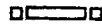

Moved and supported that all the seats in front of the middle tent pole constitute the Assembly bar. Carried. Roll call read and revised. Moved and supported to accept the Syracuse and Hartford churches into the Assembly. Carried. Moved and supported that the chair appoint the Committees. Carried.

Rev. Lois Fairchild and Rev. C. B. Mitchell were introduced to the Assembly, gave their testimonies and were granted honorary seats in the Assembly bar.

Moved and supported that a memorial of Bro. M. S. Mitchell and Bro. Seth C. Rees be written by the District Secretary and to be printed in the Minutes. Carried.

Partial report of Examining Board read and accepted.

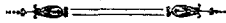
Brother Job and Brother Keller were introduced to the Assembly and gave their testimonies. Moved and supported to recess until 10:30. Carried.

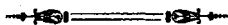


MEMOIRS

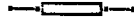
REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

4. Resolved, that each active minister be released for two Sundays during Camp and that they receive regular salary, providing they attend Camp and Assembly.
5. Resolved, that we hold the Assembly in connection with the Camp, plan to be worked out by the Council. Carried.
6. Resolved, that no pastor shall employ an evangelist for a revival without the endorsement of the District Superintendent. Carried.
7. Resolved, that we express by a rising vote our appreciation to the pastor and wife (Brother and Sister O. A. Morgan) and members of the Hutchinson Church for their entertainment and hospitality during Camp and Assembly. Carried.
8. Resolved, that our Evangelists and other ministers arrange their slates and work so as to not conflict with the Camp and Assembly. Carried.
9. Resolved, that all pastors and evangelists sound a clear and constructive note of warning against all worldliness. Carried.
10. Resolved, that all licensed preachers and all licensed deaconesses looking forward to ordination keep in touch with the secretary of the examining board, whose name and address shall be placed in the minutes. Carried.
11. Resolved, that the District tents be left in the hands of the District Superintendent and that he shall use his own judgment where they shall go. Carried.
12. Resolved, that we as an assembly express our thanks and appreciation to the business men, churches, and citizens of Hutchinson who have contributed to help make our camp and assembly a success and that it be printed in the Hutchinson paper. This resolution to be drafted by the secretary. Carried.
13. In as much as God has been extremely good to us in sparing our lives, giving us a good year and a marvelous, wonderful Spirit in our Camp and Assembly, now in session, Be it resolved that we as the Kansas District offer here and now grateful thanks unto our God. Carried.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT



To the twentieth annual assembly of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Greetings in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost:

Another year has passed with its blessings, possibilities, labors, and opportunities. This year is especially marked by much deepening in the things of God. A greater spirit of love and unity has never existed in the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Our preachers and laymen have worked as a unit in carrying on the great task left to our efforts. Most all of our churches have shown some increase in membership. More than one has broken all previous records in S. S. attendance. Genuine revivals have swept our District with what seems to be everlasting results.

Every department of the church has received consideration. We are endeavoring to co-operate with the General Church and General officers One Hundred per cent. I believe the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate is being pushed by every pastor and our subscription list equals more than sixty per cent of our Membership.

Your Superintendent has spent considerable time of this year trying to build up some of the weaker points. In addition to this, we were enabled to organize two splendid churches,—one church at Syracuse which now has more than 35 members, also a new church at Hartford with 21 members. In all we visited some of the churches a number of times,—some three and none less than two. Have traveled during the year more than 15,000 miles, conducted 9 revivals, with 335 seekers, made 100 calls, 2 funerals and about 50 subscriptions to the Advocate, preached 201 times, conducted about 40 business meetings, etc., with a financial report as follows:

REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all active ministers pay one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of their ministerial tithe direct to the District Treasurer, to be applied on the District Superintendent's salary.

3. We recommend that the District Superintendent give his time to the District and Home Missionary work. That we give him the privilege of conducting not more than three (3) revivals outside the District, and that he be allowed to retain offerings from the same.
4. We recommend that all offerings received in District Evangelistic and Home Missionary work be paid into the District Treasury.
5. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent \$1,000 for the year, and that free-will offerings be taken by the Pastors, to apply on his traveling expenses.
6. We recommend that the District pay all traveling and incidental expenses connected with Home Missionary work.
7. We recommend that each Sunday School pay one dollar per month into the Home Missionary fund.
8. We recommend that all churches calling the District Superintendent on trouble calls pay his traveling expenses.
9. We recommend that all churches endeavor to send all money to the District Treasurer monthly.
10. We recommend that the District Council, at this Assembly, assist in planning the District Superintendent's work for the coming year according to section 147 of our Manuel.
