I herewith submit report of work, remembering that for four months and a half I have been laid to one side owing to too strenuous labor and official cares, that no one man ought to have borne. God is restoring me and in April I expect to begin again my work in meetings believing God for souls and victory. Paul and Myrtle Haines Report Annual Report of Paul and Myrtle Haines from Seoul, Korea, Reported by mail. To the brethern and Sisters in session at the Michigan State Convention, greetings in the name of our Blessed Lord: We are glad to be able to send a few lines of victory to be added with the rest of the reports from our colaborers in the vinyard of the Lord. The Lord has most graciously granted to us a year of victory, not only in a few ways but we feel that in no way has he suffered us to take a backward step.

Upon our arrival in the Orient we were detained in Tokyo, Japan for a few months at our headquarters there, as it was necessary that Bro. Kilbourne should go to Korea. While we were there the Lord blessed our labours and gave us souls.

About the last of June we were permitted to come on to Korea, the needy land to which we started when we left Michigan over a year ago. Our entrance into Korea was quite a thrilling occasion indeed, as we landed in the middle of the night and had to cross swellen streams and ride thru mud carrying the baggage on our backs, which our baggage carriers refused to carry when we were yet a long way from the home of Bro. and Sister Orkney, in whose home we were first entertained when we reached Korea. We are now studying the language and feel that the Lord is giving us special help, as he has enabled us to pass our examinations on the first terms work with good marks. Your faithful prayers have helped and are helping us. May God help you to continue.

Mrs. Haines is also being blessed in song in these lands where the songs of true gladness have entered, comparatively few hearts. She is also teaching music in the Bible Training Institute, and is thoroughly enjoying her work for the Master.

We have preached about twenty-five times. If ave seen over one hundred souls seek God. We are expecting greater results as the language becomes more and more our own. The one thing that encourages us here is that souls are hungry enough to seek God, even after getting a message second hand thru an interpreter. What will they do if they get the message direct? Please pray for us fervently.

Let us keep filled with fire and the Holy Ghost until we pass beyond the smoke of battle and stack our arms on the other side. Amen. Your Brother and Sister in Bonds of Christian Love.

Voted that as a district assembly, we ask the general council to call a special session of the General Assembly to take care of the immediate needs.

Voted that the new state board be a nominating committee to nominate delegates to the called General Assembly.

Voted that we publish the Minutes of the Assembly in book form.

Voted that the chair appoint a committee to edit the minutes of the assembly and get them ready for book form.

Voted that each pastor on the District take a special offering to defray the expense of sending the delegates to the special General Assembly.

The following resolutions were presented by the resolution committee and were passed on by the Convention. These resolutions to go to the next General Assembly.

First—Be it resolved, that the time of the General Assembly be changed from Nov. 1923 to Nov. 1924 and that the General Assembly be convened every two years thereafter.

Second—Be it resolved, that the Dist. Advisory board have the right or power to enitiate charges against any minister of the District for immoral conduct.

Third—Be it resolved, that the calling of a pastor be determined by three fourths vote of the resident membership of the local church after two weeks notice; said candidate to be nominated by a three-fourths vote of the local advisory board. (This resolution is to be a substitute for section 75 page 36 in the Manual.)

Fourth—Be it resolved, that the District Supts. be a nominating committee for the purpose of nominating candidates for the general Missionary board; said board to be elected by a majority vote of the General Assembly.

Fifth—Be it resolved, that the General Missionary board consist of not more than nine members.

Sixth—Be it resolved, that a District Missionary Sec.-Treasurer be elected annually by each District assembly; said Secretary Treasurer shall cooperate with the General Missionary board. The duties of the Secretary Treasurer shall be to furnish general Missionary Information to the pastors

on the District and to receive Missionary offerings from the various churches on the District, receipting for the same to the local church Treasurer; said funds to be forwarded monthly to the Treasurer of the General Missionary board.

Seventh—Be it resolved, that a General Supt. be elected at each session of the General Assembly; said Supt. to devote his entire time to the interests of the church at a salary of \$2500.00 per year.

Eighth—Be it resolved, that a first and second Assistant General Supt. be elected and in event of death, resignation or removal by other causes of General Supt. first Assistant Supt. shall automatically become General Supt. and the Second assistant shall automatically become first assistant General Supt.

Ninth—Be it resolved, that any candidate seeking the office of General Supt. shall thereby be disqualified for election.

Tenth—Be it resolved, that a fund be created based upon twenty-five percent of the preachers tythe; said funds to meet the needs of the General Supt. office and publishing interests. Balance of needs to be met by free-will offerings.

Eleventh—Be it resolved, that our Dist. Home Missionary funds be supplied by an annual offering based upon a minimum of two dollars per member; to be gathered by the pastors quarterly; said funds to be forwarded to the Dist. Treasurer.
