Journal of Proceedings

MORNING SESSION, MONDAY, AUGUST 16, 1920.

The First Annual Assembly of the International Holiness Church convened in the Tabernacle on the camp grounds at Frankfort, Indiana, Monday morning, August 16, 1920, at 8 o'clock. The devotional services were in charge of Rev. George B. Kulp, General Superintendent, of Battle Creek, Mich. After singing "A Charge to Keep I Have" Brothers W. S. Dean, George E. Huff, and Elmer D. Joy, led the assembly in prayer. Rev. George B. Kulp then gave a very stirring address relative to our church union. The assembly was then called to order with General Superintendent Kulp in the chair.

First in order was the assembly roll call and the revision of the same. As the names of Rev. N. Bradshaw and Rev. B. H. Hines were called, the assembly arose to their feet in memory of these two brothers who have gone to their reward.

ASSEMBLY RULES

Moved and supported that we accept the rules given in our church manual, paragraph 215, on page 95. Motion carried. (See Manual). Hours of Session, 8:00 to 11:30 a.m., 1:30 to 5:00 p.m.

Moved and supported that we have a night session from 7:00 to 9:30 p.m. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the first ten seats in the two center rows in the tabernacle shall constitute the assembly bar. Motion carried.

Next in order was the reading of reports. (See Statistical, Numerical, Evangelists, and District Superintendents tables.)

Moved and supported that all visiting Ministers be received into the

assembly bar as advisory members. Motion carried.

The following persons were invited to take seats in the assembly. M. F. Pratt, D. C. Shearer, Harry Shepherd, Crystal White, Alma Shearer, M. R. Lewis, Nellie George, Miriam Auxier, Minnie Snyder and Ezra Schrock.

Motion to adjourn.

^a AFTERNOON SESSION, AUGUST 16, 1920.

After song, and prayer by Rev. G. C. Middleton, the assembly was called to order with General Superintendent George B. Kulp in the chair. The minutes of the morning session were read and adopted.

Moved and supported that Miriam Auxier be transferred from the Illinois-Missouri district to this district, and that she be seated in the as-

sembly bar. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we elect the following committees: Auditing Committee, Statistical Committee, Resolution Committee, Examining Committee, and Ways and Means Committee. Motion carried. (See Official Record.)

The chair then appointed the Ordination Council as follows: George B. Kulp, G. C. Middleton, A. M. Ewing, Elmer D. Joy, and W. C. Canary.

Moved and supported that 8 o'clock, Tuesday morning be set aside for the election of officers, and the reconstruction of our work. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the credentials of Crystal White be accepted, and that she be seated in the assembly bar as a member. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we excuse the Board of Education for the present, so they can begin their work of examination. Motion carried.

The assembly was favored at this time with a special song, by the Dunkleberger Sisters, entitled "My Mansion in the Sky.", after which a free will offering of \$68.55 was taken for the expense of the assembly.

Moved and supported that the Examining Committee be excused for the

present, so they can take up their work. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that a free will offering be taken at this time for J. P. White, who is afflicted and in need. An offering of \$40.34 was taken up.

Motion to adjourn.

Benediction by Rev. A. M. Ewing.

NIGHT SESSION, AUGUST 16, 1920.

After song and prayer by Rev. W. A. Frye, the assembly was called to order with General Superintendent George B. Kulp in the chair. The minutes of the afternoon session were read and adopted.

Moved and supported that we release George Huff from the Statistical Committee, and the chair appoint Arthur Plunkett to fill the vacancy. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we release E. W. Wright from the Auditing Committee. Motion carried. Chair appointed W. E. Clark to fill the vacancy.

Moved and supported that we reconsider the motion relative to the election of officers, and the reconstruction of our work. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we take up the work of reconstruction in this present session. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the state of Indiana be divided into Two Districts, the Pennsylvania Railroad running through Richmond, Greenfield, Indianapolis, Greencastle, and Terre Haute to be the dividing line. After much discussion the motion was lost.

The camp meeting treasurer read financial report. Moved and supported that it be adopted and printed in the Assembly Minutes. Motion

carried.

Moved and supported the Rev. E. W. Wright, Secretary of the Burial Association, be given an opportunity to explain to the assembly the workings of the association at this time. Motion carried.

Rev. Wright gave a detailed account of the association, and the bene-

fits derived from it by its members.

Motion to adjourn. Benediction by Rev. M. F. Pratt.

MORNING SESSION, TUESDAY, AUGUST 17, 1920.

The morning session of the assembly was called to order with General Superintendent George B. Kulp in the chair. The song, "Rock of Ages" was sung by the assembly, after which Rev. F. A. Calahan offered prayer. The minutes of the night session were read and adopted.

The report of the Resolution Committee was read by Rev. John W. Clark. Moved and supported that the report be adopted and referred to

the editor of minutes. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that Ezra Schrock be seated in the assembly bar as delegate from the Kokomo, Ind., church, instead of G. C. Colter. Motion carried.

Next in order was the election of officers. The chair appointed two sets of tellers as follows: First Set, George E. Huff, E. W. Wright, and Elmer Joy. Second Set, John W. Clark, W. S. Dean, and John Shue.

The first officer to be elected was the State Superintendent. Rev. Albert M. Ewing was elected on the first ballot. After a motion was made and carried to make his election unanimous, the assembly stood and sung "O How I Love Jesus" and extended the right hand of fellowship to Rev. Ewing.

The next in order was the election of the Assistant State Superintendent. Rev. H. W. Cochran was elected on the first ballot but resigned the office. A second ballot was cast which resulted in the election of Rev.

Edward Schoeff, of Elwood, Ind.

The next in order was the election of the State Secretary. Rev. E. J. Clem was elected on the second ballot but resigned the office. Moved and supported that the Secretary cast the ballot for Rev. John W. Clark for State Secretary. Motion carried. Rev. Clark was elected.

The next officer to be elected was State Treasurer. Rev. R. W. Chat-

field was elected on the first ballot.

Next in order was the election of the Board of Examination. The election resulted in the election of Rev. G. C. Middleton for a period of three years; Rev. C. A. Fouts, for two years, and Rev. W. C. Canary, for one year.

Moved and supported that the State Council appoint the de'egates to the special session of the General Assembly to be held in October. Mo-

tion carried.

Moved and supported that the State Council cast ballot for the election of Foreign Missionary Board. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the State Council cast ballot for the elec-

tion of the camp meeting committee. Motion carried.

The next in order was the report of the Examining Committee. The report was read by W. C. Canary as follows: We recommend that the following persons be duly ordained: Mary P. Friend, Albert H. Blume, Bertha M. Blume, H. N. Dickerson, W. B. Fugett, Chas. E. Kendall, James B. Douglas, Harry L. Holden, J. H. Baughman, W. P. Senn, Rush Möore, Audra C. Harris, Elsie Bradley, and V. A. Popejoy.

AFTERNOON SESSION, TUESDAY, AUGUST 17, 1920

The afternoon session of the State Assembly was called to order at 1.30 p.m. with the General Superintendent, George B. Kulp, in the chair. After singing "Jesus Lover of My Soul", the Assembly was led in prayer by Rev. Ella Ewers. The minutes of the morning session were read and adopted.

The Secretary then gave the report of the State Council in the election of th Forign Missionary Board, and the camp meeting committee. (See official record).

The State Council elected the following delegates to attend the special session of the General Assembly to be held in October of this year.

The report of the State Foreign Missionary Treasurer was read and referred to the Auditing Committee.

Moved and supported we take a recess until 2:30 p.m. Motion carried

After recess the Assembly was called to order with the General Superintendent, George B. Kulp, in the chair. After singing "He Leadeth Me," the persons recommended by the Examining Committee were duly ordained. The ordination sermon was preached by Rev. Kulp, and was full of instruction and good advice.

The auditing committee report was given by W. P. Senn as follows: We have carefully audited the books of the Home and Foreign Missionary Treasurer, the State and Camp Meeting Treasurers, the Burial Association Treasurer, District Superintendent Schoeff and find them all correct.

Moved and supported that the report of the Auditing Committee be adopted and referred to the editor the minutes. Motion carried.

The report of the Committee on Education was read and adopted. The report of the Ways and Means Committee was reported by Rev. Area Montgomery, as follows:

Article 1

We recommend that each local church that has not already decdied on the pastor's salary for the coming year meet immediately after this annual Assembly and decide on the minimum amount to be paid the pastor for the year. And that hereafter each church shall decide on the salary at the last annual business meeting before the State Assembly. further recommnd that each church calling or changing pastors, shall pay the moving expenses and carfare of the pastor and his family, and where the church has no parsonage they provide a house for the pastor. ommendation carried.

Article 2

We recommend that the State Superintendent and the Assistant State Superintendent be paid a salary of \$2,000 each, this to include their trav-Recommendation lost. eling expenses.

Resolved that we as a church move forward on financial lines. a well known fact that we have been hindered on financial lines. We have tried many different plans, none of which have proven satisfactory. We therefore recommend that this Assembly pass resolutions asking each local church to set aside a certain per cent of the gross offerings to pay the salary of the State Superintendent, the Assistant Superintendent, and Home Missions. We recommend that this per cent, be not less than 10 cents on each dollar. After much discussion, the motion was lost.

Article 4

We recommend that each member of our local churches over 18 years of age, pay the sum of Seventy-Five cents each membership dues to defray the expenses of the State Assembly. Motion carried.

Article 5

We recommend that the State Secretary be paid the sum of Twenty-Five (\$25) dollars annually instead of Fifteen (\$15) dollars, the present amount, and that the present Secretary be given the benefit of the increase. Motion carried.

Article 6

We recommend that this State Assembly pay the traveling expenses of the State Superintendent, the Assistant State Superintendent, and the State Secretary, to the special session of the General Assembly. Recommendation carried.

Moved and supported that the Secretary have 500 copies of the As-

sembly Minutes printed. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we appoint or elect a field manager for Home Missionary work. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that Rev. H. W. Cochran of Rising Sun, Ind., be elected by a rising vote. Motion carried. Rev. Cochran was elected.

Moved and supported that the field manager for Home Missions advise with the State Council when in need of assistance, or advice. tion carried.

Moved and supported that we recommend Rev. H. W. Cochran, our field manager to the Home Missionary Board of the General Assembly. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that inasmuch as we have elected a State Foreign Missionary Board, that all plans for raising money for Foreign Missions be placed in their charge. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the Indiana State Assembly in connection with the Illinois-Missouri Assembly, pledge to pay our field manager for Home Missions \$2,000 and traveling expenses the coming year. Motion to amend.

Moved and supported that we amend the above motion, by placing the salary at \$3,000 and traveling expenses, if the districts of Ohio and Michigan will concur with us. Amendment carried.

Moved and supported that the amended motion be accepted. Motion

carried.

Moved and supported that we elect a Home Missionary Board of three members to devise plans to raise money and to assist the field manager. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the State Secretary cast ballot for three

candidates named by the State Council. Motion Carried.

Moved and supported that the Secretary cast ballot for the three advisory members of the State Council, George E. Huff, W. S. Dean, and H. W. Cochran, and that they constitute the Home Missionary Board. Motion carried. Huff, Dean and Cochran elected.

Moved and supported that each pastor pay the sum of \$1.00 for ten

copies of the Assembly Minutes. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we show our appreciation of the splendid services rendered in this Assembly by our dear Brother Kulp, General Superintendent, by a rising vote. Motion carried. Vote taken.

Moved and supported that we take a free will offering for our General Superintendent, George B. Kulp, for his services as chairman of this Assembly. Motion carried. An offering amounting to \$100.00 was then taken.

Moved and supported that we leave the fixing of the dates for the camp meeting and the Annual Assembly for 1921 with the camp meeting committee. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we have two ministerial conventions this assembly year. One in the north and one in the south part of the state, and that the arrangements and dates together with the assignments of the subjects, be left in the hands of the State Superintendent, and the Assistant Superintendent. Motion carried.

Moved and supported we receive the 10th Street Mission in Marion, Ind., into this Assembly. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that this Assembly empower the State Secretary to have evangelistic blanks printed. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the State Council nominate the candidates for Burial Association Board, and that the Secretary cast ballot for the election of same. Motion carried. (See official record.)

Moved and supported that the State Superintendent or the assistant Superintendent, visit each church and mission once each quarter. Motion carrid.

Motion to adjourn.

Benediction by Rev. Edward Schoeff.

MORNING SESSION, WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 18, 1920

The morning session of the State Assembly was called to order at $8:30\,$ a. m. with State Superintendent Rev. A. M. Ewing in the chair. After song service, Rev. Edward Schoeff offered prayer. The minutes of the night session were read and adopted.

Moved and supported that the \$50 loaned to the Home Mission Treaser by the Foreign Missionary Treasurer, be paid at once. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the motion empowering the State Council to place the apportionment on the local churches be rescinded. Motion lost.

Next in order was the reading of the pastoral assignments.

Motion to adjourn.

Resolution 2

Resolution 3

Resolved, that this Assembly express its sympathy for our dear Brother E. D. Davis of North Vernon, Indiana, in his present affliction, and assure him our continued prayer in his behalf that he may be healed and restored to the work of God.

Resolution 4

Inasmuch as our precious Brother Rev. Earl E. Davis and wife, members of this Assembly, are now laboring in Africa, resolved, that we express our appreciation of their work as missionaries, and assure them of our continued prayers and financial support.

Resolution 5

Resolved, that inasmuch aos we as a church are in favor of bone dry prohibition, we are agreed that no member of our body will support the candidate of any political party who is not heartily in favor of the Volstead act to enforce the law of the 18th amendment to the constitution of the United States.

Resolution 6

Inasmuch as God has brought about the consolidation of the International Apostolic Holiness Church, and the Holiness Christian Church, be it therefore resolved, that we forget that we were formally two organizations, and that we stand together in unity and love for the advancement of the kingdom of God, and that we push His work as never before.

Resolution 7

Inasmuch as the Lord has given us such a faithful camp meeting committee, and band of self-sacrificing helpers, and as God has also given us the best camp meeting we have ever had, and many precious souls, be it resolved, that we continue to pray for our camp meeting, and that we show our appreciation of the committee and helpers by a rising vote.

Resolution 8

Resolution 10

Resolved, that inasmuch as our Brother Rev. O. W. Barnes is going to accept a pastorate at Owosso, Michigan, we recommend him to the people there as a big-hearted man, and as he has labored faithfully among us we bid him God speed and success in his new field of labor.

A MEMOIR

Rev. Newton Bradshaw was born in Theme, England, September 5th, 1857. Died at his late home in Carlinville Ill., February 26th, 1920. Age, 62 years, 5 months, and 21 days. In young manhood he studied law in London, England, and engaged in this profession for a time. He later on left England and went to Canada, and it was while there he sought and found the Savior, after which he engaged in Colportage work, and while thus engaged he became conscious of the need of a clean heart. spending some time in Canada he came to the United States and located in Indiana. It was here he got sanctified wholly united with the Holiness Christian church and entered the ministry. Many of his friends will recall his testimony given so clearly, that he was born in England, born again in Canada, and sanctified in Indiana. He devoted several years to pastoral work, serving the churches at Carlisle, Ind., Three Oaks, Mich., Logansport, Ind., and Effingham, Ill. He was also Presiding Elder of the Kansas and Oklahoma District, and for several years he was editor of the church paper, "A Voice From Canaan." Brother Bradshaw was a devout Christian. He lived a life of self sacrifice. He sought not his own. He was a man of prayer and after he had lost his physical strength he was found on his knees by a chair so weak that he could not rise without aid. He lived well and he died well. As he was leaving this world his face was illuminated with the glory of God and as he gazed upward amid the tears of joy his earthly pilgrimage closed. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Chas. C. Brown, assisted by Rev. Melvin F. Pratt, nad Rev. D. C. Shearer, after which his remains were laid at rest in the City Cemetery at Carlinville, Ill. Brother Bradshaw is gone but not forgotten.
