JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING

The Forty-First Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Hutchinson, Kansas, August 2, 1954, at 8:00 a. m. The first sitting opened with a song service led by Rev. James Butler. The conference was then led in prayer by Rev. A. R. Wylie.

A letter of greetings from the General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, explaining the reason for his absence from the district conference was read.

In the same letter he indicated that the Rev. R. G. Flexon was to act as the presiding officer of the conference.

Brother Flexon was then introduced to the conference. He proceeded to bring a message to the conference on the subject, "The Mechanics of Personal Evangelism. Some of the points emphasized were:

Consistent, spiritual church members should be trained to do personal work.

We need trained altar workers.

Personal house to house evangelism should be practiced. Without persistency we cannot expect much success.

Definite courteous testimony not only in church but elsewhere has a powerful influence for God.

Preach personal evangelism until our people catch the vision and begin to practice it.

We are fast becoming a prayerless people. We need to train a praying people.

The roll call was then read.

Moved and seconded that the center sections and the platform constitute the conference bar. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the conference continue until 12 noon, recess for dinner, convene at 1:30 p. m., and continue until 5:30 p. m. Carried.

Rev. and Mrs. L. L. Miller were introduced to the conference and gave their testimonies.

The report of the examining board was read and accepted.

The report of the district superintendent was read and received by a rising vote of appreciation.

The report of the auditing committee was read and accepted.

The report of the district treasurer was read and accepted.

The report of the resolutions committee was read and acted upon.

The report of the ways and means committee was read and acted upon.

The report of the foreign missionary committee was read and acted upon.

The report of the Sunday School Committee was read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that the election of officers be the order of the day at the beginning of the afternoon sitting. Carried.

Motion to recess until 1:30 p. m. prevailed.

SECOND SITTING

The afternoon sitting began with a song led by Rev. Wayne R. Plummer. Rev. L. L. Miller then led in prayer.

Moved and seconded to set aside the reading of ten pastoral reports this year and proceed with other business. Carried.

Moved and seconded to dispense with the reading of the statistical report. Carried.

The following resolutions were passed by a rising vote of thanks.

Rev. H. K. Busby for his labors as District Superintendent.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

LOCAL CHURCH WORK

1. Whereas many of our members are not familiar with the actions of this conference, therefore be it resolved: that each pastor shall at his earliest possible convenience familiarize his church with their responsibilities to the district as outlined by this conference.

2. We recommend that the sacrament of the Lord's Supper be observed in our churches at least once each quarter.

3. We further recommend that opportunity for baptism be given by our churches at least once each year.

4. Resolved that each pastor may hold two revival meetings each year off his charge.

5. Be it resolved that our churches do not open their doors to other churches, organizations institutions, or individuals for financial appeals.

6. Resolved that no pastor employ an evangelist outside the Pilgrim Holiness Church without first consulting the District Superintendent.

7. Inasmuch as some of our churches are quite a distance from our district camp, be it resolved that each church pay the traveling expense of their delegate to camp and conference.
8. Resolved that the first prayer meeting of each month shall be donation night for the pastors of the district. The announcement to be made the Sunday previous by the Sunday School Superintendent.
9. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, leave the parsonage and premises clear: also he shall leave a complete calling list with the

and premises clean; also he shall leave a complete calling list with the location.

10. We recommend that the churches of the district be encouraged as far as possible to purchase Sunday School and Church supplies through our own Publishing House.

11. Whereas some of our churches are failing to meet their financial requirements, therefore be it resolved that the District Superintendent as he visits the district shall give the matter careful consideration with each local church board.

12. We recommend that each pastor be granted two weeks vacation with pay.

13. Resolved that each pastor read to his church section 65, page 49 of the manual at regular intervals.

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

God is blessing the Sunday School of the Kansas District. Twentysix of them have made gains and only four has shown a loss. We have shown a total gain of 155 numerically and 9.9 percentage gain.

There were Sunday School Conventions held at Topeka, Fredonia, Hutchinson, Goodland and Big Bow during the past year.

Wichita receives the General Conference certificates for the largest gain over the past four years in Sunday School attendance. Over the past conference year St. Francis receives the certificate for the highest gain numerically and Garden City for the highest percentage gain.

The Sunday School committee met twice during the year and sent into the District paper 9 monthly Sunday School Reports.

SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUTH WORK

The duties of the Sunday School Committee in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

1. The District Sunday School Committee together with the District Superintendent shall arrange for Sunday School conventions to be held in the district during the year.

2.To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the district.

3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:

A. A statement of the work accomplished during the year.

B. A statement of the general condition of the Sunday

School work in the District.

4. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a Summer Vacation Bible School and a report of that work shall be sent to the District Sunday School Committee.

5. We further recommend that each pastor resolve to make an earnest effort to attend and bring as large a delegation as possible of Sunday School workers to the Sunday School Convention.

6. Be it resolved that each church strive for a 20 percent gain in Sunday School attendance this year, and that they use the plan suggested by the general church.

7. Be it resolved that each church of the Kansas District seek to establish children's meetings this conference year.

8. Be it resolved that each church on the Kansas District where Young People's Societies are not organized, or have no services in their behalf, endeavor to organize a chartered Young People's Society (as suggested by our general church) and where it is impossible to do so, that they strive toward this great goal.

9. We recommend that the District Young People's Committee arrange for Youth Conventions to be held throughout the state.

REPORT OF THE EXAMINING BOARD

John Rovenstine, James MacIntosh and William Elkinton were granted Conference license.

The following were granted renewal of Conference license—Orval Gualtney, Richard Long, Ruby Long, Mrs. Avis P. Brophy, James Butler, Charles Colaw, Robert Durham, David Jellison, John Keller, Paul McNall, Ivan Ullom and Cecil Wallace.

Mrs. J. O. Keller and Mrs. Zella Lyder were granted renewal of Deaconess license.

Marvin Moberly was granted a song evangelist's license.

Rev. L. L. Miller and Mrs. L. L. Miller were received into the district on their (ordination) ministerial credentials.

REPORT OF THE FOREIGN MISSIONARY COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to Rev. Miss Dorothy Abel for her faithful representation of foreign missions to our camp.

2. We recommend that the first Sunday afternoon of the 1955 Camp be devoted to the interest of foreign missions.

3. We recommend that the first Sunday of each month be designated as Missionary Sunday by our local churches, that prayer be offered, and that an offering be taken.

4. Because of the cost of our foreign missionary work, we recommend that our churches give as much as possibe above the foreign missionary buaget.

5. We recommend that our pastors encourage those who feel the call to God to special service, and that the church assist them in their preparation as much as possible.

6. We recommend that our local missionary societies be encouraged to send as many packages of used clothing as possible for distribution to the poor, and that the missionaries be remembered at Christmas and birthdays.

7. We recommend that the district secretary send to each local church missionary society an annual report blank covering the yearly work. This blank is to be filled out and returned to the secretary with the annual church reports at the close of the conference year.

CAMP AND CONFERENCE

1. We recommend that a system of rules and regulations governing our camp and premises be adopted by this conference which shall read as follows:

Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church Camp Grounds at Hutchinson, Kansas, has been established and dedicated for the purpose of that fellowship and ministry that will promote and propagate scriptural holiness, it is expected that those attending shall willingly observe the following:

RULES

1. Smoking on grounds prohibited.

2. The wearing of immodest dress will not be tolerated.

3. No dogs or pets are permitted on camp grounds.

4. Those sleeping in dormitories are expected to be in by 10:45 p. m. unless special permission is obtained from those in authority.

5. Unmarried young ladies shall not be permitted to rent tents, ex-

cept by special permission and that only if properly chaperoned.

6. Loud talking, rowdyism, or behavior unbecoming a Christian will not be tolerated in the dormitories.

7. It is presumed that those attending the camp have read and are willing to observe the above rules and regulations.

8. Anyone refusing to comply with the above rules and regulations may expect to be asked to leave the camp premises without any refund of registration fee.

2. We further recommend that the above camp rules and regulations be printed on cards for display on camp premises and also that a copy be included in the camp advertisements sent to the churches.

3. We recommend that the first service of camp meeting be conducted on Friday night on the first week and that all pastors make a special effort to come on the day previous to assist in making preparations for the camp.

4.We further recommend that all pastors make a special effort to attend all of camp and conference.

5. Resolved that the District Camp have Children's and Young People's services; workers to be secured as soon as possible.

6. Resolved that we hold conference at the close of camp.

7. Resolved that each pastor urge his people to bring their instruments to camp.

8. Resolved that each church take a special offering for the camp by June 30th.

9. Be it resolved that the first Friday night service and the day services of the first Saturday be designated as Y. P. services and during this period the Youth Conference shall be held.

And be it further resolved that each church endeavor to have as many of their young people present as possible.

10. Inasmuch as the manual requires in section 90, page 68, paragraph 4 in 1950 or section 91, page 67, paragraph 4 in the 1946 manual that the ministers' reports be read at the district conference.

We resolve that one-third of the annual reports be read at each district conference; the selection being made by lot.

11. Resolved that those attending Sunday morning service of the camp meeting be given credit on the Sunday School attendance at home.

12 Resolved that we have men and women's prayer bands during camp meeting and that the leaders be appointed by the district council.

DISTRICT WORK

1. Be it resolved that our district have a ministerial convention to begin the first Tuesday of March and the place to be set by the district council.

2. Be it resolved that the district council appoint an editor for the district publication.

3. Resolved that any pastor, who is required to be away from his church on District, local or general business, shall receive his salary as usual.

4. Resolved that we, as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church go on record as opposed to members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the Church in physical education classes in the public Schools.

5. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, and the

names of those appointed on said committees be printed in the district minutes.

6. Resolved that in the event of death of any of pastor' or evangelists' immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired and in turn each pastor shall be notified by wire by the District Secretary.

7. Be it resolved that no mortgage be placed upon our District Camp Grounds, parsonage and equipment pertaining thereto, without two-thirds vote of this conference.

8. Be it resolved that each church strive for a 10 percent gain in membership and that each pastor work toward that goal.

EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that at each annual camp meeting, on the last Thursday, Friday and Saturday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examination of licensed ministers and deaconesses. All ministers knowing themselves due to appear before these boards are urged to be present with their recommendations.

We further recommend that the time of each session shall be announced from the platform.

2. We recommend that all ministers working toward ordination con-

3. We recommend that one-half year's credit on the study course be granted for each year of seminar work approved. This credit does not apply to the reading course required in the manual.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that each church furnish the district secretary with the names of its delegate or delegates at least 24 hours before the conference convenes.

2. Be it resolved that we as a conference show our appreciation to our camp evangelists Rev. Thomas Lee, Rev. Preston Harmon, and Rev. Bob French for their ministry, and to our song evangelists, Bro. Byron Crouse and family by rising vote of thanks.

Rev. R. G. Flexon for his splendid address to the conference and for his chairmanship during the conference.

Rev. James Butler for his work with the youth. Sister Rovenstine and Hofen for their work with the children. Brothers Charles Colaw and Roy Glendening for their fine work in preparing the material for the Progress of the Pilgrims.

Mrs. H. K. Busby and Mrs. Ray Jellison for their fine work as cooks during the camp.

Brother M. L. Pottenger for his fine work as treasurer during the year and Brother J. H. Fortner as the district secretary.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 41st Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in Session, Greetings;

I feel it is only through the mercy of God that we are privileged to assemble under such favorable circumstances. No hand of restraint is laid upon us as we strive to serve God and advance His Kingdom.

I wish to thank God, whose I am for the marked way, in which He has upheld His servent through the past year. By His help and yours we have been able to carry on. Any success achieved is due to co-operation, faith and answered prayer.

We should call attention to a number of forward steps taken by our churches. Osawatomie has nearly completed work on a full basement and other improvements costing several thousand dollars. Kansas City has carried out a long range program in building a church over their basement. They should be in the new building by early autumn. The Fields Memorial Church at Johnson is nearing completion. This has meant months of real effort on the part of the pastor and people.

Less than one week after the 1953 District Conference adjourned, we carried out the plan of the District Council and purchased a church in Topeka, as a venture in launching a new work. Though not elaborate, we do feel it is adequate and pray the day will soon come when we have a fully organized church in Topeka. L. C. Gray and family have labored there this year.

Attendance has been below what we hoped, but their financial report is encouraging.

Numbers of needed improvements have been made in places such as Lyndon, Toronto, Fall River, and others. Sharon Springs and Scott City have purchased pews, which are a fine addition.

The Bird City church has also made several hundred dollars worth of improvements.

In addition to other duties I have tried to pastor the church at Lamont. My remuneration for this labor has all been returned to the District Treasurer.

The District has paid me for 20,854 miles of travel. I have visited all of the churches twice except one. A tragic death kept me from keeping my engagement with this church. I conducted all of the annual meetings except one. During the year I visited the churches 78 times. Exclusive of these visits I called on the pastors 70 times and made 267 other calls. I preached 164 times, held two camps, our own and Binghamton, N. Y. and two revivals in the District, seeing some 275 souls bow at an altar for definite help. In addition, we either preached or assisted in nine funerals, delivered two baccalaureate addresses, presided at one District Conference and ordained four men to the ministry. As a member of the General Board and the Bible College Board, we tried faithfully to serve, attending all of their meetings. We also attended the mid-winter District Superintendent's meeting in Indianapolis and the General Conference at Winona Lake, Indiana. Further personal activity included Dedication of one church, one wedding and helping to baptize 17 persons.

My salary is paid in full and the churches have given me \$375.66 in love offerings.

This has been one of the busiest years of my life. The future unknown, is surely a safe one as we cling to God's unchanging hand.

REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all pastors pay all of their Ministerial tithe through their local church treasure; ³/₄ to be applied on District budget; ¹/₄ to apply on loan fund for District Church Extension.

2. We recommend that the evangelist, District Superintendent, Home Missonary Workers, Evangelists singers, ministers pay 75 percent of their Ministerial tithe to the District treasure, one-fifth of which to apply on District Church Extension loan fund, the balance to apply on District budget. We further recommend that the conference payment for pension plan members be paid from the District budget.

3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District Budget at the rate of \$2.00 per member in full standing; and at the rate of \$6.00 per member for the General Budget, which apportionment equals the following amounts for each church. The first item is the District budget.

4. We recommend that the District Superintendent have the privilege of conducting one revival meeting off the District, and that he have a two weeks vacation each year.

5. We recommend that all the churches send in all money to the District Treasurer so as to reach him by the tenth of each month.

6. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent at the rate of \$225.00 per month and his traveling expense, and pay his telephone bill and \$15.00 per month for utilities.

7. We recommend that each Sunday School be apportioned the following per month for District Home Missions.

8. Whereas the General Board has requested that each district place its zone school in its district budget, be it resolved that each of our churches raise a monthly free will offering for our school.

9. We recommend that all churches take a love offering for the District Superintendent at the time of his regular visits.

10. We recommend that all money raised by the representatives of the General Church and institutional interests be turned over to the local church treasurer and be used for the purpose for which it was raised.

11. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$50.00 per year and that our District Treasurer be paid \$75.00 per year.

12. Be it resolved, that the traveling expense of any minister whose travel is authorized by the district have his traveling expense met on the same basis as the District Superintendent.

13. We recommend that each Sunday School take one special offering during the year for the District Sunday School Committee.

14. We recommend that a form copy of the budget apportionments for each church be sent to the local church treasurer immediately after the conference.

15. We recommend that each church be assessed at the rate of 25c per member per year or \$1.00 per quadrennuim for General Conference Expense.
