A beautiful and impressive ordination service followed, with Rev. and Mrs. O. R. Hofen receiving the rites of Ordination.

It was moved and seconded that the conference adjourned. Carried.

Thus bringing to a close a great conference and leaving one looking to the future to reveal the rightness of the business enacted.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 36th Annual District Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in session, Greetings!

The Lord delays His return, and thus, through His mercy, we are allowed to meet in another annual conference. While it is impossible for you to see the work as we do, it is our desire in this brief report, to give you some of the facts concerning some of our activities and the high lights of District progress during the past twelve months.

In some respects it has been an eventful year for us. Records will likely show more improvements of church property, acquiring buildings, etc., than any previous year.

We were compelled to vacate our property at Sylvan Grove as the location was needed for a new school building. The brethren were able to find a splendid site for a church and have their new building and other improvements made. Sharon Springs goes forward and has a church which stands on their corner lots. This is a fine building for our need and plans are under way for a new parsonage. The Keystone Church has undergone extensive repair. The Syracuse Church filled to the capacity, and with a growing Sunday School faced a real challenge. Equal to this they began a real overhauling and enlarging of the church plant. They have made real progress. Goodland too has a splendid pro-

ject underway which will increase their seating capacity and give them a better opportunity to serve. I feel that a real need has been met at Bird City, where both church and parsonage have been moved into town. A full basement has been prepared for each building. Hutchinson has made extensive improvements on their Church with more soon to follow. Mention should be made of our infant church at Garden City, where the Irelands are laboring. For nearly two years they have lived under conditions that no other Kansas pastor knows today. They are engaged in building a fine parsonage at this time, which will soon be ready to occupy. Fredonia has improved their basement for Sunday School rooms. Sabetha has taken forward steps in this line also, and Lincoln has raised hundreds of dollars for Sunday School rooms. Colby has received much needed repair and Winona is glad for a new basement under their church.

Many other worthy things have been accomplished across the District and at the same time we have kept wonderfully free from debt. Much of this work, has been done by prayer, faith, sweat, and tears. My hat's off to God's children such as you, who have taken these forward steps!

Many of our churches have had a battle holding up their attendance. It is likely we have had the worst winter we have known for our work, stormy, bad week ends were the order of the day for months it seems. In spite of this, reports will show that some of our churches have done exceedingly well and that we have a District gain in membership as well as Sunday School attendance.

When Sharon Springs was able to release the portable tabernacle in the spring, all plans were laid for moving into a new territory for the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Plans for the new work had to be abandoned, when workers failed us, almost on the eve of launching the project.

Plans for the Ministerial Convention were stalled, when no church in central Kansas, extended us an invitation.

I have preached 190 times during the year, attended all meetings of the General Board, and have met with the brethren at Colorado Springs as a member of the Bible School board. Other activities include work at the Camp Grounds, two visits or more to each of the churches, except two, (something interfered with our plans in these cases) and conducting all the annual meetings except one. I have held two revivals and one camp outside the District, and four meeting in the District.

My salary has been met and I have received about \$1,000.00 from Evangelist offerings, beside expense. At my request no house rent money was paid me. My records show the churches have remembered me with a little more than \$400.00 in love offerings.

For prayers answered and victories given, much praise is due God. A look to the future reveals a real challenge to the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and her people. My prayer is that God may help us meet this challenge and prove ourselves worthy of the trust He has placed in us.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all active ministers pay three fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$) of, their ministerial tithe, through their local church treasurer, to the District Budget.

2. We recommend that the Evangelist, District Superintendent, Home Missionary Workers, and Evangelistic Singers pay 60% of their ministerial tithe to the District Budget and be it further resolved that the conference treasurer pay the 4% to the Pilgrim Pension Plan for those who desire to participate, if they pay their 60%.

3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District Budget at the rate of \$1.00 per member, in full standing; and at the rate of \$4.00 per member for the General Budget, which apportionment equals the following amounts for each church. The first item is the District Budget.

4. We recommend that all churches calling the District Superintendent on trouble calls pay his traveling expenses.
5. We recommend that the District Superintendent have the privilege of conducting one revival meeting off the District and retaining his offering, and that he have a two weeks vacation each year.
6. We recommend that all the churches send in all money to the District Treasurer so as to reach him by the tenth of each month.
7. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent at the rate of \$200.00 per month and his traveling expense, and pay his telephone bill and \$15.00 for utilities.
8. We recommend that each Sunday School be apportioned the following per month for District Home Missions.

10. Resolved that the first prayer-meeting each month shall be donation night for the pastors of the District. The announcement to be made the Sunday previously by the Sunday School Superintendent.
11. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, leave the parsonage and premises clean and a complete calling list with locations.
12. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, said committees to be appointed before the adjournment of the conference.
13. Resolved that each church send in one or more blanket or quilt, three or more dish towels, one or more aprons, for use at the District Camp.
14. Whereas there is a great need for more efficiency in our Sunday school and young peoples work, therefore be it resolved that the Kan-

sas District be divided into zones and that each zone have a Sunday school convention once each year and young people's rallies as often as is practical, and that the District Council outline the zones and appoint the necessary officers.

15. Resolved that in the event of the death of any pastor's or evangelist's immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired and in turn each pastor notified by wire by the District Secretary.

16. Be it resolved that the conference year end June 30th and that all District money be sent to the District Treasurer and all reports to District Secretary by July 15th.

17. Resolved that the last Thursday night of Camp of 1950 be designated as Young People's night and that service be directed to the interest of our young people.

18. Resolved that those attending Sunday morning service of the Camp Meeting be given credit on the S. S. attendance at home.
