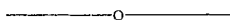

MINUTES
of the
THIRTIETH ANNUAL CONFERENCE
of the
KANSAS DISTRICT
of the
PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

The first sitting of the thirtieth annual conference convened at Beloit, Kansas, with Rev. H. J. Olsen as Chairman. The song service was conducted by Rev. J. E. Isgrigg. The scripture lesson was read by Rev. B. F. Durham from II Timothy, the second chapter. Prayer was offered by Rev. H. P. Engle.

Motion that the two center rows of seats back to the elevation constitute the conference bar. Carried.

The roll call was read and revised.

Motion made and seconded that the regular sittings of the conference be from 8:30 a. m. to 12 noon; 1:30 p. m. to 5 p. m. and 7 p. m. to the close. Carried.

Report of the examining board read and accepted.

Rev. and Mrs. E. W. Burton and Rev. Albert Gillum were introduced to the conference and gave testimony.

Moved and seconded that Rev. E. W. Burton be received into the conference bar on his credentials. Carried.

Rev. B. H. Edwards was introduced to the conference and gave his testimony and was granted an honorary seat in the conference bar.

Motion made and carried to receive the Goff and Sylvan Grove churches into the conference. Carried.

Report of the Foreign Missionary Committee was read and acted upon.

Report of the Resolutions Committee was read and acted upon.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee read and accepted.

Report of the Statistical Committee read and accepted.

The following resolution was adopted by the conference: "Whereas there appears to be a definite need in taking steps toward the purchase of a permanent camp ground and whereas the spirit of our people in Sunday's service seemed to point toward this action, be it therefore resolved that the council be instructed to purchase the proposed site in Hutchinson, price to be paid not to exceed \$1800.00"

A rising vote of thanks was extended to the retiring district secretary for his service during the past year.

Moved and seconded that the election of officers be held at 2 p. m. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we recess until 1:30 p. m. Carried.

Dismissed by prayer by Rev. J. H. Fortner.

The first sitting was continued at 1:30 p. m. with a song led by Miss Almeda Martsof. Prayer was led by Rev. J. E. Isgrigg.

The minutes of the morning were read and accepted.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

Partial report of the Foreign Missionary Committee was read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that this conference show their appreciation to the following children's workers: Sisters Hofen, Glendening, Carroll, Griffin, Gafford, Burton, Cork and Martsof.

Moved and seconded that this conference show their appreciation to the cooks, Sister Alice Cork and Sister Gladys Gafford, for the splendid way in which they performed their duties. Carried.

The following tellers were appointed: Joye Doane, Clifford Conard, Roger C. Jones, and F. M. Eichelberger. Miss Lois Cork assisted the Secretary in recording the results.

The following were nominated as district trustees by the district council: Clarence Berkgren, B. F. Ireland, J. J. Cork. These nominations were accepted by the district conference.

Misses Lily Slaven and Arminta Bilby sang a special song.

The following resolution was adopted by the conference: "Whereas L. W. Brown has so kindly offered us his vacant building at Vining, Kansas, be it resolved that the District Secretary write Brother Brown a letter of acceptance and appreciation from the Kansas Conference now in session; Be it further resolved that our Secretary write Brother Brown concerning the action of the conference relative to the purchase of the Hutchinson camp ground."

Motion made and seconded that the district council be granted authority to take whatever action seems wise to them in regard to the purchase of buildings in the Beloit park. Carried.

The report of the District Treasurer was read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that the district council determine place and number of minutes to be printed. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the conference year end June 30 and that all district monies be sent to the district treasurer and all annual reports be sent to the District Secretary by July 15. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this conference grant authority to the district council to take care of any district business which may have been overlooked by this conference. Carried.

Date of the ministerial convention: March 7, 8, 9, 1944.

Moved and seconded that this conference give a rising vote of thanks to the following young people's workers: Elmer Gafford, Granville Carroll and H. J. Olsen.

Moved and seconded that M. L. Pottenger be granted a rising vote of thanks for his efficient service as publicity man. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this conference show their appreciation to our Chairman, Rev. H. J. Olsen, for the efficient way in which he has presided over this conference by a rising vote of thanks. Carried.

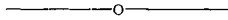
The Minutes were read and approved.

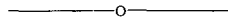

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 30th Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convening at Beloit, Kansas, August 9, 1943, Greetings!

With real gratitude to God and the church I submit the following report:

This has been a year of battles but not without victories. World conditions have militated against some of our best efforts but God has enabled us to go forward in His name.

During the past year Home Missionary meetings have been held at Goff, Sylvan Grove, Wichita and Colony, Kansas. We have organized two churches, namely Goff and Sylvan Grove. Definite plans have been made for the purchase of property at Sylvan Grove, Colony and Goff. Our Home Missionary dollars are bearing fruit: Thank God!

In some of our churches attendance is low but in others it is up. A number of fine revivals were reported this spring.

This has been perhaps the best financial year the District has ever enjoyed. The churches have been loyal in paying their budgets and numbers of our pastors have received one or more increases in pay.

Colby lifted the indebtedness on their splendid new parsonage. At Oakley and at Brewster our people have bought comfortable modern homes to serve as parsonages. Brother Conard built a six room parsonage at Johnson, meeting a need of the years. We dedicated it free of debt a few weeks ago.

Syracuse has taken a forward step with the purchase of a church building. Their debt is very small.

I have labored in one camp and four revivals, have preached 150 times, and have had many seekers.

In spite of travel difficulties I have covered the District twice. I have attended one General Board meeting, two Bible School board meetings and have held all of our annual meetings except one.

My salary is paid in full.

These are times that try our consecration but I am firm in my conviction that "He is able to keep that committed unto Him." I bless God for an anchor that keeps the soul—steadfast and sure while the billows roll.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

1. Resolved that each pastor have the privilege of conducting two revival meetings off charge during the year; provided that his charge be supplied satisfactorily to his advisory board.
2. Resolved that the 1944 District Camp have children's and young peoples' services; workers to be secured as soon as possible.
3. Resolved that we as a conference express our thanks and appreciation to the council and city of Beloit, also to the Park care-taker which have contributed to make our camp and conference a success; and that it be printed in the Beloit paper.
4. Resolved that each church take an offering to be used in the purchase of needed camp equipment; such offering to be sent to the chairman of the purchasing committee by January 1, 1944.
5. Resolved that we have a workers meeting each day of the 1944 camp.
6. Resolved that we have two prayer band leaders appointed by the camp management for the 1944 camp; one for men and one for women.
7. Resolved that we hold conference at the close of the camp.
8. Resolved that each active minister be released two Sundays during the camp and conference and that they receive regular salary provided that they attend camp and conference.
9. Resolved that no pastor or church employ an evangelist for a revival meeting without the endorsement of the District Superintendent.
10. Resolved that all pastors and evangelists sound a clear and constructive note against all worldliness such as anklets, rolled hose, short sleeves, permanents, etc., calling special attention to the resolution of our last general Conference relative to this subject.
11. Resolved that we as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church go on record as opposed to members of the P. H. Church being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the church in physical educational classes in public schools.
12. Resolved that we devote two of the workers' meetings of the camp to the Sunday School.
13. Resolved that as some of our churches are quite a distance from our district camp, each church pay the expenses of their delegates to the camp and conference.
14. Resolved that we have a Ministerial Convention in 1944, the date to be set by the District Council and announced before the close of this conference, and that each church send a food or cash donation.
15. Resolved that all licensed ministers and licensed deaconesses looking forward to ordination, keep in touch with the secretary of the educa-

tional board, whose name and address will be in the minutes.

16. Resolved that all ministers and deaconesses taking the course of study have their papers in to the educational board by June 30.

17. Resolved that the District Superintendent have charge of the district tents and tabernacle.

18. Resolved that all our District musicians bring their instruments to the 1944 camp.

19. Resolved that the first prayer meeting night of each month shall be donation night for the pastors of the District. The announcement shall be made the Sunday previous by the Sunday School Superintendent.

20. Resolved that we as pastors do our best for our evangelists in their cash offering and where practical give them a good food donation.

21. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, furnish his successor a complete calling list with their location.

22. Resolved that when a licensed minister continues year after year as a licensed minister making no attempt to take the course of study and is doing little or no active preaching, that he or she be referred by the Examining Board to the local church for local preacher's license.

23. Resolved, whereas there are several licensed preachers doing little or no active preaching, and who have no prospect of doing more than local work, we urge that our local churches be more careful in recommending candidates for district license to preach.

24. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, said committees to be appointed before the adjournment of the conference.

25. Resolved that we as a conference show our sincere appreciation to our beloved district superintendent, Howard K. Busby, by a rising vote of thanks for his untiring labor of love among us during the past year.

26. Whereas there is a great need for more efficiency in our Sunday School work, therefore be it resolved that the Kansas District be divided into zones and that each zone have a Sunday School convention once each year and that the District Council outline the zones and provide for the necessary officers.

27. Whereas it is an injustice to the local church to have a pastor to delay his answer of acceptance or rejection when he is recalled, therefore be it resolved that in the annual business meeting if a pastor is recalled he must give his answer at said meeting.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all active ministers pay three-fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$) of their ministerial tithe, through their local church treasurer, to the District Budget.

2. We recommend that the Evangelists of our District pay one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer for the District Budget.

3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District Budget at the rate of \$1.00 per member, in full standing; and at the rate of \$3.00 per member for the general Budget, which apportionments equal the following amounts for each church. The first item is the District Budget and the last the General Budget.

4. We recommend that all churches calling the District Superintendent on trouble calls pay his traveling expense.

5. We recommend that all churches send all money to the District Treasurer so as to reach him by the 10th of each month.

6. We recommend that the District Superintendent have the privilege of conducting two meetings off the District and retaining his offerings.

7. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent at the rate of \$125.00 per month and his traveling expenses, and that the District Treasurer be instructed to pay him monthly if there be any District money on hand.

8. We recommend that each Sunday School be apportioned the following per month for District Home Missions.

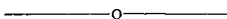
9. We recommend that each church be apportioned at the rate of 15c per member, each year, for the General Conference expenses or 60c per quadrennium.

10. We recommend that the District pay our District Superintendent's telephone bill and his house rent.

11. We recommend that all churches take a free-will offering for the District Superintendent at the time of his visit to help defray his traveling expenses, the same to be given him at the time of his visits.

12. We recommend that all money raised by representatives of general church and Institutional interests be turned over to the local church treasurer to be used for the purpose for which it was raised.

13. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$30.00 per year and the District Treasurer \$50.00 per year.



REPORT OF THE FOREIGN MISSIONARY COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to Brother Olsen for his faithful representation of the missionary work in the Camp.

2. We recommend that at least one service of the Camp of 1944 be devoted to the interest of Foreign Missions.

3. We recommend that the first Sunday of each month be designated as Missionary Sunday by our local churches, and that a special missionary offering be taken on that day.

4. Due to the fact that there are many people interested in our Foreign Missionary work outside the membership of the church we recommend that our larger churches organize a local Missionary Society to harmonize with the provisions of the Manual, Sections 84 and 85.

5. Since the General Missionary office has set a goal of \$25,000 as a post war fund, we recommend that our churches strive to help reach it by sending in special offerings designated for that purpose.

6. Because of the increased cost of living on all our mission fields, we recommend that our churches raise as much as possible above the regular Foreign Missionary Budget.

7. We recommend that our District Secretary send a letter of greeting to Rev. and Mrs. H. L. Solter.

8. We recommend that our pastors encourage those who feel the call of God to special service and that the church assist them in their preparation as much as possible.

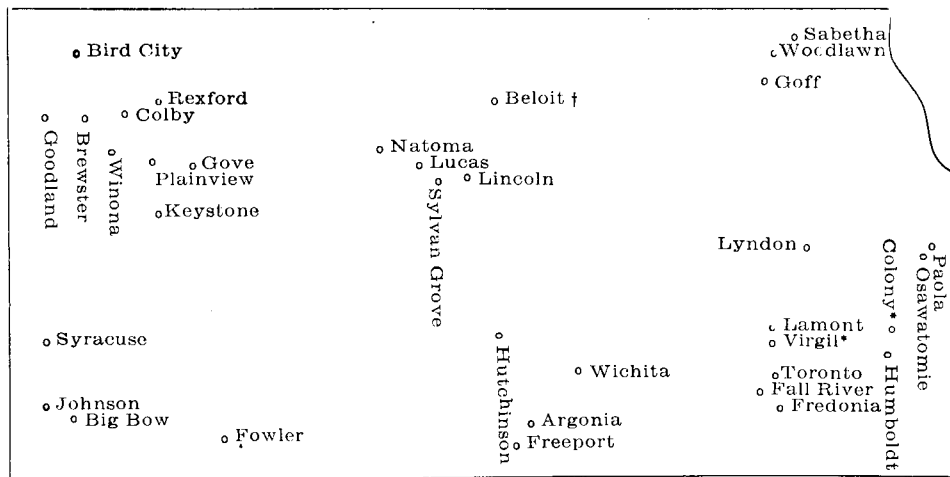
