive years, will automatically forfeit their license, unless in the judgment of the Educational Board an exception shall be made.

(The following recommendations were brought in by the Resolutions Committee and are printed in this section of the Minutes at the request of the Educational Board.)

#### 1.

We recommend that all persons taking the preachers' study course shall have their examinations in the hands of their instructors by July 16th of each Conference Year. No teacher will be expected to grade examinations after this time.

#### 2.

We recommend that at each annual Camp Meeting on the last Thursday, Friday and Saturday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examination of ministers. All ministers knowing themselves due to appear before these boards are urged to be present.

We further recommend that the time of such session shall be announced from the platform.

#### 3.

We recommend that the Conference Secretary furnish the Educational Board such copies of questions as may be needed.

#### 4.

Each minister pursuing our course of study shall mail 25 cents with each request for questions on each subject. Those failing to comply with this recommendation will not receive their questions.

#### 5.

We recommend that all material pertaining to the work of the Educational Board contained in the Minutes be mimeographed or printed and a copy of

the same be sent to each pastor and each one pursuing the course of study. The printing and mailing to be taken care of by the Educational Board, the expense to be paid by the Conference Treasurer.

6.

We recommend that the following paragraph be inserted in the Minutes at the end of the Educational Committees report:

Inasmuch as the teachers of the Ministerial Study Course are doing their work gratis and in the midst of pressing duties, it is requested that each applicant apply for questions as early in the year as possible and that a reasonable length of time be allowed for the questions to be returned to the applicant.

---

## REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

### Church Government

1.

We recommend that the annual business of the church be closed on June 30 of each year.

2.

Inasmuch as it is impossible for the local church to send Conference funds to the Conference Treasurer by June 30, we recommend that the Treasurer hold his books open until July 15.

3.

We recommend that each church provide a parsonage with telephone, and if possible, other utilities also be furnished as recommended by the Local Church Board.

4.

We recommend that where parsonages are not equipped with heating device that provision be made for same by local church.

5.

We recommend that where churches and parsonages are located in cities that the location of the church and parsonage appear in our Minutes. We further recommend if possible, that where parsonages are equipped with phones, that the name of the pastor and Pilgrim Holiness Church be listed in the phone book.

6.

We recommend that no Local Church Board endorse for Conference license anyone who is not willing to give full time to the ministry of God's Word. We further recommend that the Examining Board pass no candidates for Conference license who fails to give evidence of a Divine Call to the ministry or a willingness to give full time to the same.

7.

Whereas, we have many able-bodied licensed and ordained ministers who are employed in other than ministerial work, and seldom if every preach, we recommend that the Examining Board be instructed to draw the lines closer on such individuals and that no one who is not active in the ministry be recommended for ordination.

8.

We recommend that the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper be observed at least once each quarter by our local churches.

9.

Whereas our present Conference comprises approximately 140 churches and our present District Boundries are not equally proportioned, therefore, we recommend that there should be one Conference and Council with three Districts. Each District shall have a full time Superintendent with full authority in his respective District. Each Superintendent shall have one Assistant.

Said Superintendent shall be elected by the Conference. The boundaries are to be set by the District Council.

10.

We recommend that the District Council assign the District Superintendents to their respective Districts.

11.

We recommend that the Assistant Superintendents be selected from the pastors of their respective Districts. We further recommend that the District Council nominate three men from each District from which the Assistant Superintendents shall be elected.

12.

We recommend that the District Superintendents with their Assistants together with the Zone Chairmen in their respective Districts shall be responsible for the promotion of Home Missionary Work.

13.

We recommend that each District Superintendent with his Zone Chairmen and Pastors meet in his respective District to determine the location and provide a suitable parsonage for the District Superintendent.

14.

We recommend that the Conference Council consist of 13 members comprised of the three District Superintendents, their Assistants, the Conference Secretary, the Conference Treasurer, one Advisory member from each District, and two members at large.

15.

We recommend that the District Superintendents alternate in presiding at Council Meetings unless otherwise required by emergency.

16.

We recommend that the District Superintendents be members of the Camp Meeting Board by virtue of their office.

17.

We recommend that where there are vacancies in our Conference that members of our Conference with three or more years standing be given first consideration.

18.

We recommend that the following recommendations in our 1945 Minutes under the various heads be deleted.

Church Government. Number 9 and 13.

Camp Meeting and Conference. Number 16 and 17.

Miscellaneous. Number 5 and 6.

---

### Sunday School

1.

The duties of the Conference Sunday School Board in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

1. The Conference Sunday School Board, together with Zone Presidents, shall arrange for Sunday School Conventions to be held in the respective Zones during the year.
2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the Conference.
3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:
  - a. A statement of the work accomplished during the year.
  - b. A statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work in the Conference.
  - c. The Council shall direct the Conference Treasurer to take care of all finance incurred by the Conference Sunday School Board.

4. The Conference Sunday School Board shall be amenable to the Council.
5. The Council shall have the right to remove, or cause to be removed, any member of the Conference Sunday School Board who, in the judgment of such Council, is not in harmony with the teaching of the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.
6. If for any reason there is a vacancy on the Conference Sunday School Board, the Council, by a majority vote, may fill the vacancy.
7. The Conference Sunday School Board shall work in conjunction with the General Sunday School Committee in promoting the annual Rally Day, etc.
8. To have published each quarter a Conference Sunday School sheet showing the attendance of each Sunday School in the Conference for the quarter, this sheet to be sent to each pastor and Sunday School Superintendent in the Conference.
9. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a summer vacation Bible School.

### Camp Meeting and Conference

1.

We recommend that all those desiring to pay for their board by serving as a worker during the Camp Meeting be required to pay a registration fee of \$1.00 when accepted as a worker by the Camp Meeting Committee.

2.

We recommend that no pastor or minister promise workers tickets for Camp Meeting to anyone other than the Church delegate.

3.

We recommend that the Conference Ministers and their wives and dependent children be given worker tickets for their meals during Camp Meeting.

4.

We recommend that all proposed building programs or all major changes on the State Camp Ground be endorsed by a two-thirds vote of the Council, Camp Meeting Board, and the School Board.

We further recommend that all future constructions be made to conform to State and Local codes.

5.

Be it resolved that there be a Correlated Board representing the Camp Board, Conference Council, School Board, consisting of two members of each board. It shall be the duty of the Board to pass upon improvements or construction not entailing an expense of more \$1,000.00. We further recommend that the chairman be elected from this board.

6.

We recommend that no delegate to the Conference be given free entertainment during Camp Meeting.

7.

We recommend that our Camp Meeting begin on the second Friday of August each year.

8.

We recommend that the heads of departments of the Camp Meeting Board and Stand Manager be authorized to make purchases for their respective departments. We further recommend that all bills for said purchases be placed in the Camp Meeting Treasurer's hands before the close of the Camp Meeting.

9.

We recommend that all who rent rooms during Camp be advised to bring their own bedding.

10.

We recommend that in case the Conference considers changing or increasing the amounts in financial recommendations by the Ways and Means

Committee that Ways and Means Committee may appeal to the Conference for a Committee to investigate the financial balance of the treasury before voting on the change, this investigation committee to consist of one member from the Conference Council, one member from the Ways and Means Committee, and one member chosen from the Conference.

11.

We recommend that only ministers, their wives and unmarried dependent children and lay delegates be given entertainment during Conference. All entitled to this entertainment shall be duly registered and given cards of recognition. For all other entertainment the same rate shall prevail as during Camp Meeting.

12.

We recommend that there be a Publishing Committee composed of the Conference Secretary and two appointee members. It shall be the duty of this committee to publish the Conference Minutes.

13.

Whereas, we have had the very efficient service of Miss Clyde Titus, a State registered nurse, and whereas she dispenses gratis a considerable amount of medicine, therefore

We recommend that she be given the status of a Camp Meeting worker and that she be seated at the Camp Meeting Workers Table in the Dining Hall.

14.

We recommend that our Trustees and the new Correlated Board engage competent help before any more buildings are constructed, and that a drawing be made of our whole plot and that a proper lease be given to owners of cottages.

15.

We recommend that each local church furnish the Camp with one sheet and one tick. To provide uniformity of size, it is requested that each sheet be 72x90 inches and single ticks measure 36x90 inches. Where a church is unable to send both, they shall send either a sheet or a tick.

16.

We recommend that the Conference Council be responsible for providing needed help for the kitchen and dining room during Conference.

17.

Whereas some of our pastors and families have found it difficult if not impossible to secure a room on the Camp grounds during Camp, therefore, we recommend that our ministers be given more consideration in the rental of rooms, applying only to the new dormitory.

18.

We recommend that the water and the sewer service be installed under the directions of the Camp Meeting Board.

19.

Whereas the present system of the Conference Statisticians complicates the rendering of a complete Conference report, therefore we recommend that there be one Conference Statistician for all Districts.

20.

We recommend that the Conference Council in conjunction with the School Board formulate a plan for the maintenance of the buildings and equipment, for all Conference property.

21.

We recommend that the Camp Meeting Board provide and post signs on the Camp ground that they deem advisable such as "No Smoking", "No Parking", etc.



22.

Whereas the city sewer is inadequate to take care of our institutions and grounds, therefore, we recommend that the Conference authorize and empower the Camp Meeting Board to act as their agent to petition the city of Frankfort to install adequate sanitary sewerage to our property line.

We further recommend that the Camp Meeting Board provide for adequate electric service.

23.

We recommend that caution be taken to not over-estimate the values of Church property in our Annual Reports.

24.

We recommend that canning equipment be installed if the Conference Council and School Board deem it advisable.

25.

We recommend that the Conference go on record as interpreting I Peter 3:3, where it speaks of the wearing of gold, to mean all rings including wedding and class rings.

26.

We recommend that where a man is inadvertently placed on more Boards or Committees than he can well serve that the Conference Council be authorized to make proper adjustment in such Boards and Committees.

---

### Zone Work

1.

Inasmuch as the Zone Meetings have been beneficial in advancing the spiritual, educational, and doctrinal interests of the Conference, we recommend they be continued.

We further recommend the Zone Chairmen be elected by the preachers and lay delegates.

2.

We recommend that the newly received churches, Seymore and Deputy be placed in Zone 7, Petersburg Zone 10, Lagrange Zone 1, and Greenfield Zone 5, until such a time as re-zoning is completed.

3.

We recommend the following Zone changes be made. Lebanon and Clarks-hill to Zone 2, Muncie and Winchester to Zone 3, Greenfield and Browns Chapel to Zone 4.

---

### Educational and Examining Board

The recommendations brought in regarding this work are printed under the report of the Educational Board at their request.

---

### Pastoral

1.

We recommend that each pastor be granted a two-weeks vacation with pay.

2.

Whereas, each year there is a difficulty in securing the correct ministerial list, we recommend that each pastor bring to conference a list of names of all unstationed ministers that are members of his church, respectively, with correct addresses.

3.

We recommend that no pastor call an evangelist outside of our church without the approval of the District Superintendent.

4.

We recommend that pastors of deceased members of our District Conference bring to the Memorial Committee a copy of the obituary of the deceased and any other information that is available, this information to be used in our Annual Memorial Service.

---

### Young People

We recommend that the Young People's Committee, consisting of the State Y. P. Secretary, Conference Treasurer, and Y. P. Zone Chairmen make plans for a Y. P. Rally.

We further recommend that this Rally be held on a separate date from our Camp Meeting, and that we have it in the form of an Institute. Classes of various subjects will be taught in the morning with the afternoon given to various subjects and discussions, and evangelistic services at night.

Also that there be appointed a Dean of Boys and Girls, with rules governing the behavior of all attending.

We further recommend that all who attend be enrolled in the various classes of the Institute.

---

### Miscellaneous

1.

We recommend that the Office of Superintendent of the Old People's Home and Farms be under the administration of the Conference Council. We further recommend that the Council consider the advisability of appointing a 3-man Farm Board of the Conference Council to supervise the farm administration. Said committee will be amenable to the Council.

2.

We recommend that immediately following the Conference the Secretary mail to each pastor an itemized postal notice of the financial requirements of the church for the year.

3.

We recommend that the Ways and Means Committee and the Resolutions Committee meet at the call of the District Superintendents, who may also meet with the Committee, prior to the next Conference.

4.

We recommend that 1200 copies of the Conference minutes be published within thirty days after the Conference adjourns, and that all orders for same be sent directly to the Conference Secretary.

5.

We recommend that we have a Thanksgiving Harvest Day for the School. Such day shall be set aside for the various zones to bring in their canned goods and produce of all kinds for the School.

---

## REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

### Local Church Financial

1.

We recommend that the Conference Budget consist of 10 per cent of all money raised by the local church, Sunday school and Young People's societies, except that raised for missions, general budget, building funds, and all funds raised for specified Conference interests. Building fund purposes shall be interpreted to include rent on parsonages and churches and money paid on contracts of the same.

2.

We recommend that the Conference Budget be prorated as follows: Conference fund, 65%; Old People's Home, 7%; Frankfort Pilgrim College, 16%; Home Missions, 10%, and General Conference, 2%.

3.

We recommend that each church raise five cents per member per month for Home Missionary Work and Church Extension, money to be paid to the Conference Treasurer.

4.

We recommend that each church help the Frankfort Pilgrim College by sending to the Conference Treasurer each month an amount equal to 1% of the gross receipts of the local church treasury for the current month for each church which has an annual income up to and including \$3,000.00 and 2% for all churches with an annual income over \$3,000.00.

---

### District Financial

1.

We recommend that our regular Conference stenographer be paid \$25.00 and that the Secretary be authorized to secure additional helpers at the rate of \$15.00 per person.

2.

We recommend that our District Superintendents be paid a salary of \$3,000.00 plus mileage, when funds are available.

3.

We recommend that our Assistant District Superintendents be paid at the rate of \$7.50 per day plus mileage for each day's service.

4.

We recommend that Conference Secretary be paid \$125.00 for his service for the year.

5.

We recommend that the Conference Treasurer be paid \$200.00 for his services for the year.

6.

We recommend that the Conference Statistician be paid \$100.00 for his services for the year.

7.

In view of the fact that our school is rapidly growing, and our buildings are inadequate, and inasmuch that there is an influx of money, we recommend that we launch an immediate, intensive financial drive for the purpose of erecting a building adequate for our growing scholastic demands.

8.

We recommend that the standard mileage rate be fixed at four cents per mile.

9.

Whereas, there is a deficit in the operating expenses of the Old People's Home, we recommend that each member of the local church pay 50 cents per year.

---

### Young People's Work

1.

We recommend that each Young People's Society be requested to send an offering for the Young People's Rally to the Conference Young People's Treasurer; also that churches without organized societies be invited to send an offering for the same.

2.

We recommend that in order to finance the work of the Conference Young People's organization during the year each society send in an amount equal to two cents per member each month. This amount to be sent regularly to the Young People's Conference Treasurer.

---

### Educational and Examining Board

1.

Each minister pursuing our course of study shall mail 25 cents with each request for questions on each subject. Those failing to comply with this recommendation will not receive their questions.

---

### Camp Meeting and Conference

1.

We recommend that the District furnish all permanent equipment for our Junior playground.

---

### REPORT OF MEMORIAL COMMITTEE

1.

Praise God from whom all blessings flow for such an unusual Camp Meeting, with such stirring Gospel truths from the ministry of our evangelists, Rev. Warren McIntire and Rev. P. O. Carpenter and the delightful song services under the direction of Rev. C. D. Jester. Many splendid special numbers were rendered by our song evangelists and others. The orchestra was blessed with the return of many of our veterans of the recent war. The music rendered was never better. Since God has been so gracious in giving us such good success in our altar work with so many seekers finding good victory; and thanking God for the faithful efforts of our children's worker, Bro. Don Schooley, let us therefore show our gratitude by standing and shaking hands with our neighbor and saying, "Hallelujah!"

2.

5.

Since Frankfort Pilgrim Bible School has been blessed of God under the earnest endeavors of its president, Rev. O. G. Hahn, and faculty; therefore, let us pray for God's continued blessings and His leadership in our school.

6.

Since the dreadful liquor traffic is growing steadily more menacing to our nation; and since we know we make no progress voting for a dry man on a wet party. As a Conference, let us stand and urge our people where possible to go to the polls and vote a dry ticket.

7.

Feeling that an expression of gratitude should be given to Rev. Dennis Barber and his assistant for providing the splendid address system which has been such a benefit to our Chairman as well as the Conference; therefore, be it resolved that we show our appreciation by a hearty, "Amen!"

8.

Whereas God has honored and prospered our Old People's Home and Farm and made them a blessing and asset to our church; and whereas God has been merciful in protecting the home from the hand of death throughout the year; therefore, be it resolved we show our appreciation to God by saying, "Praise the Lord."

9.

Since God has blessed our District with men so well qualified to serve on the Camp Meeting Board in each of the various departments, who with their willing helpers have made possible this great Camp Meeting; therefore, be it resolved that we show our appreciation by a rising vote of thanks.

10.

## Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements from July 1, 1945 to August 19, 1946
