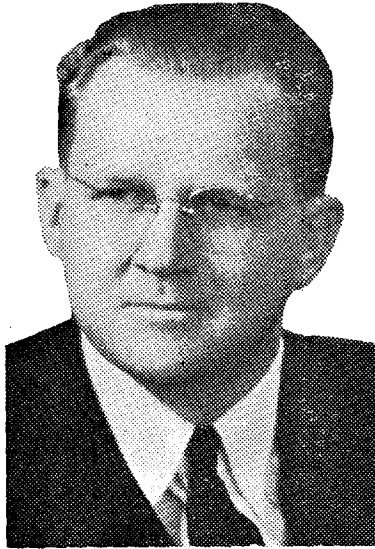

The service opened with singing led by Rev. M. M. Conrad singing "Love Lifted Me" and "Let the Lower Lights Be Burning."

Rev. Ray L. Jellison and Rev. Roy Glendening led in a fervent session of prayer.

Rev. Howard K. Busby, District Superintendent, then introduced our chairman, Rev. L. W. Sturk, General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, who brought greetings from all the general officers of the church.

Brother Sturk read from Matt. 16:18. Then spoke on the "Prosperity of Zion" or "Things on Which the Success of the Church Depends" as follows:

## **DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT**

**To the 35th Annual District Conference of the Kansas District  
of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in session, Greetings!**

*In His providence we are again gathered to plan and  
promote the work of His kingdom on earth. He has  
never failed us yet, and as we desire and obey Him  
we may expect His blessing.*

Real progress is being made on a number of our fields. Two of our pastors have regular, free radio programs on good stations. This furnishes the Pilgrim Holiness Church with hundreds of dollars worth of publicity and should appreciably aid our home missionary efforts in western Kansas.

Our Garden City property has been cleared of debt and a building site for a parsonage has been purchased. Splendidly located lots were bought at Sharon Springs before we organized, and our portable tabernacle is located there. These folks have definite plans for a church building. There has been considerable improving of property at Humboldt, Johnson, Hutchinson, St. Francis, etc. Natoma sold their church and exchanged parsonages. A building program has resulted in a full basement under their new church, and their indebtedness is low. Colony recently purchased a school house, and this will be moved in for a much needed place of worship. Big Bow parsonage has been completed, and it is an outstanding piece of workmanship. The nearly completed District parsonage is a worthwhile addition to our work, and will meet a need of the years. There are plans for our Bird City work to move from the country into town. This would be a forward step.

In the overall picture of the work there is reason for encouragement. We show a gain of over 5% in membership, while our Sunday School attendance is still on the climb. Thank God! I have preached 153 times during the year, attended all meetings of the General Board, and one District Superintendent's meeting in Indianapolis. I also have tried to discharge my duty as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Colorado Springs Bible Training School. Other work includes several weeks at the Camp Ground, visits to all of the churches twice or more, except those where Rev. Plummer conducted the annual meetings, three church revivals, two Camp Meetings and two funerals. We have seen between three and four hundred seekers in our meetings. Organized two churches. The District has met every obligation to me in the way of salary, etc. While not all remember, some do and we are grateful to the churches for love offerings that may reach four hundred dollars.

So it is the past twelve months have gone . . . the future is in His hands, and well it should be.

It matters not though the way be long,

Or if the feet that follow Him bleed,

I know full well I cannot go wrong . . . if I follow where Christ may lead.

WE RECOMMEND for first year license, Chas. Colaw (renewal), B. M. Pottenger (renewal) and Cecil Wilkins.

## **REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE**

1. We recommend that all active ministers pay three-fourths ( $\frac{3}{4}$ ) of their ministerial tithe, through their local church treasurer, to the District Budget.

2. We recommend that the Evangelists, District Superintendent, Home Missionary Workers, and Evangelistic Singers pay 60% of their ministerial tithe to the district budget and be it further resolved that the conference treasurer pay the 4% to the Pilgrim Pension Fund for those who desire to participate, if they pay their 60%.

3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District Budget at the rate of \$1.00 per member, in full standing; and at the rate

of \$4.00 per member for the General Budget, which apportionment equals the following amounts for each church. The first item is the District Budget and the last the General Budget.

4. We recommend that all churches calling the District Superintendent on trouble calls pay his traveling expense.

5. We recommend that the District Superintendent have the privilege of conducting three meetings off the district and retaining his offering.

6. We recommend that all the churches send all money to the District Treasurer so as to reach him by the 10th of each month.

7. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent at the rate of \$200.00 per month and his traveling expense, and that the District Treasurer be instructed to pay him monthly if there be any District funds on hand.

8. We recommend that each Sunday School be apportioned the following per month for District Home Missions:

11. Resolved that the District Superintendent have charge of the District Equipment.
