Faidley were introduced to the Assembly and granted honorary seats in the Assembly bar. -- Moved and supported that election of officers take place at 9:30 Wed morning. Carried. -- Moved and supported that recommendation of Council in regard to revision of roll call be accepted. Carried. -- Moved and supported that 300 copies of the Minutes be printed. Carried. -- Moved and supported that each Local Church take offerings to pay for the printing of the Minutes. Carried. -- Moved and supported that a committee be appointed to see about purchase of Fair grounds and buildings or a part of same. Carried. -- Moved and supported that Chair appoint committee. Carried. -- Council was appointed. Moved & supported to ratify action of Dist. Supt. in regards to charter. Carried. -- Moved & supported that Dist. Council be Dist. Trustees. Carried. Philpot.---Moved and supported to elect members of Examining Board by acclamation. Carried. --- M. M. Conrad, R.C. Stalcup, and O. A. Morgan were elected.

Secretary \$10.00 each for their services during the year, passed. Moved and supported that the time, place, and Workers for 1933 Camp be left to Dist. Council. Carried. -- Moved and supported that District Council act as stationing committee. Carried.-- Bro. & Sr. Brockman gave their testimonies. -- Prayer was offered in behalf of Bro. Cornelson, of Hutchinson.-- Solo by Bro. Philpot. -- Motion to adjourn.

FIFTH SESSION THURSDAY A.M. AUG. 11, 1932.

Carried. -- Partial report of Resolution Committee read & acted upon. -- Partial report of Examining Board read & acted upon. -- Moved and Supported to grant a transfer to Mrs. E. A. Coop if she desires one. Carried.

Moved and supported to receive Bro. E. A. Gafford on his credentials. Carried.

Moved and supported to print list of evangelists in Minutes. Carried.

Bro. & Sr. Keller were introduced to the Assembly and gave their testimonies.

Statistical read and accepted.

Acceptance speech by Dist. Supt.

Moved and supported that the name of each local preacher be inserted in the Minutes and that each pastor send in list of local preachers in his church. Carried.

Motion to adjourn.

REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE, Continued.

18. Whereas God has commanded us to preach the Word and to evangelize the world, therefore be it RESOLVED, that we extend our Home Missionary work by giving it our best support by prayer and by financial aid. Carried.

REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend, that all active ministers pay one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of their ministerial tithe direct to the District Treasurer, to be applied on the District Supt.'s salary.

2. We recommend, that the churches be apportioned as follows:

3. We recommend that the District Supt. give his time to the District and Home Missionary work. That we give him the privilege of conducting not more than two (2) revivals outside the District, and that he be allowed to retain offerings from same. Sect. 147.

4. We recommend, that all offerings received in District evangelistic and Home Missionary work be paid into the District Treasury.

5. We recommend that we pay our District Supt. \$1200.00 for the year, and that free-will offerings be taken by the pastors, to apply on his traveling expenses.

6. We recommend that the District pay all traveling and incidental expenses connected with Home Missionary work.

7. We recommend that each Sunday School pay one dollar per month into the Home Missionary fund.

8. We recommend that all churches calling the District Supt. on trouble calls pay his traveling expenses.

9. We recommend that all churches endeavor to send all money to District Treasurer monthly.

10. We recommend that the District Council, at this Assembly, assist in planing the District Supt.'s work for the coming year according to section 147 of our manual.

REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

1. Resolved, that our Assembly year close one week previous to our Assembly, all reports to be made out in full, and all money be sent directly to the District Treasurer immediately afterwards. Carried.
2. Resolved, that the pastor have the privilege of holding two revival meetings off of charge during year. Carried.
3. Resolved, that the 1933 District Camp have children's and young people's services. Carried.
4. Resolved, that we hold the Assembly in connection with the Camp, plan to be worked out by the Council. Carried.
5. Resolved, that each active minister be released for two Sundays during Camp and that they receive regular salary for this time. Carried.
6. Resolved, that since the churches are to grant their pastors leave of absence with full pay during Camp, each pastor feel it his duty to be at the entire Camp. Carried.
7. Resolved, that no pastor shall employ an evangelist for a revival without the endorsement of the District Superintendent. Carried.
8. Resolved, that each church send to Camp 6 tea towels, 2 crash towels, and 2 bed ticks; and that the pastor present this need to his people. Carried.
9. Resolved, that we pay Rev. A. E. Smith and helpers \$30.00 for clearing up the Camp Ground and money be taken out of Camp fund. Carried.
10. Resolved, that we express by a rising vote our appreciation to the pastor and wife (Brother and Sister Smith) and members of the Lincoln Church for their entertainment and hospitality during Camp and Assembly. Carried.
11. Resolved, that our Evangelists and other ministers arrange their slates and work so as to not conflict with the Camp and Assembly. Carried.
12. Inasmuch as there is much inconsistency in the making of minister's reports we request Brother Thomas to give us an interpretation of the report blanks and said interpretation be placed in the minutes, for future reference. Carried.
13. Resolved, that all pastors and evangelists sound a clear note of warning against all worldiness. Carried.
14. Resolved, that all licensed preachers and all licensed/looking forward to ordination keep in touch with the secretary of the examining board, whose name and address shall be placed in the minutes. Carried.
15. Resolved, that we, as an Assembly, express our thanks and appreciation to the Business Men, Fair Association, and Citizens of Lincoln for their hospitable entertainment and use of Fair grounds, and same be printed in the Lincoln Paper. This resolution to be drafted by Secretary. Carried.
16. Resolved that the District tents be left in the hands of the Dist. Supt. and that he shall use his own judgment where they shall go and what shall be the charges for the same. Carried.
17. Resolved, that the members of the Kansas District now in session, offer grateful thanks unto God for His guidance of, and blessing upon, our labors of the past year. Carried.
