JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Thirty-ninth Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened Monday, August 4, 1952 at the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Hutchinson, Kansas.

The first sitting opened at 8:00 a.m. with a song service led by Rev. Herschel Hughes. The conference was then led in prayer by Rev. F. N. Griffin.

A letter from the general superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, was read in which he stated that Rev. P. W. Thomas was to act as chairman of this conference.

Rev. B. F. Ireland then read the 13th chapter of I Corinthians.

The roll call was read.

Moved and seconded that the conference continue until 12 noon, recess for dinner, convene at 1:30 p.m., continue until 5:30 p.m., recess for supper, convene again at 7:00 p.m., and continue until all business is completed. Carried.

A motion was made and seconded that the three center sections back to the pillars constitute the conference bar. Carried.

The district superintendent, Rev. Abraham I. Wise, read a good report of his labors which was received with thanks.

The report of the auditing committee was read and accepted.

The report of the district treasurer was read and accepted.

Rev. David Jellison, Rev. I. L. Shanafelt, Rev. Warren D. Ruble, Rev. Ivan Ullom, Rev. Glenn I. Boardman, and Rev. J. V. Hickman were introduced to the conference, gave their testimonies, and were given honorary seats in the conference bar.

The report of the Examining Board was read and each minister was voted upon by separate action. The following recommendations were passed.

Second year deaconess license to Mrs. J. Orvan Keller and Mrs. Almeda Martsolf Lake.

Rev. Warren D. Ruble and Rev. J. V. Hickman were received into the conference on their ordination credentials from the Oklahoma District.

Rev. Glenn I. Boardman was received into the district on his ordination credentials from the Wesleyan Methodist Church.

Marvin Moberly was granted an evangelistic singer's certificate.

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and acted upon.

The Lakin Church was hilariously received into the conference.

The conference was recessed for five minutes.

Rev. Fred Patton was introduced to the conference, gave his testimony, and was granted an honorary seat in the conference bar.

The report of the statistical committee was read and accepted.

It was moved and seconded that the valuation of the district headquarters property be included in the property statement report. Carried.

Partial report of the resolutions committee read and acted upon.

The foreign missionary report was read and accepted.

The report of the Sunday School Committee was read and accepted.

The committee on memoirs reported to the conference. A service in memory of Rev. M. M. Conrad was conducted during the camp.

The ministers' pension plan was presented by the chair and discussed on the conference floor. Moved and seconded that we proceed with the election of officers. Carried.

Rev. A. I. Wise was overwhelmingly re-elected as the district superintendent.

We have appreciated the kindness and good spirit of the Kansas District, and sincerely trust that this shall always remain.

IMPROVEMENTS OF CHURCH PROPERTIES

Argonia has painted their church basement and the sanctuary, which is quite beautiful. This church shows a steady gain in Sunday School and Church membership.

Bird City has a basement with lovely Sunday School rooms, and the finishing of the basement was done this year.

Colby has made some new improvements, by the way of painting the sanctuary, installing new light fixtures, which are quite effective.

Fowler has installed a new hot water heater.

Fredonia has made several improvements, including rewiring the parsonage, and has a new church paper called Pilgrim Tidings.

Garden City. The parsonage has some new clothes closets, built by their good pastor.

Hutchinson has installed a new gas furnace and beautified the church with a new lawn.

Johnson. The parsonage has new shingle siding, has been insulated, and the church sanctuary has been redecorated. This good church hopes to build a new church soon, let us pray for them.

Kansas City. Rev. Freetag has made out papers to deed the property which is his home to the Kansas District.

Lamont has a beautiful new church. This church building was purchased and moved into Lamont. It has been through the able leadership of their pastor that it has been painted on the inside and out, plus hours of labor on other parts of the building. More power to them.

Lyndon. New siding was put on the parsonage, and the rooms of the parsonage have been redecorated.

Natoma. The properties have been painted and improved in general.

Oakley has already laid plans for a new parsonage.

Sabetha. Much work has been done to make the place of worship attractive.

Scott City has been making plans for a new church. This church has made great gains in Sunday School and membership. Praise God!

Several churches have been blessed this year by having D.V.B.S. (God help us to continue in this direction.)

MY LABORS

I have traveled approximately 22,456 miles in District work, visited all the churches, conducted all the Annual Meetings, with the exception of one. Worked about four weeks on the Lakin, Kansas, Church, with the brethren. I regret to say some of my tasks were bitter and made my soul heavy, and this was so as we completed the sale of two churches, namely, Lucas and Goff. It was my pleasure to organize the Lakin Church May 1, 1952, with the presence of God upon us. I received \$375.00 from revivals, \$324.05 in love offerings from the churches, my salary is paid in full. I conducted a revival in the School at Colorado Springs, and traveled to the Superintendent's meeting, Indianapolis, Ind. It was my pleasure to preach 130 times through-out the year, and God granted about 50 souls at an altar of prayer; to Him be the honor and glory.

It has been a pleasure to work with my assistant, and the district council, and with all pastors and their wives, and also the laity. I have thanked God time and time again for you folk and pray that under God we will have a great year of revivals over the district. May God's love overflow on the Kansas Pilgrims.

REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all pastors pay three-fourths $(\frac{3}{4})$ of their ministerial tithe, through their local church treasurer, to the District Budget.

2. We recommend that the Evangelists, District Superintendent, Home Missionary Workers, Evangelistic Singers, and unstationed ministers pay 60% of their ministerial tithe to the District Budget and be it further resolved that the conference treasurer pay the 4% to the Pilgrim Pension Plan for those who desire to participate, if they pay their 60%.

3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District Budget at the rate of \$2.00 per member in full standing; and at the rate of \$5.65 per member for the General Budget, which apportionment equals the following amounts for each church. The first item is the District Budget.

4. We recommend that the District Superintendent have the privilege of conducting one revival meeting off the District, and that he have a two weeks vacation each year.

5. We recommend that all the churches send in all money to the District Treasurer so as to reach him by the tenth of each month.

6. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent at the rate of \$200.00 per month and his travelling expense, and pay his telephone bill and \$15.00 per month for utilities.

7. We recommend that each Sunday School be apportioned the following per month for District Home Missions.

8. Whereas the General Board has requested that each district place its zone school in its district budget, be it resolved that each of our churches raise a monthly free will offering for our school.

9. We recommend that all churches take a love offering for the District Superintendent at the time of his regular visits.

10. We recommend that all money raised by the representatives of the General Church and institutional interests be turned over to the local church treasurer and be used for the purpose for which it was raised.

11. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$50.00 per year and that our District Treasurer be paid \$75.00 per year.

12. Be it resolved, that the traveling expense of any minister whose travel is authorized by the District have his traveling expense met on the same basis as the District Superintendent.

13. We recommend that each Sunday School take one special offering during the year for the District Sunday School Committee.

14. We recommend that a form copy of the budget apportionments for each church be sent to the local church treasurer immediately after the conference.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

LOCAL CHURCH WORK

1. Whereas many of our members are not familiar with the actions of this conference therefore be it resolved: that each pastor shall at his earliest possible convenience familiarize his church with their responsibilities to the district as outlined by this conference.

2. We recommend that the sacrament of the Lord's Supper be observed in our churches at least once each quarter.

3. We further recommend that opportunity for baptism be given by our churches at least once a year.

4. Resolved that each pastor may hold two revival meetings each year off his charge.

5. Be it resolved that our churches do not open their doors to other churches, organizations, institutions, or individuals for financial appeals.

6. Resolved that no pastor employ an evangelist outside the Pilgrim Holiness Church without first consulting the District Superintendent.

7. Inasmuch as some of our churches are quite a distance from our district camp, be it resolved that each church pay the traveling expense of their delegate to camp and conference.

8. Resolved that the first prayer meeting of each month shall be donation night for the pastors of the district. The announcement to be made the Sunday previous by the Sunday School Superintendent.

9. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, leave the parsonage and premises clean; also he shall leave a complete calling list with the location.

10. We recommend that the churches of the district be encouraged as far as possible to purchase Sunday School and Church supplies through our own Publishing House.

11. Whereas some of our churches are failing to meet their financial requirements, therefore be it resolved that the District Superintendent as he visits the district shall give this matter careful consideration with each local church board.

12. We recommend that each pastor be granted two weeks vacation with pay.

13. Resolved that each pastor read to his church section 65, page 49 of the manual at regular intervals.

SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUTH WORK

The duties of the Sunday School Committee in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

1. The District Sunday School Committee together with the District Superintendent shall arrange for Sunday School conventions to be held in the District during the year.

2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the District.

3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:

a. A statement of the work accomplished during the year.

b. A statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work in the District.

4. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a Summer Vacation Bible School and report of that work be sent to the District Sunday School Committee.

5. We further recommend that each pastor resolve to make an earnest effort to attend and bring as large a delegation as possible of Sunday School workers to the Sunday School Convention. 5. Be it resolved that each church strive for a 20% gain in Sunday School attendance this year, and that they use the plan suggested by the General Church.

7. Be it resolved that each church of the Kansas District seek to establish children's meetings during this conference year.

8. Be it resolved that each church on the Kansas District where Young People's Societies are not organized, or who have no services in their behalf, endeavor to organize a chartered Young People's Society (as suggested by our General Church) and where it is impossible to do so, that they strive toward this great goal.

9. We recommend that the District Young People's committee arrange for Youth Conventions to be held throughout the state.

CAMP AND CONFERENCE

1. We recommend that a system of rules and regulations governing our camp and premises be adopted by this conference which shall read as follows:

Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Camp Grounds at Hutchinson, Kansas has been established and dedicated for the purpose of that fellowship and ministry that will promote and propagate scriptural holiness, it is expected that those attending shall willingly observe the following—

RULES

- 1. Smoking on grounds prohibited.
- 2. The wearing of immodest dress will not be tolerated.
- 3. No dogs or pets are permitted on camp grounds.
- 4. Those sleeping in dormitories are expected to be in by 10:45 p.m. unless special permission is obtained from those in authority.
- 5. Unmarried young ladies shall not be permitted to rent tents, except by special permission and that only if properly chaperoned.
- 6. Loud talking, rowdyism, or behavior unbecoming a Christian will not be tolerated in the dormitories.
- 7. It is presumed that those attending the camp have read and are willing to observe the above rules and regulations.
- 8. Anyone refusing to comply with the above rules and regulations may expect to be asked to leave the camp premises without any refund of registration fee.

2. We further recommend that the above camp rules and regulations be printed on cards for display on camp premises and also that a copy be included in the camp advertisements sent to the churches.

3. We recommend that the first service of camp meeting be conducted on Friday night of the first week and that all pastors make a special effort to come on the day previous to assist in making preparations for the camp.

4. We further recommend that all pastors make a special effort to attend all of camp and conference.

5. Resolved that the District Camp have children's and young people's services; workers to be secured as soon as possible.

6. Resolved that we hold conference at the close of camp.

7. Resolved that each pastor urge his people to bring their musical instruments to camp.

8. Resolved that each church take an offering for dining hall equipment such as silverware and cooking utensils and the money be sent to District Treasurer on or before April 1st. And be it further resolved that the secretary send out notice to this effect not later than ten days prior to the above date.

9. Be is resolved that a pay telephone be installed on Camp Ground for use during the next Camp.

10. Be it resolved that we observe the 40th anniversary of our Camp and Conference.

11. Be it resolved that the tabernacle be completed during the coming year and plans be laid for the dedication of our Camp Ground and parsonage, and that the service be held at 9:00 A. M. the last Sunday of the 1953 Camp.

12. Be it resolved that the first Friday night service and the day services of the first Saturday be designated as Y. P. services and during this period the Youth Conference be held—

And be it further resolved that each church endeavor to have as many of their Young People present as possible.

13. Inasmuch as the manual requires in section 90, page 68, paragraph 4 in 1950 manual or section 91, page 67, paragraph 4, in the 1946 manual that the ministers' reports be read at the District Conference.

We resolve that one third of the annual reports be read at each District Conference; the selection being made by lot.

14. Resolved that those attending Sunday morning service of the Camp Meeting be given credit on the Sunday School attendance at home.

15. Resolved that we, as a Pilgrim Holiness Camp, have men and women's prayer bands and that the leaders be appointed by the District Council.

DISTRICT WORK

1. Be it resolved that our district have a ministerial convention and be it further resolved that a permanent date be set, and the place be centrally located—and the date be set for beginning the first Tuesday in March and the place be set by district council.

2. Be it resolved that the district council appoint an editor and arrange a means of finance for a district publication which would include reports, news, etc., and that the paper be published monthly.

3. Resolved that any pastor who is required to be away from his church on any District, local or general business, receive his salary as usual.

4. Resolved that we, as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, go on record as opposed to members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the Church in physical education classes in the public schools.

5. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, said committees to be appointed before the adjournment of the conference.

6. Resolved that in the event of death of any of pastors' or evangelists' immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired and in turn each pastor notified by wire by the District Secretary.

7. Be it resolved that no mortgage be placed upon our District Camp Ground, parsonage and equipment pertaining thereto, without two-thirds vote of this conference.

8. Be it resolved that each church strive for a 10 percent gain in membership and that each pastor work toward this goal.

EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that at each annual camp meeting, on the last Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examination of licensed ministers. All ministers knowing themselves due to appear before these boards are urged to be present with their recommendations.

We further recommend that the time of each session shall be announced from the platform.

2. We recommend that all ministers working toward ordination consult with the educational board at the close of district conference.

3. We recommend that one half year's credit on the study course be granted for each year of seminar work approved. This credit does not apply to the reading course required in the manual.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that we as a conference show our appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. A. I. Wise, by a rising vote of thanks and confidence for his labors of love during the year.

2. Resolved that this conference show our appreciation to our District Secretary, Rev. J. H. Fortner, and to our District Treasurer, Rev. M. L. Pottenger, by a rising vote of thanks.

3. Resolved that we show our appreciation to Brother Carl Dillon for the beef which he gave to the camp by saying "God bless you."

4. Resolved that by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to our camp cooks, Brothers F. M. Eichelberger and Elmer Jantz, and to our dining room manager, Brother John Keller, who served so faithfully.

5. Resolved that we as a conference express our appreciation to our camp evangelists, Rev. Wm. Pratt and Rev. Paul Thomas, for their scriptural ministry, and to our song evangelists, Brother and Sister Athol McCombs, by a rising vote of thanks and that the conference secretary be instructed to write them of this conference action.

6. Resolved that we as a conference express our appreciation to our District Youth Executive Secretary, Rev. Herschel Hughes, by a rising vote of thanks.

7. Whereas we are privileged to have as our presiding officer, Rev. P. W. Thomas, the editor of the P. H. Advocate, for this conference, be it resolved that we show our appreciation for his Godly leadership and capable supervision by a rising vote of thanks.

THE SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE REPORT

There were nine issues of the Sunday School Bulletin published this past year. The Bulletin acquired the name of "The Progress of the Kansas Pilgrims' and except for one issue, which was a mimeograph paper, the papers were printed by a printer on regular newsprint in newspaper form. The reception for the little paper was real good and the people rallied to the cause and the free-will offerings sent to the Secretary were ample to pay all of the costs of printing and mailing the little paper and we have a balance of \$33.18. To God be the glory.

All three members of the committee were permitted to attend each of the Zone conventions held at Woodlawn, Humboldt, Hutchinson, Natoma, Garden City, and Brewster. These conventions were well attended and a blessing to all who were there.

This past year the Sunday School Committee stressed the value of the Daily Vacation Bible Schools. Nearly every church rallied to the task and had a D.V.B.S. This will surely show some real dividends in the future. Another thing the committee stressed was Lay-Visitation. It is slowly taking hold and will no doubt result in a nice increase in attendance over the state.

We are sorry to report a loss of 47 in average attendance for the state this past year, yet we are happy that several Sunday Schools have made some good gains and Scott City gets the certificate this year for the largest gain, both actual and percentage-wise, in Sunday School.
