This has been a good year for our church in all ways, and the Lord has blessed us greatly, for which we praise Him and give Him all the Glory. Two services have been held in the church every Sunday during the year and sometimes three, except the last Sunday of Camp Meeting, when we had no service. The Lord has most graciously granted to us a year of victory, not only in a few ways but we feel that in no way has he suffered us to take a backward step.

Upon our arrival in the Orient we were detained in Tokyo, Japan for a few months at our headquarters there, as it was necessary that Bro. Kilbourne should go to Korea. While we were there the Lord blessed our labours and gave us souls.

Voted that as a district assembly, we ask the general council to call a special session of the General Assembly to take care of the immediate needs.

Voted that the new state board be a nominating committee to nominate delegates to the called General Assembly.

Voted that we publish the Minutes of the Assembly in book form.

Voted that the chair appoint a committee to edit the minutes of the assembly and get them ready for book form.

Voted that each pastor on the District take a special offering to defray the expense of sending the delegates to the special General Assembly.

The following resolutions were presented by the resolution committee and were passed on by the Convention. These resolutions to go to the next General Assembly.

Resolutions

First—Be it resolved, that the time of the General Assembly be changed from Nov. 1923 to Nov. 1924 and that the General Assembly be convened every two years thereafter.

Second—Be it resolved, that the Dist. Advisory board have the right or power to initiate charges against any minister of the District for immoral conduct.

Third—Be it resolved, that the calling of a pastor be determined by three fourths vote of the resident membership of the local church after two weeks notice; said candidate to be nominated by a three-fourths vote of the local advisory board. (This resolution is to be a substitute for section 75 page 36 in the Manual.)

Fourth—Be it resolved, that the District Supts. be a nominating committee for the purpose of nominating candidates for the general Missionary board; said board to be elected by a majority vote of the General Assembly.

Fifth—Be it resolved, that the General Missionary board consist of not more than nine members.

Sixth—Be it resolved, that a District Missionary Sec.-Treasurer be elected annually by each District assembly; said Secretary Treasurer shall cooperate with the General Missionary board. The duties of the Secretary Treasurer shall be to furnish general Missionary Information to the pastors

on the District and to receive Missionary offerings from the various churches on the District, receipting for the same to the local church Treasurer; said funds to be forwarded monthly to the Treasurer of the General Missionary board.

Seventh—Be it resolved, that a General Supt. be elected at each session of the General Assembly; said Supt. to devote his entire time to the interests of the church at a salary of \$2500.00 per year.

Eighth—Be it resolved, that a first and second Assistant General Supt. be elected and in event of death, resignation or removal by other causes of General Supt. first Assistant Supt. shall automatically become General Supt. and the Second assistant shall automatically become first assistant General Supt.

Ninth—Be it resolved, that any candidate seeking the office of General Supt. shall thereby be disqualified for election.

Tenth—Be it resolved, that a fund be created based upon twenty-five percent of the preachers tythe; said funds to meet the needs of the General Supt. office and publishing interests. Balance of needs to be met by free-will offerings.

Eleventh—Be it resolved, that our Dist. Home Missionary funds be supplied by an annual offering based upon a minimum of two dollars per member; to be gathered by the pastors quarterly; said funds to be forwarded to the Dist. Treasurer.
