FIRST SITTING, MONDAY, 8:30 a. m. Aug. 7, 1939

The first sitting of the twenty-sixth annual assembly convened at Beloit, Kansas, with Dist. Supt. Howard K. Busby as chairman. Brother Busby read Eph. 5:25-27, after which he addressed the assembly on the subject "A Glorious Church" using the following outline:

I. A Praying Church. II. A Progressive Church. III. A Pentecostal Church.

Moved and seconded that the two center sections back to the elevation constitute the assembly bar. Carried.

Rev. and Mrs. R. C. Stalcup, Rev. J. E. Pottenger, Rev. Fred Lincoln and Rev. Geo. Farr were introduced to the assembly, testified, and were granted honorary seats in the assembly bar.

Moved and seconded that the time for the regular sittings of the assembly be 8 a. m. to 12 noon; 1 p. m. to 5 p. m.; and 7 p. m. to 9:30 p. m.

Moved and seconded to recess ten minutes. Carried.

Report of Committee on Resolutions read and adopted.

Report of the Auditing Committee read and accepted.

Report of the District Treasurer read and accepted.

Report of the District Superintendent read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that the order of the day be the election of officers at 1:30 this afternoon. Carried.

Miss Pearl Light was introduced to the assembly, gave her testimony and was granted an honorary seat in the assembly bar.

Moved and seconded to pay the district treasurer \$25.00 and the district secretary \$20.00 for their services during the past year. Carried.

> Moved and seconded that 400 copies of the minutes be printed for the coming year. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the Lincoln News print the 1939 minutes. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the assembly give Bro. Keller a rising vote of thanks for his services in song and for the use of his amplifier. Carried.

District Superintendent's Report

TO THE 26TH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE KANSAS
DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

GREETINGS:

This Annual Assembly finds us another year nearer the end of our Pilgrimage. It has been a year of battles, but, praise God, victory has come again and again in time of need.

Our District membership for this year shows a loss. This is deplorable, but due largely, I feel, to the clearing of membership rolls. The action of last General Assembly concerning budgets evidently prompted this action. Wherein I have failed, full responsibility is assumed.

I wish to thank you who have co-operated in any way, and for your prayers in our behalf. I believe that a beautiful spirit of unity prevails among our brethren, and that the future, under God, points to better things for the Kansas District.

Good revivals have been reported over the District. Young peoples work is finding a larger place in our midst. A number of material improvements have been made in the way of painting, building etc. Outstanding among these is Lyndon, where a building program is progressing nicely. Fredonia recently purchased a well-located seven room parsonage. Sabetha, where their final church debt was paid. Brewster that was dedicated, free of debt this spring. In recent weeks, Syracuse has planned to buy the church in which they worship.

Through the kindness of our friends, the District now owns twenty-five new tents to be used in our Camp Meeting. We have also acquired fifty folding chairs which were badly needed for Home Missionary work.

Soon after our Ministerial Convention at Hutchinson, Brothers Paul Hires and Ray Jellison went into Lucas, Kansas, for a Home Missionary Meeting, holding on for about five weeks. And, then, Brother Hale and family of Oklahoma, followed them with a tent meeting, preaching for seven weeks. The Lord blessedly honored their labors and just one week before the opening of our Camp, I went to help them push the battle and was privileged to organize a church of eleven members.

I have been on the District approximately nine months of the year. It has been the busiest year of my life. I have borne burdens that I never before knew existed. I believe God has helped me to grow in grace, and, your prayers and co-operation have made my work enjoyable.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

1. Resolved, that each pastor have the privilege of conducting two revival meetings off charge during the year, provided that his charge be supplied satisfactory to the local advisory board.

2. Resolved, that the 1940 district camp have children's and young people's services. Workers to be secured as soon as possible.

3. Resolved, that we as an assembly express our thanks and appreciation to the Council and City of Beloit, also to the park caretaker which have contributed to help make our camp and assembly a success and that it be printed in the Beloit papers.

4. Resolved, that each church send six plates, six cereal bowls, one blanket, and two pounds of dried noodles for the 1940 Camp and Assembly.

5. Resolved, that the District Superintendent meet with each local board at the time of his visits and assist them in solving their varied problems.

6. Resolved that we have two prayer band leaders appointed by the camp management for the 1940 camp; one for the men and one for the women.

7. Resolved, that we hold assembly at the close of camp.

8. Resolved, that all annual reports to the assembly be made on uniform blanks and that they have the pastor's signature of approval.

9. Resolved, that each active minister be released for two Sundays during the camp and assembly and that they receive regular salary, providing they attend camp and assembly.

10. Resolved, that no pastor or church employ an evangelist for a revival without the endorsement of the district superintendent.

11. Resolved, that we urge our evangelists and other ministers to arrange their slates and work so as not to conflict with the camp and assembly.

12. Resolved, that all pastors and evangelists sound a clear and constructive note of warning against all worldliness.

13. Resolved, that inasmuch it is the little foxes that spoil the vine that our ministers and laymen take a more definite stand against anklets, rolled hose, short sleeves, permanents, etc.

14. Resolved, that we have a workers' meeting each day of the 1940 camp.

15. Resolved, that we devote two of the workers' meetings of the camp to the Sunday School.

16. Resolved, that each church send a food or cash donation to the 1940 ministerial convention.

17. Resolved, that, as some of our churches are quite a distance from our district camp, each church pay the expenses of their delegates to the Camp and Assembly.

18. Resolved, that all licensed ministers and licensed deaconesses looking forward to ordination keep in touch with the secretary of the educational board whose name and address shall be in the minutes.

19. Resolved, that the district superintendent have charge of the district tents.

20. Resolved, that all our district musicians bring their instruments to the camp.

21. Resolved, that the first prayer meeting night of each month shall be donation night for the pastors of the District. The announce-

ment shall be made the Sunday previous by the Sunday School Superintendent.

22. Resolved, that all ministers and lay delegates remain until the close of the assembly; no pastor or lay delegate shall be excused without a good and written excuse.

23. Resolved, that when a licensed minister continues year after year as a licensed minister making no attempt to take the course of study, and is doing little or no active preaching, that he or she be referred by the Examining Board to the local church for local preacher's license.

24. Resolved, whereas there are several licensed preachers who are doing little or no active preaching, and who have no prospect of doing more than local work, we urge that our local churches be more careful in recommending candidates for district license to preach.

25. Resolved, that by rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to Brother Minor for his services during the camp and during the past year on the district.

26. Resolved, that by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to Sister Sigle for her untiring services as children's worker.

27. Resolved, that our district secretary send a letter of greeting to Brother and Sister Solter from this assembly.

28. Resolved, that we as an assembly show our sincere appreciation to our beloved district superintendent Howard K. Busby by a rising vote of thanks for his untiring labor of love among us during the past year and for the splendid and efficient manner in which he has presided over our assembly.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all active ministers pay three-fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$) of their ministerial tithe, through their local Church Treasurer, to the District for the District Budget.

2. We recommend that the Evangelists of our District pay one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer for the District Budget.

3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District Budget at the rate of \$1.00 per member, in full standing; and that the rate of \$3.00 per member for the General Budget which apportionments equal the following amounts for each church.
