JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING

The Forty-sixth Annual Session of the Indiana Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Frankfort, Indiana, August 22, 1949, at nine-thirty a.m.

The Conference opened with devotions in charge of Rev. Dale Emery. Rev. Edgar Poe led in singing, "Glory To His Name", after which Rev. Loyd Montgomery led in prayer. Rev. Willis Clock read, as the Scripture lesson, the 24th Psalm. Rev. Floyd Goins led the conference in singing "Blest Be The Tie."

Rev. Floyd Goins introduced Rev. A. H. Wilson, Second Assistant General Superintendent, who took the chair.

The Secretary, Rev. Carl R. Reed, called the roll.

Motion prevailed that the names of lay delegates not called in the first roll call be given to the secretary in writing.

Motion prevailed that the hours of the Conference session be the same as last year: 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.; 1:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. and from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

Rev. John W. Adcock, Rev. Chester Wilkins, and Rev. Roy Grant were introduced to the conference. Each gave a brief testimony.

A motion prevailed that these men be given honorary seats within the Conference Bar.

The report of the Statistician was read and accepted.

A partial report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and accepted.

Motion prevailed that all resolutions in the Resolution Committee's report be re-read to the conference.

Motion prevailed to rescind the former motion of reading all resolutions now a part of the Conference Minutes.

The Resolutions Committee gave a partial report which was accepted.

Motion made and seconded that the Resolution under Church Government be changed to read May 15th to June 1st, instead of May 1st to May 15th.

A motion prevailed to extend the time until the completion of debate on this Resolution.

Motion carried as amended.

The Conference recessed by expiration of time. Dismissed with prayer by Rev. Melvin Snyder.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting opened with Rev. Walter Keeney in charge of devotions. Rev. Jack McCullough led in singing "Deeper, Deeper". Rev. Mrs. Macil Warner read the 33rd Psalm as a Scripture lesson, and led in prayer.

Motion prevailed that the roll call be dispensed with for the remainder of the Conference.

Motion prevailed that Melbourne Kable be seated as the delegate from the Oaktown Church.

The Minutes of the morning sitting were read and approved.

The Revs. Deborah Wharton, Donald Washburn, and H. E. Williams were introduced to the Conference. Each gave a brief testimony.

Motion prevailed that the Conference Secretary give the report of the major actions of the Council during the past year.

This report was given by the Secretary .

The Resolutions Committee continued the partial report.

Motion prevailed that the Resolution under Church Government concerning the questionnaire for Licensed Ministers, be referred to the committee for re-drafting.

Motion prevailed that the Resolution concerning further construction and remodeling of cottages be referred to the Committee for re-drafting.

A substitute motion prevailed to delete the last paragraph of Resolution 6 under "Miscellaneous".

Motion prevailed that Rev. E. V. Halt, General Treasurer, and Rev. R. K. Storey, President of Frankfort Pilgrim College be seated on the platform.

Rev. Melvin Snyder presented six new churches from the Southern District to the Conference: Evansville, East Side; Orrville; Valeene; Birdseye; Centerville, South; and Grandview.

Motion prevailed that Mrs. Ellen Manship be seated as delegate from the Birdseye Church.

Motion prevailed to accept these churches into the Conference.

Rev. Floyd Goins presented Pilgrim Chapel, Frankfort, the new church from the Northern District to the Conference.

Motion carried to receive this church into the Conference.

Motion prevailed to receive Warren Park Church, Indianapolis, the new church from the Central District into the Conference.

Rev. Ralph McCrory read extracts from the Report of the Sunday School Committee as prepared by the Promotional Secretary, Rev. Moreland Yundt.

A motion carried to receive the report as read with the exception of the request made by the Promotional Secretary at the close of the report.

Rev. Floyd Goins, Superintendent of the Northern District, read his report, which was accepted.

Motion prevailed to adjourn until the evening session.

Rev. Clarence Hamilton dismissed with prayer.

THIRD SITTING

The third sitting opened with Rev. William Pratt in charge of devotions. Rev. Edmond Wells led in singing "He Brought Me Out". Rev. Ben Colen read the 12th chapter of First Corinthians as a Scripture lesson, and led in prayer.

The Memorial service was in charge of Rev. Area Montgomery who spoke briefly concerning those who had died during the year; Revs. George C. Barnes, Jack Donovan, G. W. Groshart, Stanley Johnson, John Kennedy, Blanche Vampner, Lee Gardner, and Walter Goins, Evangelistic Singer and Teacher.

Rev. A. H. Wilson took the chair.

The Minutes of the second sitting were read and approved.

Rev. A. M. Ewing and Rev. Area Montgomery were given seats on the platform, honoring their long years of administrative labor in the District.

The Resolutions Committee continued the partial report.

A motion was lost to table the Resolution concerning the ordaining of ministers without two years full time service.

Motion prevailed to extend the time until 10:00 p.m.

The Ways and Means Committee gave a partial report.

The Committee on Memorials to the General Conference reported.

Motion prevailed that the Memorial concerning the election of superintendents for a three-year period be tabled.

Previous question was called for on the Memorial concerning electing three General Superintendents and the motion to adopt memorial lost.

A Motion to refer the Memorial concerning the questionnaire for candidates for Ordination to the committee for re-drafting was lost.

Motion prevailed to extend the time until the matter before the Conference is completed.

Previous question called for on the Memorial concerning the questionnaire for candidates for Ordination and the motion to adopt the Memorial carried.

Dismissed with prayer by Rev. Floyd Goins.

FOURTH SITTING

The fourth sitting opened with Rev. Elton Call leading the conference in singing "Jesus Saves", "Where He Leads I'll Follow", and "We're Marching To Zion", after which Rev. Wilbert McCrory led in prayer.

Rev. Floyd Goins introduced Rev. L. W. Sturk, General Superintendent.

Rev. L. W. Sturk gave a brief report on the work of the General Church, then gave a stirring message on "Prohibitions for Pilgrims", after which the conference joined in singing "Blest Be The Tie".

Rev. John Steele, Methodist Minister, was introduced to the Conference and a motion prevailed to give Rev. Stelle an honorary seat within the Conference Bar.

The Ways and Means Committee gave a partial report.

Motion prevailed to table the resolution concerning pastors salary as an exemption from the District Budget.

The Committee on Memorials to General Conference gave a partial report.

Motion prevailed to reconsider the Memorial concerning the questionnaire for candidates for Ordination and the transferring of ministers.

The Resolution Committee gave a partial report.

Motion prevailed to extend the time until 11:45 a.m.

Motion prevailed to refer the resolution concerning the Ministerial Convention to the committee.

Dismissed in prayer by Rev. E. V. Halt.

FIFTH SITTING

The fifth sitting opened with Rev. Edgar Poe leading the conference in singing "The Solid Rock". Rev. Walter Keeney read the 13th chapter of First Corinthians, as a Scripture lesson. Rev. Charles Thomas, a local minister from the Tipton Church, led in prayer.

Rev. L. W. Sturk took the chair.

The Minutes of the fourth sitting were read and approved.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

The report of the Conference Treasurer was read and accepted.

The report of the Camp Meeting Treasurer was read and accepted.

The report of the Conference Young People's Treasurer was read and accepted.

The report of the Ministerial Convention Treasurer was read and accepted.

Rev. Ralph Nibarger introduced the following evangelists and singers from the Central District: Rex Phares and wife, C. E. Posey, Katie Locke, Esther White, Clarence May, Mamie Yaryan, Viola Borders, Fern McHenry, Misses May and Rush, W. B. Fugett, and William Slater.

Rev. Floyd Goins introduced the following evangelists and singers from the Northern District: Oscar Felsburg, Wilbur McGinnis, Lewis Stroud and wife, Dale Zeits, Howard Goins, Lee Goins, Mark Waddell, Grace McCrory, William McFarlin and wife, Area Montgomery, E. J. Clem, Beulah Day, A. M. Ewing, Marvin Young, and Ellen Webb.

Rev. Mark Storey, Assistant Superintendent, introduced the following evangelists and singers from the Southern District: Lee Kearby, Ray Williams, Wilkes Ragsdale, Pauline Watson, Velma Hertel, B. H. Colen, E. I. Faidley, and Pearl Dean.

Motion prevailed to have Rev. John Steele speak to the Conference for ten minutes.

Rev. Steele spoke, giving information concerning the organization and work of the Lord's Day Alliance.

A motion prevailed to ratify the names of Rev. Melvin Snyder and Rev. Ralph McCrory as members of the Board of Directors of the Lord's Day Alliance of Indiana.

Rev. J. C. Billhart was introduced to the conference, and after giving a brief testimony favored the conference by singing "Amazing Grace".

The report of Rev. Melvin Snyder, Superintendent of the Southern District, was read and accepted.

The report of Rev. Ralph Nibarger, Superintendent of the Central District, was read and accepted.

The Resolutions Committee gave a partial report.

The report of the Frankfort Pilgrim College was read and accepted.

A motion prevailed to proceed with the election of officers immediately after the report of the Examining Board.

At the request of the General Superintendent, the conference recessed for a few minutes.

The conference reconvened at the call of the chair.

Motion prevailed that the Ordination Service be 6:30 p.m. instead of 7:00 p.m.

The conference was adjourned until the evening sitting.

SIXTH SITTING

The sixth sitting opened with Rev. Floyd Gookins leading the conference in singing "He Keeps Me Singing". Rev. Donald Washburn led in prayer.

A partial report of the Examining Board was read and accepted.

The names of the candidates for ordination were read, and the candidates were seated in front of the platform. The candidates were: Wayne Stroud, William Slater, John Stewart, Jr., Paul W. Thomas, for Ordained Ministers, and Jennie M. Kable, for Ordained Deaconess.

The Ordination Service opened with Rev. William Pratt leading the conference in singing "A Charge To Keep I Have". Scripture lessons were read by Rev. Area Montgomery, Second Timothy 4:1-8; and by Rev. George Huff, First Timothy 3:1-7. Rev. Floyd Goins led in prayer.

Rev. L. W. Sturk delivered a challenging ordination message using as a Scripture text, Ruth 2:17, stressing three points: (1) the Parting of the Ways, (2) Gleaning in the Fields of Boaz, and (3) the Rest and Rich Reward at the End of the Day.

After the Ordination Service the conference joined in singing "Blest Be The Tie", and "When We All Get To Heaven".

The following persons were introduced to the conference and gave a brief testimony: Mrs. L. W. Sturk, Rev. Frederick Lyon, Miss Julia Hoover, Miss Bertha Keinbaum, Miss Marcella Dean, and Rev. and Mrs. R. A. Beltz.

The final report of the Examining Board was read and accepted.

The Conference was re-seated according to the respective districts for the purpose of voting for the District Superintendents and Assistants.

The Chairman appointed the following as chairmen of the different sections: Rev. R. A. Beltz, Central District; Rev. E. V. Halt, Southern District; Rev. L. W. Sturk, Northern District.

The ballots were cast.

The report of the chairman showed that for the Northern District, F. J. Goins was elected Superintendent, and Gilbert Noel as Assistant; for the Central District, R. E. Nibarger was elected Superintendent, and T. J. Preusz as Assistant; and in the Southern District, Melvin Snyder was elected Superintendent and Mark Story as Assistant.

Ballots were cast for the Conference Secretary.

Report of the tellers showed that Carl R. Reed was elected Conference Secretary.

Motion prevailed to extend the time until 10:00 p.m.

The following nominations for Conference Treasurer were made by the District Council: E. V. Halt, Angus Jeffers, and E. W. Wright.

Ballots were cast for the Conference Treasurer.

Report of the tellers showed that Rev. E. V. Halt was elected Conference Treasurer.

The Conference was seated according to their Districts, and ballots cast for one council member each from the Northern and Central District, and two from the Southern District.

The report of the tellers showed the following elections: Northern District, Ernest Carroll; Central District, C. D. Jester; Southern District, Virgil Camp and E. W. Wright.

Motion prevailed to adjourn.

Dismissed with prayer by Rev. Carl R. Reed.

SEVENTH SITTING

The seventh sitting opened with Rev. Dale Emery in charge of devotions. Rev. Carl Roark led in singing "In The Sweet Bye and Bye". Rev. Clarence Hamilton read the first chapter of First John as a Scripture lesson, and led in prayer.

Rev. L. W. Sturk took the chair.

The conference joined in singing "A Child Of The King".

The minutes of the fifth and sixth sittings were read and approved.

Rev. Goins appointed three tellers: James Colter, Virgil Halt, and Victor Wade.

Ballots were cast for one District Council member-at-large.

Motion prevailed that the Conference Statistician be re-elected by acclamation. He was elected.

Motion made and seconded that due to the building program the same trustees be re-elected for another year: Rev. Melvin Snyder, Rev. F. J. Goins, Rev. R. E. Nibarger, Rev. E. V. Halt, and Rev. Area Montgomery. Motion carried unanimously and they were elected.

The report of the Memorial Committee was read and accepted.

The report of the tellers showed no election on the first vote for the Council member-at-large.

Motion prevailed to vote on the two highest names, Area Montgomery and James Hertel.

Ballots were cast for Council member-at-large.

The Examining Board gave a partial report, which was accepted.

Nominations for Examining Board as made by the Council were: Aaron Hayhurst, Loyd Montgomery, George Huff, and C. I. Wilson.

Ballots were cast for the election of the Examining Board members.

The tellers report on the vote for District Council member-at-large, showed Rev. Area Montgomery elected.

Nominations for the School Board member from the Northern District as submitted from the Council were: Carl Reed and Area Montgomery.

Ballots were cast for School Board member from the Northern District.

Nominations for the School Board member from the Central District as submitted from the Council were: C. D. Jester, and James Hertel.

Ballots were cast for the Central District School Board member.

Nominations for the School Board member from the Southern District as submitted from the Council were: Mark Storey and E. W. Wright.

The report of the tellers showed Carl R. Reed elected as the School Board member from the Northern District.

The report of the tellers showed the following elections on the Examining Board: Rev. George Huff and Rev. Loyd Montgomery.

Nominations for the Educational Board, as submitted by the Council were: Lester Henry, Mrs. Dale Williams, and Harry Shepherd.

The report of the tellers showed James Hertel elected as the School Board member from the Central District.

The report of the tellers showed E. W. Wright elected as the School Board member from the Southern District.

Ballots were cast for two members-at-large for the School Board.

The report of the tellers showed the following elected to the Educational Board: Rev. Lester Henry and Rev. Harry Shepherd.

The Resolution Committee gave a partial report, which was accepted.

The report of the tellers showed no election on the first vote on the two School Board members-at-large.

Motion prevailed to vote on the four highest names: Area Montgomery, Ralph McCrory, C. D. Jester, and Mark Storey.

Ballots were cast for the two School Board members-at-large.

The following invitations were given for the Ministerial Convention: Forest Hills, Evansville; Anderson, First; and Frankfort, First.

The invitation to Forest Hills, Evansville was accepted.

The report of the tellers showed the following elected as members-at-large on the School Board: Ralph McCrory and Area Montgomery.

Motion made and seconded that the Indiana Convention go on record as favoring the present set-up of having three Districts in one Conference.

Motion prevailed to extend the time until 12:00 noon.

Previous question called for on the motion concerning the set-up of the Indiana Conference. Carried.

Motion carried concerning favoring the present set-up.

Motion prevailed to appoint a committee to study the possibility of establishing a camp meeting in the southern part of Indiana.

Motion made and seconded that the zone chairman, south of Indianapolis for the committee.

A motion made to amend by adding "the Southern Superintendent be the chairman of the committee." Motion to amend was lost.

Motion carried, with zone chairmen comprising the committee.

Conference adjourned until 1:00 p.m.

The conference reconvened with Rev. L. W. Sturk leading in singing "Down At The Cross". The Conference joined in prayer.

The Secretary read the names of the various committees submitted by the District Superintendents.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT Northern District Indiana Conference

To the Indiana Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in session, Greetings in the All-Prevailing Name of Jesus. Another conference year is now history. I am herewith reporting my activities as a District Superintendent.

My heart is filled with deep gratitude to God and keen appreciation for the over-all picture of the Northern District. This has been a year of lengthening cords and strengthening stakes, a year of sweet fellowship with God and my fellow laborers, a year of understanding and united effort, for which we say "Praise the Lord".

THE REVIVAL SPIRIT. A number of churches have enjoyed the best revivals in years. These revivals have resulted in enlarged visions, increased Sunday School attendance and new members in the church. I feel the statistician's report will substantiate this. Space will not permit the mention of every church having good revivals but I will note a few. Noblesville is one of our oldest churches and has struggled for years, but God has given them a gracious revival and the church is moving forward. Alexandria, Lafayette, Marion First, Anderson, and many others are making blessed gains. To God be the Glory.

The victories in the churches are reflected in the recall of pastors. Eighteen ministers were recalled without an opposing vote. It is my candid opinion that if Pastors and Churches will behave as weaned children, we can change pastors as God leads and escape the reaction that so often divides the forces and opens a way for Satan to make havoc of the church.

NEW CHURCH AND MISSION. Through the help of certain young people from Frankfort First Church and students of Frankfort Pilgrim College, a church has been built and an organization effected in West Frankfort known as Pilgrim Chapel. We organized with eleven members. The Sunday School has averaged 45 this year.

Rev. William Shroyer has secured a Church building near Huntington and is having regular services with splendid success.

Rev. Mose Wire, who is returning to us from the Nazarenes has opened services in Jolietville and a splendid group of people are looking our way.

We have anxious calls from Hammond to start a work at that industrial center but lack the necessary funds to get this work under way.

CHURCHES DEDICATED. The new Pilgrim Chapel in Frankfort was dedicated free of debt. We also dedicated a splendid basement at Fort Wayne and materials are on the ground to complete the church.

The new Church at Andrews is ready for dedication.

OLD PEOPLES' HOME. One of our members went to Heaven this year. Rev. G. W. Groshart, veteran minister of our Conference went to his Heavenly home in January. He died in the Faith which characterized his long life and Ministry.

A number of the members of the Home are very infirm and are being tenderly cared for by the matron, Mrs. Rosa Mobley and her helpers.

OUR LOSS AS A DISTRICT. Along with the Home Going of Brother Groshart, Rev. John S. Donovan also heard the summons to come up higher. "Jack" as we knew him was a champion for God and the Church he loved. Rev. Mrs. DaFoe Vampner was called home to Heaven after a long and painful illness. Rev. George Barnes likewise went to his eternal reward.

It is with a saddened heart I remember the death of my own son, Walter. None will ever know the inspiration he was to my heart and the great anticipation I had for him. I feel my personal loss greatly and also a loss to my church. I have every reason to believe he died in the faith.. This gives me great joy in the midst of sadness. My wife and family join with me in expressing deep gratitude to all of you for the prayers, telegrams, letters and cards we received in our time of need. I look forward to the last trump with great expectation.

OUR PASTORS AND EVANGELISTS. The Lord has given us a group of Ministers who have proven themselves worthy of their calling. They possess holy enthusiasm and a willingness to sacrifice to make the Church and Kingdom grow. I have enjoyed blessed fellowship with everyone.

EXPANSIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS. Many of the churches have made great improvements. Logansport is now using a Sunday School Annex, the building which was purchased with the thought of enlarging the church. Wabash is building a large garage to house the three Sunday School buses. Swayzee has put down new hardwood floor. LaGrange is starting the erection of the main church structure. The Bass Lake Church has been completely remodeled and veneered with brick and a utility room erected. Forest is building an addition to the church. This will give added auditorium space as well as Sunday School rooms.

THE DISTRICT PARSONAGE. The District Parsonage has been painted this summer. During the winter some of the pastors and laymen came in and erected a fine two car garage. This was a much needed improvement. The debt on the Parsonage has been decreased to approximately \$3500.00.

MY PERSONAL ACTIVITIES. I have visited each church at least three times making a total of 215 visits, 24 of which were for Annual Meetings and 21 for Zone Gatherings. In addition, I have made 25 business trips, attended all Council and General Board Meetings and was present for all but two School Board and Executive Committee meetings, two District Youth Meetings and the State Young Peoples Convention, attended many building committee meetings and enjoyed many days labor on the building program.

I have dedicated two church buildings, dedicated ten children, assisted in three funerals and have had the oversight of the Old People's Home. I held two Camp meetings and one three-day Ministerial Conference and two Home Missionary Revivals. In my work I have traveled approximately 30,000 miles.

THE OUTLOOK. We are in the last days and deepening shadows are gathering. Wickedness and sin are on the increase. The challenge is great. May we buckle on the whole armor of God, being led by the all-conquering Christ, go forth to battle, never wavering or compromising, but to triumph over sin and establish the church of Jesus Christ, to the Praise of His Glory.

Central District
Indiana Conference

It is my desire to report my activities to this Conference as humbly as I know how. I am grateful unto the Lord for His divine guidance along the road of Providence which I have been called upon to travel.

I hereby wish to thank God for the great fellowship I have enjoyed with Rev. F. J. Goins and Rev. M. H. Snyder, superintendents of this great conference, and my assistant, Rev. T. J. Preusz, as well as the district councilmen and the committeemen of the various boards.

We wish to praise God for the spiritual interest shown in our churches, and for the good revivals which have been blessed of the Lord, with many seeking and finding God.

Entering upon my activities for the present year, I was asked to take over the building project started on our conference and school campus. This was requested because the contractor, due to illhealth and financial conditions, had been released by the building committee. I have endeavored by the help of the Lord to buy materials as reasonable as possible, and erect the buildings according to code and state regulations.

This has taken many days of oversight and labor, but it has been a pleasure to do it for our youth and the cause of Holiness. Again I wish to state my appreciation to Rev. F. J. Goins, Rev. M. H. Snyder, Rev. R. K. Storey, and the many other officials, pastors, laymen, and friends who have assisted in making this program possible.

Also I wish to thank the pastors and churches of the central district for their kind consideration extended unto me, because of my increased duties, relative to the building program.

Since accepting this office three years ago, it has been my desire and ambition as Superintendent of the Central district to promote and encourage all congregations worshiping in halls and rented places to secure or build adequate places of worship. To date this has been accomplished, for during the past year three new churches have been completed, three are now in the process of building, five churches have been remodeled, and also to this list we have been able to add two new parsonages.

By the help of the Lord we have been able to make 152 visits to the churches, conducted 28 board meetings and annual elections, organized one new church with three more in the making, made 68 trips to Frankfort, attended 20 zone meetings, made 33 business trips, conducted 16 radio services, attended all council and camp board meetings, 5 executive council school board meetings, preached 131 times, dedicated 3 new churches, and held one revival. We faithfully submit this report and give God all the honor and praise.

REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Southern District

To the Forty-sixth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Churches of Indiana, Greetings:

"Grace be to you and peace from God the Father, and from our Lord Jesus Christ, who gave himself for our sins, that he might deliver us from this present evil world, according to the will of God and our Father: To whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.

It is with deep gratefulness to God for His manifold grace and mercy extended to us throughout the past year that we submit this report of our activities in the Southern District. The love, prayers, and cooperation of pastors, evangelists, and laymen have made it possible for us to move forward and make some substantial gains for the glory of God. For this we give thanks. Not the least among our blessings has been the fellowship, council and sympathetic understanding of my fellow Superintendents. It has been a pleasure to work with them for the advancement of God's kingdom in this great Conference.

NEW CHURCHES. The Lord has been pleased to give us six new churches to present to this Conference with a total membership of 116.

Evansville, East Side. In the extreme east section of Evansville God visited a needy and hungry community with a gracious revival under the ministry of Rev. Macil Warner. Feeling that the spiritual interests of these new converts could be best served by bringing them into an established denomination Sister Warner asked us to come and organize the group into a Pilgrim Holiness Church. This we did, and the membership is now 45. Rev. Mark Storey, and Rev. Walter Keeney, pastors of our other churches in the city were most cooperative in helping to establish this work. The group is now worshipping in a residence converted into a neat chapel. However, they are now looking for a good location upon which they plan to build a new church.

Birdseye. This group, formerly under the supervision of the Trinity Gospel Tabernacle Association, came to us with Brother Luttrell's full approval. While this transaction was made last year, the organization of the group was not effected until this past year. Rev. Estel Eckhart first pastored the church and during the past year Rev. Emmet Manship has faithfully ministered. The church was organized with 13 members and the church property has been deeded to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Orrville. At the request of a burdened layman we went into this community last year and organized a Sunday School. The work, under the anointing of God, has prospered far beyond our fondest expectation. Rev. Albert Lowe, the first pastor, was used of God to help indoctrinate the people and was followed by Rev. Robert Martin who with faith and vision took hold of the work and has been marvelously used of God in establishing a church of loyal Pilgrims. A lovely church and parsonage combination that would grace any city is nearing completion. How God has provided the finance to carry on is a story in itself. The church was recently organized with twenty charter members. Many others are to follow. We had the honor of having our beloved general superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk with us on July 3 to dedicate the church.

Valeene. This work was started under the ministry of Rev. Stella Critchfield and was recently organized with 17 charter members. A barn was purchased right in the center of this little town of 100 population and converted into a beautiful little church. It is not unusual to see it packed with people to hear the gospel.

Centerville, South. This work was started by Rev. Oscar Snyder at the request of Mrs. Gertrude Laswell who was burdened for the community. God has blessed the work and a number of needy souls have found God. We were able to organize with 12 charter members. Sister Laswell, who owned the church property, is deeding the same to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Grandview. This group was also formerly under the supervision of Rev. A. L. Luttrell, but upon his advice they sent for us recently and we were able to organize with 9 charter members. Rev. William Gerbig has pastored the group during the past year. It was our privilege to be with him in a week-end meeting last January to get acquainted with the people. They are now happy Pilgrims. Let us all praise God for these open doors and open hearts.

REVIVALS. God has blessed many of our churches with gracious revivals during the past year. Many young people have found God as well as older people. Without doubt we are living in the closing hours of this dispensation and it is only as we keep the revival fires burning brightly that we may expect to stem the awful tide of worldliness and wickedness. Thank God, the God of Battles still lives and we may expect Him to work with us mightily as we move forward in His will.

PASTORAL CHANGES. It is my candid conviction that we have altogether too many pastoral changes for the best interests of our church.

The quicker our laymen learn that in many cases the best way to remedy a pastor's fault is to take it to the Lord in earnest believing prayer, and the quicker our pastors learn that the best way to find a greener pasture is to water his present field the better off we will be in this work of reaching lost men for Christ. I do not mean that there should never be a change of pastoral relations, but I am fully persuaded we are overworking the idea and it is costing us thousands of dollars that should be used in an aggressive program to reach the lost.

NEW CHURCH BUILDINGS. God is marvelously helping the Evansville, Forest Hills Church construct a lovely new church of Bedford Stone construction under the direction of Rev. Mark Storey, the faithful pastor. This church which measures 50 by 90 feet will adequately house the church and Sunday School which has far outgrown the present building. The sacrifice of this people is beautiful to behold. With \$40,000.00 in the building this far they only have an indebtedness of \$8,000.00.

The Petersburg church will soon have their lovely basement church completed. This is made possible by the untiring labors of Rev. Raymond Street, the faithful pastor, and his sacrificing people. The church is ideally located within two blocks of the court house.

The Scottsburg church has begun the construction of their new church in one of the best locations in the city. Rev. and Mrs. Lester Smith have labored sacrificially for many years to see this accomplished. Their people are pushing forward with them and they hope to be in their new church this Fall. The Shelburn church has sold the hall in which they have been these many years and they plan to construct a new church this Fall.

MORTGAGES LIQUIDATED. The Medora church has succeeded in liquidating the mortgage on their parsonage and are now free from debt. This is largely due to the sacrificial labors of the former pastors Rev. and Mrs. Edward Waldron as well as the present pastor, Rev. M. D. James, and his good people. During the past year Rev. E. W. Wright, pastor of the Oaktown church, has been able to lead his people in liquidating all the indebtedness on the parsonage as well as the indebtedness on their practically new furnace and redecorating job. Rev. and Mrs. Clarence Keith have also been blessed of the Lord, paying all the indebtedness on the new church at Austin.

NEW PARSONAGES. The Vincennes church is now building a long needed parsonage directly across from their church. Rev. Herman Smith, pastor, is doing much of the work. Rev. J. M. Burcham, pastor of the Washington church reports that they plan to build a new parsonage just as soon as they can dispose of the old one. The Mitchell church, due to the untiring labors of Rev. and Mrs. Edward Waldron, has remodeled and beautified its parsonage as well as built a retaining wall of Bedford stone around the lot. The remodeling includes the removal of an unnecessary porch and the building of a much needed extra room and bath.

OUR SCHOOL. As chairman of the School Board I have been brought face to face with the trials and triumphs of Frankfort Pilgrim College. It has been a pleasure to work with Brother Storey, the president, and the other members of the board. We believe that, under God, there is a great future for the School. I wish to take this opportunity to thank the churches of the conference for the noble support they have given the School and the splendid response to the offering appeal on the last day of our great camp.

PERSONAL ACTIVITIES. I have visited all of my churches at least twice, some more, making a total of 125 visits. I have preached 255 times, not counting radio messages, conducted 51 District radio broadcasts, held one camp meeting, one district ministerial convention, and three home missionary meetings. By permission of the District Council, I have held five revivals in our churches and placed \$340.00 in the Home Missionary Funds from the revivals. I have attended 15 Zone meetings, all Camp

Board Meetings, all Council Meetings, Building Committee Meetings, and School Board Meetings. I have attended two General Board Meetings, three Pension Board Meetings and have made many business trips with regard to our churches, the School, and our new home missionary churches. I have also had three week-end meetings, two funerals, and one wedding. I have travelled approximately 40,000 miles.

REPORT OF ELECTION BOARD

Special Sections from the Manual

Section 210, paragraphs 2, 3, and 4:

Those entering a ministerial office shall immediately enter upon the prescribed course of study and pursue same until completed. To this end they shall place themselves under the direction of the District Educational Board, which has charge of this work, unless the same course, or its equivalent, is taken in school.

Examinations required by the District Educational Board shall be submitted in writing and shall be conducted at the time and place of the annual conference or during the year upon completion of a book or subject, either personally or through the mails.

The passing grade of any study shall not be less than an average of 70 per cent.

Section 154:

No person shall be eligible for ordination until first having served at least two years in active ministry.

Section 155:

The licentiate who has held his license at least three years, and has successfully completed the required course of study, shall be eligible for ordination as a minister of the Gospel, unless the district council will have deemed it wise to have ordained before the expiration of the three year period.

Section 149, paragraph 1:

All licensed ministers failing to complete and report on at least two subjects a year in their required Course of Study, for two consecutive years, will automatically forfeit their licenses, unless in the judgment of the educational board an exception shall be made. The district council shall have power to review and pass upon such action when it deems advisable. (Section 109, paragraph 2).

The following recommendations were brought in by the Resolutions Committee:

1

We recommend that all persons taking the preacher's study course shall have their examinations in the hands of their instructors by July 16th of each Conference Year. No teacher will be expected to grade examinations after this time.

2

We recommend that at each annual Camp Meeting on the last Thursday, Friday and Saturday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examination of ministers. All ministers knowing themselves due to appear before these boards are urged to be present.

We further recommend that the time of each session shall be announced from the platform.

3

Each minister pursuing our course of study shall mail 25 cents with each request for questions on each subject. Those failing to comply with this recommendation will not receive their questions.

We recommend that the following paragraph be inserted in our Minutes at the end of the Educational Committee's report.

"Inasmuch as the teachers of the Ministerial Study Course are doing their work gratis and in the midst of other pressing duties, it is requested that each applicant apply for questions as early in the year as possible, and that a reasonable length of time be allowed for the questions to be returned to the applicant."

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

Church Government

1.

Whereas many of our members are not familiar with the actions of the Conference, therefore

Be it resolved that the Pastor shall have a special meeting of his church at the earliest possible date, for the purpose of familiarizing his people with their responsibilities for the Conference year.

2.

We recommend that the annual business of the church be closed on June 30 of each year.

3.

Inasmuch as it is impossible for the local church to send Conference funds to the Conference Treasurer by June 30, we recommend that the Treasurer hold his books open until July 15.

4.

We recommend that each church provide a parsonage with telephone, and if possible, other utilities also be furnished as recommended by the Local Church Board.

5.

We recommend that where parsonages are not equipped with heating device, window shades, kitchen and bathroom floor coverings that provision be made for the same by the local Church.

6.

We recommend that where churches and parsonages are located in cities that the location of the church and parsonage appear in our Minutes. We further recommend if possible, that where parsonages are equipped with phones, that the name of the pastor and Pilgrim Holiness Church be listed in the phone book.

7.

We recommend that no Local Church Board endorse for Conference license anyone who is not willing to give full time to the ministry of God's Word. We further recommend that the Examining Board pass no candidate for Conference license who fails to give evidence of a Divine Call to the ministry or a willingness to give full time to the same.

8.

Whereas, we have many able-bodied licensed and ordained ministers, who are employed in other than ministerial work, and seldom if ever preach, we recommend that the Examining Board be instructed to draw the lines closer on such individuals and that no one who is not active in the ministry be recommended for ordination.

9.

We recommend that the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper be observed at least once each quarter by our local churches.

10.

We recommend that each District elect a full time Superintendent.

11.

We recommend that each District elect an Assistant Superintendent from the Pastors of that District.

12.

We recommend that the District Superintendents with their Assistants together with the Zone Chairmen in their respective Districts shall be responsible for the promotion of Home Missionary Work.

13.

We recommend that there be District Parsonage Committees composed of the District Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, and Zone Chairmen, whose duty it shall be to supervise the liquidation of their parsonage debt, and also be responsible for the maintenance of the parsonage.

14.

We recommend that the Conference Council consist of 13 members comprised of the three District Superintendents, their Assistants, the Conference Secretary, the Conference Treasurer, one Advisory member from each District, and two additional members from the District or Districts which are unequally represented.

15.

We recommend that the District Superintendents alternate in presiding at Council Meetings unless otherwise required by emergency.

16.

We recommend that the District Superintendents be members of the Camp Meeting Board by virtue of their office.

17.

Whereas in many of our building projects there seems to be poorly formulated plans due to incompetent committees which has resulted in some poorly constructed buildings, therefore

Be it resolved that before constructing church buildings or parsonages that plans and specifications be approved by the conference council or by a committee appointed by same.

18.

Whereas there has been difficulty and irregularity of time in the calling and changing of pastors, therefore

Be it resolved that each church shall vote on its Pastor during the time from May 15th to the 30th and that each Pastor must give a definite answer to his church and his Superintendent within two weeks following the date of voting.

19.

Inasmuch as the Resolutions Committee has been approached with the matter of the use of lantern slides and motion pictures in our churches, therefore

Be it resolved that the Indiana Conference go on record as opposed to the use of the same.

20.

We recommend that a committee consisting of the three Superintendents formulate a questionnaire, which shall be ratified by the Conference Council, the same to be filled out in quadruplicate form by all Conference Ministers.

We further recommend that this questionnaire be given to each one of the Superintendents and one to be kept on file by the Examining Board.

21.

We recommend that no person be recommended for ordination without having served two years in full time pastoral or evangelistic work.

22.

Whereas there are many of our churches that are failing to meet their financial requirements, therefore

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent, as he visits his District, shall give this matter careful consideration with each local church board.

23.

We recommend that the following recommendations in our 1948 Minute be deleted:

Camp Meeting and Conference Nos. 18, 30. Miscellaneous No. 8.

Sunday School

1.

The duties of the Conference Sunday School Board in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

1. The Conference Sunday School Board, together with Zone Presidents shall arrange for Sunday School Conventions to be held in the respective Zones during the year.

2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the Conference.

3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:

a. A statement of the work accomplished during the year.

b. A statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work in the Conference.

4. The Council shall direct the Conference Treasurer to take care of all finance incurred by the Conference Sunday School Board.

5. The Conference Sunday School Board shall be amendable to the Council.

6. The Council shall have the right to remove, or cause to be removed, any member of the Conference Sunday School Board who, in the judgment of such Council, is not in harmony with the teaching of the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church

7. If for any reason there is a vacancy on the Conference Sunday School Board, the Council, by a majority vote, may fill the vacancy.

8. The Conference Sunday School Board shall work in conjunction with the General Sunday School Secretary in promoting the annual Rally Day, etc.

9. To have published each quarter a Conference Sunday School sheet showing the attendance of each Sunday School in the Conference for the quarter, this sheet to be sent to each pastor and Sunday School Superintendent in the Conference.

10. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a summer Vacation Bible School.

Camp Meeting and Conference

1.

We recommend that all those desiring to pay for their board by serving as a worker during the Camp Meeting be required to pay a registration fee of \$1.00 when accepted as a worker by the Camp Meeting Committee.

2.

We recommend that Conference Ministers and their wives and dependent children be granted workers tickets for their meals during the Camp Meeting.

We further recommend that those physically able be assigned to their respective duties and all failing to fill their assignment shall have their workers tickets forfeited.

3.

We recommend that the Camp Meeting Secretary issue no workers tickets to Laymen except as he is authorized by the Superintendents of the various departments.

4.

We recommend that all proposed building programs or all major changes on the State Camp Ground be endorsed by a two-thirds vote of the Council, Camp Meeting Board, and the School Board.

We further recommend that all future constructions be made to conform to State and Local codes

5.

We recommend that the Camp Meeting Board pass upon all improvements or construction not entailing an expense of more than \$1,000.00.

6.

We recommend that our Camp Meeting begin on the second Friday of August each year.

7.

We recommend that there be a Camp Meeting Purchasing Committee consisting of the three District Superintendents, one advisory member, who shall be appointed by the Camp Meeting Board, and the Superintendent of the department for which purchase is made.

We further recommend that all bills for said purchase be placed in the Camp Meeting Treasurer's hands at the close of the Camp Meeting.

8.

We recommend that all who rent rooms during Camp be advised to bring their own bedding.

9.

We recommend that in case the Conference considers changing or increasing the amounts in financial recommendations by the Ways and Means Committee that Ways and Means Committee may appeal to the Conference for a Committee to investigate the financial balance of the treasury before voting on the change, this investigation committee to consist of one member from the Conference Council, one member from the Ways and Means Committee, and one member chosen from the Conference.

10.

We recommend that only ministers, their wives and unmarried dependent children and lay delegates be given entertainment during Conference. All entitled to this entertainment shall be duly registered and given cards of recognition. For all other entertainment the same rate shall prevail as during Camp Meeting.

11.

We recommend that there be a Publishing Committee composed of the Conference Secretary and two appointee members. It shall be the duty of this committee to publish the Conference Minutes

12.

We recommend that each church give the purchase price of one cot pad and one sheet for each 50 members or major fraction thereof.

13.

We recommend that the Conference Council be responsible for providing needed help for the kitchen and dining room during Conference.

14.

Whereas some of our pastors and families have found it difficult if not impossible to secure a room on the Camp grounds during Camp, therefore, we recommend that our ministers be given more consideration in the rental of rooms, applying only to the new dormitory.

15.

We recommend that the water and sewer service be installed under the directions of the Camp Meeting Board.

16.

We recommend that there be one Conference Statistician.

17.

We recommend that the Conference Council in conjunction with the School Board formulate a plan for the maintenance of the buildings and equipment, for all Conference property.

18.

We recommend that the Conference Secretary at his earliest possible convenience inform the Chairmen of the various Boards and Committees of their respective duties.

We further recommend that within three months said Committees and Boards be required to formulate plans to meet the desires of this Conference.

19.

We recommend that caution be taken to not over-estimate the values of Church property in our Annual Reports.

20.

We recommend that the Conference go on record as interpreting I Peter 3:3, where it speaks of the wearing of gold, to mean all rings including wedding and class rings.

21.

We recommend that where a man is inadvertently placed on more Boards and Committees than he can well serve that the Conference Council be authorized to make proper adjustment in such Committees.

22.

We recommend that the camp meeting board appoint a committee to see that there are two blueprints made; one showing the plumbing and sewerage system, and the other showing the wiring of the camp grounds, and buildings.

23.

We recommend that no District levy any assessments, other than Conference assessments, without the consent of the Conference Council.

24.

Whereas our deceased Ministers are only honored by a brief memorial service during conference and

Whereas it seems that there should be something of a more permanent nature, therefore be it resolved that we provide for a Memorial section in our Minutes and publish a brief history of the life work of those of our Ministers who have died during the year.

Be it further resolved that the Conference Secretary gather the needed information of each of our Ministers by sending out a questionnaire. This information is to be kept on file and kept up to date by making the needed additions at the close of each conference.

25.

We recommend that the Memorial Service be held at the beginning of the evening session of the first day of Conference.

26.

Whereas there are new cottages being built and others being remodeled and

Whereas there has been no set of rules formulated to govern the same, therefore

Be it resolved that a committee of three, composed of our Conference Secretary, electrician, and plumber, formulate a set of rules governing the

plumbing, wiring, construction, and remodeling of all privately owned cottages, trailers, etc.

We further recommend that a written permit must be secured from this committee before construction is started.

We further recommend that all cottage owners be notified of this recommendation, and that anyone failing to meet the requirements shall be required to make the necessary changes or their lease forfeited.

27.

We recommend that there be a fee for each house car, car or trailer which is on the camp ground for three months or more during the year for the purpose of maintaining the roads.

28.

We recommend that the camp meeting board appoint an inspector for camp grounds and buildings who shall make periodic inspections and shall have the authority to enforce such regulations that shall be delegated him by the camp meeting board.

29.

Whereas there is a growing number of cottages being constructed upon the camp grounds and whereas these cottages and buildings are helping to meet the housing needs of the school and whereas our properties are part of a non-profit organization, and whereas there is the possibility that some are not aware of the limitations of such an organization, and hereby may make charges for use of cottages which are out of harmony with our organization, therefore

Be it resolved that an appraisal committee be appointed by the Camp Meeting Board for the purpose of appraising the camp cottages and trailers to determine the maximum amount of remuneration to be received from the same during the school year.

30.

We recommend that upon the death of a Conference Minister or his wife, that the conference secretary be notified at once, who shall notify all conference pastors by telephone or telegraph.

31.

Whereas the Conference Council has considerable business to care for between conferences, and such business is important and more or less unknown to the members of the Conference, therefore

Be it resolved that the Conference Secretary read in review to the assembled Conference the major actions of the Council during the preceeding year.

32.

We recommend that our School President be a member of the Camp Meeting Board.

33.

Whereas improper names have been attached to some of our camp and school buildings, therefore

Be it resolved that the Conference Council give them proper names.

34.

We recommend that any Minister, who fails to get his annual report to the Conference Statistician by July 31st, shall be referred to the Examining Board.

35.

We recommend that all auditing material be brought to the Auditing Committee by the first Monday of the Camp Meeting.

36.

We recommend that the Conference Council appoint a Committee to prepare a uniform Report Blank for the District Superintendents.

Zone Work

1.

Inasmuch as the Zone Meetings have been beneficial in advancing the spiritual, educational, and doctrinal interests of the Conference, we recommend they be continued.

We further recommend that the Zone Chairmen be elected by secret ballot by the Ministers and lay delegates.

2.

Whereas as the need arises for a district to change its zone boundaries because of receiving new churches and distance, therefore be it resolved that there be a committee appointed by the District Superintendent to work out the rezoning of that district to be ratified by the Conference.

Educational and Examining Board

The recommendations brought in regarding this work are printed under the report of the Educational Board at its request.

Pastoral

1.

We recommend that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

2.

We recommend that no pastor call an evangelist outside of our church without the approval of the District Superintendent.

3.

We recommend that pastors of deceased members of our District Conference bring to the Memorial Committee a copy of the obituary of the deceased and any other information that is available, this information to be used in our Annual Memorial Service.

Young People

1.

We recommend that the Young People's Committee consisting of the Conference Young People's Secretary, Treasurer, and zone chairman make plans for a young people's convention.

We further recommend that this convention be held the third Thursday of June each year.

2.

We recommend that there be District Young People's conventions and zone rallies.

3.

Whereas the General Conference will be at Frankfort next June and

Whereas the Young People's Conference Convention will also be in June, therefore

Be it resolved that the Young People's Conference Convention be omitted for the year of 1950.

Miscellaneous

1.

We recommend that the Conference farm be under supervision of the Conference Council.

2.

We recommend that immediately following the Conference the Secretary mail to each pastor an itemized postal notice of the financial requirements of the church for the year.

3.

We recommend that the Ways and Means Committee and the Resolutions Committee meet at the call of the District Superintendents, who may also meet with the Committee, prior to the next Conference.

4.

We recommend that 1200 copies of the Conference Minutes be provided within 30 days after the Conference adjourns. Each church must send in the money with its order.

5.

We recommend that we have a Thanksgiving Harvest Day for the School. Such day shall be set aside for the various zones to bring in their canned goods and produce of all kinds for the School.

6.

Whereas example is more powerful than precept and

Whereas our Officials and Ministers are looked upon as examples of standards for our Church, therefore

Be it resolved that the Indiana Conference call attention to Sec. 65, page 49 of our Manual and urge our Ministers and Officials and their families to exemplify these standards.

7.

We recommend that the three District Superintendents be members of the School Board by virtue of their office.

We further recommend that they form a committee to nominate two men from each district from which one shall be elected by the Conference.

We further recommend that the Conference elect two members at large, which shall comprise the School Board.

8.

We recommend that the Conference Council select from the respective districts, Ministerial and lay delegates to the General Conference, who are to be ratified by this Conference.

9.

We recommend that the day services of our Ministerial Convention be restricted to the Ministers, their wives, Deaconesses, and Evangelistic Singers.

We further recommend that there be a registration fee of 50c. The entertainment is to be provided as formerly.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

Local Church Financial

1.

We recommend that the Conference budget consist of 10% of all money raised by the local church, Sunday School and 5% from the Young People's Society, except that raised for Missions, General Budget, building funds and all funds raised for specified Conference interests. Building fund purposes shall be interpreted to include rent on parsonages and churches and money paid on contracts of the same.

2.

We recommend that the Conference Budget be prorated as follows: Conference Fund, 62%; Old Peoples Home, 5%; Frankfort Pilgrim College, 17%; Home Missions, 14%; and General Conference, 2%.

3.

We recommend that each church raise five cents per member per month for Home Missionary Work and Church Extension, money to be paid to the Conference Treasurer.

4.

We recommend that each church pay the Frankfort Pilgrim College at the rate of 1% of their annual gross receipts of the local Church treasury up to and including \$3000.00, and 2% for all churches with an annual income over \$3000.00. Said amount to be paid monthly through the Conference Treasury.

District Financial

1.

We recommend that our regular Conference stenographer be paid \$30.00 and that the Secretary be authorized to secure additional helpers at the rate of \$20.00 per person.

2.

We recommend that our District Superintendents be paid a salary of \$65.00 per week plus mileage at the rate of four cents per mile not to exceed \$750.00 for the Conference year.

3.

We recommend that our Assistant District Superintendents be paid at the rate of \$7.50 per day plus mileage for each day's service.

4.

We recommend that the Conference Secretary be paid \$150.00 for his services for the year.

5.

We recommend that the Conference Treasurer be paid \$400.00 for his services for the year.

6.

We recommend that the Conference Statistician be paid \$100.00 for his services for the year.

7.

We recommend the Superintendents be authorized to launch a drive in their respective Districts to help finance the new buildings now under construction.

8.

We recommend that the standard mileage rate be fixed at 4 cents per mile.

9.

We recommend that each church raise fifty cents per member per year for the operating expense of the Old Peoples Home.

10.

Inasmuch as the Pension Plan would entail considerable expense to make it fully operative in our District, we recommend that our District go on record as favoring the Plan; We further recommend that the matter be left on a voluntary basis, both as to ministers becoming members and churches desiring to participate in the Pension Plan.

11.

We recommend that we as a Conference go on record as favoring the sale of the Conference farm, the same to be applied on Conference indebtedness.

We further recommend that the disposal of farm be left to the discretion of the District Council.

Young People's Work

1.

We recommend that each Young People's Society be requested to send an offering for the Young Peoples Rally to the Conference Young People's

Treasurer; also that Churches without organized Societies be invited to send an offering for same.

We further recommend that said offering be sent in at least 30 days prior to the Conference Young Peoples Rally.

2.

We recommend that each Young People's Society send six per cent of all money raised in the regular offering to the State Young People's Treasurer to finance the work of the Conference Young People's Organization.

Camp Meeting and Conference

1.

Whereas there is a need of improved roads on our camp ground, we recommend a fee of \$5.00 be collected from all persons owning a car who live on the grounds for a period of three months or more out of each Conference year. This money to be used exclusively for improving necessary roads.

We further recommend an equal amount be paid by the Camp Meeting Treasurer for this purpose.

2.

We recommend where repairs are necessary on the buildings used by the school, the material be furnished by the Camp Meeting and the labor by the School.

REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE

The following is a five year report of the number of churches with Sunday Schools and the average attendance each Sunday for the year.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MEMORIALS TO GENERAL CONFERENCE

1.

Whereas our Marriage Ritual is inadequate, Be it resolved that the General Conference provide a committee to prepare a new Marriage Ceremony for our Ritual.

2.

Whereas our church has grown numerically and geographically to such proportions that it is almost too great a task for one man, we recommend three General Superintendents shall have the general oversight of our church.

3.

Whereas some pastors do not give an answer to the church when they are recalled thereby placing the church in an embarrassing position, therefore Be it resolved that the following paragraph be placed after paragraph 2, page 41, section 52 in our Manual: "When a pastor is re-called by his church, he must give his answer of acceptance or rejection within ten days from the date of recall by the church."

4.

We recommend that the General Church provide a questionnaire to be used by the District Examining Boards. Each candidate for conference license shall answer all questions and sign the questionnaire. If and when any licensed or ordained minister shall transfer from one District to another, this questionnaire must be presented together with his letter of transfer.

5.

We recommend that a concise supplemental blank for the statistical report of each local church be provided to be placed within the District Minutes in paragraph form. This is not to take the place of the present blank for the District Statistician.

6.

We recommend that the following paragraph be added to paragraph 2, section 27, page 28, of the Manual: "When the number of active members in any local church shall fall below the number required for organization, such church shall automatically revert to the status of a Home Missionary church and shall be under the direct supervision of the District Superintendent."

IN MEMORIAM

GEORGE WASHINGTON GROSHART
