A motion was made and seconded that the 1950 conference adjourn. (Carried)

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To our beloved General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, and to the 37th Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, now in session, greetings in the name of Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood.

Through the great mercy and watchful care of our Lord we have been permitted to enjoy His blessings and fellowship another year. We have found a wonderful spirit of Christian love and unity, a desire for the old paths, and fidelity to the Pilgrim Holiness Church throughout the District. Our predecessor had chartered such a course and the people's hearts were in it.

There has been considerable improvement in church property this year. Argonia has refinished their basement, Garden City has a fine parsonage and garage. Fredonia did some remodeling in the parsonage and put in some oak floors. Sabetha also put oak floors in their parsonage and Goodland, Hutchinson, and Syracuse each completed their extensive remodeling projects to better care for their growing Sunday Schools. Wichita has two buses and are in great need of more Sunday School room. Lamont shingled their church. Lincoln did some excavating and built some beautiful Sunday School rooms. Osawatomie also went in for some new rooms for their Sunday School. Sharon Springs has a beautiful new parsonage with a built-in garage. The District Headquarters has a new garage, ladies' rest room, and sidewalks. After making several trips to Colony it was deemed advisable by the council to dispose of the property there.

Our portable tabernacle was taken down at Sharon Springs and through the kindness of Glen Honeyman we were allowed to store it in one of his buildings. Our missionary plans in the West did not materialize, but we heard the Macedonian call saying, "Come over to Kansas City, Kansas and help us." We thank God that we were not disobedient to the call, for after several trips there we organized a church. They bought a good lot in University Heights and have built a fine basement church 28 feet by 42 feet of cement block in which they are now worshipping. We wholeheartedly welcome this new church into our conference. We also have some new pastors whom we welcome into our midst as ministerial brothers in the Lord.

Many of our Sunday Schools have shown substantial gains. Good

revivals have been reported. God has been blessing. We thank Him for the good Ministerial Convention He gave us.

We attended one Regional Youth Convention at Colorado Springs, one District Superintendent's meeting at Indianapolis, two Bible School meetings, four Sunday School Conventions, participated in four dedicatory services, Sharon Springs, Sylvan Grove, Syracuse, and Lincoln. Perhaps the most unusual one was at Syracuse where the church was dedicated free of debt and offering taken to pay the indebtedness on the Garden City property. Surely the Lord is pleased with such a spirit of thoughtfulness and liberality for others. We preached 110 times, visited all the churches two or more times except Lucas, held all the annual meetings, held two revivals on the district, two council meetings, and one Ministerial Convention, and worked weeks on the district parsonage and garage. I travelled 12,550 miles in district work. My salary is paid in full. I received \$245.00 in revival work, and \$387.04 in love offerings from the churches.

I appreciate the help of my assistant, the very fine spirit and cooperation of the district council, of my ministerial brethren, and of all the laity. For whatever worthwhile achievements that have been attained, we owe it to this wonderful spirit of love, forbearance, and helpfulness that has prevailed among the saints of God. We thank God for the members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in the Kansas District. We thank Him for His grace that is able to keep each of you from falling and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy. So to this only wise God our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

9. We recommend that each church be apportioned at the rate of 15 cents per member, each year, for the General Conference expense or 60 cents per quadrennium.

- 14. Whereas there is a great need for more efficiency in our Sunday school and young people's work, therefore be it resolved that the Kansas District be divided into zones and that each zone have a Sunday school convention once each year and young peoples rallies as often as is practical, and that the District Council outline the zones and appoint the necessary officers.
- 15. Resolved that in the event of death of any of pastors' or evangelists' immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired and in turn each pastor notified by wire by the District Secretary.
