The service opened with singing led by Rev. J. Orvan Keller singing "Heavenly Sunlight." Rev. A. P. Cummins led in a season of fervent prayer.

Rev. Howard K. Busby, District Superintendent, then introduced our chairman, Rev. Paul W. Thomas, Editor of the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate.

Rev. P. F. Elliott, General Sunday School Secretary then spoke on the Pilgrim Pension Plan.

We were recessed by common consent.

The conference was opened by singing "Blessed Assurance."

The Pension Plan discussion was continued.

It was moved and seconded that we adopt the pension plan as a unit. It was carried.

The Statistical Committee reported. It was moved and seconded we receive their report. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that the Council appoint the Treasurer for the State Young People's Work. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that we elect a fourth member to the educational board and it was amended that he serve for three years. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that we have a district news bulletin issued quarterly by the District Secretary and the District Superintendent. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to Carl Dillon and F. W. Light for the fine beef they donated, and which was enjoyed by all. It was given.

The Ways & Means Committee reported.

It was moved and seconded we rescind recommendation No. 2 of the Ways and Means Committee. It was rescinded.

It was moved and seconded the pension plan begin retroactive to July 1. 1947. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that the council take care of all unfinished business. It was carried.

The minutes were read and approved. It was moved to adjourn.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 34th annual District Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, now in session, Greetings:

God in His mercy has allowed us to gather for this important occasion. Not once has He failed us as we have tried to do His will and promote the work of the church during the past year. The kindness and cooperation of our precious people have aided more than you can know.

Numbers of hard fought battles have been won in the name of our Christ. Syracuse and Big Bow realized a long standing ambition during the year. Each started building a new parsonage with full basement. The Syracuse building is completed and Big Bow progresses nicely. Woodlawn has purchased a splendid property with a large house for a parsonage. Lucas paid off the debt on their new parsonage and the parsonage debt at Natoma has also been lifted. Every church now has a parsonage. I say, "Praise the Lord!"

The Scott City Mission has now become an organized Pilgrim Holiness Church and have improved their property during the year. Other churches have also made needed improvements. We were privileged to dedicate St. Francis and Oakley churches in the past months. Oakley was free of debt and at the dedication at St. Francis we were able to raise their debt. Thank God! We also own a new church property at Garden City. It should be valued at around \$5000.00. Sentiment and talk for a District parsonage has at last passed such a stage and we have a fine start on the new building here on our Camp Ground property.

We thank God for answered prayer, loads lifted, souls saved and sanctified in the work—best of all, if Jesus tarries, "the end is not yet."

Financially, the entire work is in wonderful condition. It we are to maintain our present Christian standards and spirituality, we must gird ourselves for the fight.

I have recorded 138 meetings as preaching services during the year. I am a member of the General Board of the church and am also a member of the Board of Trustees of the Colorado Springs Bible Training School. These interests claim some of our time as has Home Missionary work and the Camp Ground. I have been off the District for one Camp Meeting of eleven nights. God has enabled us to return over \$1200.00 into the work in the District this year. We praise Him for the privilege of helping!

With love in my heart for God, His church, and those that sit yonder in the shadows, I gladly place my hand in His, and will follow where He leads.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

- 1. We recommend that all active ministers pay three-fourths (%) of their ministerial tithe, through their local church treasurer, to the District Budget.
- 2. We recommend that the Evangelists, District Superintendent, Home Missionary Workers, and Evangelistic Singers pay 60% of their ministerial tithe to the district budget and be it further resolved that the conference treasurer pay the 4% to the Pilgrim Pension Fund for those who desire to participate, if they pay their 60%.
- 3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District Budget at the rate of \$1.00 per member, in full standing; and at the rate of \$4.00 per member for the General Budget, which apportionment equals the following amounts for each church. The first item is the District Budget and the last the General Budget.

- 4. We recommend that all churches calling the District Superintendent on trouble calls pay his traveling expense.
- 5. We recommend that the District Superintendent have the privilege of conducting three meetings off the district and retaining his offering.
- 6. We recommend that all the churches send all money to the District Treasurer so as to reach him by the 10th of each month.
- 7. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent at the rate of \$175.00 per month and his traveling expense, and that the District Treasurer be instructed to pay him monthly if there be any District funds on hand.
- 8. We recommend that each Sunday School be apportioned the following per month for District Home Missions.

9. We recommend that each church be apportioned at the rate of 15c per member, each year, for the general conference expense or 60c per quadrenium.

10. We recommend that the District pay our District Superintendent's

telephone bill and his house rent.

11. We recommend that all cturches take a free-will offering for the District Superintendent at the time of his visit.

12. We recommend that all money raised by the representatives of the general church and institutional interests be turned over to the local church treasurer to be used for the purpose for which it was raised.

13. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$50.00 per year and the District Treasurer \$75.00 per year.

14. We recommend that each church take a Home-Missionary offering each month in addition to their Sunday School assessment.

1. We recommend that by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to Rev. R. E. Strickland for his faithful representation of the missionary work in the camp and for his years of labor on the field.

2. We recommend that the first Sunday afternoon of the 1943 camp meeting be devoted to the interests of Foreign Missions.

- 3. We recommend that the first Sunday of each month be designated as
- Missionary Sunday by our local churches, that special prayer be offered and that an offering be taken for Foreign Missions.

 4. Due to the fact that there are many people interested in Foreign Missionary work outside our membership, we recommend that our larger churches organize a local Missionary Society to harmonize with the provisions of the Manual.
- 5. Because of the increased cost of living on all our mission fields, we recommend that our churches raise as much as possible above the regular Foreign Missionary Budget.

6. We recommend that the District Secretary send a letter of greetings

to Rev. and Mrs. G. F. Fletchall.

- 7. We recommend that our pastors encourage those who feel the call of God to special service and that the church assist them in their preparation as much as possible.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

- 1. Resolved that each pastor have the privilege of conducting two revival meetings off charge during the year; provided that his charge be supplied satisfactorily to his advisory board.
- 2. Resolved that the District Camp have children's and young people's services, workers to be secured as soon as possible.
 - 3. Resolved that we hold Conference at the close of Camp.
- 4. Resolved that each active minister be released two Sundays during the Camp and Conference and that they receive regular salary provided that they attend Camp and Conference.
- 5. Resolved that no pastor or church employ an evangelist for revival meetings without the endorsement of the District Superintendent.
- 6. Resolved that we, as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, go on record as opposed to members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the church in physical educational classes in public schools.
- 7. Resolved that as some of our churches are quite a distance from our District Camp, each church pay the expense of their delegate to the camp and conference.
- 8. Resolved that we have a ministerial convention during the year; the date to be set by the District Council and announced before the close of this conference and that each church send food or a cash donation.
- 9. Resolved that all licensed ministers and deaconesses looking forward to ordination, keep in touch with the secretary of the educational board, whose name and address will be in the minutes.
- 10. Resolved that all ministers and deaconesses taking the course of study have their papers in to the educational board June 30.
- 11. Resolved that the District Superintendent have charge of the District Equipment.
- 12. Resolved that each pastor urge his people to bring their musical instruments to camp.
- 13. Resolved that the first prayer meeting each month shall be donation night for the pastors of the District. The announcement shall be made the Sunday previously by the Sunday School Superintendent.

- 18. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, said committees to be appointed before the adjournment of the conference.
- 19. Resolved that each church receive an offering for the camp meeting of 1948; the same to be sent to the District Treasurer.

- 20. Whereas, there is a great need for more efficiency in our Sunday School work, therefore be it resolved that the Kansas District be divided into zones and that each zone have a Sunday School Convention once each year and that the District Cuncil outline the zones and provide the necessary officers.
