### JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Forty-Second Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:00 a. m. Monday, August 8th, 1955 at the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Hutchinson, Kansas.

#### FIRST SITTING

The Conference opened with Rev. F. N. Griffin, pastor of the Hutchinson Church, leading the song service. Rev. F. M. Eichelberger, pastor of the Argonia Church, led the Conference in a gracious season of prayer.

Rev. Howard K. Busby, District Superintendent, introduced to the Conference Rev. R. G. Flexon, General Secretary of Foreign Missions. Rev. Flexon then addressed the Conference from the first chapter of Acts, the eighth verse. He emphasized the power we receive with the baptism of the Holy Ghost. That the Holy Ghost makes us Prayer warriors and Witnesses, witnesses on the Character level, the Conversational level, the Enduring level, and the Sacrificial level.

The roll call was read and revised.

Moved and seconded that the two center sections to the posts and the platform constitute the conference bar. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the time for conference be from 8:00 a. m. until 12:00 noon, and from 1:30 p. m. until 5:30 p. m. Carried.

At this time three new Churches were presented by the District Superintendent—Trinity at Wichita, Topeka, and Iola. The pastors and the delegates from these churches were introduced to Rev. Flexon and the Conference.

The Trinity pastors are Rev. and Mrs. Victor Marvin; delegate, Mrs. Mae Lawrence.

Topeka pastor, Rev. David Jellison; delegate, Mrs. Betty Buck.

Iola pastor, Rev. A. R. Wylie; delegate, E. Mitchel.

It was moved and seconded to receive these Churches into the Conference. Carried.

Partial report of the examining board was read and accepted.

Rev. and Mrs. Victor Marvin were received on Credentials and seated in the conference bar.

Rev. Max Greene and Rev. T. E. Aslin were received on their transfer from the Rocky Mountain District and seated in the conference bar.

Gene Whetstone was received and seated in the conference bar.

The good report of our beloved District Superintendent, Rev. H. K. Busby, was read and accepted with a hearty 'Amen'.

Verbal report of the assistant superintendent accepted.

Report of the auditing committee read and accepted.

The examining board presented Mrs. T. E. Aslin, ordained minister, who was then received on transfer from the Rocky Mountain District and seated in the conference bar.

Report of the district treasurer was read and accepted.

Rev. Flexon brought a report from Rev. William H. Neff, General Superintendent, in which he highly commended us for being the only Gold Star District in the entire church.

Report of the Sunday School committee was read and accepted.

Moved and seconded to dispense with the reading of the statistical report. Carried.

Report of the Ways and Means committee was read and accepted.

Report of the resolutions committee was read and acted upon.

Voted to recess for ten minutes.

Report of the foreign Missionary committee was read and accepted.

Report of the Memorial committee was read and accepted. Rev. Flexon then led in prayer in behalf of Sister Sturk and the loved ones of the other deceased.

Moved and seconded to send greetings from this conference to Rev. George Farr who is seriously ill at this time. Carried.

Moved and seconded to send greetings to Rev. A. H. Wilson, our former second assistant General Superintendent. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we dispense with the reading of the reports from the ministers. Carried.

Moved and seconded to extend the time of this sitting five minutes. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the election of officers be the order of the day at the beginning of the afternoon sitting. Carried.

Motion made and carried that we adjourn.

## SECOND SITTING

The afternoon sitting began with a song led by Rev. James Butler. Rev. W. R. Plummer and Rev. H. C. Freetag then led in prayer. Instead of a scripture lesson, about ten promises were quoted from the floor.

Motion made and carried to dispense with the roll call.

The District Superintendent appointed L. C. Gray, Ivan Ullom, Dave Jellison, and Paul Sickler as tellers.

### ORDINATION SERVICE

A very impressive ordination service was conducted in our Camp Meeting Tabernacle in Hutchinson, Kansas at 9:00 a. m. Sunday morning, August 7th, 1955.

After an opening song, Rev. Howard K. Busby, District Superintendent, led in prayer. Scriptures were read by Rev. B. F. Ireland, Rev. Ray L. Jellison, and Rev. W. R. Plummer.

Rev. R. G. Flexon, General Secretary of Foreign Missions, gave the Ordination address. Basing his remarks on First Timothy third chapter, he stressed that necessity of being spiritual and living a godly, blameless life.

### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 42nd Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in Session, Greetings;

A merciful heavenly Father has allowed us to labor another year to advance His work. With gratefulness to Him and His people I submit this report.

It has been a good year in the Kansas District with many forward steps being taken. Both Kansas City and Johnson have completed their church buildings and have been worshipping in them for many months. Outstanding building improvements have been made in Syracuse, Lyndon and Toronto. A four room annex has been added to the Sabetha church. Other churches have made improvements and more are planned.

Three new churches have been organized and will be presented to this conference. They are: Topeka, Iola and Wichita. Two of these are the result of our labors while Wichita Trinity comes to us, a church already thriving under the leadership of Rev. and Mrs. Victor Marvin.

Along with other labors I have served the Lamont church as pastor. Again, all of our pay for this work has been paid to the District Treasurer.

Reports reveal that we have made splendid gains the past year in church membership and Sunday School attendance.

You have paid me for 18,630 miles of travel. I have visited all of the churches at least twice except two and conducted all of the annual meetings except two. In the past year I have visited the churches 75 times. Exclusive of these visits I have made 85 parsonage calls, I

preached 152 times, made 146 other calls, and held four revivals. In addition we either preached or assisted in four funerals, conducted one wedding, one baptismal service and assisted in a church dedication. As a member of the General Board and Bible College Board, we did our best to help, attending all of their meetings. I was also present at the mid-winter meeting of the District Superintendents in Indianapolis.

You have paid my salary in full and the churches have given me \$396.73 in love offerings.

In this activity we have scarcely touched the surface but do thank God for the privilege of adding our bit to what others are doing. This is the Better Way—Thank God!

## REPORT OF THE AUDITING COMMITTEE

We, the auditing committee of 1955 have examined the District Treasurer's book and believe it to be correct and in excellent condition.

### REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all pastors pay all of their Ministerial tithe through their local church treasurer;  $\frac{3}{4}$  to be applied on District budget;  $\frac{1}{4}$  to apply on loan fund for District Church Extension.

2. We recommend that the evangelists, District Superintendent, Home Missionary Workers, Evangelistic singers, Ministers pay 75 percent of their Ministerial tithe to the District treasurer, one-fifth of which to apply on District Church Extension loan fund, the balance to apply on District budget. We further recommend that the conference payment for pension plan members be paid from the District budget.

3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District budget at the rate of \$2.00 per member in full standing; and at the rate of \$6.00 per member for the General Budget, which apportionment equals the following amounts for each church. The first item is the District budget.

10. We recommend that all money raised by the representatives of the General Church and institutional interests be turned over to the local church treasurer and be used for the purpose for which it was raised.

11. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$100.00 per year and that our District Treasurer be paid \$150.00 per year.

12. Be it resolved that the traveling expense of any minister whose travel is authorized by the district have his traveling expense met on the same basis as the District Superintendent.

13. We recommend that a form copy of the budget apportionments for each church be sent to the local church treasurer immediately after the conference.

14. We recommend that each church be assessed at the rate of 25c per member per year for General Conference expense.

## REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

### I Local Church Work

1. We recommend that the sacrament of the Lord's Supper be observed in our church at least once each quarter.
2. We further recommend that opportunity for baptism be given by our churches at least once each year.
3. Resolved that each pastor may hold two revival meetings each year off his charge.
4. Be it resolved that our churches do not open their doors to other churches, organizations, institutions, or individuals for financial appeals.
5. Resolved that no pastor employ an evangelist outside the Pilgrim Holiness Church without first consulting the District Superintendent.
6. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, prepare and leave for his successor a complete calling list with the location of the homes.
7. We recommend that each pastor be granted two weeks vacation with pay.

### II DISTRICT WORK

1. Be it resolved that our district have a ministerial convention to begin the first Tuesday of March and the place to be set by the district council.
2. Be it resolved that the district council appoint an editor for the district publication.
3. Resolved that any pastor, who is required to be away from his church on district, local, or general business, shall receive his salary as usual.
4. Resolved that we, as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church go on record as opposed to members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the Church in physical education classes in the public schools.
5. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, and the names of those appointed on said committees be printed in the district minutes.
6. Resolved that in the event of death of any of our pastors' or evangelists' immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired, and in turn each pastor shall be notified by wire by the District Secretary.
7. Be it resolved that no mortgage be placed upon our District Camp grounds, parsonage and equipment pertaining thereto, without two-thirds vote of this conference.
8. Be it resolved that each church strive for a 10 per cent gain in membership and that each pastor work toward that goal.

### III—CAMP AND CONFERENCE

1. We recommend that a system of rules and regulations governing our camp and premises be adopted by this conference which shall read as follows:

Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church Camp Grounds at Hutchinson, Kansas, has been established and dedicated for the purpose of that fellowship and ministry that will promote and propagate scriptural holiness, it is expected that those attending shall willingly observe the following:



## Rules

- (1) Smoking on grounds prohibited.
- (2) The wearing of immodest dress will not be tolerated.
- (3) Those sleeping in dormitories are expected to be in and quiet by 11:30 p. m. unless special permission is obtained from those in authority.
- (4) Unmarried young persons shall not be permitted to rent tents, except by special permission and that only if properly chaperoned.
- (5) Loud talking, rowdyism, or behavior unbecoming a Christian will not be tolerated in the dormitories.
- (6) It is presumed that those attending the camp have read and are willing to observe the above rules and regulations.
- (7) Anyone refusing to comply with the above rules and regulations may expect to be asked to leave the camp premises without any refund of registration fee.

2. We further recommend that the above camp rules and regulations be printed on cards for display on camp premises and also that a copy be included in the camp advertisements sent to the churches.

3. We recommend that the first service of campmeeting be conducted on Friday night on the first week and that all pastors make a special effort to come on the day previous to assist in making preparations for the camp.

4. We further recommend that all pastors make a special effort to attend all of camp and conference.

5. Resolved that the District Camp have Children's and Young People's services; workers to be secured as soon as possible.

6. Resolved that we hold conference at the close of camp.

7. Resolved that each pastor urge his people to bring their instruments to camp.

8. Resolved that each church take a special offering for the camp by June 30th.

9. Be it resolved that the first Friday night service and the day services of the first Saturday be designated as Young People's services and during this period the Youth Conference shall be held.

10. Resolved that those attending the Sunday morning service of the camp meeting be given credit on the Sunday School attendance at home.

11. Resolved that we have men and women's prayer bands during camp meeting, and that the leaders be appointed by the district council.

## IV—EDUCATION COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that at each annual camp meeting, on the last Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examination of licensed ministers and deaconesses. All ministers knowing themselves due to appear before these boards are urged to be present with their recommendations.

2. We further recommend that the time of each session shall be announced from the platform.

3. We recommend that all ministers working toward ordination consult with the educational board by the close of the district conference.

4. We recommend that one-half year's credit on the study course be granted for each year of seminar work approved. This credit does not apply to the reading course required in the manual.

#### V—SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that each church furnish the district secretary with the names of its delegate or delegates at least 24 hours before the conference convenes.

2. Be it resolved that the Conference approve the tentative Blue Cross-Blue Shield plan and that it be optional with the local Churches to pay one-half of the monthly payment.

3. Moved and seconded to express our appreciation to Mr. and Mrs. Loren Harkins and Rev. F. N. Griffin for their work on the camp grounds by a rising vote of thanks. (Carried)

4. Moved and seconded to show our appreciation for the beef donated by Carl Dillon by a rising vote of thanks. (Carried).

5. Moved, seconded and carried that we show our appreciation to Rev. and Mrs. R. G. Flexon, Rev. Robert H. Heckart, Brother and Sister Ernie Lewis for their work with us during the Camp by a rising vote of thanks.

6. Moved and carried to give a rising vote of thanks for Rev. H. K. Busby for his untiring labors as our district superintendent.

7. A rising vote of thanks was given to the following for their labors during the camp:

Dave Jellison and Virgil Law, tent men.

John Keller, Elmer Jantz, Francis Hobbs, Brother and Sister W. C. Byrd in the kitchen.

James Butler for his work with the youth.

Charles Colaw for his work on the district paper.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

Our gains in Sunday School over the Kansas District are larger than last year by the addition of two new Sunday Schools. They are Iola and Wichita Trinity. Eighteen Sunday Schools have shown gains and twelve have shown a loss. We have shown a total gain numerically of 190, and a percentage gain of 11%.

There were Sunday School Conventions held at Topeka, Johnson, Colby, Hutchinson, and Fall River during the past year.

Topeka received the certificate for the highest percentage gain of 95%. Topeka and Garden City tied for the largest numerical gain with 22 each. Topeka and Garden City received gold ribbons. Lyndon, Sabetha, and Lakin received red ribbons. Johnson, Sharon Springs, Argonia, and Kansas City received blue ribbons.

### SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUTH WORK

The duties of the Sunday School Committee in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

1. The District Sunday School Committee together with the District Superintendent shall arrange for Sunday School Conventions to be held in the district during the year.

2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the district.

3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:

- a. A statement of the work accomplished during the year.
- b. A statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work in the District.

4. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a Summer Vacation Bible School and a report of that work shall be sent to the District Sunday School Committee.

5. We further recommend that each pastor resolve to make an earnest effort to attend and bring as large a delegation as possible of Sunday School workers to the Sunday School Convention.

6. Be it resolved that each church strive for a 20 percent gain in Sunday School attendance this year, and that they use the plan suggested by the General Church.

7. Be it resolved that each church of the Kansas District seek to establish children's meetings this conference year.

8. Be it resolved that each church on the Kansas District where Young People's Societies are not organized, or have no services in their behalf, endeavor to organize a chartered Young People's Society (as suggested by our General Church) and where it is impossible to do so, that they strive toward this goal.

9. We recommend that the District Young People's Committee arrange for Youth Conventions to be held throughout the state.

### REPORT OF THE FOREIGN MISSIONARY COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to Rev. and Mrs. R. G. Flexon, our general Sec. of Foreign Missions for their faithful representation of foreign missions to our camp.

2. We recommend that the first Sunday afternoon of the 1956 camp be devoted to the interest of foreign missions.

3. We recommend that the first Sunday of each month be designated as Missionary Sunday by our local churches, that prayer be offered, and that an offering be taken.

4. Because of the cost of our foreign missionary work, we recommend that our churches give as much as possible above the foreign missionary budget.

5. We recommend that our pastors encourage those who feel the call of God to special service, and that the church assists them in their preparation as much as possible.

6. We recommend that our local missionary societies be encouraged to send as many packages of used clothing as possible for distribution to the poor, and that the missionaries be remembered at Christmas and birthdays.

7. We recommend that the district secretary send to each local church missionary society an annual report blank covering the yearly work. This blank is to be filled out and returned to the secretary with the annual church reports at the close of the conference year.

8. We recommend that our pastors endeavor to organize and encourage a junior missionary society in their churches.
