of the

SIXTEENTH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE KANSAS DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

First Session Monday, August 12th, 1929

The first session of the Sixteenth Annual Assembly of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Hutchinson, Kan., at 7:30 a. m., August 12th, 1929, with Rev. Howard Beecher in the chair. Devotional services were led by Rev. Beecher.

Moved and supported that Oscar Frank be delegate from Bird City. Carried.

Roll call read and corrected.

Moved and supported that two center rows of seats constitute the Assembly bar. Carried.

Minutes of the last session were read and approved.

Moved and supported that the chair appoint the committees and fill the vacancies in existing committees. Carried.

Moved and supported that we omit the reading of the reports and that these reports be given to statistical committee. Carried.

Moved and supported that all ministers acting as pastors in the district and those expecting to come into the Assembly be granted Assembly privileges subject to the examining board. Carried.

Rev. E. M. Smith, Bro. Engle, and Bro. Lorenson were introduced to the Assembly and gave their testimonies.

Moved and supported that Assembly hear appointment of committees. Carried. Committees appointed as follows:

Statistical—Howard Busby, J. E. Isgrigg, S. H. Umbarger.

Resolution—Mrs. J. J. Cork, Mrs. C. A. Brockman, J. H. Philpot, E. M. Smith.

Auditing—Hazel Taylor, Bessie Cork, Bertha Busby.

Foreign Missionary—R. H. Smith, J. H. Fortner.

Moved and supported to adjourn until 10:00 a. m.

Second Session August 12th, 1929

Session opened with Supt. H. J. Beecher in charge.

Moved and supported that visiting ministers be admitted into the Assembly bar as honorary members. Carried.

Moved and supported that in the absence of the delegate the pastor appoint a delegate and in case of absence of pastor the chair shall fill

said vacancy. Carried.

Moved and supported that we adjourn at 12 m. and convene at 1:30 p. m. Carried.

Moved and supported that we adjourn at 5 p. m., convene again at 7:30 p. m. and adjourn on decision of Assembly to convene Tuesday morning at 7:45. Carried.

Moved and supported that we set time for election of officers at 1 p. m. Lost.

Moved and supported that we set time for the election of officers at 4 p. m. providing the examining board has examined all candidates for admission into the Assembly. Carried.

Rev. Oral Morgan, Rev. Richard Felsburg, Rev. W. E. Hall, and Rev. W. F. Beck were introduced to the Assembly and gave their testimonies.

Motion to adjourn in order.

Third Session August 12th, 1929

Session opened at 1:30 p. m. with Supt. H. J. Beecher in chair. Devotional services were conducted by Asst. Supt. M. M. Conrad.

Moved and supported that Bro. Stalcup be received into conference bar with conference privileges as delegate from Woodlawn. Carried.

Moved and supported that Sister Stalcup be received into Assembly bar as an honorary member. Carried.

Sister Morgan was introduced to the Assembly and gave her testimony after which a motion was passed receiving her into the Assembly with Assembly privileges.

Partial report of Resolution Committee read and acted on.

Partial report of Ways and Means Committee acted on.

Partial report of Examining Board read and acted on.

Bro. Dunham was introduced to the Assembly and granted an honorary seat in the conference bar.

Moved and supported that Sister Morgan sing a song. Carried.

Election of officers after prayer.

Rev. H. J. Beecher elected on first ballot District Superintendent.

Rev. L. L. Waddell elected Assistant District Superintendent.

Rev. J. H. Fortner elected on first ballot, District Secretary.

Mrs. J. J. Cork elected on first ballot, District Treasurer.

Rev. Benj. Brockman, Rev. A. E. Smith, and Rev. M. M. Conrad were elected as the other members of the council.

Moved and supported that the district council act as Home and Foreign Missionary Boards. Carried.

Moved and supported that rules of Assembly be suspended and that vacancy on examining board be filled by voting by acclamation. Carried.

Moved and supported that Bro. A. E. Smith be elected to fill vacancy on Examining Board. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Secretary cast the ballot of the Assembly for Rev. M. M. Conrad, Rev. Howard Beecher and Rev. O. M. Maris for District Trustees. Carried. I hereby cast my ballot for these three men named. The chair declared them elected.

District Treasurer's report read and accepted.

Moved and supported that District Secretary present his bill for postage on Minutes and that the District Treasurer be instructed to pay the same. Carried.

Moved and supported that the District pay Secretary and Treasurer \$20 each for their services during past year. Carried.

Fourth Session August 12th, 1929

Session opened at 7:30 p. m. with Asst. Supt. M. M. Conrad presiding over devotional services. A testimony meeting was conducted and God's marvellous blessing was manifested.

Roll call read and approved.

Moved and supported that a recess of 15 minutes be granted. Carried.

Partial report of Resolution Committee was read and acted on.

Motion to adjourn until 7:45 Tuesday morning.

Fifth Session August 13th, 1929

Session opened at 8:00 a. m. with District Supt. H. J. Beecher in chair.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Moved and supported that we omit the reading of the roll call. Carried.

Moved and supported that we reconsider the purchase of the camp ground. Carried.

Moved and supported that we close the consideration. Carried.

Moved and supported that we retain the camp ground. Lost.

Moved and supported the District have the piano repaired and placed in church at close of camp. Carried.

Moved and supported that we receive the report of the Home Missionary. Carried.

Moved and supported that we have election of Home Missionary. Carried.

Rev. J. H. Philpot elected Home Missionary.

Final report of Resolution Committee read and acted on.

Moved and supported that recommendation No. 8 of the Ways and Means Committee be lifted from table. Carried.

Final report of Ways and Means Committee read and acted on.

Moved and supported that we vote collectively on the report of examining board. Carried.

Moved and supported that we receive the report of the examining board. Carried.

Moved and supported that we receive the camp meeting treasurer's report. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Assembly grant the council the power and authority to set time, place of camp and the calling of evangelists, and other workers. Carried.

Final report of the Resolution Committee read and acted on.

Moved and supported that Bro. Waddell write a memoir of Bro. J. E. Benjamin and that it be entered in the minutes as a separate item. Carried.

Moved and supported that all money raised for the Colorado Springs Bible School be sent directly to Rev. P. W. Thomas through the local

church treasurer. Carried.

Report of Foreign Missionary Committee read and acted on.

Report of Auditing Committee read and accepted.

Report of Statistical Committee read and accepted.

Moved and supported that the council prepare a list of appointments including the preachers and their charges. Carried.

Moved and supported that a love offering of not less than \$10 be taken for Bro. and Sister Brockman for their services in the camp. Carried. \$11.55 was taken in the offering for Bro. Brockman.

Moved and supported that Bro. Beecher give a verbal report now and write his report to be published in minutes. Carried.

Moved and supported that we receive the report of the District Supt. Carried.

Moved and supported that the secretary read Bro. Solter's letter of greeting. Carried.

Report of Bro. Solter read and accepted.

Moved and supported that the District council apportion the churches to cover the present demands on the District for Gen. Supt. and Pilgrim Holiness Advocate. Carried. See Ways and Means Committee Report. Moved and supported that each church be apportioned at the rate of 10 cents per member for Pilgrim Holiness Advocate and that said apportionment be sent to the District reasurer. Carried.

Motion to adjourn.



Report of the **WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE**

1. We recommend that this District observe the financial plan recommended by the General Assembly with the privilege of supplementing it. Carried.

2. We recommend that each Sunday School pay the sum of \$1.00 per month into the Home Missionary fund. Carried.

3. We recommend that this District pay District Superintendent \$1,000.00 and his traveling expenses be met by free will offerings from the church on his visits and that any church calling him for trouble other than his regular visit pay his expenses. Carried.

4. We recommend the printing of 300 copies of minutes, the same to be sold at 20 cents per copy. Carried.

5. We recommend that all money raised by Home Missionary in Home Missionary Meetings, above incidental expenses, be sent to Treasurer; and that Home Missionary send in monthly report to Treasurer; said Missionary to be paid \$20.00 per week and traveling expenses and that he receive his check weekly. Carried.

6. We recommend that this Assembly elect a Home Missionary upon nomination of District Council. Carried.

7. Upon recommendation of District Supt., Home Missionary be permitted to hold revival meetings in weak churches. Carried.

8. We recommend that each local congregation pay one-half of the ministerial tith to the District Treasurer for Home Missionary work in the District. Carried.

9. We recommend that each pastor raise from his church an amount equal to twenty-five cents per member for General Superintendent support. Carried.

REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

We, the Committee on Resolutions, beg leave to submit the following report:

1. Resolved, That all reports be made out in full and sent to the District Secretary previous to the opening session of the Assembly and all money be sent to the District Treasurer one week before the camp. Carried.

2. Resolved, That the District Camp have Children's meetings and Young People's Services in 1930 and that the District Council employ workers for the same. Carried.

3. Resolved, That the District have at least one Ministerial Convention during the year and that the District Council determine the time and place. Carried.

4. Resolved, That our pastors and evangelists arrange their revival meetings so as not to conflict with the above Convention. Carried.

5. Realizing the great need of an earnest and intense Home Missionary Spirit and zealous work in our District, be it resolved that the Assembly intrust the pastors and evangelists to hold at least two Home Missionary Services during the year at which time a special offering shall be taken and the same to be forwarded to the District Treasurer. Carried.

6. Be it Resolved, That we hold the Assembly in connection with the Camp, plan to be worked out by the Council. Carried.

7. Resolved, That each active minister be released for two Sundays during Camp and that they receive regular salary for this time. Carried.

8. Resolved, That no pastor shall employ an evangelist for a revival without the indorsement of the District Superintendent. Carried.

9. Resolved, That representatives from our various General Church institutions and departments shall be received in our District to represent their causes as they may be arranged for by the District Superintendent, or the District Council. Carried.

10. Resolved, That this Assembly instruct all pastors to do their best to get their churches to adopt a plan of systematic giving so that each member shall feel his responsibility to the church according to his ability. Carried.

11. Resolved, That we express, by a rising vote, our appreciation to the pastor and wife (Bro. and Sister Brockman) and members of the Hutchinson Church for their entertainment and hospitality during the Camp and Assembly. Carried.

12. Resolved, That all who can, remain at the close of the Assembly for at least one day to assist in clearing the Camp ground. Carried.

13. Whereas, There is a fearful tendency toward worldliness in these days in the matter of dress, bobbed hair, face paint, rouge, lip stick, backbiting, gossiping, unfriendly criticism, cigaret smoking, attending movies and street carnivals and a multitude of like evils, be it resolved that we instruct our pastors and evangelists to sound a clear note of warning againt indulging in such, as they are contrary to the teachings of the Bible and our Manual and any who are not saved from these evils be not admitted to membership in our church and any of our members who shall be found indulging in these same evils shall be dealt with according to Section 80 in the Manual. Carried.

14. Resolved, That the District Council print stationery for the

District Council and all other officers, pastors, evangelists, deaconesses, and local preachers of the District, the same to be purchased from the District Superintendent and be it further resolved that the same be furnished the Council free of charge and bill for same to be paid by District Treasurer. Carried.

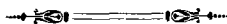
15. Resolved, That our pastors be advised by the Assembly to employ evangelists of our own church in preference to others. Carried.

1. We recommend that one service each month be devoted to the interest of Foreign Missions and that offerings shall be taken for same. Carried.

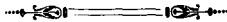
