### FIRST SITTING MONDAY A. M., AUGUST 9, 1937

The first sitting of the twenty-fourth annual Assembly convened at Beloit, Kansas, August 9, 1937, at 8:30 a. m. with Assistant General Superintendent L. W. Sturk in the chair. Bro. Sturk read from I Cor. 13 and addressed the Assembly. His subject was "The Things upon Which the Success of our Church Depends".

The roll call was read.

Moved and seconded that the two center rows of seats back to the elevation constitute the Assembly bar. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the time for regular sittings of the Assembly 8 a. m. to 12 noon; 1 p. m. to 5 p. m.; and 7 p. m. to 9:30 p. m. Carried.

Moved and seconded to dispense with the reading of the reports of churches and ministers. Carried.

Report of examining board read and accepted.

Rev. and Mrs. Edward Rife were introduced to the Assembly, gave their testimonies, and were granted honorary seats in the Assembly bar.

Mrs. Anna Hamilton was introduced to the Assembly and gave her testimony.

Misses Snider and Johnson were introduced to the Assembly, gave their testimonies, and were granted honorary seats in the Assembly bar.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that election of officers transpire at 1:30 p. m. Carried.

Report of resolution committee read and acted upon.

Moved and seconded to recess 15 minutes. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the District Council nominate the Candidates for Educational Board. Carried. Wayne Plummer was nominated for period 1937-1940 and Lee Rathbun for period 1937-1939. Nominations were ratified by Assembly.

Report of Statistical Committee read and accepted subject to correction.

Report of the District Superintendent read and accepted. Motion to adjourn.

### SECOND SITTING

The second sitting convened at 1 p. m., August 9, 1937, with Rev. Sturk in the chair. Prayer by Bros. Cork and Fortner.

Roll call read and revised.

Minutes of last sitting read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that the District Superintendent appoint tellers. Carried.

Rev. and Mrs. Canady were introduced to the Assembly, gave their testimonies, and were granted honorary seats in the Assembly bar.

Election of officers as follows.

H. J. Beecher was elected Dist. Supt. on the first ballot. H. K. Busby was elected Asst. Dist. Supt.

J. H. Fortner was elected Secretary on the first ballot. Jack Campbell was elected Treasurer on the first ballot.

Other members of the Council. Wayne Plummer and A. R. C. Howard on the first ballot and J. J. Cork on the second.

Moved and seconded that the District Council nominate five men out of which three shall be elected for Examining Board. Carried.

Examining Board as follows: Jack Campbell 1937-1940; Paul Isgrigg, 1937-1939; H. K. Busby, 1937-1938.

Moved and seconded that Bro. and Sister Rathbun sing for the Assembly.

Moved and seconded that Bro. J. E. Isgrigg be granted an honorary seat in the Assembly bar. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the District pay the District treasurer and secretary \$25 and \$20 respectively for their services. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the District have 400 copies of the Minutes printed. Carried. Moved and seconded that Sisters Busby and Carter be secured as Children's Workers for 1938 Camp. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the time and place of the 1938 Camp and Assembly be determined by the District Council. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this Assembly express their appreciation of the Children's workers by a rising vote. Carried

Hutchinson was selected as the place of the next Ministerial Convention. The time of this Convention is to be determined by the District Council.

Report of the Foreign Missionary Committee read and acted upon.

Motion to adjourn.

### THIRD SITTING

The third sitting of the Assembly began at 7 p. m. with an Ordination Service conducted by Assistant General Superintendent Sturk, Assisted by Bros. Beecher, Busby, Fortner, Campbell, Plummer, and Cork.

Moved and seconded to dispense with the roll call. Carried.

Moved and seconded that each church give a donation to the Ministerial Convention. Carried.

Moved and seconded that all church and ministerial reports for Assembly year close June 30, 1938. Carried.

Moved and seconded that all District monies be in the hands of the District Treasurer not later than July 15, 1938. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the District Superintendent appoint the Committees for the 1938 Assembly. Carried.

Final report of the Resolution Committee read and adopted.

Report of the Auditing Committee read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that the Dist. Supt. appoint a publicity committee. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the District Council be empowered and urged to search immediately for a permanent Camp ground and if suitable ground is found to purchase the same. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this Assembly give the District Treasurer and Secretary a rising vote of thanks for their efficient services. Carried.

Moved and seconded that a love offering be taken for the First Assistant General Superintendent for his services in the Camp Meeting. Carried. An offering of \$10.00 was taken. Moved and seconded that a vote of thanks be given to our District Superintendent for his services and sacrifice. Carried

J. E. Isgigg was granted first year district license.

Moved and seconded to dispense with the reading of the District Treasurer's report. Carried.

Moved and seconded to complete the business of the Assembly this evening. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this Assembly grant the District Council authority to take care of any business which may have been overlooked. Carried.

Motion to adjourn.

### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To L. W. Sturk, our beloved First Assistant General Superintendent, and Twenty-Fourth Annual Assembly of the Kansas District Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Another milestone has been passed; another year's activities recorded, and we are being hurried on to meet Him Who has said, "Behold I come quickly and my reward is with me to give to every man according as his work shall be."

A more serious hour I never felt when a year ago you elected me to serve as your District Superintendent. I recognize greater accomplishments could have been obtained, yet in all our ministerial labors we have never been more conscious of God's presence and seal upon our humble efforts. I am sure that we, as a Pilgrim Holiness Church, have a very vital and important place to fill. The preaching and living this Gospel of full Salvation was never more needed than today. There have been a number of blessed God given revivals. Thank God our people are still earnestly contending for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints.

On the account of sickness, dust storms and other difficulties we have had more changes in our pastorates than any previous time in our history. Definitely and distinctly has God answered prayer again and again.

Since it became necessary as well  $a_s$  providential for Mrs. Beecher to take the Lincoln pastorate, I called a special session of the District Council on the First day of October, 1936, at which meeting I conceded \$450.00 of my year's salary to be applied on Home Missionary work. A great deal of my time and travels have been in the interest of frontier meetings. Much effort has been launched along these lines. A short meeting was conducted in Allen by Brothers Philpot and Busby. After all their resources were exhausted to get the people of Allen to attend the meeting (but to no avail) they went to Osage City and conducted a five weeks campaign which resulted in the organizing of a small class. Brother and Sister Ray Jellison were placed there as pastors. They were loyal and real sacrificing. Later in the Spring Brother Busby and Misses Lois Cork and Julia Mikesell earnestly battled away for three weeks here in Beloit, then was added to the party Brother Philpot and Sister Vera Carter continuing two weeks longer. A number of souls were at the alter and some very profitable Gospel interest established. Another two weeks meeting was held in Hartford by Rev. Busby as evangelist and Sisters Lois Cork and Julia Mikesell as singers. Then a second Home Missionary Campaign in Osage City by Rev. J. Orvan Keller and wife as the workers. Some good interest was shown in this meeting and it should have gone on longer. Also Sister Mabel Rathburn and family conducted a two and a half weeks meeting in Lyndon, Kansas. A lot of good, I believe, was accomplished in these meetings and attention should be given to conserve and preserve what seed has been sown.

As your District Superintendent I do enjoy the blessed experience of entire sanctification or heart purity. I have conducted two revivals in the District and attended two Bible School Board Meetings at Colorado Springs. I have cried and prayed and preached and counseled with our pastors and people and answered many letters and tried to solve many incidental problems. Only by the Grace of God, your patience, prayers, and cooperation have the problems been solved as they have. I have visited all the churches of the District three times (excepting two only twice) and many of the churches four or five times.

Miles traveled in the interest of District and Home Missions: more than 18,000; sermons preached, 168; calls, 202.

Have had some seekers both for pardon and purity which the pastors will report.

Conducted all the annual business meetings and at least 30 Board Meetings. Also helped the wife hang out a few washings, but most of all God answered prayer in enabling us to lift an over \$1300.00 church indebtedness from the Lincoln church.

### **REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE**

1. Resolved, that each pastor have the privilege of holding two revival meetings off charge during the year, provided that his charge be supplied satisfactory to the local advisory board.

2. Resolved that the 1938 District Camp have children's and young people's services.

3. Resolved, that we as an Assembly express our thanks and appreciation to the Council and City of Beloit which has contributed to help make our Camp and Assembly a success and that it be printed in the Beloit papers.

4. Resolved, that each church send one-half dozen tea towels and one quilt for the 1938 Camp.

5. Resolved, that the District Superintendent meet with each local church board at the time of his visits and assist them in solving their varied problems.

6. Resolved, that we have three prayer band leaders appointed by the Camp Management for the 1938 Camp; one for men, one for women, and one for young people.

7. Resolved, that we hold Assembly at the close of Camp.

8. Resolved, that all annual reports to the Assembly be made on uniform blanks and that they have the pastor's signature of approval.

9. Resolved, that each active Minister be released for two Sundays during Camp and that they receive regular salary; providing they attend Camp and Assembly.

10. Resolved, that no pastor shall employ an evangelist for a revival without the endorsement of the District Superintendent.

11. Resolved, that our evangelists and other ministers arrange their slates and work so as not to conflict with the Camp and Assembly.

.12. Resolved, that all pastors and evangelists sound a clear and constructive note of warning against all worldliness.

13 Resolved, that all licensed ministers and licensed deaconesses looking forward to ordination keep in touch with the secretary of the educational board whose name and address shall be placed in the minutes.

14. Resolved, that the District Superintendent have charge of the district tent.

15. Resolved, that all our musicians bring their instruments to the 1938 Camp.

16. Resolved, that the first prayer meeting night each month shall be donation night for the pastors of the district. The announcement shall be made the Sunday previous by the Sunday School Superintendent.

17. Resolved, that all ministers and lay delegates remain until the close of the Assembly; no pastor or delegate shall be excused without a good and written reason.

18. When a licensed minister continues year after year as a licensed preacher making no attempt to take the course of study, and is doing little or no active preaching, he or she may be referred by the Examining Board to the Local Church for Local Preacher's License.

19. Whereas there are many licensed preachers who are doing little or no active preaching, and who have no prospect of doing more than local work, we urge that our local churches be more careful in recommending candidates for District License to preach.

20. Resolved, that we extend a vote of thanks to our Assistant General Superintendent for the splendid and efficient manner in which he has presided over our Assembly, and that we extend to him a most gracious invitation to be with us again as Providence may permit.
