Journal of Proceedings

MORNING SESSION, MONDAY, AUGUST 22, 1921

The second Annual Assembly of the International Holiness Church convened in the Tabernacle on the Camp Grounds at Frankfort, Indiana, Monday morning, August 22, 1921, at nine o'clock. The devotional services were in charge of Rev. Albert M. Ewing, District Superintendent, of Frankfort, Indiana. After singing "God Will Take Care of You" and "Bring Them In", the Assembly was led in prayer by Rev. Edward Schoeff, Assistant District Superintendent, of Lawrenceburg, Indiana. Rev. Ewing read for the Scripture lesson the Fourth chapter of First Corinthians. A few minutes was given for a testimony meeting, after which the Assembly was called to order with the Rev. A. M. Ewing, District Chairman, in the chair.

First in order was the Assembly Roll Call and the revision of the same. As the name of Rev. J. J. McIntosh was called the Assembly stood on their feet in memory of this dear brother who has gone to his reward.

ASSEMBLY RULES

Moved and supported that the Assembly bar shall include three sections of seats, ten seats back in the Tabernacle, and the side wing to the aisle. Motion carried.

Moved and accepted that we accept the rules given in the Church

Manual, paragraph 215 on page 95. (See Manual) Hours of session 8:00 to 11:30 a. m. and 1:30 to 5:00 p. m. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the following visiting ministers be admitted in the Assembly bar as advisory members:

Christine Penrod, Chas. M. Slusser, D. C. Shearer, Howard Beecher, R. L. Wisler, Guy C. McHenry, James W. Short, C. P. Pridgen and Martha Pridgen

Moved and supported that all motions made on the Assembly floor must be written. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the time of adjournment of this morning session be extended to 12:00 M. Motion carried.

Rev. G. C. Middleton tendered his resignation as a member of the Board of Examination, and it was accepted by the Assembly.

The following ministers were appointed by the chair to compose the Board of Examination: Rev. W. S. Dean, 3 years; Rev. C. A. Fouts, 2 years, and Rev. Area Montgomery, 1 year.

Rev. George Huff tendered his resignation as a member of the Educational Board and it was accepted by the Assembly.

Rev. Mrs. Alice Hart, of Carlisle, Indiana, was appointed by the chair to fill the vacancy made by resignation of Rev. Huff.

The chair appointed the following brethren on the Ways and Means Committee: Rev. John W. Clark, Rev. O. W. Barnes, and Rev. Area Montgomery.

Rev. A. H. Plunkett tendered his resignation as a member of the Statistical Committee, and it was accepted by the Assembly.

Moved and supported that Rev. R. W. Chatfield be released from the Statistical Committee. Motion carried.

The chair then appointed the following persons to constitute the Statistical Committee: Rev. B. A. Popejoy, Mrs. W. S. Dean, and Miss Hatlie Dunkelberger.

Adjournment.

AFTERNOON SESSION, AUGUST 22, 1921

After devotional services conducted by Rev. R. W. Chatfield, of Frankfort, Indiana, the Assembly was called to order with Rev. A. M. Ewing in the chair. After roll call the minutes of the morning session were read and adopted.

A letter of recommendation from Rev. D. C. Shearer, District Superintendent of the Illinois District, recommending the transfer of Rev. Lowell H. Coate, from the Illinois to the Indiana District, was read by the Secretary. A motion was made to receive Rev. Coate into the Assembly as an ordained minister from the Illinois District. Motion carried.

Rev. R. L. Wisler, of Elwood, Indiana, and Rev. Guy C. McHenry, of Frankfort, Indiana, members of the Nazarene Church, were invited to take seats on the platform with the District Superintendent. Rev. Wisler gave a brief address in which he expressed thankfulness for the privilege of being in our Assembly, and for the success we have obtained as an organization during the past year, and for the great camp meeting just closed. Rev. Ewing gave a short address of welcome, after which the Assembly sang "Blest be the Tie that Binds."

Moved and supported that the rules of the Manual be suspended, and Rev. C. P. Pridgen be given a vote in the Assembly. Motion carried.

The following committees were appointed by the chair: Auditing Committee, Resolution Committee, Reception Committee, and Ordination Council. (See Official Record.)

Moved and supported that all pastoral and Evangelistic reports be placed in the hands of the Secretary to be placed in the printed minutes. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we print new pastoral blanks in time for 1922 Assembly. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that all persons making application for Ordination, or the renewal of license must have their names read before the Assembly, and if any member of the Assembly shall give any reasons why said persons should not be ordained or given license, the objection must be given in writing, with the name of the objector and the person objected to. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we extend the time of the afternoon session until 5:30 o'clock. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that this Assembly be lenient with all licensed preachers on the course of study provided for in the Church Manual. Motion carried.

Motion to adjourn.

MORNING SESSION, AUGUST 23, 1921

After devotional services conducted by Rev. C. A. Fouts, of Linton, Indiana. The Assembly was called to order with Rev. A. M. Ewing in the chair. After the roll call the minutes of the previous session were read and adopted.

Moved and supported that the name of Christine Penrod, a missionary from Japan, be referred with her credentials from the Christian Church to the Board of Examination. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that Christine Penrod act as delegate for the Merom, Ind., Church. Motion carried.

The chair also referred E. P. Shrock, of Noblesville, Indiana, to the Board of Examination for Ordination.

Moved and supported that all delinquent preachers not in attendance at this Assembly be referred to the committee on Ways and Means. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the number of State Superintendents, and the number of times they will be expected to visit each local church during the coming year be referred to the committee on Ways and Means. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the chair appoint a committee to revise the by-laws of the Burial Association. Motion carried.

Committee Appointed: Rev. C. P. Pridgen, Rev. George Huff, Rev. John W. Clark, Rev. O. W. Rees, Rev. E. W. Wright.

Moved and supported that the election of officers be held at the night session tonight (Tuesday.) Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the new church organized this year at Richmond, Indiana, be received into this Assembly. Motion carried.

At this time the Assembly sang "The Ark Is Coming Up the Road" and "Our Church is Moving On," while shouts of victory went up from the Assembly.

Moved and supported that the new church at Richmond be named "MYERS CHAPEL". Motion carried. The North Landing Church will be named at the dedication services.

Moved and supported that the new church known as Mount Zion Chapel be admitted into the Assembly. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the new church organized at Mitchell, Indiana, be admitted into this Assembly. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the church at Newcastle be admitted into this Assembly, and that it be named "OAK GROVE." Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the Sparksville church be placed in the hands of the Home Missionary Board for disposition. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the matter of old churches be placed in the hands of the Home Missionary Board for disposition. Motion carried.

The Home Missionary Treasurer, Rev. W. S. Dean, gave financial report which was referred to Auditing Committee.

Motion to adjourn.

AFTERNOON SESSION, TUESDAY, AUGUST 23, 1921.

After devotional services conducted by Rev. G. W. Groshart, the Assembly was called to order with Rev. A. M. Ewing in the chair. The minutes of the morning session were read and adopted.

First in order was a free will offering to defray Assembly expenses. While the congregation sang "The Old Ark is Coming Up the Road" an offering amounting to \$165.09 was taken.

By consent Rev. E. W. Wright and Rev. O. W. Rees were placed on the committee to revise by-laws of the Burial Association.

Moved and supported that the Secretary revise the list of churches as regards location, and street numbr. Motion carried.

Rev. Area Montgomery gave the following report of the Board of Examination, which was received and referred to the Editor of minutes.

We recommend that E. P. Shrock, Donald Snow, W. F. Hinds, Mary Eva Beitzel, Beryl Weismantel, Emma Hibler, Iiah Rees and Minnie Snyder be duly ordained.

We recommend that Fred Myers, Ray Smith, Charles Slusser, Orth McCune, Lawrence Williams, Augusta Lewis, Ivan Hedrick, Donald Lewis, O. B. Harper, Oscar Decker, and Joseph Smith be granted license.

We recommend that Cora Allen, Clyde Titus, and Alice Brady be granted renewal of Deaconess license.

We recommend that S. W. Bland, A. H. Blume, Bertha Blume, and E. E. Fulkerson, be dropped from the Assembly, and their names stricken from the roll.

We recommend that Andrew Parker, Hobart Whittinghill, E. O. Harbison, Raymond Tremble, and Andrew Whitaker be referred back to their local church for Local Preachers License.

We recommend that Perry Runnells, Ira Lundy, Gilbert Goins, and Charles Gaither be referred to the State Council, as they have no recommendation from their local church advisory board.

Moved and supported that all applicants for license who do not attend the Assembly in person be referred back to their local church board. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we have two ministerial conventions during this Assembly year. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we have one convention in the North and one in the South part of the State, the division line being the Pennsylvania railroad running through Indianapolis, Ind. Motion carried.

Rev. John W. Williams, pastor of the Tabernacle Church at Marion gave a special invitation to have the convention in the north district in Marion. The invitation was accepted.

Rev. V. A. Popejoy, pastor of the North Vernon church, gave an invitation to hold the South district convention in his church. This invitation was also accepted.

Moved and supported that the State Superintendent set the dates for these conventions. Motion carried.

Mrs. Alice Hart, District Treasurer of the Foreign Missionary Board, gave a financial report for the year, which was received and referred to the Auditing Committee.

Rev. Area Montgomery read the following report of the Committee on Ways and Means.

Article 1

We recommend that each local church that has not already decided on the salary for the pastor for the coming year meet immediately after the annual business meeting and decide on the minimum amount to be paid for the year. And that in the future each church shall decide on the preacher's salary at the annual business meeting to be held just prior to the District Assembly. We further recommend that each church calling or changing preachers shall pay all transportation charges on household goods and the carfare of the pastor and his family, and where the church has no parsonage the Advisory Board shall provide a suitable house for him. Recommendation carried.

Article 2

We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid Twenty-three Hundred Dollars (\$2,300) this year, said amount to include all of his traveling expenses. Recommendation carried.

Article 3

We recommend that inasmuch as the District Superintendent receives a stipulated salary, that his entire time be given to the interests of the International Holiness Church. Recommendation carried.

Article 4

We recommend that the District Superintendent visit each church on the district at least once annually as provided in the Church Manual, page 30, paragraph 61, article 2. Recommendation carried.

Article 5

We recommend the District Secretary be paid the sum of Twenty-five dollars for editing the Assembly Minutes. Recommendation carried.

Article 6

We recommend that our local churches adopt the budget system, and that Fifteen Per Cent (15 per cent) of gross receipts of both the Church and Sunday School, based on the minimum amount of Seventy Thousand Dollars, (\$70,000) to be apportioned each church according to membership, be sent to the District Treasury on or before the first day of each month. Said amount to be paid out under the direction of the District Council as follows: State Expenses, Orphanage, Rescue Home, Home Missions, Educational Institutions, etc., Foreign Missions to be excluded. Recommendation carried.

Article 7

We recommend that each local church send all money due the District from the budget raised, direct to the District Secretary, Rev. John W. Clark, 1258 First Street, Frankfort, Indiana, not later than the first day of each month. If a church desires to raise their 15 per cent by special offerings, the amount sent to District Secretary each month must not be less than one-twelfth of total apportionment. Recommendation carried.

Article 8

We recommend that the salary of the Home Missionary Evangelist be left in the hands of the District Council. Recommendation carried.

Article 9

We recommend that each church in the District make at least Two (2) bed comforters and donate them to the Camp Meeting Committee for use in the Annual Camp Meetings. Recommendation carried.

Article 10

We recommend that the District Secretary have 600 copits of the Assembly Minutes printed. Recommendation carried.

NIGHT SESSION, TUESDAY, AUGUST 23, 1921

After devotional services conducted by Rev. George Huff, of Sullivan, Ind., the night session of the Assembly was called to order with Rev. A. M. Ewing in the chair. The minutes of the afternoon session were read and adopted.

Moved and supported that we proceed at once to elect officers for the ensuing year. Motion carried. At this time the Assembly had a season of prayer for divine guidance in the election of officers. The chair then appointed the following tellers to pass and count ballots: Rev. George Huff, Rev. W. S. Dean, Rev. W. A. Frye, Rev. A. C. Harris, Rev. C. P. Bridgen, and Rev. Plen Smith

Moved and supported that Martha Pridgen and Howard Beecher be granted the ballot. Motion carried.

First was the election of District Superintendent, and Rev. Albert M. Ewing was elected on the first ballot.

While the tellers were counting ballots the little Misses Mary and Martha Hamilton, the three-year-old twin daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Hamilton, of Frankfort, Ind., sang "He is My Pilot", I've been redeemed," and in the "Sweet by and by" to the delight of all present. Moved and supported that it be placed in printed minutes. Motion carried.

Rev. Edward Schoeff was elected Assistant Superintendent on first ballot.

Rev. John W. Clark was elected District Secretary on the first ballot.

Rev. R. W. Chatfield was elected District Treasurer on the first ballot.

The Dunkelberger Sisters sang "My Mansion in the Sky" and Rev. Area Montgomery gave two readings which were received with enthusiasm by the Assembly.

Rev. E. J. Clem, of Miami, Ind., was elected Home Missionary Evangelist on the second ballot.

Moved and supported that the Secretary cast ballot for the election of Rev. W. S. Dean, Rev. George Huff and Rev. W. A. Frye, as Advisory Members of the State Council. Motion carried and Secretary cast the ballot.

Moved and supported that we adjourn at 10:00 p. m. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that we change the name of the Burial Association from the Holiness Christian to International Holiness. Motion carried.

Motion to adjourn.

MORNING SESSION, WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 24, 1921

After devotional services, the Assembly was called to order with Rev. A. M. Ewing in the chair. After the roll call the minutes of the night session were read and adopted.

Moved and supported that this Assembly recommend that the General Council call a special session of the General Assembly within the next sixty days for the reconstruction of the church in all its offices, and to revise the Church Manual. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that, in case a special session of the General Assembly should be called, that we hereby empower the District Council with power to select the delegates. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the chair appoint a committee of five to prepare resolutions to be presented by this Assembly to the General Assembly. Motion carried. Rev. O. W. Rees, C. P. Pridgen, John W. Williams, C. A. Fouts, and James Pursley were appointed.

Moved and supported that the chair appoint a committee of five to apportion the local churches for the budget to be raised for state expenses. Motion carried. Alice Hart, Beryl Weismantel, Katie Dunkelberger, Hattie Dunkelberger, and Martha Pridgen were appointed.

Moved and supported that we continue the election of officers. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the Secretary cast a ballot for re-election of the present Camp Meeting Committee. Motion carried. (See Official Record).

The following Foreign Missionary Board was elected by ballot: Alice Hart, Beryl Weismantel and Earl E. Davis.

Moved and supported the chair appoint the Burial Association Board. Motion carried. (See Official Record).

Moved and supported that Rev. E. W. Wright, the Burial Association Secretary, be paid the sum of Twenty dollars (\$20) for each single assessment, and Thirty-five dollars for double assessment. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that this Assembly send fraternal greetings in person to the Nazarene Assembly which will convene in Seymour, Ind., August 30-September 4, 1921. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the Secretary cast ballot for two fraternal delegates to the Nazarene Assembly. Motion carried. Secretary cast a ballot for Rev. A. M. Ewing and Rev. R. W. Chatfield.

Moved and supported that the fixing of dates for camp meeting and the Annual Assembly be left in the hands of the Camp Meeting Committee. Motion carried. The dates fixed: Camp Meeting, August 11-20 inclusive; District Assembly, August 21-24, 1921. Don't forget these dates.

The report of the Statistical Committee was read and referred to Editor of Minutes. (See Tables.)

Motion to adjourn.

Resolution 5

Inasmuch as Ed N. Thacker, reporter for the Morning Times, took great pains to write many good and interesting things about our camp meeting and workers, Resolved, That we thank him very kindly and give him a hearty invitation to come again next year. Carried.

Resolution 6

Inasmuch as the Claypool-Dunbar Music Company, of Frankfort, Ind., so kindly loaned us a new piano from their stock for our camp meeting this year, Resolved, That we show our appreciation of same by rising vote. Resolution carried.

Resolution 7

Inasmuch as God so wonderfully helped in giving us such fine missionary services, and in sending in such splendid spirit filled missionaries to help us, Resolved, That we give Him all the glory and show our appreciation of the labors of the missionaries by a rising vote. Resolution carried.

Moved and supported that the Indiana District Assembly establish a state school at Frankfort, Ind., as soon as practical. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that Rev. Edward Schoeff be excused from the Assembly on account of sickness. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the ordination services for next year be held on Tuesday afternoon at 2:30, and all candidates for ordination be instructed to be present at the last three days of the camp meeting so they can appear before the Board of Examiners. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the State Treasurer's financial report be printed in the Assembly Minutes. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that all books of financial records be ready for auditing committee before the opening of next annual Assembly. Motion carried.

As Orville Maish and Henry Cornelius have asked for a recommendation to the Nazarene Church, moved and supported that their request be granted, and their names stricken from the Assembly roll. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that this Annual Assembly recommend that the General Assembly discuss, revise, or change any part of the Church manual without its having been voted or passed by this District Assembly. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that this Assembly recommend to the General Assembly that no pastor be dismissed from any local church between the Annual Assemblies except for immorality, breach of covenant, or the propagation of doctrines contrary to our articles of faith. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that Assembly printed minutes sell at fifteen cents a copy. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that this District Assembly clothe the Camp Meeting Committee with power to employ a custodian to care for the camp grounds between each annual camp meeting and assembly. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that the District Superintendent arrange the dates for four Quarterly meetings, and that all churches hold their Quarterly meetings on these dates, except where a pastor has two churches, then the meeting at his one church shall be held as near the date given as possible. Motion carried.
