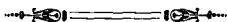

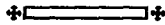

FIRST SESSION TUESDAY A. M., AUGUST 4, 1931

The first session of the 18th Annual Assembly of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened at Lincoln, Kansas, August 4, 1931, at 8:15 a. m., with Dist. Supt. L. L. Waddell in the chair. Devotional services were conducted by Rev. Waddell. Special prayer was offered in behalf of Sr. Williams of Goodland, who was to undergo an operation.

The roll call was read and corrected.

Moved and supported that the two center rows of seats constitute the Assembly bar. Carried.

Moved and supported we convene at 8:15 a. m., and continue until 12:00. Carried.

Moved and supported we continue the business sessions of this Assembly in afternoons from 1:30 to 5:00 o'clock. Carried.

Moved and supported that the chair appoint the committees. Carried. Viz.:

SECOND SESSION TUESDAY P. M., AUGUST 4, 1931

Moved and supported that the election of officers take place immediately following report Ways and Means Committee. Carried.

Partial report of Ways and Means Committee read; accepted.

Rev. A. E. Smith, Rev. M. M. Conrad and Rev. J. J. Cork were elected as the other members of the council.

Moved and supported that we suspend the rules of the Assembly and leave the present members of the examining board remain in office for the coming year. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Assembly ratify the action of District Superintendent in the incorporation of the District and the securing of charter for same. Carried

Moved and supported that the secretary cast the ballot for the five names on the charter to act as Trustees of Kansas District of Pilgrim Holiness Church. Carried.

Secretary cast ballot for M. M. Conrad, H. J. Beecher, O. M. Maris, L. L. Waddell and J. J. Cork. Motion to adjourn.

FOURTH SESSION WEDNESDAY P. M., AUG. 5, 1931

Session began with Supt. Waddell in chair.

Moved and supported that the Assembly have a recess until 4:00 o'clock. Carried.

Moved and supported that V. C. Martin preach at this time.

Moved and supported to dispense with the reading of the roll call. Carried.

Minutes of last session read and accepted. Partial report of Ways and Means Committee read and carried. Report of Examining Board read and accepted.

Moved and supported that the Assembly receive the recommendation of the Council and receive Brother S. H. Umbarger as an ordained minister and Mrs. Umbarger as an ordained deaconess. Carried. Partial report of Resolution Committee read and acted upon. Partial report of Foreign Missionary Committee read and acted upon. Motion to adjourn.

FIFTH SESSION THURSDAY A. M., AUG. 6, 1931

Session opened with Rev. Waddell in chair. Moved and seconded to dispense with the reading of roll call. Carried. Minutes of last session read and accepted.

Moved and supported that Brother Solter give an explanation of the budget system. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Assembly express their appreciation of Brother Solter's speech by a rising vote. Carried.

District Treasurer's report read and accepted.

Moved and supported to welcome the Fowler Church into the Assembly. Carried.

Moved and supported that Brother Burton, treasurer of Fowler Church, give an estimated account of money raised in their Church. Carried.

Rev. Sapp was introduced to the Assembly and given an honorary seat in the Assembly bar.

Moved and supported that the District turn over all legal pap-

ers to Fredonia Camp Ground to the Fredonia Church. Carried.

Assistant District Superintendent's report read and accepted.

Partial report of Ways and Means Committee read and carried.

Partial report of Resolution Committee read and accepted.

Partial report of Foreign Missionary Committee read and acted upon.

Moved and supported that the ordination service be Friday at 10 o'clock and District Superintendent give ordination address. Carried.

Moved and supported that the secretary of Examining and Educational Board secure questions on study course and send same to license preachers and licentiates shall forward examination papers to Secretary for grading. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Assembly adjourn until 8:30 A. M. Friday.

SIXTH SESSION FRIDAY A. M., AUGUST 7, 1931

Session opened with L. L. Waddell in chair.

Moved and supported to dispense with the reading of roll call. Carried.

Minutes of last session read and accepted.

Moved and supported to have printed a table of percentages of the general budget. Carried

Partial report of Examining Board read and accepted.

Moved and supported to show appreciation of District Secretary and Treasurer by remunerating them \$10 each for their services. Carried.

Moved and supported that time, place, and workers for 1932 Camp be left to District Council. Carried.

Moved and supported that District Council act as stationing committee. Carried.

Moved and supported to have a small tent pitched on Camp Ground and labelled Home and Foreign Missionary Tent and Book Stand. Carried.

Moved and supported that chairman appoint a chairman of book stand and that he appoint two assistants to see that the former action is carried out. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Assembly set as their goal to get as many subscriptions to Advocate as members in the District. Carried. Report of statistical committee read and accepted.

Moved and supported that District Secretary handle the ordering and dispensing of report blanks during the year and expense of same be paid by district. Carried. Motion to adjourn.

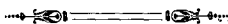
REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

We, the Committee on Resolutions, beg leave to submit the following report:

- 1—Resolved, That our conference year close on week previous to our Assembly, all reports be made out in full, and all money be sent directly to the District Treasurer immediately afterward. Carried.
- 2—Resolved, That the District Camp have children's meetings and young people's services at Camp meeting in 1932. Carried.
- 3—Resolved, That the District have at least one ministerial convention during the year and that the District Council determine time, place and worker. Carried.
- 4—Resolved, That our pastors and evangelists arrange their revival meetings so as not to conflict with the above convention. Carried.
- 5—Resolved, That the pastor have the privilege of holding two revival meetings off of charge during coming year. Carried.
- 6—Be it Resolved, That we hold the Assembly in connection with the camp, plan to be worked out by the Council. Carried
- 7—Resolved, that each active minister be released for two Sundays during camp and that they receive regular salary for this time. Carried.
- 8—Resolved, That no pastor shall employ an evangelist for a revival without the indorsement of the District Superintendent. Carried.
- 9—Resolved, That each church send to Camp Meeting six tea towels, two crash towels, and two bed ticks; and that the pastor present this need to his people. Carried.
- 10—Resolved, That we pay Rev. Albert Smith and helpers \$30 for clearing up Camp Ground and money to be taken out of Camp Meeting fund. Carried.
- 11—Resolved, That we express by a rising vote our appreciation to the pastor and wife (Brother and Sister Smith) and members of the Lincoln Church for their entertainment and hospitality during camp and Assembly. Carried.
- 12—Resolved, That all who can, remain at the close of Assembly for at least one day to assist in clearing the camp ground. Carried.
- 13—Whereas, There is a fearful tendency toward worldliness in these days in the matter of dress, bobbed hair, rouge, lip stick, backbiting, gossiping, unfriendly criticism, cigarette smoking, attending movies, and street carnivals, and a multitude of like evils, be it Resolved that we instruct our pastors and evangelists to sound a clear note of warning against indulging in such, as they are contrary to the teachings of the Bible and our Manual, and any who are not saved from these be not admitted to membership in our church and any of our members who shall be found indulging in these same evils shall be dealt with according to Section 39 in the Manuel. Carried.
- 14—Resolved, That District have stationary printed and that pastors and active workers order amount wanted and pay Secretary for same. Carried.
- 15—Be it Resolved, That we, as an Assembly, express our thanks and appreciation to the Business Men, Fair Association, and Citizens of Lincoln for their hospitable entertainment and use of Fair grounds, and same to be printed in Lincoln paper. This Resolution to be drafted by Secretary. Carried.
- 16—Resolved, That the disapproval of this Assembly be upon all ordained

and licensed preachers, pastors, evangelists, or active workers, in our connection absenting themselves from the Annual Assembly without reasonable cause. Carried.

- 17—Resolved that we be lovers of the Word and not hearers only. Carried.
 18— Be it Resolved, That we, the members of Kansas District now in session at Lincoln, Kansas, offer grateful thanks unto God for His guidance of, and blessing upon, our labors of the past year. Carried.
 19—Whereas, God has commanded us to preach the Word and to evangelize the world, therefore be it Resolved, that we extend our Home Missionary work by giving it our best support by prayer and financial aid. Carried.



REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

- 1—We recommend that we as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, adopt and support, as far as possible, the financial system recommended by the General Assembly.
- 2—We recommend that all active ministers pay one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of their ministerial tithe direct to the District Treasurer, to be applied on the District Supt.'s salary.
- 3—We recommend that the District Supt. give his time to the District and Home Missionary work. We further recommend that we give him the privilege of conducting not more than three (3) Revivals outside of the District.
- 4—We recommend that we pay our District Supt. \$1500 per year and that free-will offerings be taken by the pastors, to apply on his traveling expenses.
- 5—We recommend all offerings received in Evangelistic and Home Missionary work be paid into the District Treasury.
- 6—We recommend that the District pay all traveling incidental expenses connected with Home Missionary work.
- 7—We recommend each Sunday School pay one dollar per month into the Home Missionary fund.
- 8—We recommend the printing of three hundred (300) copies of minutes and each church take free-will offerings to help pay for same.
- 9—We recommend that each local church pay into the District Treasury for District expense, at the rate of 7% of the amount paid to their pastor.
- 10—We recommend that the District Supt. deduct his traveling expense from his evangelistic offering.
- 11—We recommend that all churches calling the District Supt. on trouble calls pay his traveling expenses.
- 12—We recommend that the churches be apportioned as follows:

- 13—We recommend all churches endeavor to send all money to District treasurer monthly.
- 14—We recommend that we pay our District Supt.'s moving expenses.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

I desire to submit a report of my labors as District Superintendent, for the year ending August First, Nineteen Hundred Thirty One. This report is only intended to cover one half of the District work for the past year, as my assistant Brother H. J. Beecher made the last round over the District, and assisted in the work of the District in many ways. God helped me to make all the churches one time and some of them more. One church was organized this year, even though it had a small membership. However, with only four men, a few women and children, it was successful in building a beautiful new stucco church building with full basement, and they raised more than three thousand dollars in cash, even more than most any other church in the District. This new church is in Fowler.

Besides a heavy correspondence, we were finally successful in getting the District duly incorporated, and have received our charter. The District has paid me three hundred dollars, besides some of the churches have given free-will offerings to pay on traveling expenses; these offerings have totaled about fifty dollars. The Home Missionary Treasurer also paid me one hundred and ten dollars to reimburse expense in traveling, phone calls, telegrams, Charter, Etc. We did not keep accurate mileage, nevertheless, we drove thousands of miles in the interest of the District and Home Missionary work, preached about thirty times. Visited several homes.

In the main this has been a great year with a Spirit of Divine Love on the Ministry, Kansas never had preachers who were more self sacrificing and happier than today, Praise God. Most of the churches are taking advance steps, some almost doubling their membership. We must do our best, no less will be sufficient. Our churches have had great revivals, but we need to go even deeper. We must win SOULS.
