FIRST SESSION TUESDAY A. M., JULY 24, 1934

The roll call was read. Moved and supported that the two center rows of seats constitute the Assembly bar. Carried.

Moved and seconded to give all district reports to Statistical Committee. Carried. District Superintendent's report read and accepted, Sister Mix, Sister Dice and Sister Deardorf were introduced to the Assembly and granted honorary seats in the Assembly bar. Bro. Beltz and Bro. Keller were introduced to the Assembly.

Moved and seconded that time for regular sessions be from 8:00 a. m. to 12:00, and from 1:00 p. m. to 4:00 p. m. Carried.

Moved and seconded that District Superintendent appoint the Committees. Carried. Committees appointed as follows:

SECOND SESSION WEDNESDAY, JULY 25, 1934

The second session opened at 8:00 a.m. with Gen. Supt. Surbrook in chair. A very instructive message on "Talents, Trouble and Time" from 1 Cor. 12th chapter, to ministers and christian workers was delivered by Bro. Surbrook.

After a recess the roll call was read. Minutes of last session were read and corrected. Report of resolution committee read and accepted. Rev. Wickens, pastor of Salina Church of the Nazarene, was introduced to the Assembly and gave his testimony.

Partial report of Ways and Means Committee read and acted upon. Moved and seconded to recess until 12:40. Carried.

Rev. Hale, pastor of the Hutchinson Nazarene Church, was introduced to the Assembly. Partial report of Ways and Means Committee read and acted upon.

Report of Committee on Memorials to General Assembly read and accepted.

Final report of Ways and Means Committee read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that District Council nominate three men for District Home Missionary. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the ten ministers receiving the highest number of votes be delegates to General Assembly and the five receiving next highest number of votes be alternates. Carried.

Partial report of examining board read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that District Council be granted power to fill vacancies that may occur in the delegation to General Assembly. Carried. The following churches gave invitations for Ministerial Convention: Goodland, Sabetha, Wichita, Hutchinson, Fredonia and Lincoln. Fredonia was selected by vote of the Assembly.

Moved and supported that Ministerial Convention be held the first Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of April. Carried.

Moved and seconded that each pastor send a list of their local preachers to the district secretary and same be printed in the minutes. Carried.

Moved and seconded that district have 350 copies of minutes printed. Carried. Moved and seconded to have ordination service at 8:15, Thursday morning, July 26. Carried.

THIRD SESSION THURSDAY, JULY 26, 1934

The Ordination Address was delivered by General Superintendent Surbrook, who had charge of this service. Moved and seconded to recess until 11:00 a. m. Carried.

Report of Auditing Committee given. Report of District Treasurer read and accepted. J. H. Philpot was elected Home Missionary on first ballot. Moved and seconded to recess until 1:30 p. m.

FOURTH SESSION FRIDAY, JULY 27, 1934

The fourth session opened with Dist. Supt. Waddell in chair.

Final report of Ways and Means Committee read and accepted.

Rev. Dooley and Rev. Sturk were introduced to the Assembly.

Final report of Resolution Committee read and accepted.

Rev. Geo. Biernes was introduced to the Assembly.

Moved and seconded to pay District Treasurer \$15.00 and Dist. Secretary \$10.00 from the district fund for their services during the past year. Carried. Moved and seconded to pay Bro. Campbell and co-laborers \$25.00 for their services in preparing and cleaning up camp grounds. Carried. Final report of examining board read and accepted. Moved and supported that Assembly refer G. J. Hirt's name back to Examining Board and give them power to act on same. Carried.

Moved and seconded that a memoir of Bro. Geo. Rubican be written by District Secretary. Carried.

Report of statistical committee read and accepted.

Bro. Reynolds, Supt. of Rocky Mountain District, and Brother Andrew Sivertsen were introduced to the Assembly. Bro. Sivertsen sang a special song which was blessed of God. Report of stationing committee read and accepted. Moved and seconded that the churches be assessed at the rate of 35c per member to pay expenses of delegates to General Assembly. Carried. Motion to adjourn.

REPORT OF FOREIGN MISSIONARY COMMITTEE

16. Resolved, that we the ministers of the Kansas District have a Ministerial Convention and Prayer Conference during the Assembly year; time and place to be set by District Council.

17. DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To General Superintendent, Rev. Walter L. Surbrook, and the 21st Annual District Assembly of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, now in session, Greeting in the name of God the Father, and His son Jesus, our own blessed Lord, and the Holy Ghost our Sanctifier:

This Annual Assembly marks another year taken from the tomorrows and placed in the yesterdays. It is now gone with its blessings, opportunities, labors and possibilities. This year was outstanding as a very spiritual one; the revival that started in this District several years ago, keeps spreading. Some churches are exceeding all previous records as to spirituality and attendance. In spite of the unparalleled drought, a large per cent. of the churches have all budgets paid in full. Every department of the work has received consideration; the District Foreign Missionary Budget has been met a hundred per cent. We are seeing the beauty of unstinted effort to co-operate with those who are placed over us in the Lord. Your Superintendent was granted time for three revivals off district. This time was utilized at Owasso, Michigan Camp; Charleston, Illinois Camp, and Huntington West Virginia Pilgrim Holiness Church. In all the Lord enabled us to conduct 8 revivals this year; attended two sessions of the General Board Meeting at Indianapolis; one session of Bible School Board Meeting at Colorado Springs; conducted about forty business meetings in the district. Travelled 18,419 miles, preached 228 times, with 465 seekers; organized

one church. Made 100 calls, visiting some of the churches a number of times—some three times and none less than twice, with a financial report as follows :

9. We recommend that the Home Missionary be under the supervision of the District Superintendent and the District Council.

10. We recommend that all money raised by the Home Missionary while in Home Missionary work be sent to the District Treasurer.
